DEAR Sir:

We find upon examination of our files of the claims in which we are the attorneys, that many cases are suspended in the Pension Office awaiting further evidence which has been called for by us, or awaiting some action on the part of the claimant which is necessary in order to complete the same. With a view of completing these cases and securing their settlement and allowance, we are giving them special attention and write to secure your co-operation in the matter of your claim.

Please give your attention to **Paragraph No. 3** of this letter and comply therewith without delay.

No. 1. Upon examination of your case in our office we find that on the _____ day of _____ 189____, we wrote you, fully explaining the Pension Office requirements in your case, and sent you forms and instructions for procuring the required evidence. Please give our communication your immediate attention and furnish the evidence called for **without further delay**, and an effort will be made to secure the allowance of your case.

No. 2. On the _____ day of _____ 189____, we called upon you for evidence showing _____

and for some reason you have failed to comply with our letter. We again send you the necessary forms for the required evidence and hope you will furnish the same **with the least possible delay** in order that your case may be completed and disposed of.

No. 3. Your claim filed under the Act of June 27, 1890, having been rejected by the Pension Office, as we have informed you, no further action will be taken thereon until you shall have filed a **new or supplemental declaration**, and we therefore enclose a new form for your use.

You should fill in the form carefully, stating **all disabilities or ailments from which you now suffer**, and then promptly execute and **return same to us** for filing when we will give your case careful attention.

As many cases are rejected by the Pension Office, and subsequently allowed upon filing of a supplemental application, we would advise that you give this matter prompt attention, and get your new application on file.

No. 4. Our records show that on or about the _____ day of _____ 189____ there was sent to you by the Commissioner of Pensions an **order for your medical examination**, and your case is now awaiting the return of said order duly complied with.

As no further action on your case will be taken by the Pension Office until you are examined under said order, you are advised to comply with same at the earliest possible date, and **then return the certificate of examination to us** in order that we may keep a complete record of your case.

The examination order can be complied with at any time within three months from the date thereof but the sooner you are examined the sooner your case will be disposed of.

The order will be changed by the Pension Office for satisfactory reasons only.

No. 5. It appears that on or about the _____ day of _____ 189____ an **order for your medical examination** was sent to you by the Commissioner of Pensions, and since then we have not been advised of your compliance with said order. Please state if you were examined in accordance with instructions, and if so, **when**, and what disposition was made of the order. If for any reason you failed to be examined please so inform us, and **state if you are now willing for an examination** and we will at once request the Commissioner of Pensions to issue another order for that purpose.

We desire to invite your attention to the fact that meritorious claims for pension, where proven up, are being daily allowed in large numbers, and it is a matter of great importance to you to follow our instructions and comply therewith without delay, in order that your case may be completed and made ready for allowance. We hope you will act on our suggestion, and comply promptly with all communications received from us relating to your case.

You will of course understand that as we are paid no fee in pension cases until they are allowed, we cannot be otherwise than diligent in the prosecution of all such claims, and we are not only willing but anxious to assist you in establishing your case.

NEW Certificate of DISCHARGE in lieu of Lost Discharge.

Under Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902, we can now secure for any Commissioned Officer, or enlisted man who has ever served in the volunteer or regular army of the United States, at any time, or the widow of such officer or enlisted man a certificate of discharge in lieu of original certificate, in cases where the original has been lost or destroyed without the soldier's knowledge or procurement.

You should see that you have in your possession record evidence of your service as a United States soldier to be handed down to your children, as it may not only prove of value to yourself or them in the future, but should be cherished as an evidence of your devotion to your country. Congress has recognized the value of these certificates by providing for issuing the same when the original certificate has been lost, but provides only for issuing them upon proper application being made by the soldier or widow. The children or parents of a deceased soldier cannot secure such certificate of service. If you have lost your certificate of discharge you should at once write us, stating your name and post-office address in full, the organization in which you served, the date of your enlistment, and discharge as nearly as possible, and when, where and how it was lost or destroyed, in order that we may draw up the proper application to obtain such certificate showing your honorable discharge from the United States Army. Fee for services is \$3.00, of which sum \$1.00 must be sent us with your statement, the balance to be paid when we secure you a certificate of service. Don't delay your attention to this matter if you have lost your original certificate, but fill up the form on the back hereof and return to us at once.

Certificates of discharge for Naval Service also secured.
