It was well said by this Court in *Bank of Mobile vs. Hall*. "It is important, ^{that litigation} should end, at least in a Court of Chancery, as soon as the merits of a case are ascertained, and a point reached which decides the principle which must govern it."

Rules 82, 83, 84 being in consecutive order, should be construed together giving to the term "final decree" in Rule 83, the same import, that it manifestly has in 84.

If so construed Chancellor Speake had no authority to modify his decree of August 1880 in regard to the matter of rents in question except so far as authorized by Rules 80 and 82 on a timely application for a rehearing. And this Court, as it seems to us, should have held that it was to be presumed that the Chancery Court treated the application for modification, as in substance an application for a rehearing, as to the question presented by the applicant, and that his decision, then made, refusing to direct the Register to charge the trustee with any rents for the 160 acre tract, not actually received, but directing him to charge him with the reasonable rental value of the 560 acre tract (in which debt Nichols had an Equity redemption)

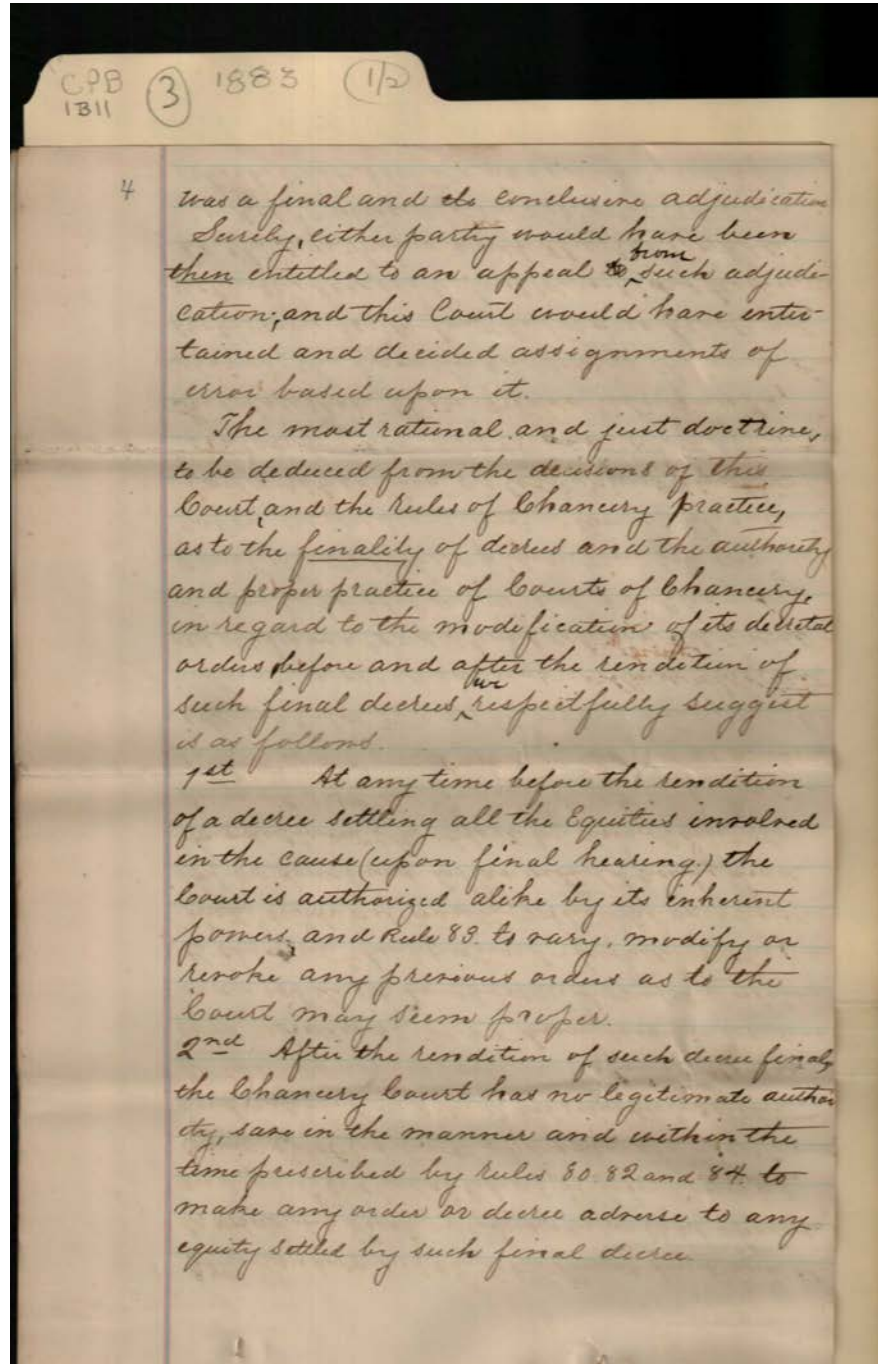

3rd The power of the Court being thus limited to making such orders only as it may deem necessary to the proper enforcement of the Equities settled by the final decree;

It may by orders made subsequent to the term at which such final decree was rendered, correct any errors or omissions in its orders for such enforcement of any of the equities so finally settled; but such authority must be exercised in such manner as not to vary or modify ~~or~~ the effect of any equity or principle settled by the decree final.

