Sister

Dear Brother and Sister in Christ
I write you a few lines to let
you know that I am still in the land
of the living and my self and family are
well and I hope these few lines will find
you all in the same. Hoping I have
wrote to you all until I have got out
of heart's anxiety and soon getting no answer
I want some of you to try an answer this
letter and let me know whether you have
or have not heard any thing of Bill or not
since this was begun and let me know
whether you have seen heard any thing from
John or not and also if you know what
has become of the rest of the connection
this letter is for you all I would not
to you all but I don't know what part
office to direct letters I am living in
Illusion in McLane Co, 8 miles west
of Abbeville Tenn but I don't know whether
I will remain here another year or not but
in living here to him and my self has
made a tolerable fair crop this year it is
not impossible to see a place here can be sold
from 40 to 50 cents a bushel wheat is worth
