This agreement made this ninth day of September, 1886, between Thomas George of the first part and Henry Baker of the second part, witnesseth that the said George sells, and the said Baker purchases, a parcel of land in the County of Madison, and State of Alabama, containing about forty-five acres, (said being a part of what is known as the Buck Roper farm), bounded on the north by the north line of said farm; on the east by lands sold by said George to Anthony Boreland; on the south by the Winchester road; and on the west by lands of William P. McBride, for the price of nine dollars per acre, to be paid as follows: in four equal annual payments, on the first days of January, 1889, 1890, 1891, and 1892, with interest from

Thomas, of date May 6. 1878. I don't remember who was the vendee; but from a memorandum found among old papers, I conclude that the parcels of Molokan land embraced were sold as property of Col. Donegan - 80 acres of which in sec 27. was recently advertised to be sold as property of estate of A. J. Withers by J. B. White Admr. in Democrat - Sale comm. land for Oct 9<sup>th</sup>.

Ben Pope as well as Mr. H. P. H. Stand and Mr. Patton and Charles H. Patton were all living in 1844 - My Mem. does not designate the Sections in which the latter acts are to be found.

**Collection Scope and Content:** The Collection of 114 Linear ft. includes a total of 156 Archival Boxes. The Frances Cabaniss Roberts collection covers the historical records of the Cabaniss Roberts family.
