Memorandum of an agreement entered into this 2nd January, 1845 between the said Thomas Fearn, Wm. J. Mastin & Robert Fearn of the first part & Alexander M. Smith of the second part, Witnesses; that the said Smith undertakes and hereby agrees to repair thoroughly the recent accident of the Presbyterian Church, with the exception of plastering and brick work, that may be necessary, in manner and form following:— to extend the columns in the gallery above the whole circuit of the same, cornice, and all in the Ionic order, columns to be fluted, repair all injury to the house, viz— the pews, fasten the feet of the principal rafters by iron bands, and in like manner the string posts to the girders, in manner & form as we verbally agreed, or as may be directed by said Fearn & Mastin, the ceiling to be prepared for lathing and plastering, — examine, and if necessary, give permanent and ample support to the columns under the lower gallery, — in short, to repair in all additional, the injury done by the late accident to the Presbyterian Church. It is understood that the said Smith furnish all materials necessary to complete the same, with exceptions following:— Timber for the columns and base, and two lengths of timber 8 in. by 8, running around the whole gallery above, — also, with the exception of the Stone necessary to fasten the feet of the rafters & the string posts to the girders, it is also understood, that the finish of the gallery cornice next to the wall above, to be finished plain, the cornice inside the gallery to be finished in the order specified above, (in Complete Ionic order) — all of which the said Smith agrees to complete, without delay, and to the satisfaction of the said parties of the first part.

Dear Sir

I this morning rec^d yours of the 17th inst which is now before me in relation to Mr. Mullally's case I was perhaps mistaken about your fees having been paid. I sent a man to him to know if he had forwarded the fees that were due and in answer he informed me that he had, but I suppose never that at that time Mr. Mullally did not understand the matter. I have not seen him since Mr. Cloy wrote to me but I wrote to him giving him a statement of the case and he has forwarded me \$5.00 etc. without saying in his letter whether he had paid your fees or not I regret having been mistaken about your fees (I suppose I was) You say in your letter that you felt piqued in no small degree at my having written to Cloy &c. and did not write to you. I am sure permit me to say that I had no intention of casting any reflection on you whatever. I thought it possible that any man doing a great deal of business might make some mistakes but I had not the most distant idea that you would do such a thing intentionally and if I have in any way wounded your feelings in the matter I am ready and willing to make any reparation in my power.

