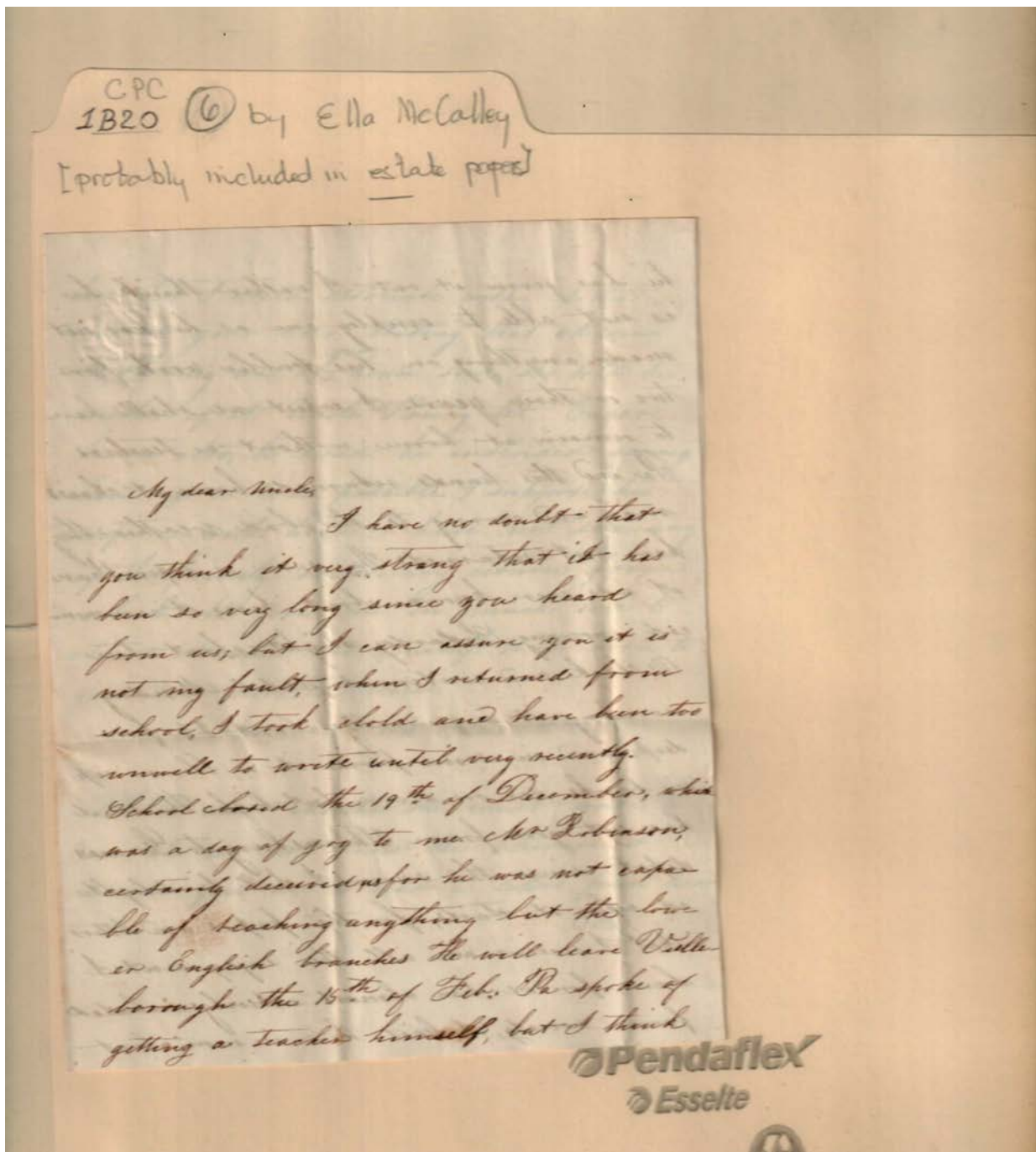

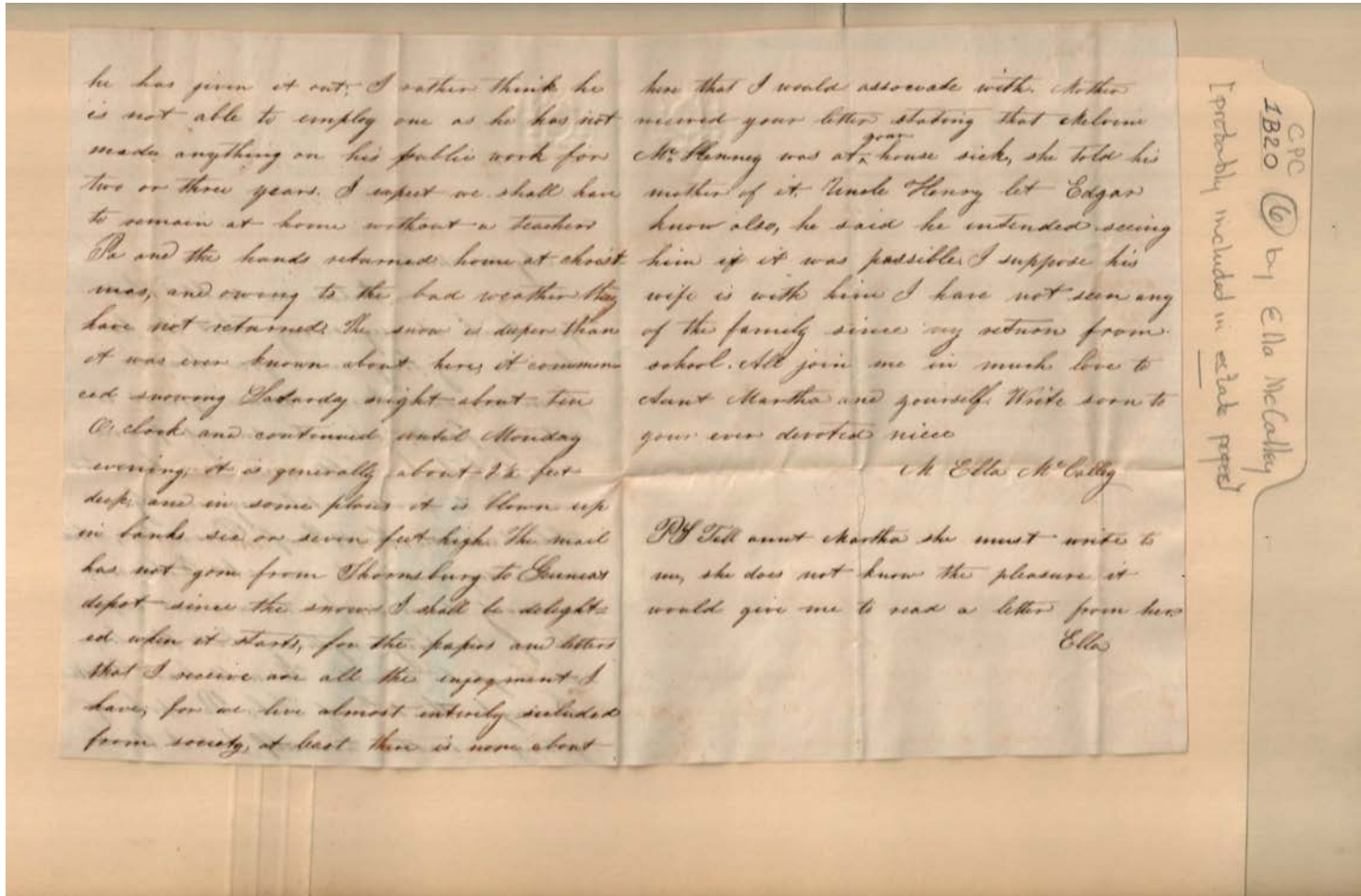

he has given it out, I rather think he is not able to employ one as he has not made anything on his public work for two or three years. I expect we shall have to remain at home without a teacher. He and the hands returned home at about noon, and owing to the bad weather they have not returned. The snow is deeper than it was ever known about here at Christmas and snowing Saturday night about ten o'clock and continued until Monday