The case of Bradford vs. Bradley 37 Ala. is in seeming conflict with the proposition last above stated; but in as much as the appeal was not taken within the time authorized in the statute as construed by the Court in that case, it was not necessary to pass upon the validity of that order of Modification. The latter had been rendered at the Dec^r Term 1856, the account stated and reported with exceptions taken thereto to the Dec^r Term 1857 when the exceptions were heard, order of reference modified. The account stated under the modification was reported to a term held in 1858 and confirmed within two years from date of appeal. The Supreme Court in its opinion sustaining the motion to dismiss the appeal speaks of the equities of the case having been all decided at the Dec^r Terms of 1856 and 1857, and mentions the fact that the last report had been confirmed without exception taken thereto by either party. It did not say however, and we presume did not intend to be understood as holding, that the finality of the decree of 1856 as modified at Dec^r Term 1857 could have been affected by any act of the Court, or of either of the parties done after the adjournment of the term, when rendered, unless by Bill of Review, or original Bill under Rule 84.

In the case at bar the decree on final hearing was rendered in vacation August 1880. It reported with exceptions thereto by Dept Nichols to October Term/80. Decree then modified & it ordered to be retained, in conformity with such modification.

It was so taken, and without any objections taken before the Register to the account - The Register's report of it was filed Jan'y 11, 1881. There were no exceptions to it filed, until sometime subsequent to Jan'y 1882. But at the July Term 1881. I have been thinking of you of late & it is to write on which you desire, I understand, to be. I have not seen any of your correspondence with Mr. Russell, but I believe he has been placed in a bad position of debt, or I suppose suits to be made against him, & that I have not expressed more strongly that in some of the letters I speak of the property in litigation or mine (it has since been sold to him, I say) and ask you to write to Mr. Russell & insist that he should not let the property fall under the law, or under the law of the country.

