Charles said that he wished me particularly to tell him
whether I ever answered Mr. Calhoun's first letter to me. I did
not say so in my last letter I say so now. I did answer
it. The day after I received it. So I do not deserve his censure
for not having written to Mr. Calhoun or you, for the long time
that he intended to keep about yet. I think that we can con-
form notes; and that being all that we had of disappointed
foreign with each other at last. If you can only have patience
for two short months (I am afraid they will run rather long
than that.)

Since I last wrote home I have been rather anxious
and really thought at one time, that I was going to be
sick. but I have not yet recovered now. I have been
half so sick as you and think that you are sick. I tell
you I am perfectly well, and just as well off as I ever
was. with the exception of some half dozen absences
from college exercises. Charles says that the sickness
in Monticello was caused by the abundance of fruit.
As far as that cause is concerned, New Haven ought
to be the healthiest place in the United States, for I never
saw such an abundance of fruit of all kinds as there has
been here this season. For my own part I have not tasted
anything in the shape of fruit the whole year
with the exception of a few sputs of currants yesterday.
The last time that I can devote to writing this morning
has nearly elapsed, and I must again go into examination.
I hope you will not follow my example in not writing.
If you can I would write as often as you can, and tell
Charles to do so likewise. Give my love to Mr. Calhoun.