evening it is generally about 3 1/2 feet deep and in some places it is blown up in banks six or seven feet high. The mail has not gone from Shrewsbury to Concord depot since the snow. I shall be delighted when it starts, for the papers and letters that I receive are all the enjoyment I have, for we have almost entirely secluded from society, at least there is none about

here that I would associate with. Arthur received your letter stating that cholera ^{was} at home sick, she told his mother of it. Uncle Henry let Edgar know also, he said he intended seeing him if it was possible. I suppose his wife is with him I have not seen any of the family since my return from school. All join me in much love to Aunt Martha and yourself. Write soon to your ever devoted niece

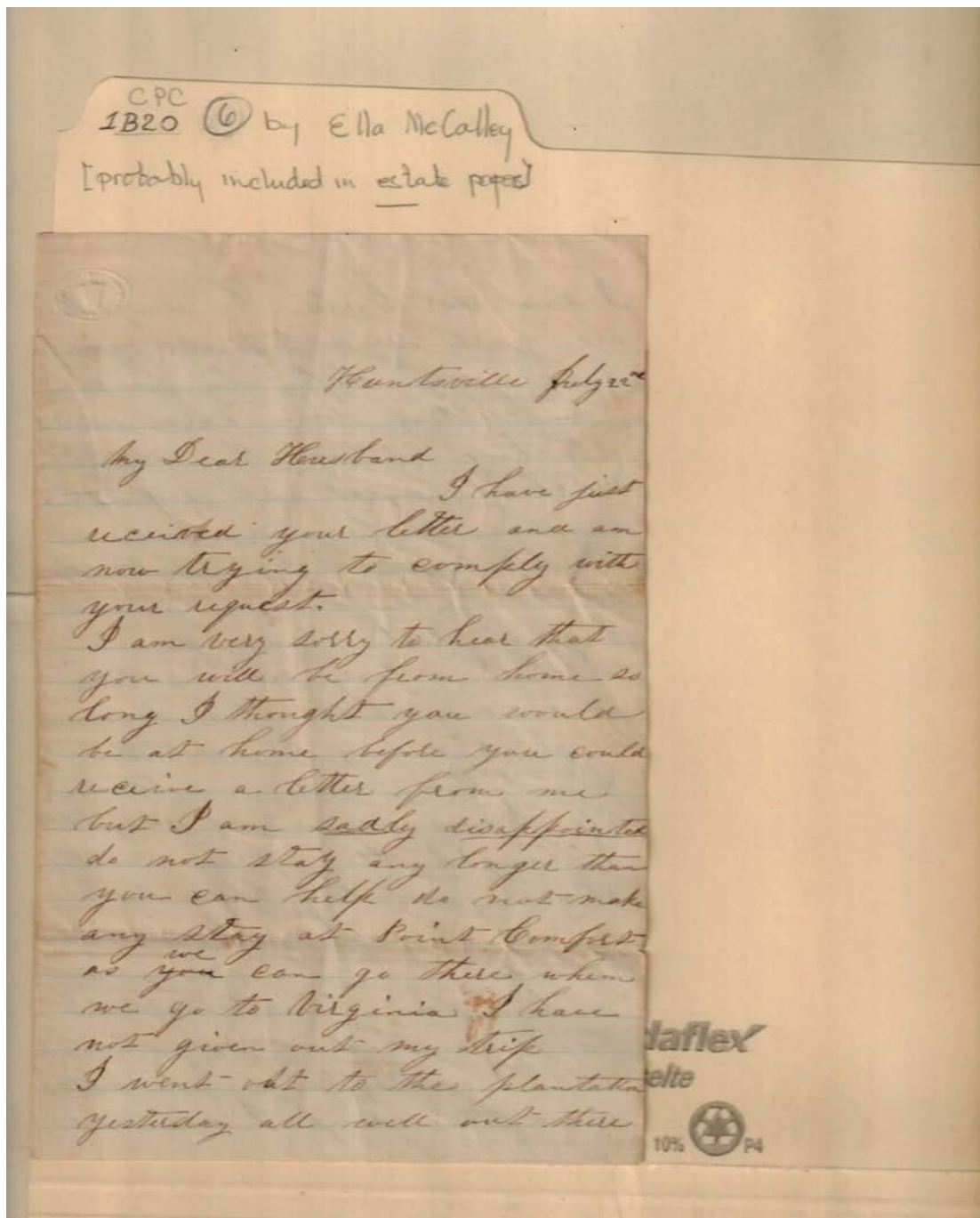

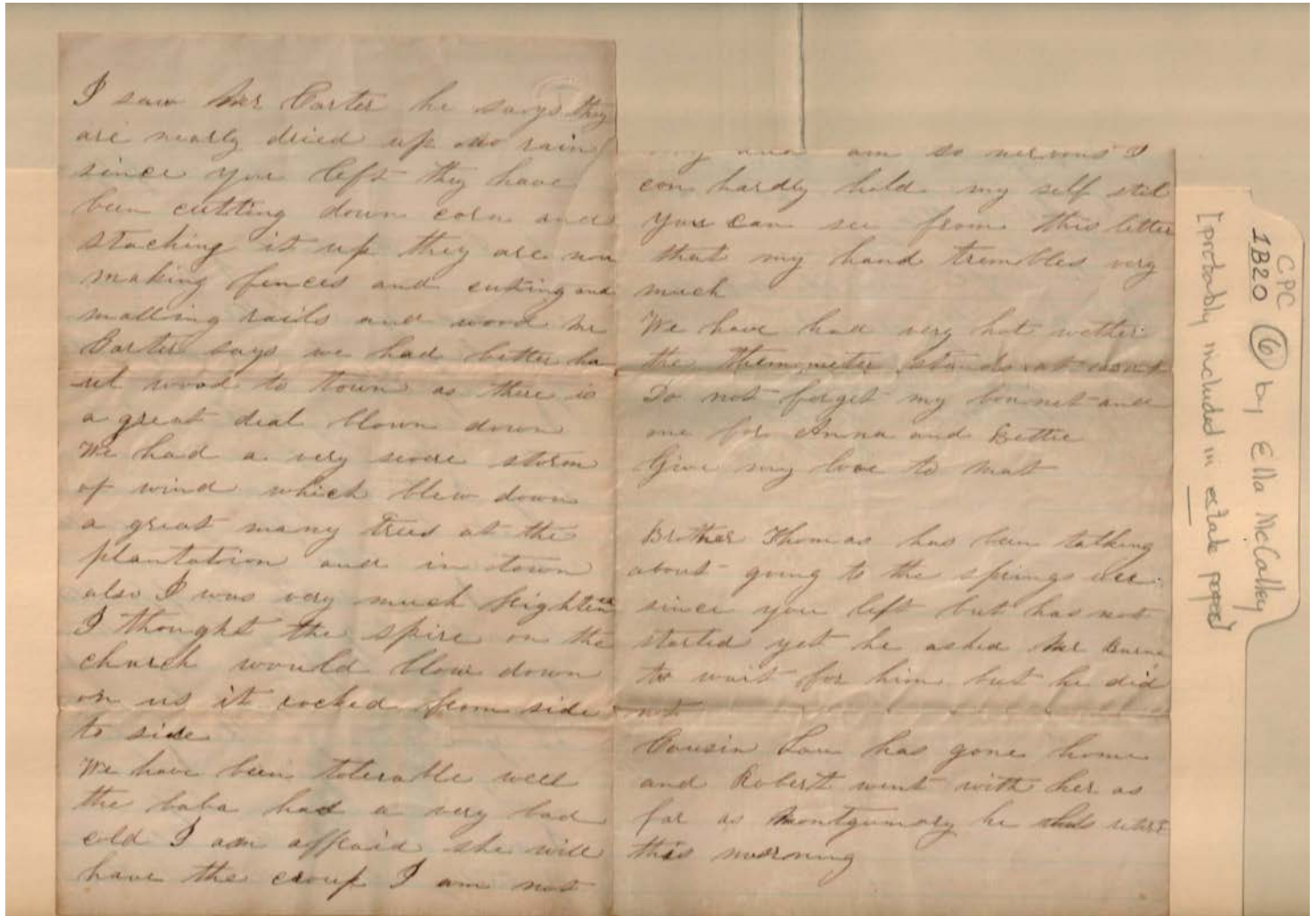

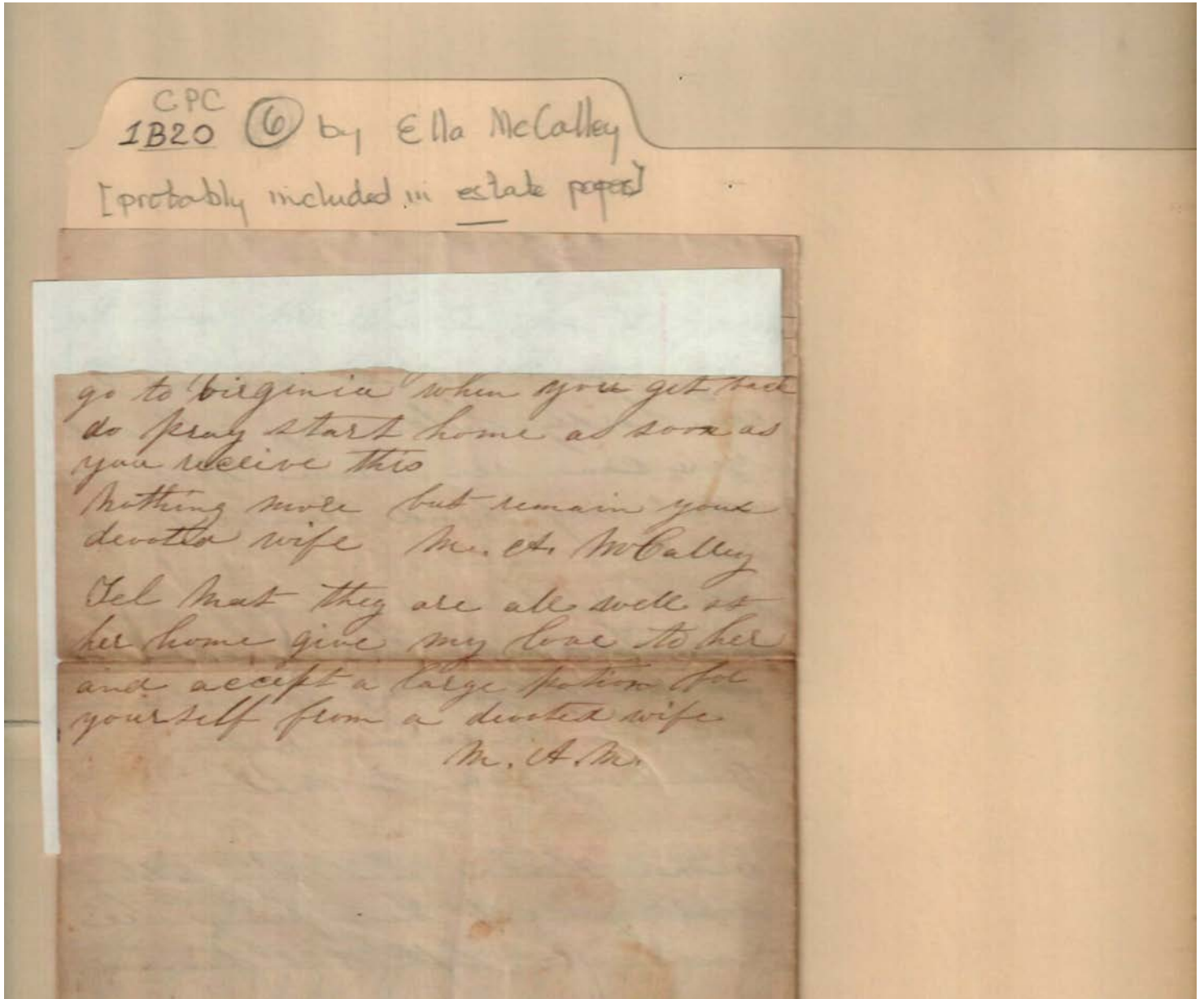

Dear William

I received your letter
to day while on my way home from
my sister. The letter you sent to me some
three weeks since I sent immediately to
Edgar McK. and received answer to it
the same day, and am much disappointed
hearing the illness of his brother Mel. He also
expressed thanks to you & family for so much
kindness. Alas my sister sent the letter
you wrote to her to his (Mother) Edgar
said to me in his note that he would see him
and I am much surprised at his not being
there before this if he has not gone. I have
this moment ascertained from ^{what he says at the time} my blacksmith
that he has not gone but will start on the first
of January. I feel mortified that they seem
to care so little for him and I cannot
account for his ships not going immediately
strange indeed. I am sorry that I
cannot give you any information about
his pecuniary affairs as he has lived some
fifty or hundred miles ^{but} from us ever since
he was married. But one thing is
certain that Edgar can raise any amount
of money he may need and it is certainly in
his place to do so and I should not
advance one cent to pay old debts no one
time more than was necessary to his comfort.
