Since the bill was filed I find that the land belonging to her which was conveyed to my friend in exchange for the land which had conveyed to Geo Garth, was given to her under the provisions of her father's will and her estate therein is limited to her for life with remainder to her children at her death. This makes the case as far as the land is concerned in great difficulty & I don't see how the complication is to be relieved except by the possession of the estate with the power - which is a matter upon which I don't think they would see both the land conveyed to him to other parties - I think her demand to the bill for Mulhann's wife - I do not think that Mulhann's case Rundy vs Rundy 2<sup>d</sup> Ala 573.