I will get you to send me the amount of fees due from J. Holloway of this County and have lost the statement please send it to me again as I now have Mr. Holloways fees in my hands & I will forward it immediately respectfully your friend and Obedt Servt

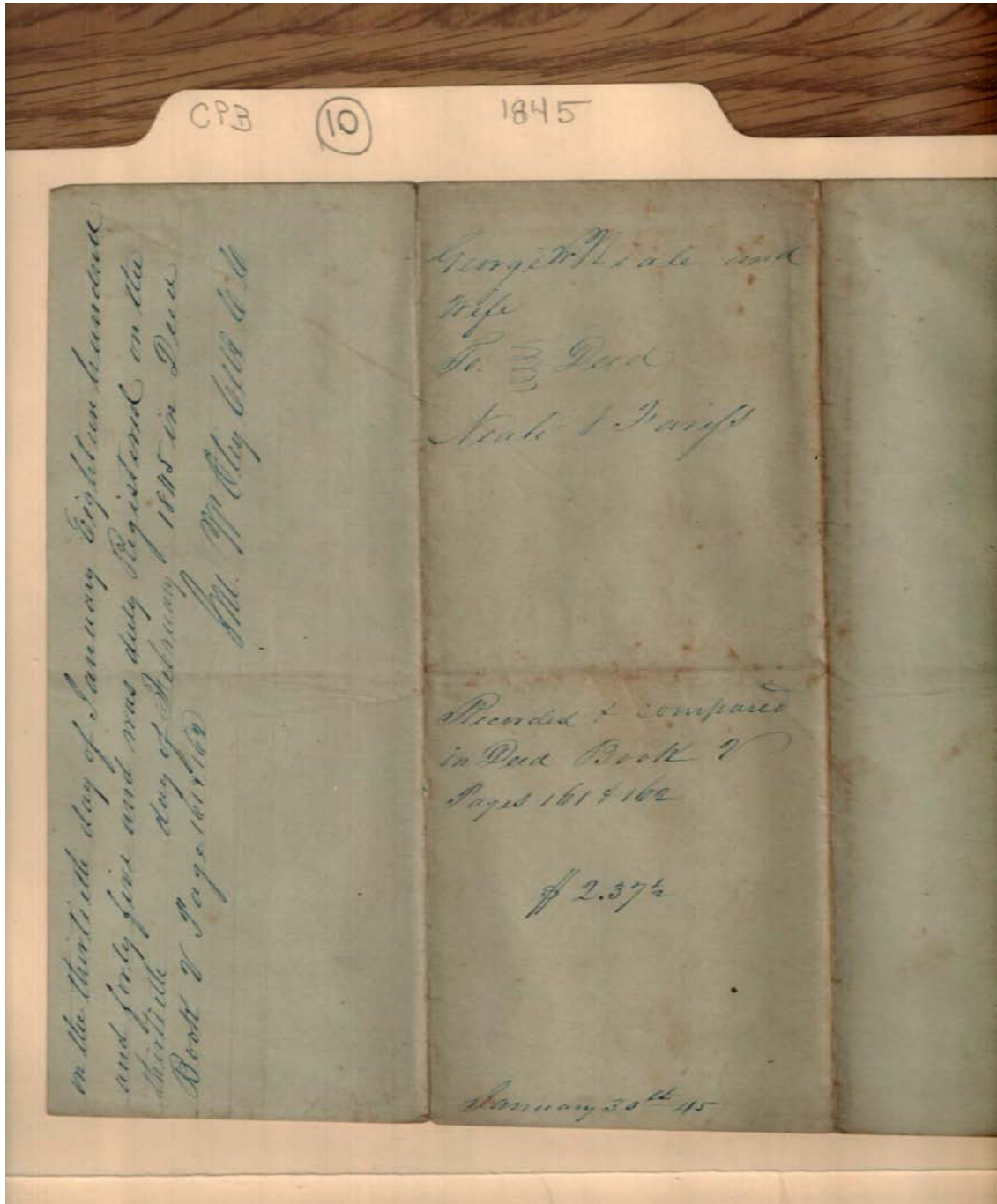

Neal and John S. Fariss, of the other part, all of the Town of Huntsville in the County of Madison and State of Alabama - Witnesseth, that the said George W. Neal and Wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars, to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have this day given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, conveyed, and confirmed, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release, convey, and confirm unto the said Neal & Fariss, all that certain lot, parcel a piece of ground, conveyed on the thirtieth day of December eighteen hundred and forty-one to the said George W. Neal by Henry Stokes and Benjamin D. & Lysanias A. Cabaniss, his wife, by attorney con-
plain of Stephen Ewing, in custody of a plea
that he answers unto them the following negro slaves
the property of plaintiffs to-wit, Sarah aged about
thirty years of the value of five hundred dollars,
from a boy aged about fifteen years of the value
of ~~thirteen~~ ^{four} hundred dollars, John a boy
aged about twelve years of the value of five hun-
dred dollars, Hannah a girl aged about ten years
of the value of five hundred dollars, & Willis a
boy aged about nine years of the value of four
hundred dollars, which he obtained from them
for that whereas heretofore to-wit on the 13th
of January 1841 at said County plaintiffs were
lawfully possessed of said Sarah, James, John
& Hannah & Willis above particularly ascribed as
of their own property, & being so possessed thereof
said plaintiffs afterwards to-wit on the 1st day of
March aforesaid at said County, lost said negro
slaves out of their possession, & afterwards to-wit
on the 1st day of March aforesaid at said County
said negro slaves came to the possession of
the defendant by finding; that said defendant
with knowing said negro slaves to be the property
of plaintiffs & of right to belong to them, hath such as
yet returned said slaves or either of them to the plain-
tiffs although he was afterwards to-wit on the
day of July 1845 so requested to, & he hath
voluntarily paid money to plaintiffs amounting
five thousand dollars Robinson P.D.

