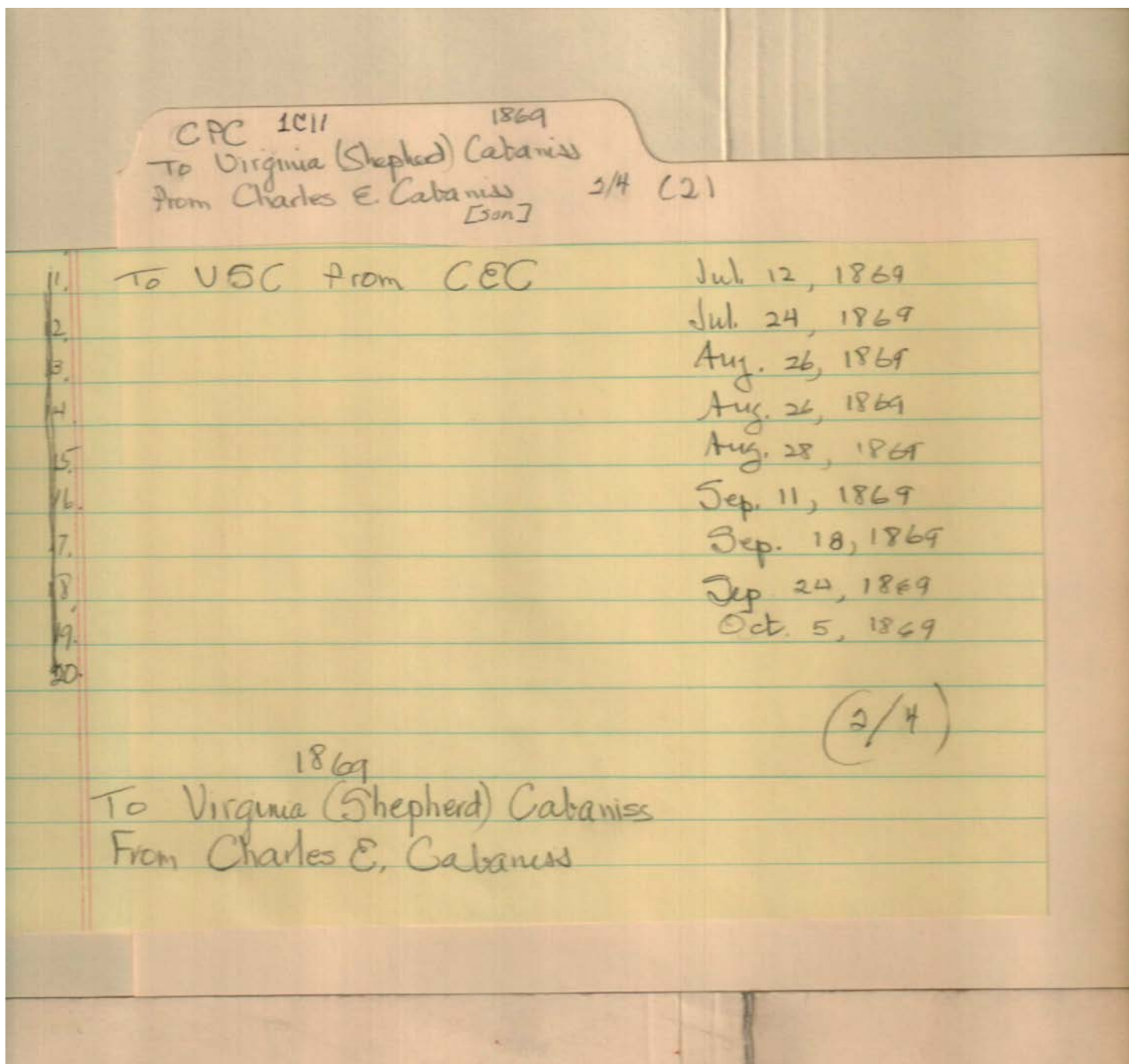

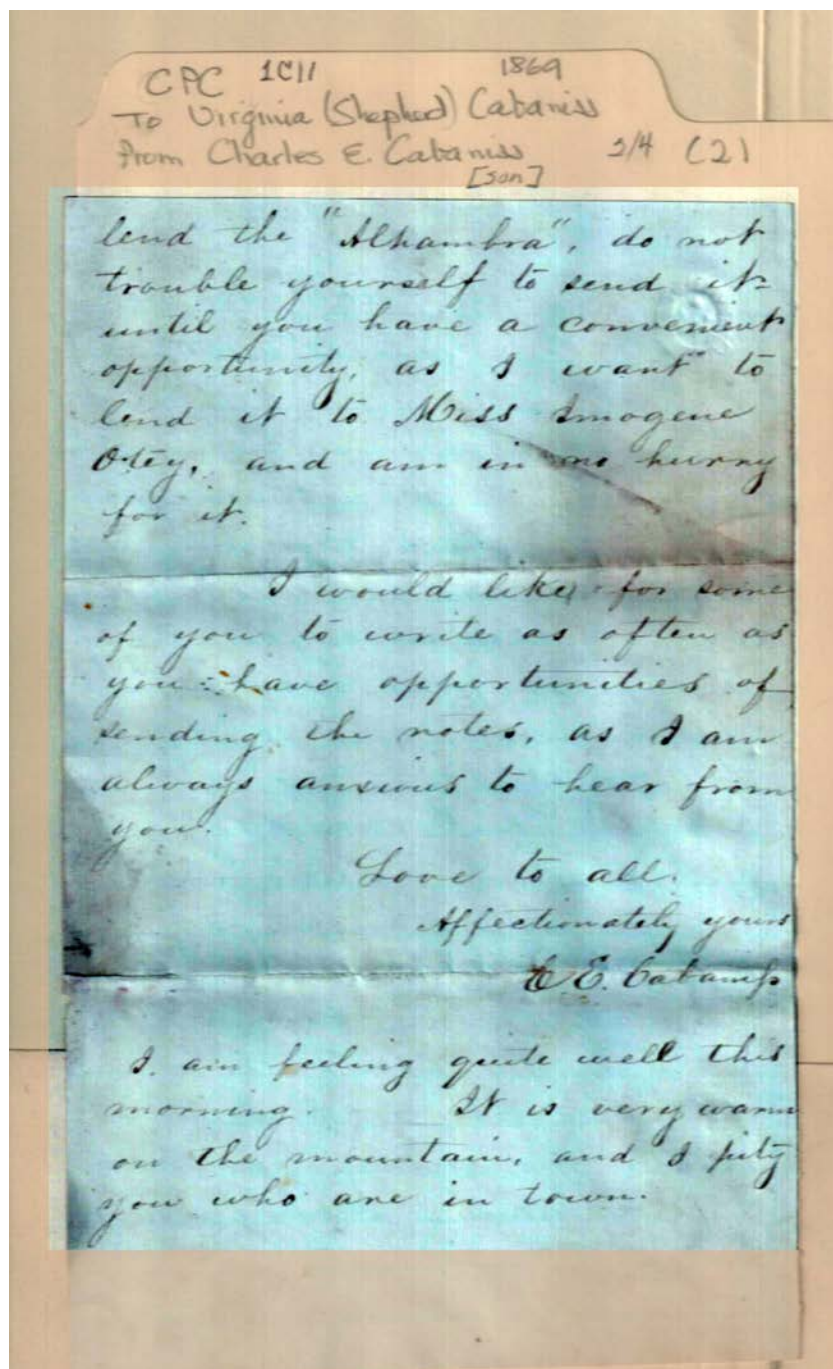

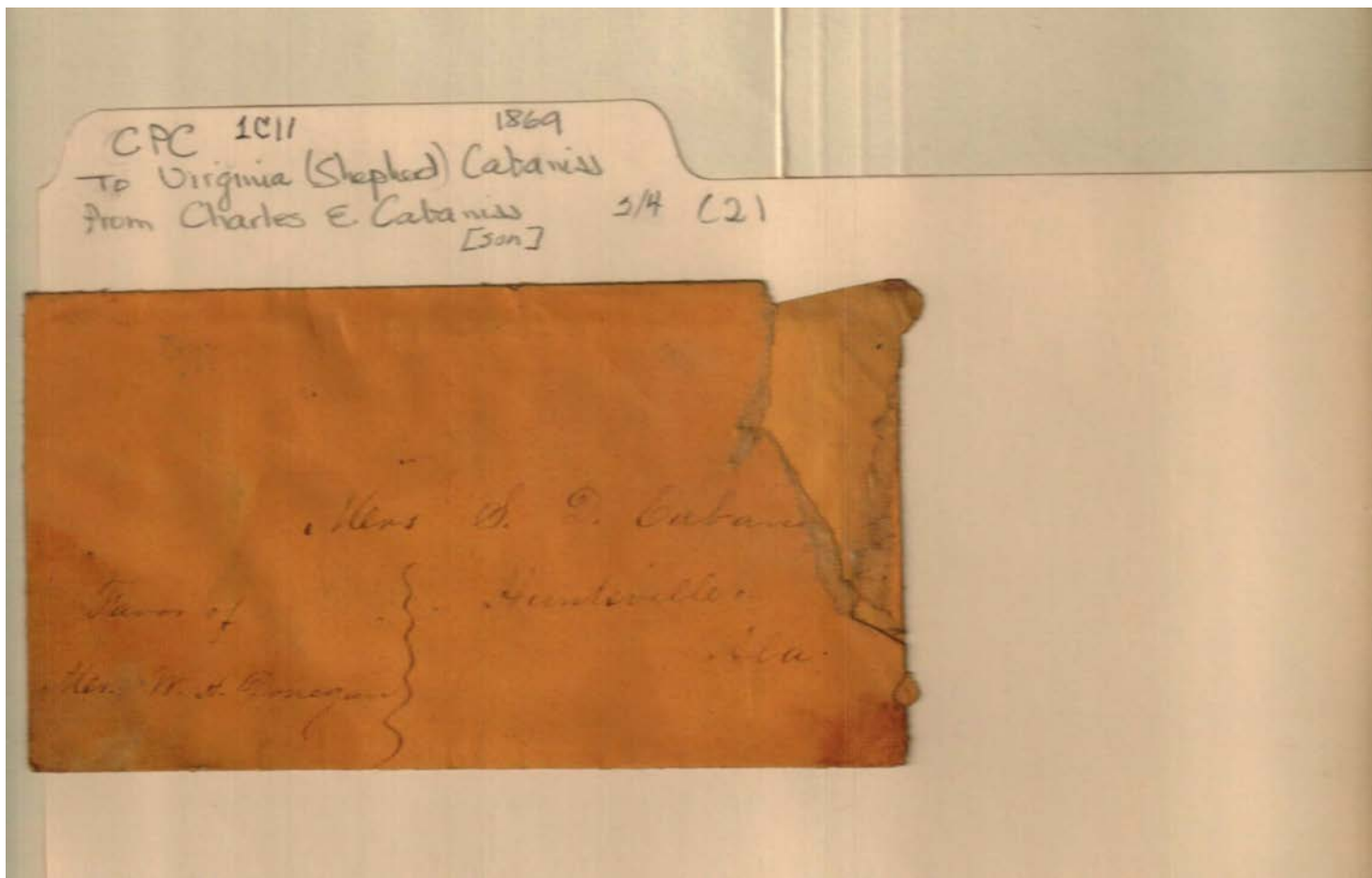

Dear Ma:

William arrived safely with the basket of clothing (all in good order), ^{the} bottle which Mrs. Fearn procured to be Apple Brandy, and the basket containing the eggs and tomatoes. He brought me note, although he spoke of ~~not~~ said, you spoke of sending one. I could find no note among the clothes.

William also gave me ^{seventy} cents in change, which he said you sent. I am much obliged to you for the change, though I do not need any at present.

I send back a few soiled clothes: I am in no hurry for them. Please keep the sweat shirt for me to use when I visit you. It will save me the trouble of bringing one with me.

