 for the consideration herein of ten Dollars
 per acre, all the enclosed land on that said
 tract or parcel situate in said County known
 as the North half of the South East quarter
 of Section Thirty Six of Township Four
 & Range one East in said County, for
 & during the years 1889, 1890, 1891, 1892 and
 1893, and covenants and agrees to pay all

 to relieve us, & that I need not urge you to stop.

I should have sent the money for the 400 \$
 note, had opportunity offered & will do so by or be-
 fore Court. Excuse me to Mrs. R. for not an-
 swering by letter, but this you, on the ground that I
 look to you to have the promised indulgence.

Of course I cannot complain of you if
 you fail to get it, but let her think otherwise.