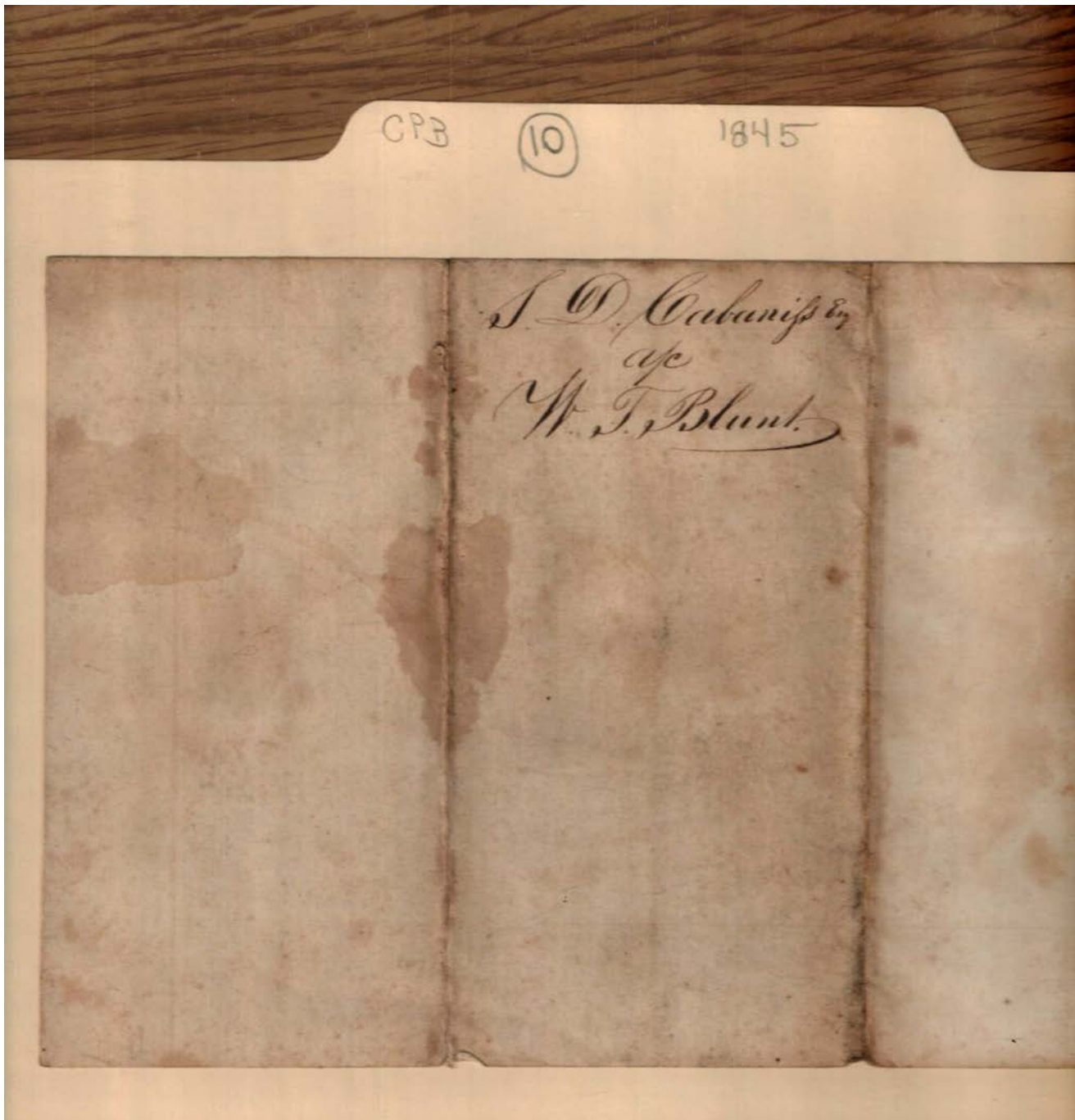

