Settlement of the estate of Mrs Moore
intermarried with Mr John Ryan of
and both of Moore's Children died -
Mrs Moore and her son or daughter
by Ryan survived them - The Statute
of distribution (in the Code) applicable to such
cases have not been construed by our
Supreme Court & it was somewhat questionable
whether Mrs Ryan or her child by her last
husband was entitled to inherit the estates
which Moore's Children took under the
will mentioned above - Finley was advised
in ~~that~~ by two prominent members of the
bar in my presence that the child of
Mr Ryan was entitled to the property -
Mr Ryan contended that the property he
descended to his wife, and wished Mr
Finley to turn the property over to him
as her trustee without any settlement
in Chancery - He came to my office
with Finley & asked me to advise Finley
to do so - I refused to advise Finley
in that way - unless Ryan would qualify
as administrator of Moore's Children &
guardian of his child & in his capacity
as guardian & administrator gave Finley
a proper acquittance so as to dis-
charge him from all future liability.

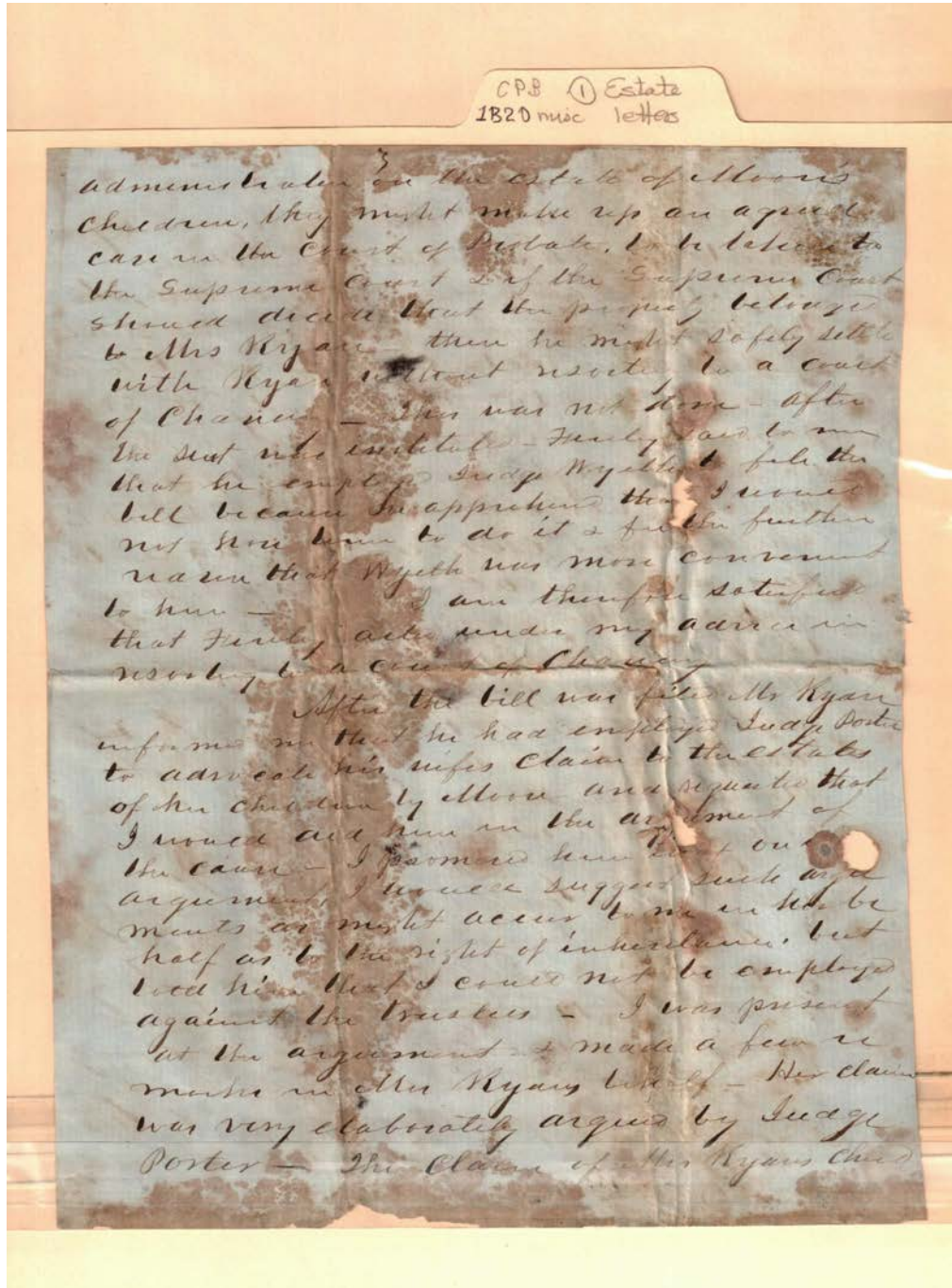

Supposing this 3rd Specification to re-
fer to a suit in Chancery instituted by
Samuel Finley & P. M. Moore to settle the
Trusts comprised upon them by a deed of
Settlement made by Gabriel M. Moore
about the year 1847 or 1850 and which
is of record in the Probate Court of
Jefferson - as follows -