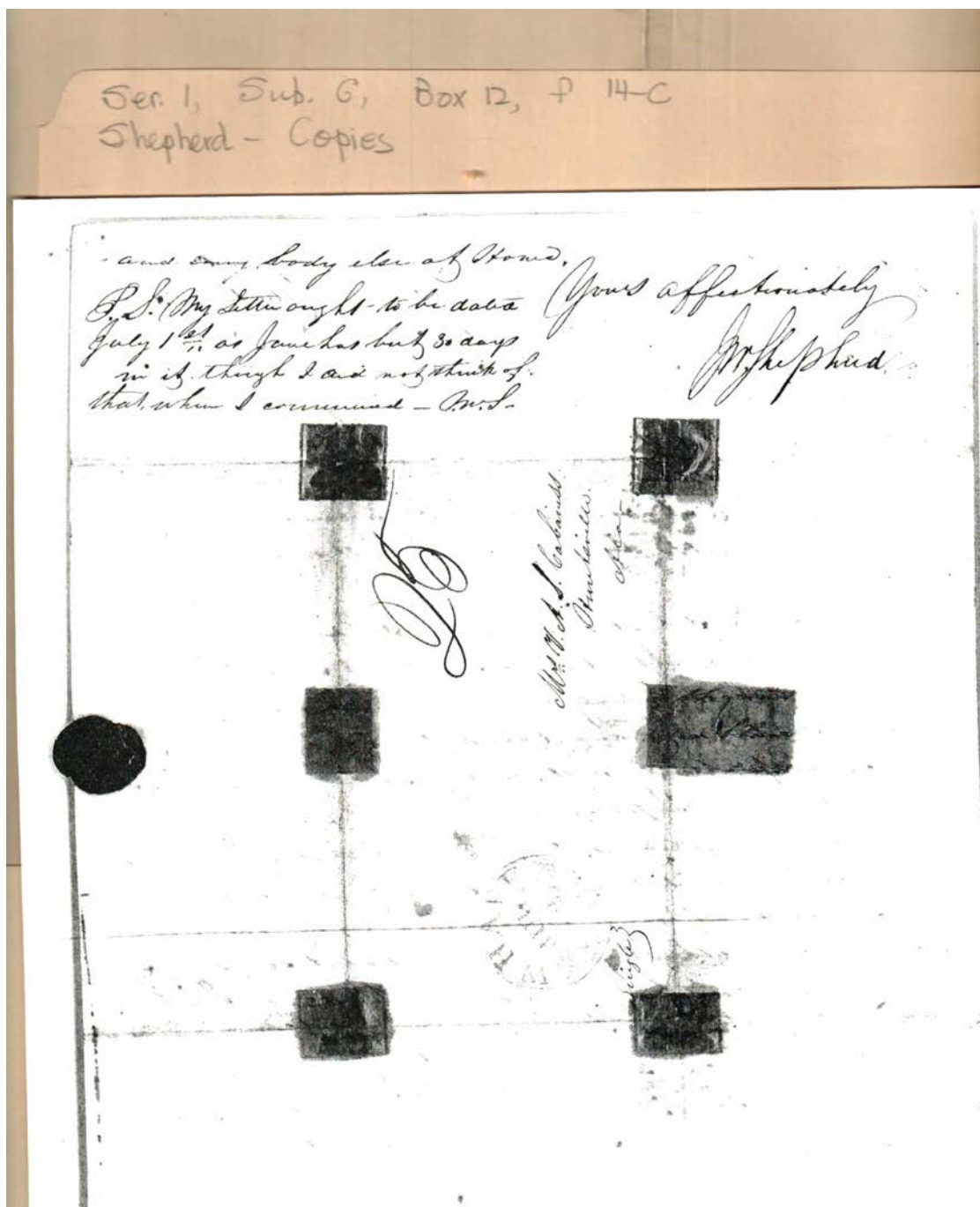

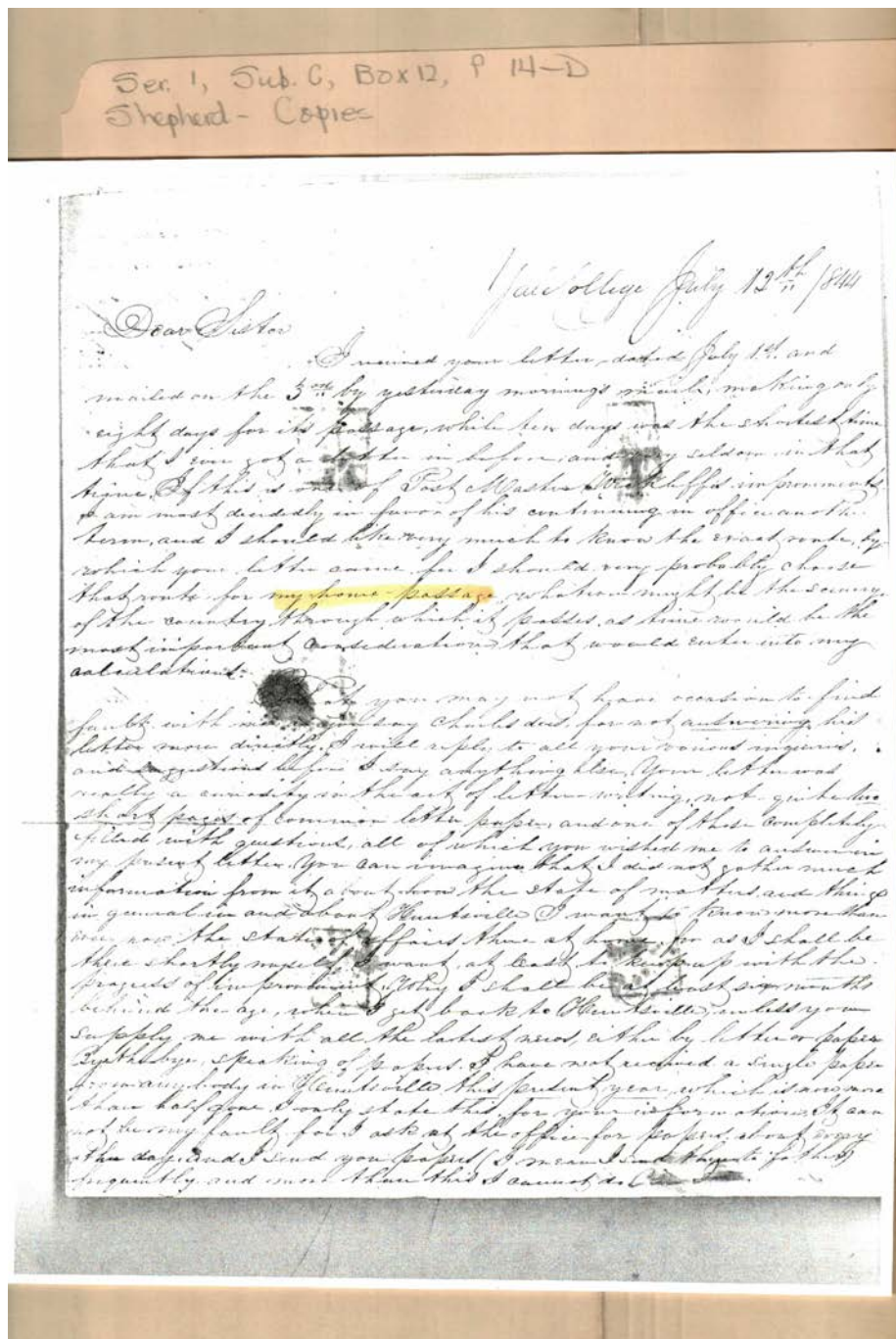

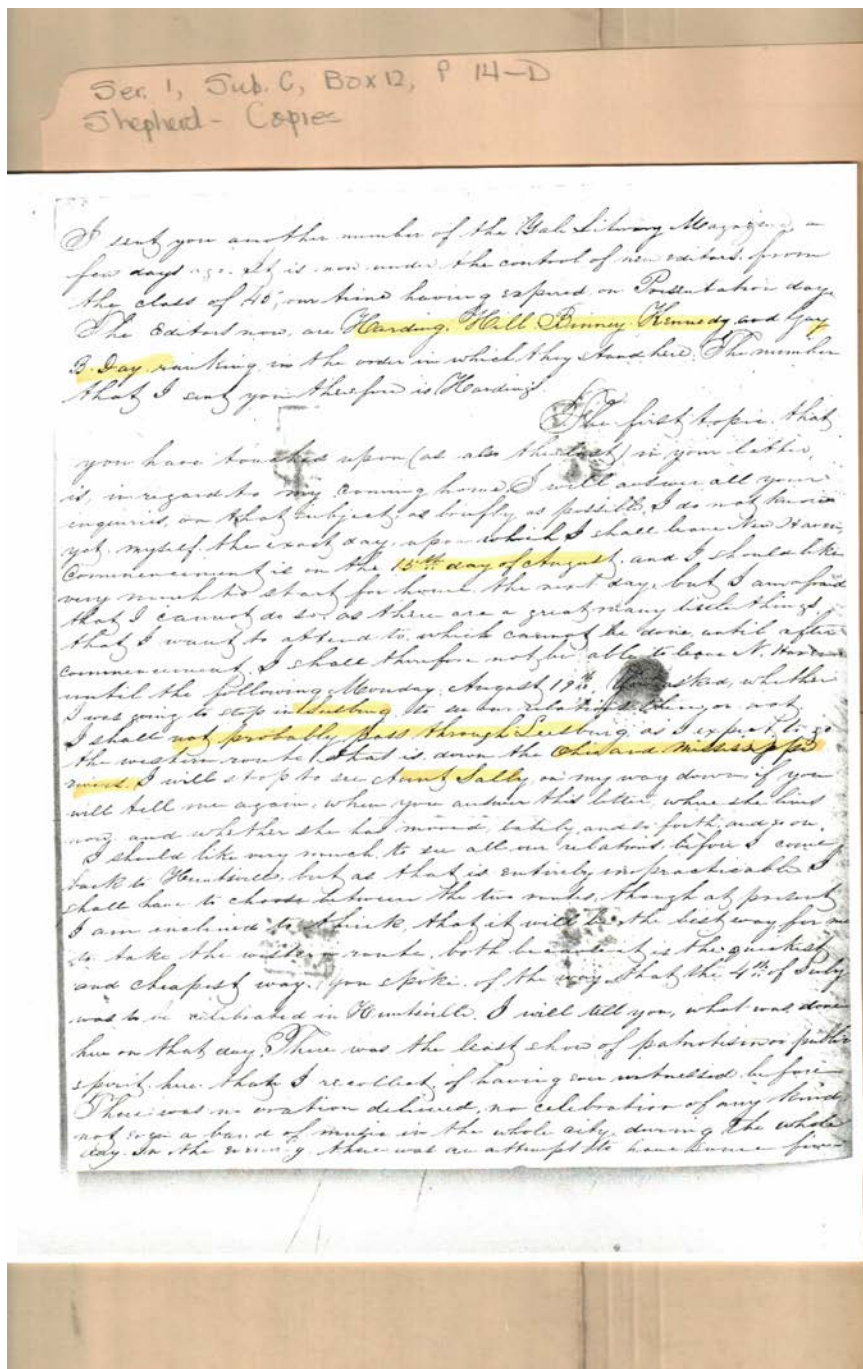

...the attempt failed, I attended however at the
celebration of the Law School, the evening before the meeting
of the Law School, when they understood that there was to be

