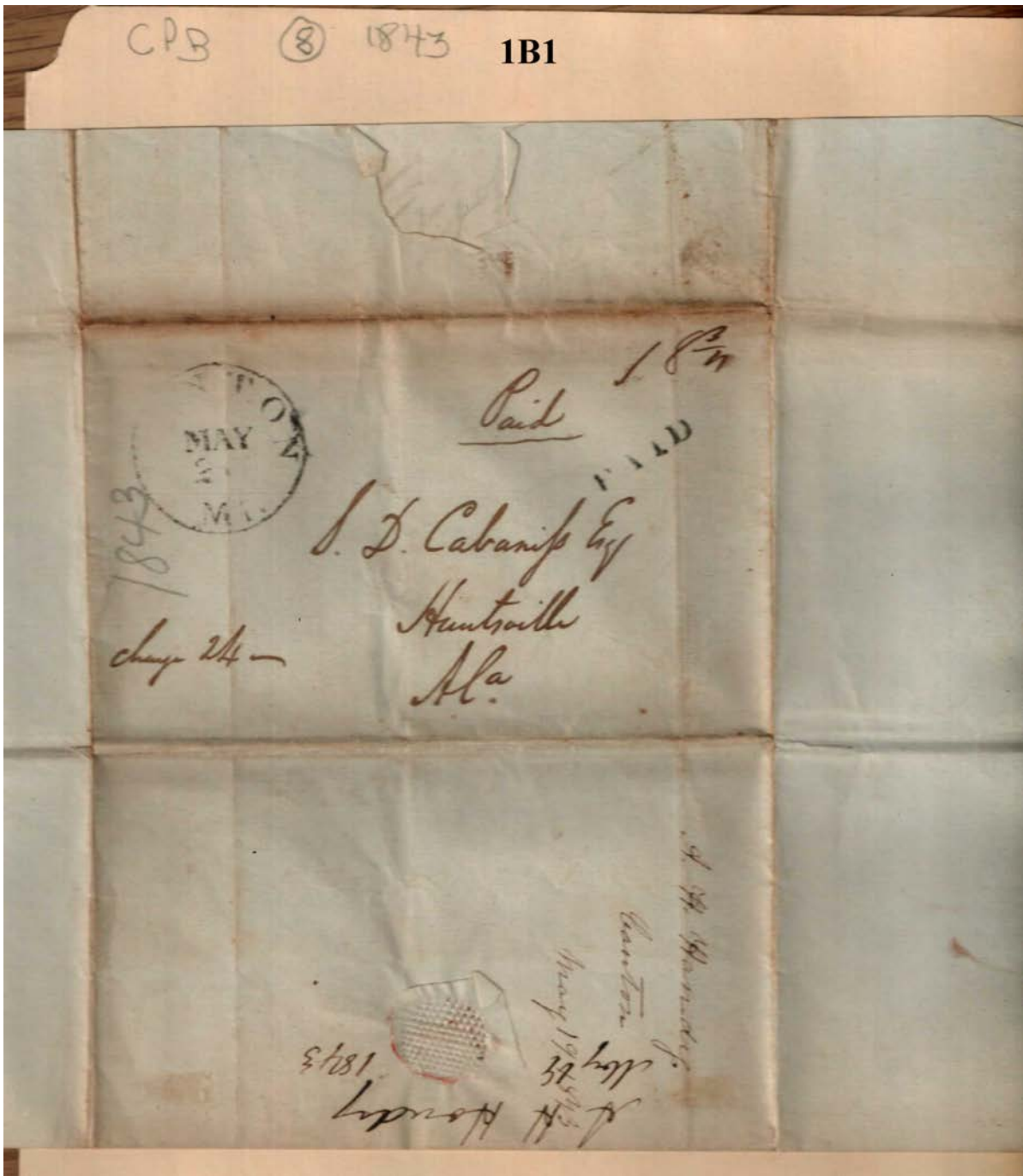

Dear Sir,

I have received your favor of the 5. inst. and accordingly to your instructions I have given you the sum of one hundred and eight dollars, the amt. due you on the note of James Brown as per my letter of the 24. ult.

You are mistaken in thinking that I had received the whole debt of \$118.90 in addition to my fee - but the fee was deducted from the principal and int. of the note, leaving due \$108.90 - It was now supposed by Mr. Brown or myself, from your letter, that you expected him to pay my fee in addition to the full amount due on the note; and had this been insisted on, he would not have made the settlement except by legal coercion. Indeed, he was averse to settling the note, on account of the greatly damaged condition of the article, for which it was given, as he stated, and in the way in which it was gotten, and was the evidence of a hardship upon him, which he former proposed submitting to soon than to be put to the trouble of a law suit.

