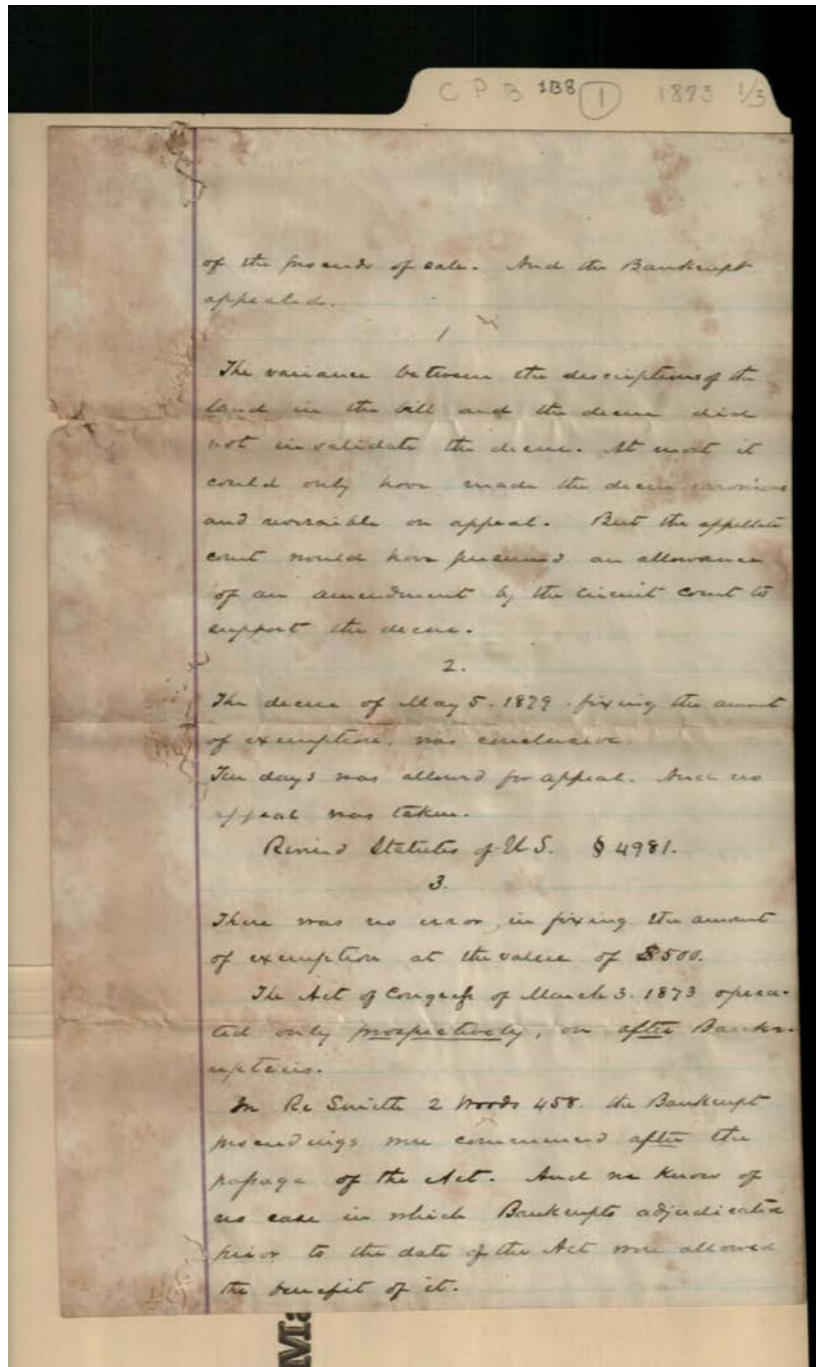
\$500 out of the proceeds of sale, on the ground that an exemption of that value could not be allotted to include the Bankrupt's homestead. (The law of Alabama in 1864 allowing an exemption of land not exceeding \$500 in value to be selected by the debtor and to include the homestead.) On Oct 27, 1879 the Bankrupt filed his answer insisting that of the Spiguer's decree was void as to the 160 acres claimed, because although embraced in the decree it was not in the Spiguer's bill, and that the decree of May 5, 1879 fixing the amount of his exemption at \$500 was in error and not executed, and that he had the right to have it reconsidered by the court and to be allowed an exemption of \$2000.

The district court considered the decree of May 5, 1879 as res adjudica, which was omitted to be recited in the order of appeal was to ascertain whether the exemption could be allotted to include the homestead.

From this order the Bankrupt prepared an appeal. And on April 30, 1880 the District court affirmed the report that the exemption could not be allotted to include the homestead, and ordered the Spiguer to sell the land free from claim of exemption and pay the Bankrupt \$500 out

The terms of the Act of March 3, 1873 had shown a legislative intent to give it retrospective effect. it would have been unconstitutional.

The constitutional provision against impairing the obligation of contracts is not binding on Congress. In Re Smith 2 Woods 458.

But the provision of the 5th Amendment that no person shall be deprived of life liberty or property without due process of law is binding on Congress. Cooley 355. 1 Kent 455. 12 N. Y. 209. 4 Wheat. 235.

In 1800 all the Bankrupts lands except B570's worth vested in the Affigees. And Congress could not take from him, in 1873, B570's worth of it, any more than by changing the statute of descent it could take from the heir of a land man land he had inherited years before the change.
