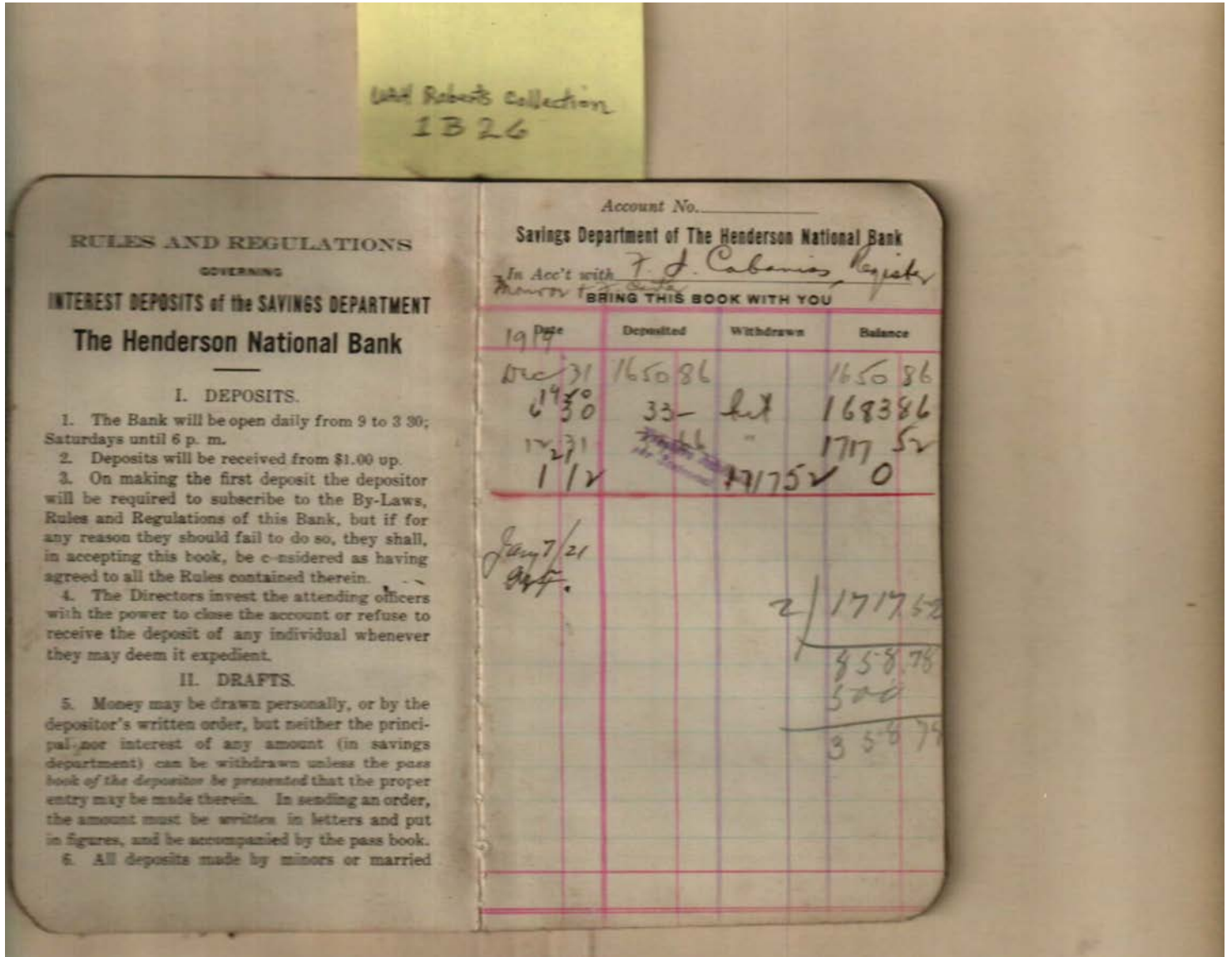

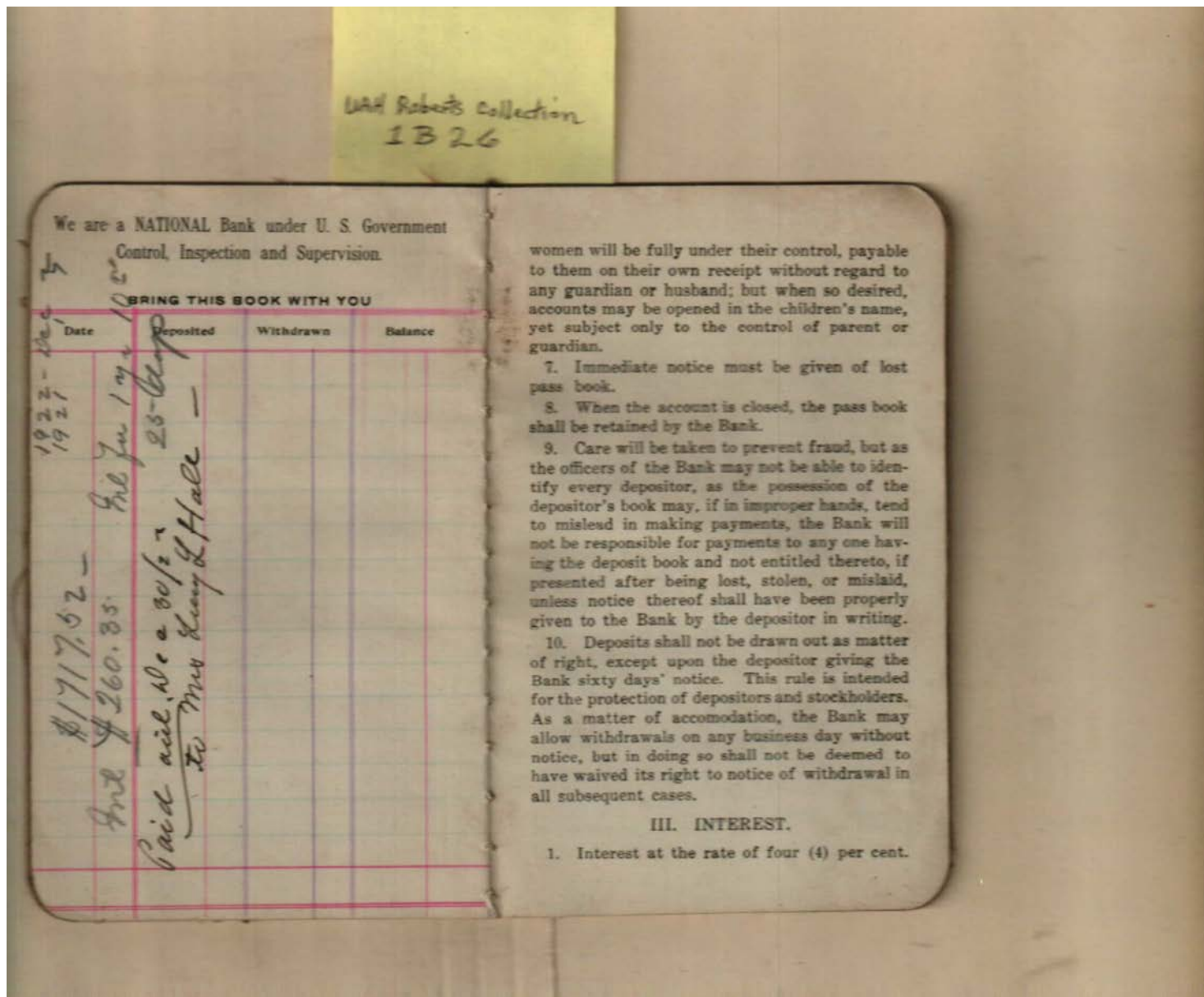

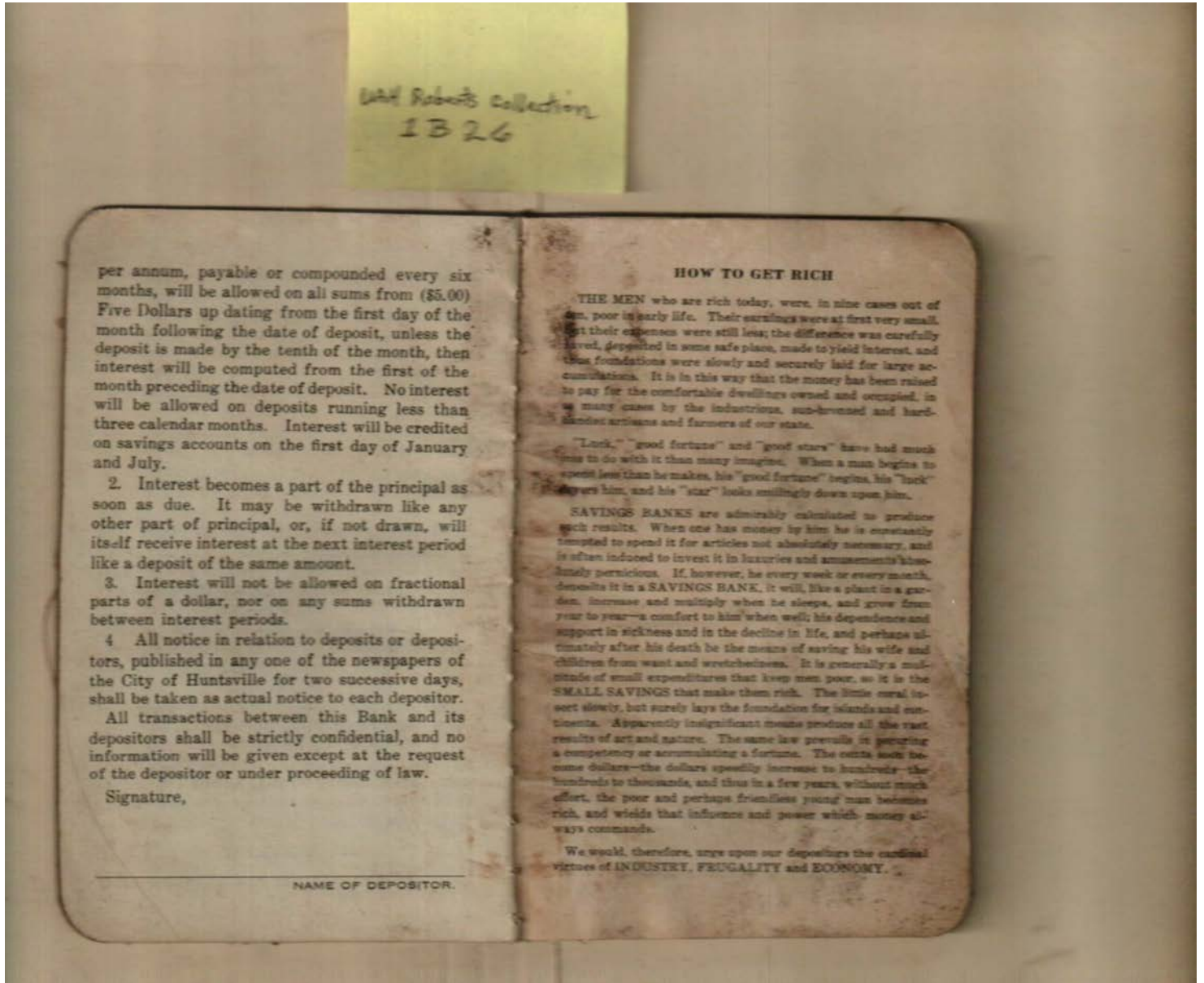

per annum, payable or compounded every six months, will be allowed on all sums from (\$5.00) Five Dollars up dating from the first day of the month following the date of deposit, unless the deposit is made by the tenth of the month, then interest will be computed from the first of the month preceding the date of deposit. No interest will be allowed on deposits running less than three calendar months. Interest will be credited on savings accounts on the first day of January and July.

2. Interest becomes a part of the principal as soon as due. It may be withdrawn like any other part of principal, or, if not drawn, will itself receive interest at the next interest period like a deposit of the same amount.

3. Interest will not be allowed on fractional parts of a dollar, nor on any sums withdrawn between interest periods.

4. All notice in relation to deposits or depositors, published in any one of the newspapers of the City of Huntsville for two successive days, shall be taken as actual notice to each depositor.