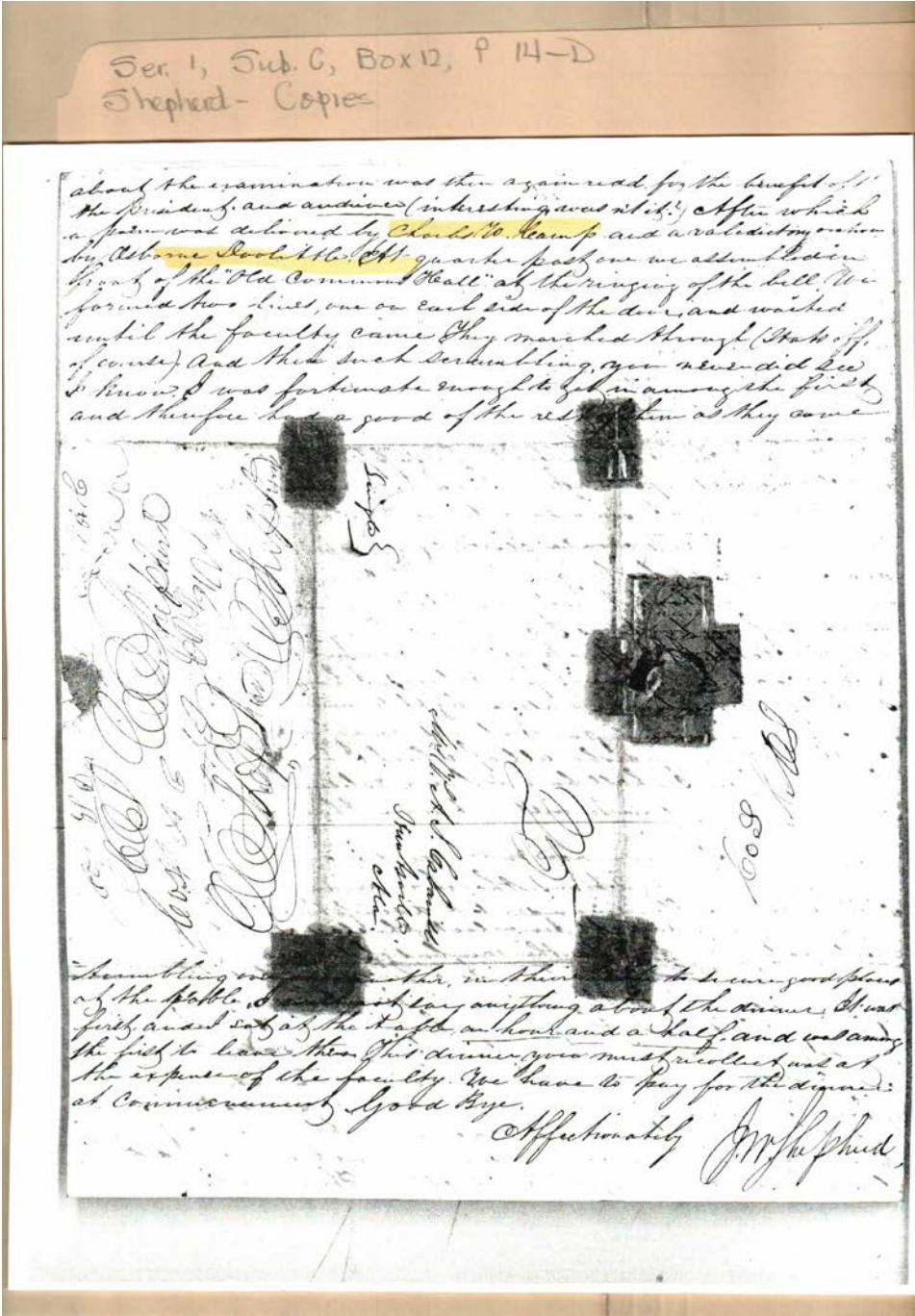

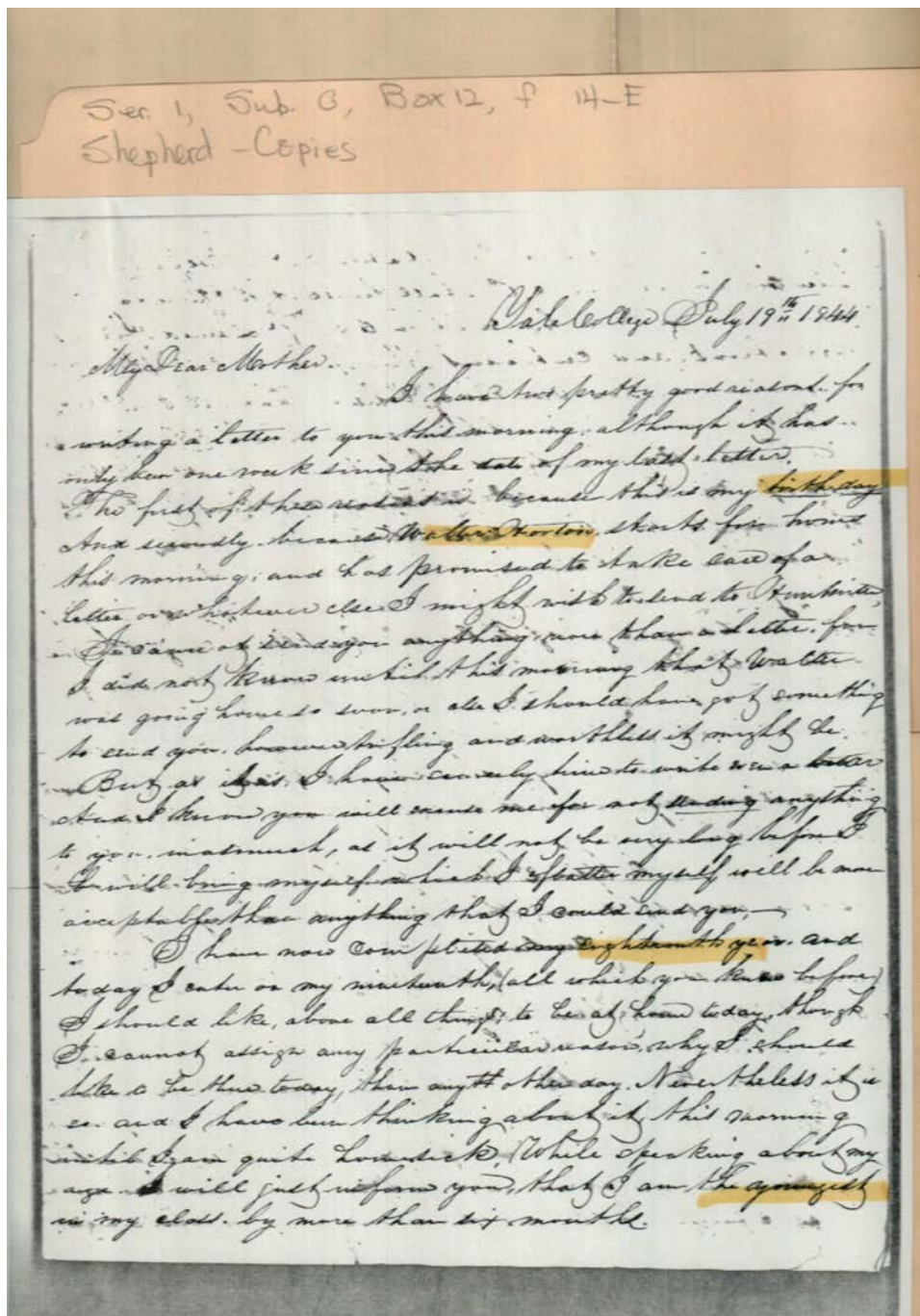

I have been engaged since Presentation Day in preparing my
piece for Commencement. I shall finish it either to-day or
tomorrow, and then hand it in to Prof. Larned, for his
corrections, and criticism. My subject is rather a
singular one. You can easily believe, that all common
subjects have been written on so often at Commencements
and Junior Exhibitions that they are pretty much
worn up. By this time, Prof. Larned's principal piece
of advice to us, always is to select some subject, that
has never been written on, and in this respect, if we re-
sist, I think I have followed his advice. My subject
is "The Language of Silence." Rather a singular one
is it not? We are not allowed to write very long
pieces. Ten minutes being the average time, allowed
for each one. This is owing to two or three firstlings
because there are a good many who are going to speak
and secondly, because longer pieces would tire out
the audience.

After I have finished my piece I shall
devote myself, during the remainder of my stay in
New Haven, more attentively to the business of reviewing
my studies, particularly to mathematics, than I have
as yet had an opportunity of doing. I shall not
therefore leave New Haven at all, until after Commence-
ment, nor then, until I start for Huntsville, Alabama.
I really cannot write any more at present
as there is a great dearth of news in the city, as well as
of ideas in my cranium, and besides I must go down
and charge Walter with any number of small jobs.

