I bought and paid for 2000 shares. Subsequently the Co. a reorganization of the capital made it 3000 shares. Whether they ever issued a certificate to me or not I do not remember but afterwards I had them issue a certificate for the 3000 shares in the name of Laura Bone which certificate was sent to me and thereafter always remained in my custody until lost as hereafter mentioned. My object in having the issue to Laura Bone was to promote her interests and convenience in case of my death. She was living in Alabama; I in Colorado. She was my only child. My health was precarious. In case of my death in Colo. she would have had trouble delay and expense in administering. My custom was to put notes, mortgages, deeds, &c. in her name to avoid these obstacles.

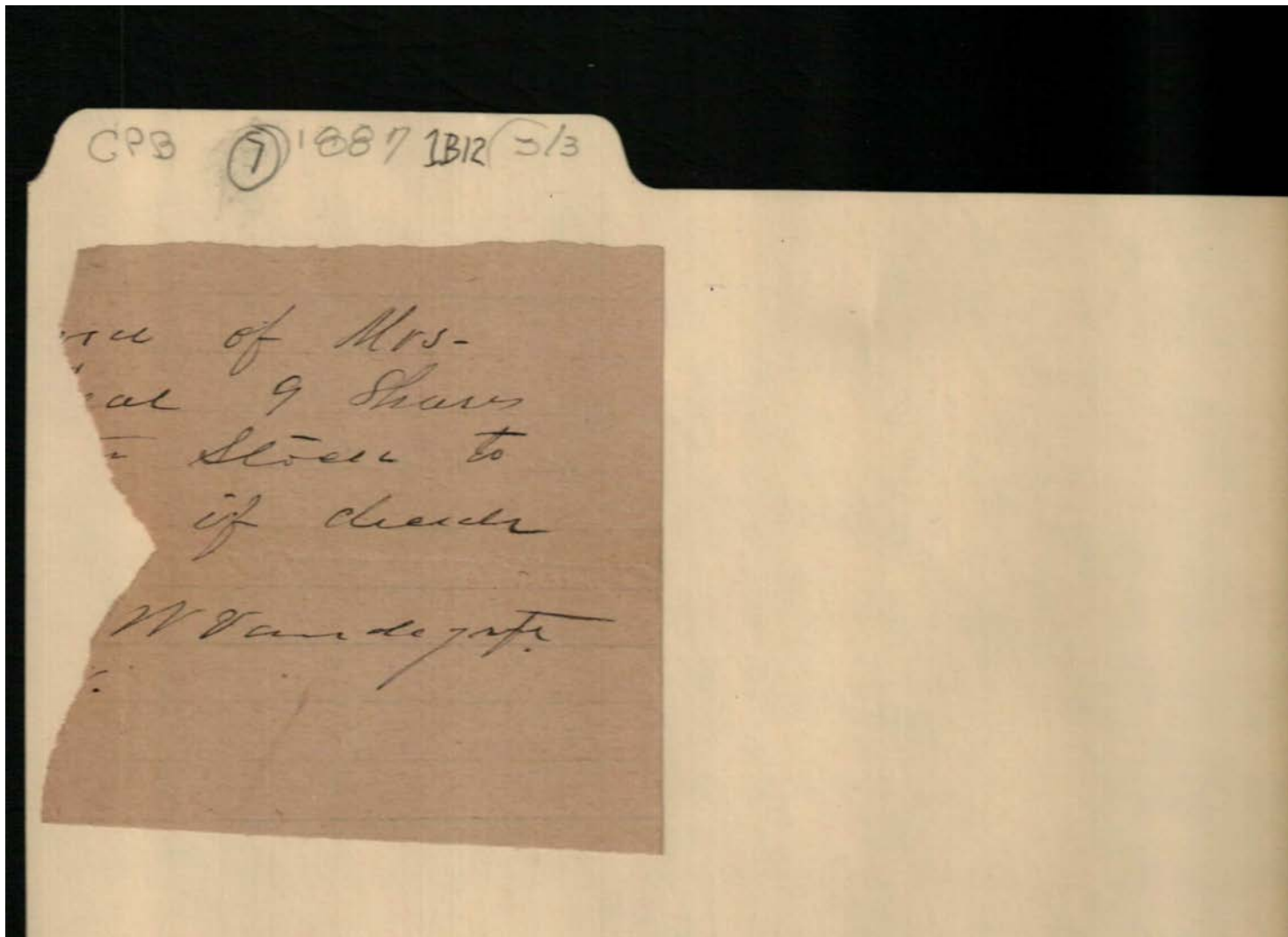
