I heard him spoken highly of except by a few, who did not bare care to have their names give. I suggested to Gephart to keep a day book in which he should set forth a full history of each transaction, showing particularly name of tenant and farm, to which he agreed and I concluded to leave him in charge.

The prices placed on the land are very near those ~~given~~ decided on by Reuben. I did not give any one agent the exclusive right to sell them, but put them in the hands of Hicks & Gephart, real estate agents, Simpson, the Hotel proprietor, besides enlisting all the tenants in the cause. ^{two real estate farms in Topeka} rec'd one or two offers shortly after returning home, and since then, one or more offers for each place. Then arose the question as to who should be appointed trustee to succeed Reuben. Capt. Humes suggested Mrs. Humes, to which we consented. I wrote Marshall Gephart Esq. under Capt. Humes' direction, instructing him to get an order of the Court appointing Mrs. Humes. Along in February last, at which time the district Court of Jefferson County convened, Gephart wired to me to know if he represented all parties concerned, also for copy of letters testamentary issued Mrs. Chapman &c. I showed the telegram to Mr. Humes, who told me to write Gephart that he did represent all the parties. It was several days before we rec'd the ^{transcript} ~~telegram~~ from the Probate Court and before they reached Gephart Court had adjourned. It was early in Jan. that I wrote to Gephart, but the delay was caused by his illness. The next term of the Court was in May at which time Mrs. Humes was appointed trustee, but we have not yet rec'd. the certified copy of the order. (Mrs. Humes left last week for New York.) I turned over the funds rec'd. by me, less the expenses of trip last Nov. and telegrams sent and rec'd. amounting to \$397.15.

I am apprehensive that we have lost the sales by the delay but hope not. So far as commencing legal proceedings, as you suggest, is concerned, I would not like to take the step, but if you prefer to do so, we will not resist you.

Your letter received last night, together with one from your sister-in-law Mrs Lee in which she claims the tone of my letter to her was not what it should be. I re-read my letter and failed to see what I wrote a thing in it that could offend any one, and as to the tone, I was not aware that it had any tone until I heard that its effect was an unpleasant one. I suppose Mrs Lee meant the conclusion which well reached upon the facts then stated was unpleasant to her, I wrote the facts with the politest of language that my education would admit of, with all due courtesy to any concerned but in behalf of what I believed to be your best interest.

Your letter received last night was not dated, but acknowledged receipt of my letter of the 17th inst. Bone of this place received the whole effect of such investment during ~~the life of~~ ~~his~~ his life time his wife, having died without a will and no one having qualified as administrator upon her estate.

We are willing to and save from any bad effect of such litigation the heirs at law of Mrs Bone who have a remainder interest in her estate her second husband Captain Bone being in the prime of life and in good health. Whatever you may persuade Mrs George to do in this matter, which I know to be against her interest she owing other debts, which she is at present unable to pay intervening her in trouble and possibly in litigation by thus transferring the assets of her ~~former~~ husband's estate, and not paying ~~her~~ other debts, which the estate owes and which she now owes. I cannot with due appreciation of the confidence she has placed in me consent to such a compromise: nor will I send the paper she requires for the Judson mortgage. the matter must be done without my assistance, and after my post as her advisor as I do not intend that I shall ever be held responsible, by her friends and kindred here, for such a step, or ~~by~~ ~~the~~ be complained of by the other creditors of the estate of Thomas George dead, of which Mrs George is sole devisee under the will.

We did not as you say think our cause a very weak one because what you had written and what we knew concerning the state of affairs we believe it to be a good one, but knowing the uncertainty of law suits and not knowing the names of all the parties by whom Judge Judson (your Brother) expects to prove his cause we could not readily devise it after his death, without plenty of time to write to various parties and get their depositions taken in the case.

You say the true fact remains that your Brother held your funds which he did not pay over to you and that in all honesty and justice his estate should be held liable for it.

His estate under the laws of Alabama is liable for it if there is any thing in his estate that can be made so liable. You and I agree entirely upon this proposition: but uphold his conveyance to Mrs Bone of certain property in the City of Huntsville was without consideration a voluntary conveyance of his property and one which the courts would declare in fraud of the creditors of his estate.