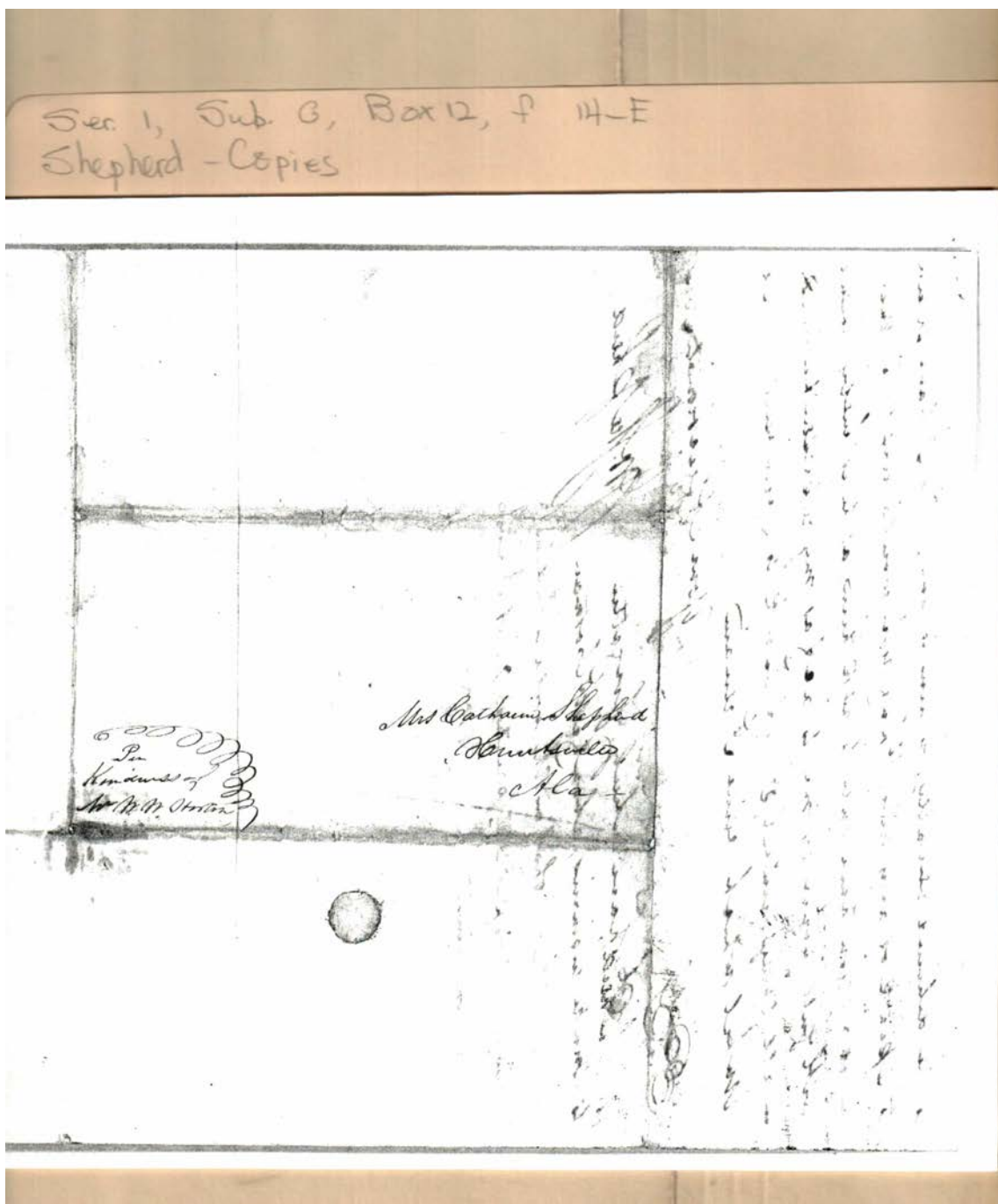

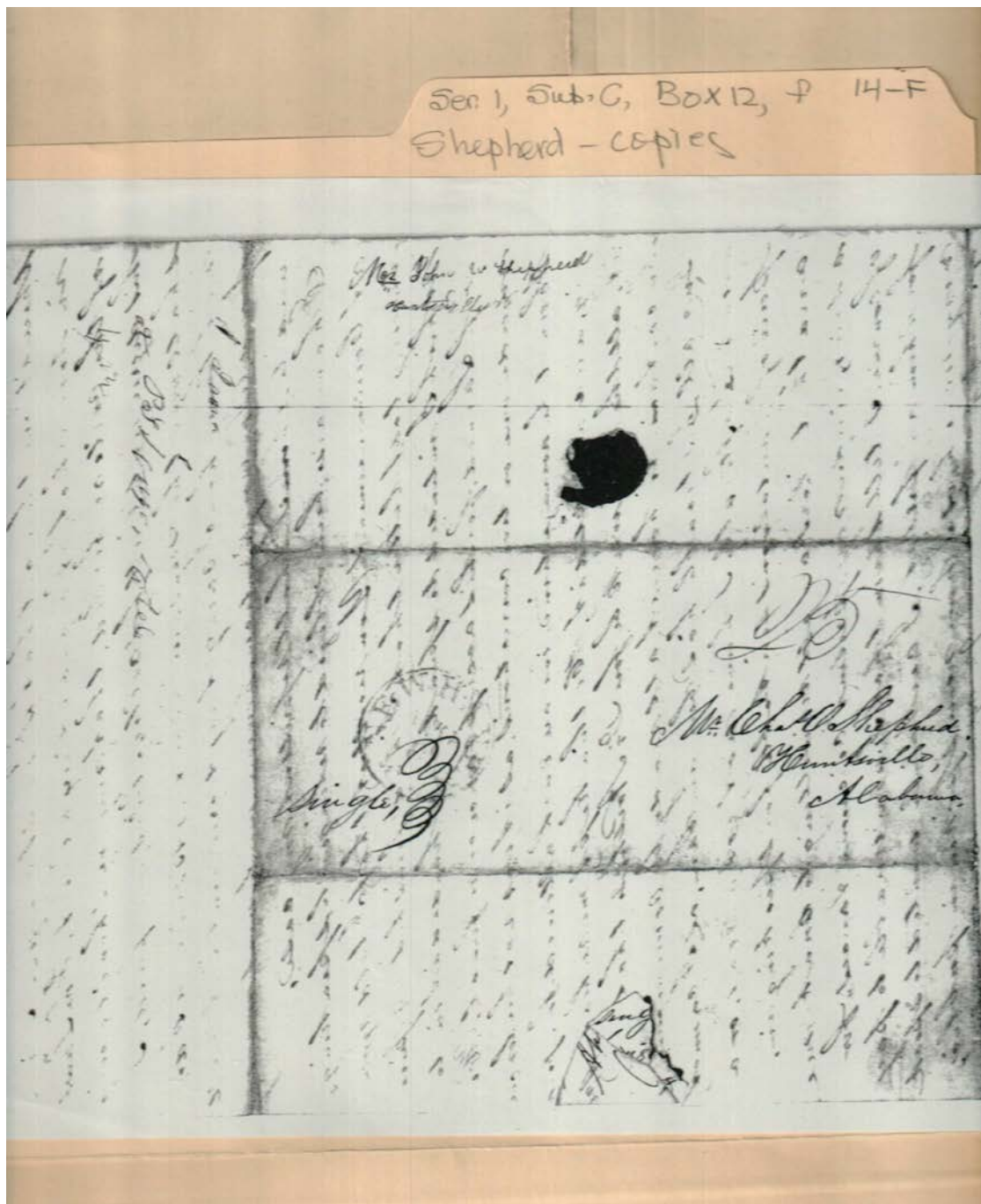

Dear Charles

I received your letter of the 18th ult., nearly a week ago. You need not think that I am going to bother you with a whole page full of excuses for not answering it before the present time, for I am going to do a much worse thing. I have written to you all so frequently of late that I think you can afford to wait a short time or a few days, at least, until I can collect the few remaining ideas of my manuscript sufficiently to communicate to people who may be interested to you, so often you will get it, and so it is, that you will regard it, at an early day, as unimportant, and therefore will not append it to my letter. But I am shorting off in a paragraph, from this subject, on the condition, and will therefore back a little and endeavor again.

At the same time, I have noticed two mistakes that I made in the first paragraph of your letter. The first is, you are mistaken that I send my letter you about a dozen times before I send them to the office. This is the last thing I do. I do not know what I should not be accused of, to my regret, but I can assure you, that I have not the least intention of changing. I have written you a great deal for the thousand and one mistakes which I have no doubt you find in my letters. If you think that I send them over so often, you are mistaken. I send them quite different. You say I suppose you don't intend to do it. You have not the least excuse for such a mistake as that, and I have carried it some two or three times before now. After your letter to me about getting to it, I have printed, and so do so very much. (That is, if I can help it.)

I do not wonder at their being distrustful. But
 then it is a thing that I must confess I am
 in somewhat of a quandary about. The Law
 of the college forbid, that any one should receive
 his degree, until all his college bills are paid, I
 shall owe the Treasurer about \$45.00. and I do
 not know how I can get my degree, until it is all
 paid. The Corporation have on Monday
 and to whom I shall represent my case.