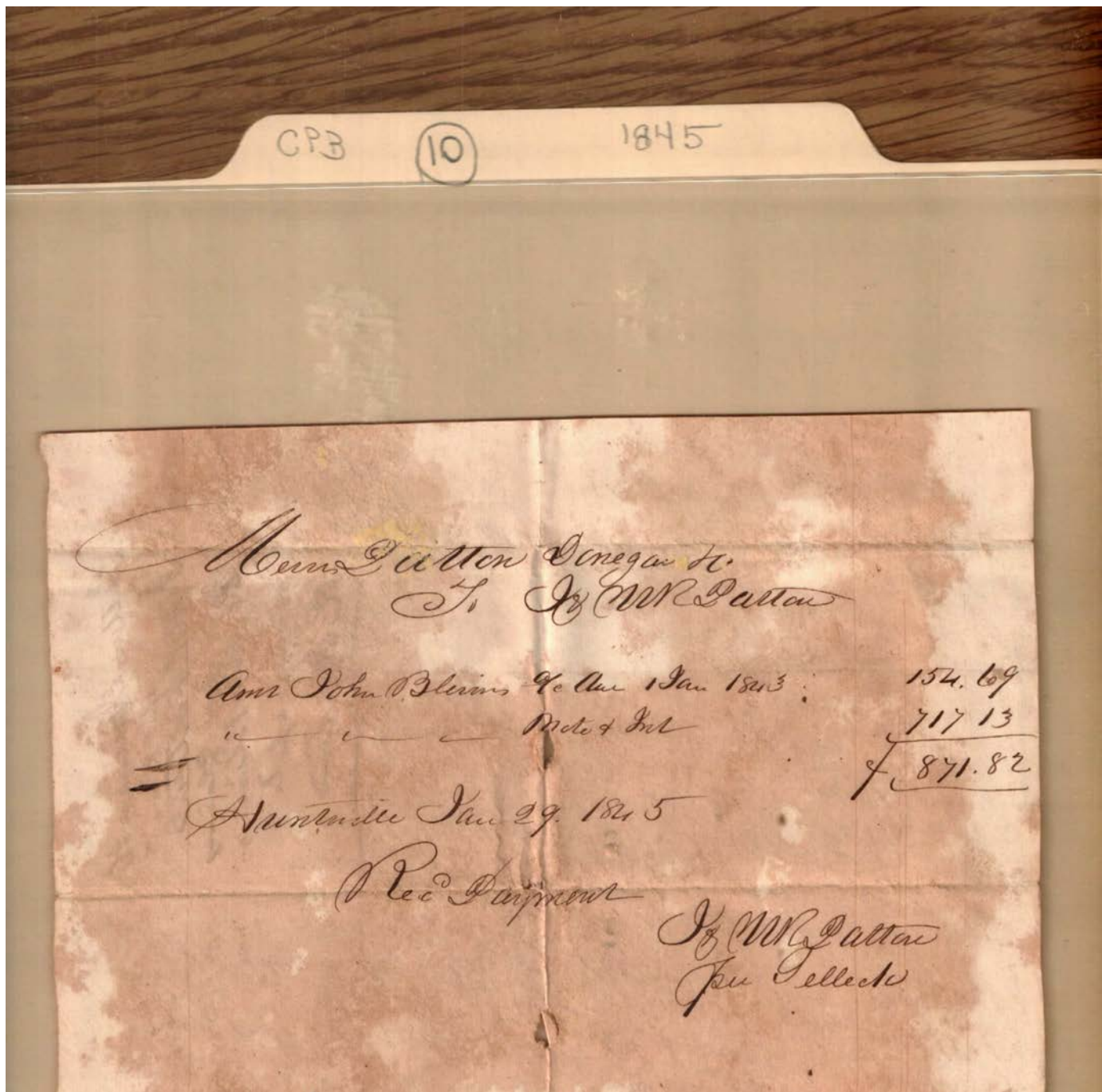