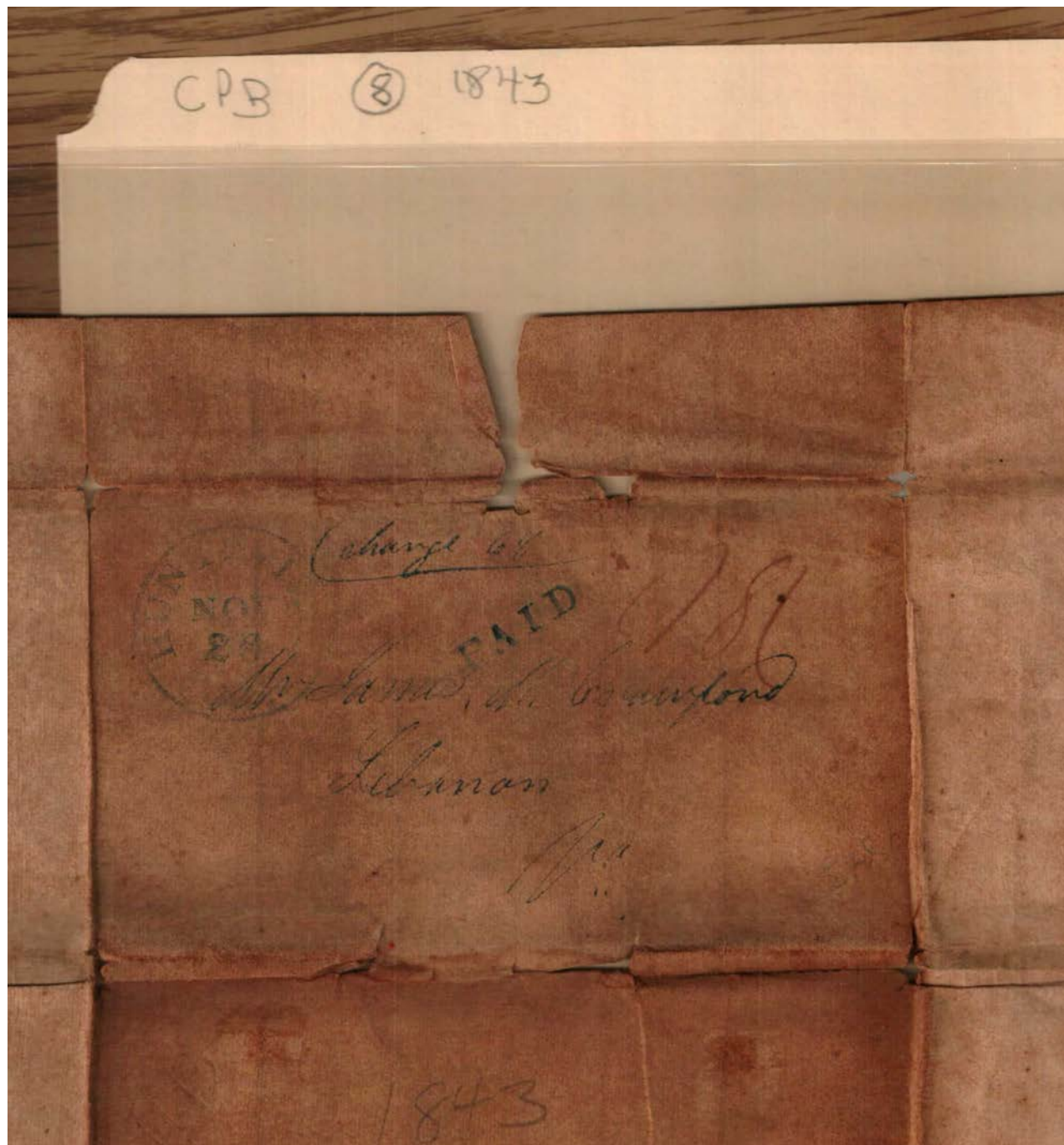

Both of both your depositions can not be had at the time designated in the commission, you need not have either taken as it will be of no use for nothing, if they are taken I wish you to be sure to attend to the directions of the letter; and in the event that both are taken the letter must be enclosed with them, that is the double letter that is in the commission. 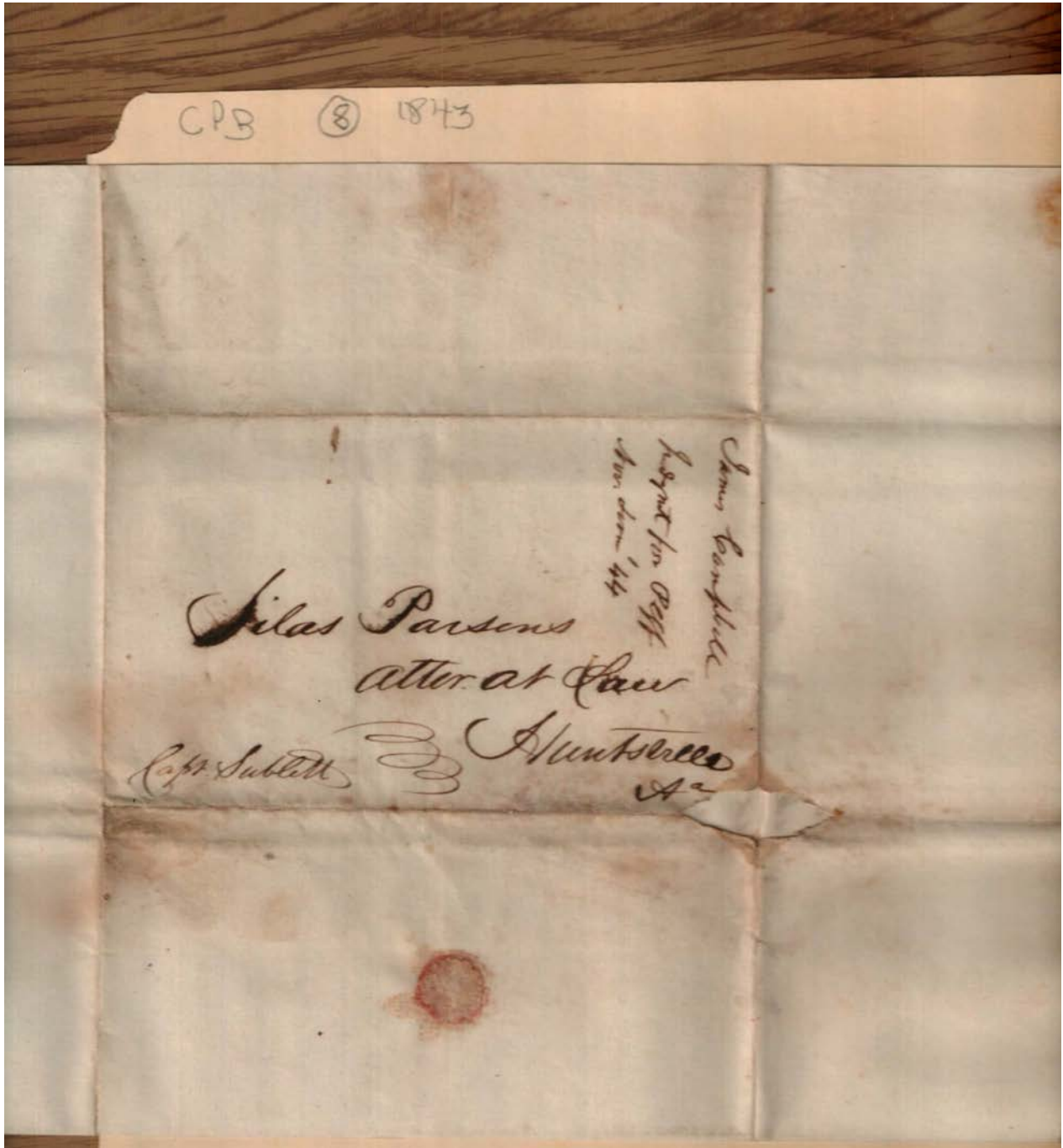

The negroes Jerry, Amy, & Isabella are now in Huntsville in the possession of your former Sheriff Robertson or the Cosener of Madison County. It was a case of involuntary bankruptcy & the deed for the negroes had been declared void & the title is vested in Hardin P. Bostick & Co in bankruptcy as you will see from the decree declaring him ^{them} a bankrupt. Mr Bostick wishes you to commence suit immediately for the negroes against the person who has them in possession, unless they are delivered up to you or him.

Gentlemen:

I am in receipt of your favor of 2^d inst. enclosing a statement of your account, showing a Balance due me of \$47.⁰⁰ which you claim to pay with you when the returns are made by the Sheriff -

You also advise me that the Sheriff had bid in / under execution, the lands of Thompson & Connally on my account & you learn from various sources that both tracts of land are worth much more than our Judgments - Of course not only sanction the purchase, but also feel thankful that the Sheriff took them steps to protect my interest -

If however the Sheriff could have been told for the amount of the Judgments, or even for something less, I would have greatly preferred it. We own a great deal of Real Estate scattered through the Southern Country - The attention requisite to look after it, the payment of taxes &c. require the constant vigilance of an Agent & involves much trouble & expense - It would be better to avoid it, I should have preferred not adding to it -

Under these circumstances I will feel greatly obliged if you will undertake the collection of the arrear rents of land (albeit this the Sheriff will do) - I am this piece of money of \$47.00 interest & commission - I will be satisfied if you will pay for me the balance of \$47.00 in the purchase of land, that I would be willing to accept of for Cash, in which case I would be willing to accept of the dollar on account of the Judgments, if a note is made to a Credit, it will be desirable to obtain a Cash payment sufficient to insure the punctual payment of the other Installments & the Credit note should be made negotiable & payable at some Bank & if possible with personal security -