 I have also been obliged to relinquish speaking,
 at Commencement. You recollect, that I told you
 in my last letter that I had finished my piece,
 which I intended to speak, and handed it in to
 Prof. Larned, for his acceptance or refusal. He
 made one or two corrections, as it was rather long
 than the average time we are each allowed for speak-
 ing, and accepted it. He then kept me rehearsing
 it, all the week before Dr. North, so that I was
 as certain as home it all ready by Commencement.
 But all this trouble had been vain, as I cannot
 speak at all. I have not got a coat, or a
 pair of pantaloons suitable for speaking in,
 and the tailors are all unwilling to make me
 a suit, under my present circumstances, for
 of course I tell them that I am unable to pay
 for them at present. I certainly wanted to speak
 very much, as I have never spoken in public,
 since I have been in New Haven, but it is of no use,
 to say so now, as it is too late to help it.
 Commencement comes one week from to day.
 I will give you an account of the proceedings
 (orally if not by letter.) For the present Good Bye
 My best love to all.

Dear Mother,

I write you these few lines to say that you need not expect me home before the 5th of Sept. as I left the 1st as I took up in my last letter. I did not leave till Monday night (today is Tuesday) and arrived in Phil^a yesterday evening. I had just written my name on the register of arrivals, at the Hotel where I stop, when some one tapped me, on the shoulder, and when I turned around two gentlemen spoke to me, whom I recollected to have seen before, but when or where I could not recollect. I wish I had their names, had they not given them to me themselves. They were Mr Fackler and Mr Scruggs, from Haverhill, Mass. Very soon Calvin Fackler came up also, and I now find that there is quite a colony here from Haverhill. Besides those then above mentioned I have since been to see Claude Mastin (who is sick here), and Mr Mastin (John's wife) and this morning I met Bill Patton. Besides all this Calvin Fackler told me that Mr McClellan, Mr McCauley, and Ed Rogers, all from Haverhill, were here in Philadelphia.