You will please explain to me how you got the information that when a regular correspondence was established with my brother some years after he came to this country, either on account of his eye & had money or from being accustomed to consider the property mine, he always spoke of the ^{property} as mine in his letters to me, & I was mentioned in my letters to him, especially in replying to him I usually adopted the same style. 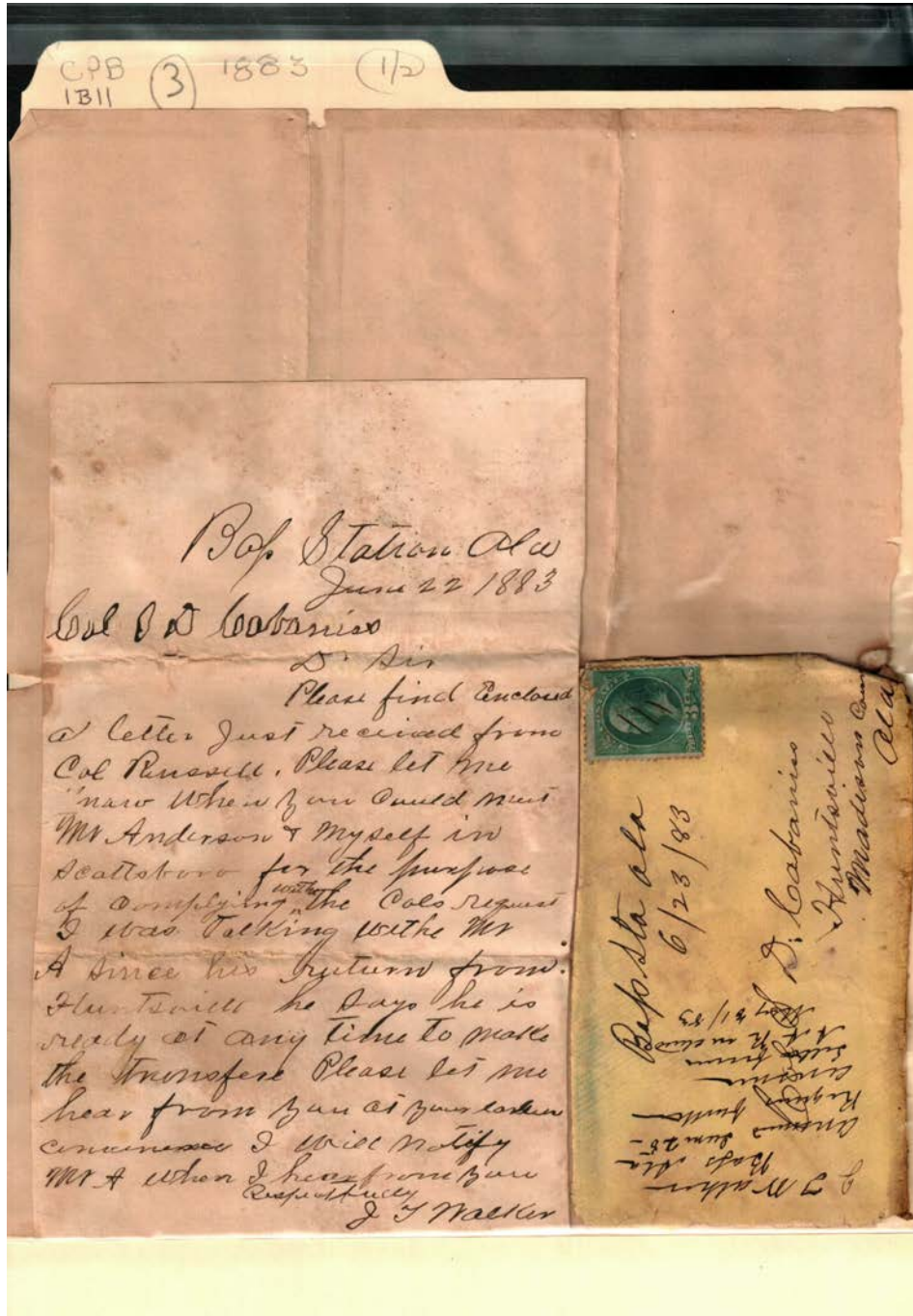

Cabaniss is correct as you put the
question. You ask him "if the suits pending
would be affected by purchase of suit by a
third party; But as I understand, that is not
exactly what you wish or propose; you
propose to purchase from Anderson all
the right title & interests he has to property
in litigation, and continue the suits in
his name to your use & benefit, at your
risk & cost. Anderson has the
right to sell & give the right in pur-
