 I in position to sacrifice all I have for

"The less that is said about the 'Lost Cause' in speeches, the better. There is no use in glorying over our valor &c. [in exhortations which reach the Northern ear. Among ourselves that would be all right and appropriate but I cannot be too emphatic when I say that] all such talk is exceedingly damaging to the cause of Seward & Democracy. If no allusion whatever was made to the war itself, but your speakers would confine themselves to the living issues, it would be much better. If those speakers would remember, when they address their audiences, that they are really talking to Northern people, to the people in the doubtful states of Ohio, Indiana, Penn: and Connecticut they would, perhaps, be more guarded in their declamation. We ought to be permitted, certainly, to talk of what we did, and it is, undoubtedly, ungenerous that a victorious foe should object to it, but we must recognize facts, and reflect that a few months of restrained silence may give us long years of liberty."