I now came to tell you, the reason why you
may not expect me home before the 5th or 6th.
Mr. Fackler & Mr. Scruggs. have not held of the
last night, and by their persuasion to him,
finally, to remain persuaded me, to stay here
until tomorrow morning, and then go
on the western route with Mr. Scruggs, who
leaves at that time. They informed me
that the route by Charleston, was now almost
impassable, being entirely out of repair, that
it would cost me at least \$15. more than
the western route, and that I should have
the pleasure of Mr. Scruggs' company all the
way home. if I would only wait until tomorrow
morning. In view of all these advantages,
though I had only as long as possible, I
at last let them persuade me, to stay &
go the western route. I shall not therefore
get to Haverhill until the 5th or 6th of next
month. I hope you will not quarrel
with me for so doing, for how could I
have only succeeded fully against them both?

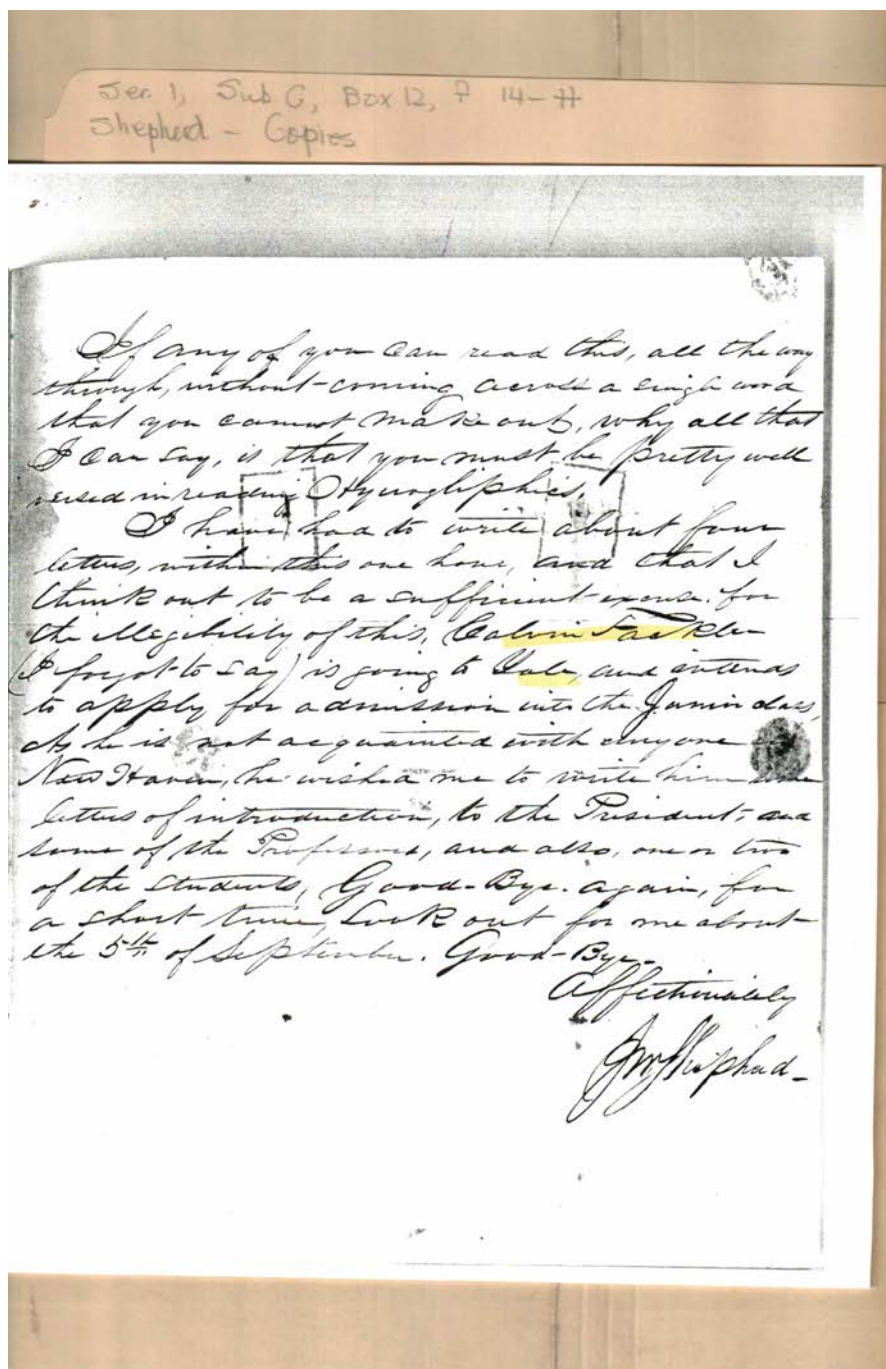