All transactions between this Bank and its depositors shall be strictly confidential, and no information will be given except at the request of the depositor or under proceeding of law.

HOW TO GET RICH

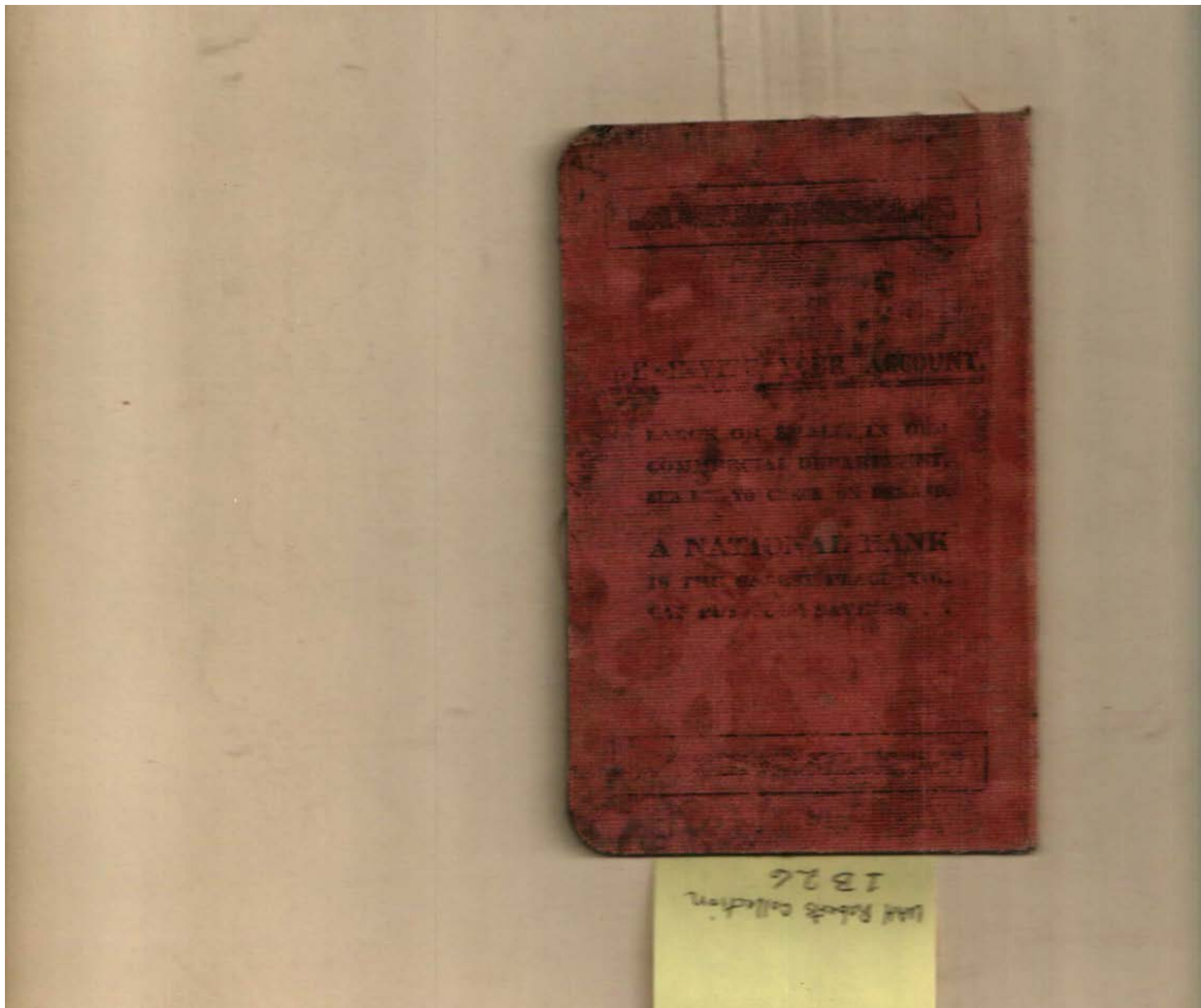