That I was of Counsel for the Trustees, in
that deed having been retained by them
when the deed was executed or shortly there-
after - That soon after the death of
Gabriel M. Moore, I advised Samuel
Finley, one of the Trustees & who had become
the Administrator of the estate of Moore,
that the papers embraced in the deed
did not belong to him as administrator,
& could not be distributed in the Pro-
bate Court - That the Chancery Court
would have jurisdiction of the settle-
ment of the Trust estate & advised
him to settle the Trust & distribute to
the Trust estate under the direction
of that Court - Finley said he wished
me to file the bill for him, which he
should discharge all the debts charge-
able on the Trust estate -

From that conversation - The impression was made upon my mind - that Judge Wyeth's opinion was that though it was a question of doubt - the weight of argument the law of the case was in favor of the Child - but that he would be gratified if the Supreme Court should be of a different opinion & award the ~~estate~~ estate to Mrs. Ryan - that he wished the question definitely settled so that the trustee would not be again troubled with any litigation about it -

In the argument of the cause I think Judge Wyeth clearly shows that his own opinion was that the Child was entitled to the property - ~~and was satisfied~~ - I do not remember that he presented any arguments in behalf of Mrs. Ryan - But if he thought her case was fully presented by Justice Porter & myself it does not

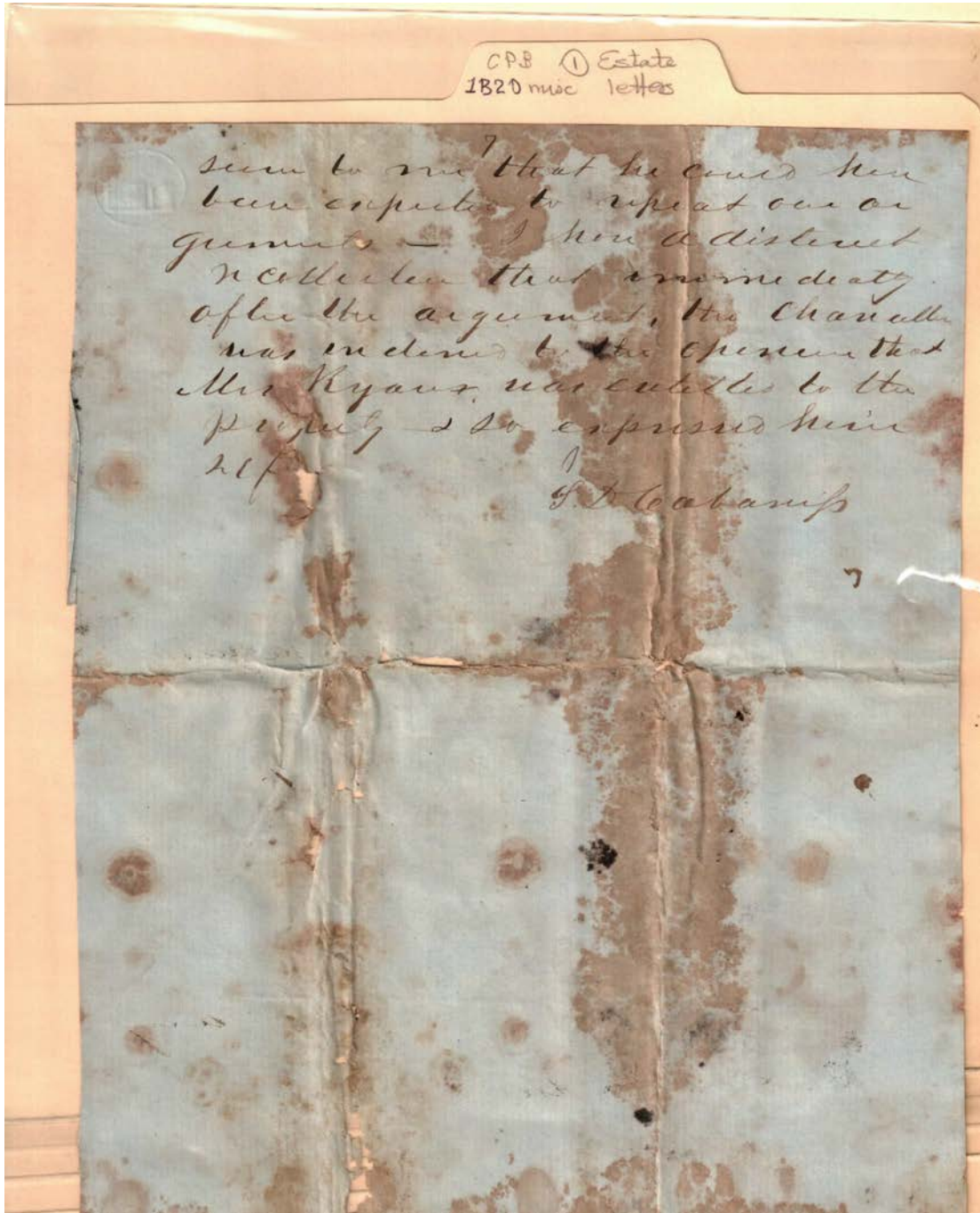

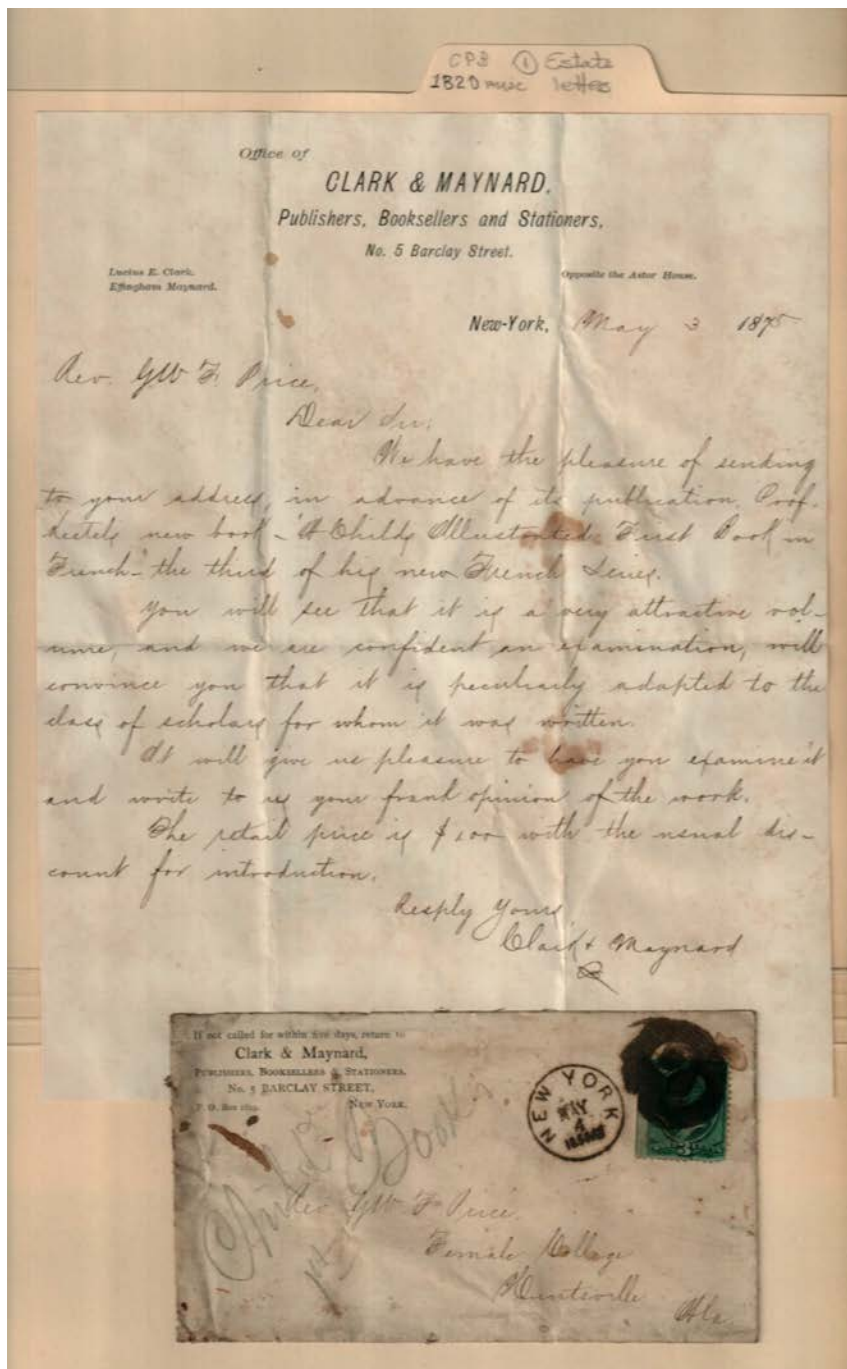