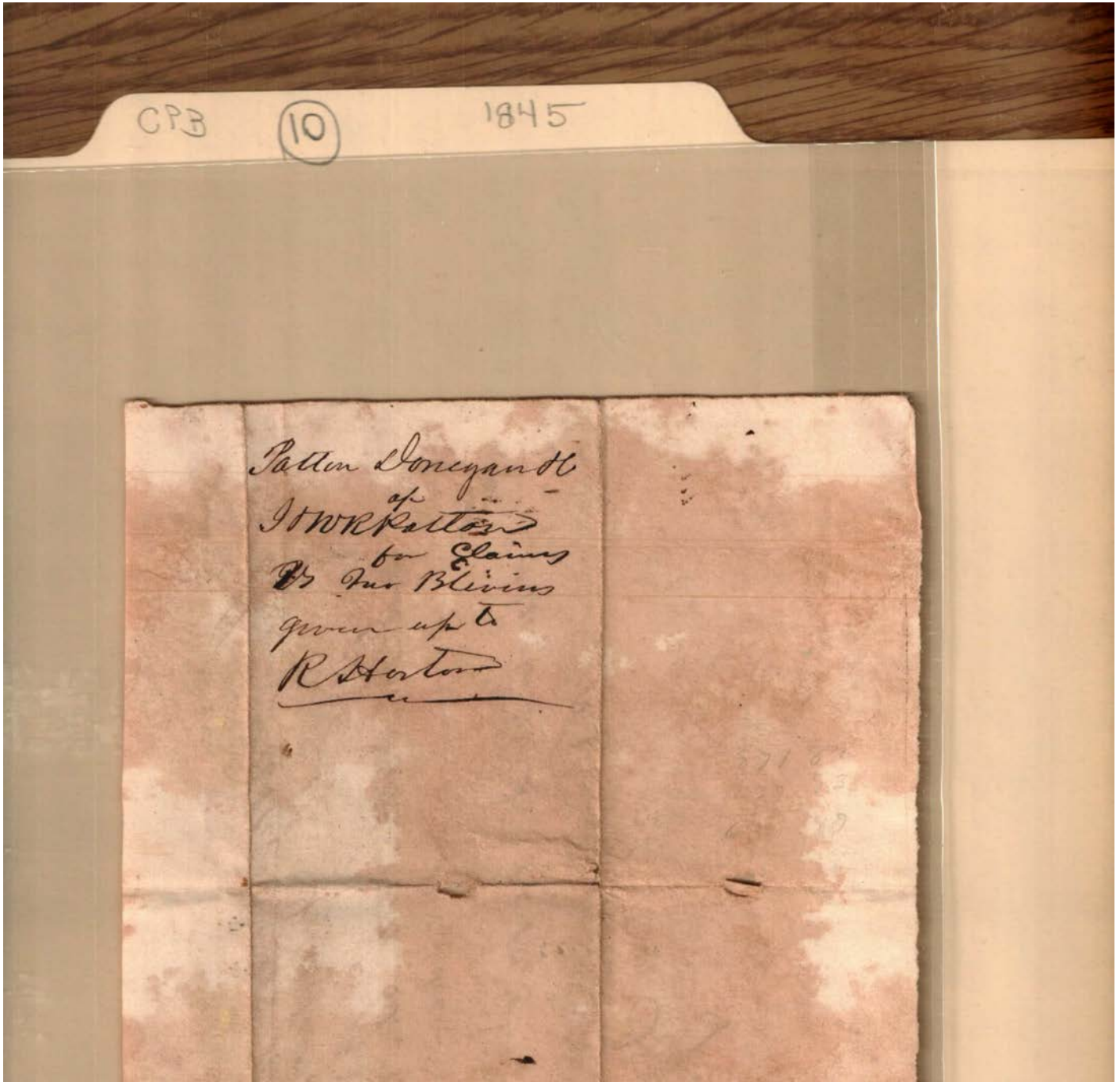
