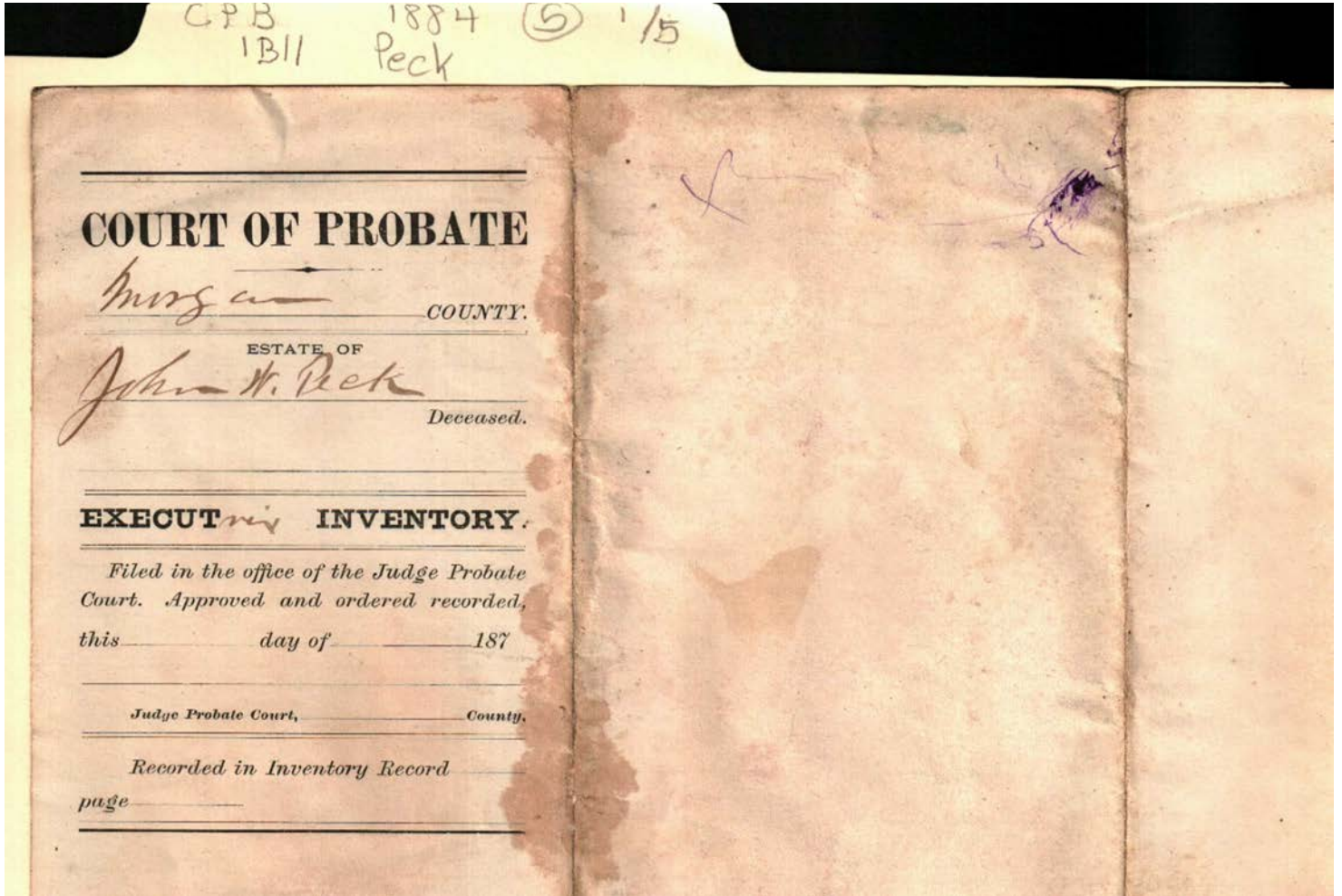

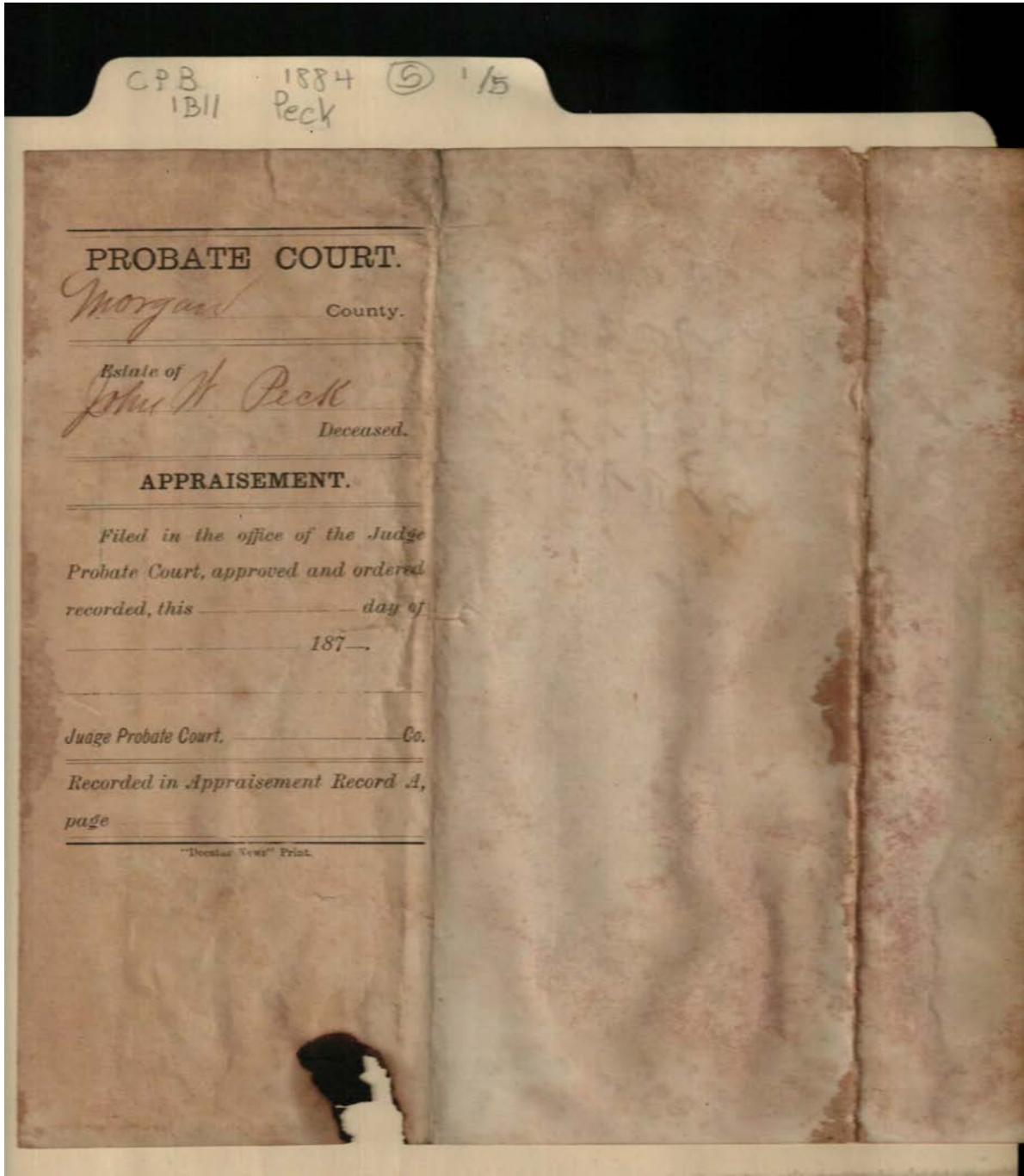

Mr John W. Peck comes to me this morning to learn what I know about his and W. T. Morrow's land case. I have this to say: That Mr J. W. Peck in a conversation with me stated that he was about to take legal steps to dispossess said W. T. Morrow of the land on which he, Morrow, was then living and on which said Morrow had located a ten year lease. Mr Peck assigned as a reason for the proposed ^{step} that that Mr Morrow had not paid anything on the lease and that he did not believe he would pay for it. I went at night, shortly after this conversation, to see Mr. Morrow and he told me he expected soon to get business that would be remunerative and was sanguine that he soon could and would pay from one hundred dollars and repeat it yearly till the whole was paid. Mr Morrow seemed to be so sure of this that he made me believe that he could make the payments as above stated that I went the same night to see Mr. Peck and got him to wait longer to see if Mr Morrow would do this. It was my understanding from Mr. Peck that if Mr. Morrow would make payments as last stated that he would wait. I myself believed that if Mr. Morrow got into the business he expected that he could pay Mr Peck. Mr. Morrow got into said business as I understand it. It was my confidence in Mr Morrow's ability and willingness to pay that quitted Mr Peck. This Feb. 24th 1882 Wilson Williams