I will get all the information I can and
write to you again soon. If Edgar should
not start in a few days I will see him and urge
him to do so.

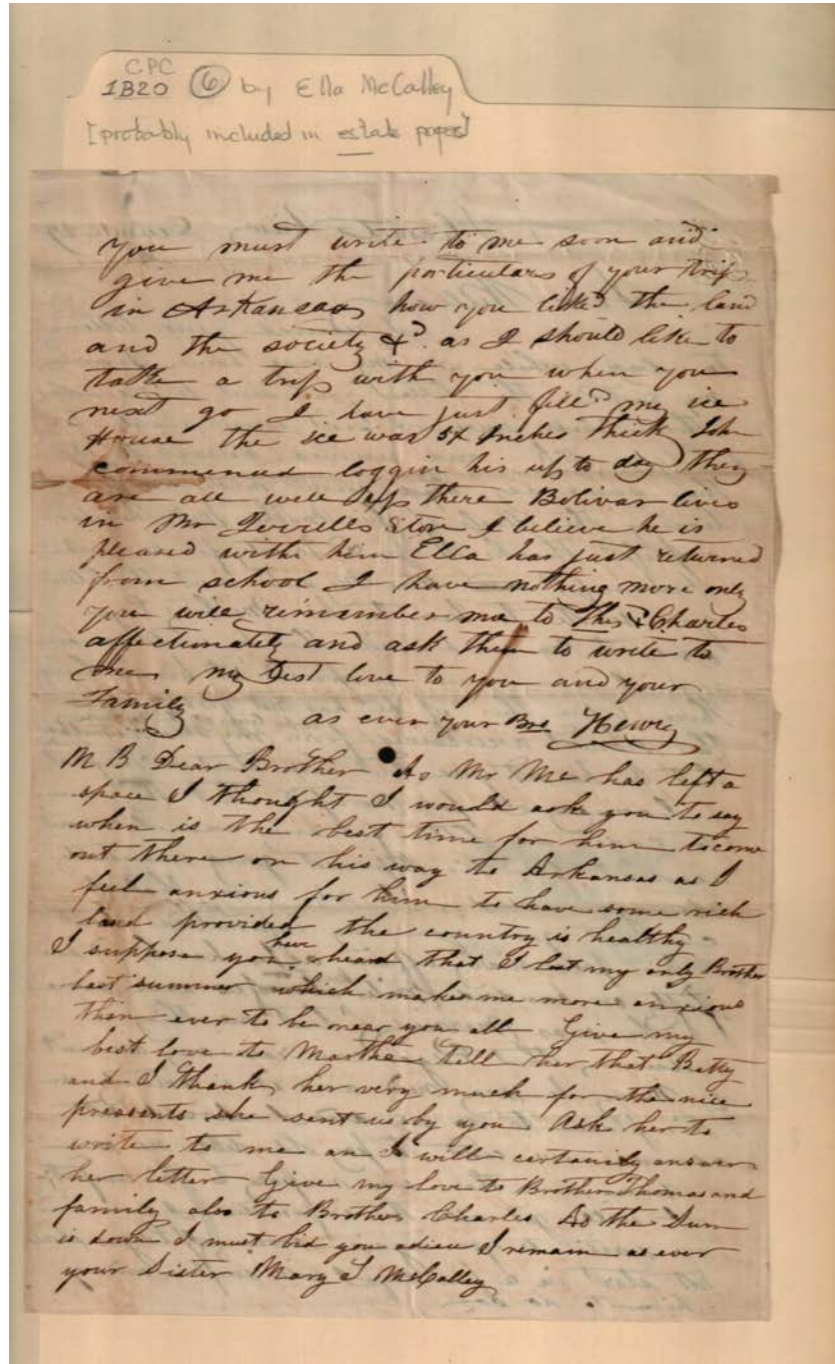