Please do not send me any more tomatoes, for Mrs. Fearn has great quantities of them. I wish that Pa had the benefit of these you sent me. I turned them over to Mrs. Fearn. Let Lucy to please not send me any more eggs, unless I send for them. I fully appreciate her kindness, however, in sending these, although Mrs. Fearn seems to be well supplied with eggs at present. I have two every morning at breakfast, and they agree with me finely.

I declined the Apple Brandy when Pa offered to send me some, when I was at home. I am willing to use wine, if it is necessary, but I do not care to use Brandy or Whisky, unless my digestion becomes much worse, except in cases

of emergency. I trust that my digestion will con-
tinue to improve. I have given the Beans to
Mrs. Fearn to keep for me. I wish very much
that Pa had it also. I hope that he bought
some for his own use.

I am going to learn all I can about gar-
dening. Mr. Fearn has lent me a book to read
on Southern Gardening, and I also have the use
of his Agricultural Papers, which I enjoy a
good deal. And as I become able, I hope to
combine the theory with a little practice, in
grafting, pruning, sowing seed &c.

Yesterday evening Mr. Fearn gave me leave
to help myself to any quantity of Peas, seed
of which he had a large quantity, & which
were in the condition for sowing. I have
saved some for our operations next season. Mr. Fearn
has promised me some valuable kinds of beans, be-
sides other kinds of seed. He takes great care
in raising his own seed.

Please ask Pa to give me a Blank-book
suitable for a Common Place Book. I read a
great many valuable Recipes, Rules &c. which
might be of immense use to me hereafter, if I
could remember them. I expect to learn many
valuable practical hints from Mr. Fearn, which
I would not like to forget.

I had a pleasant ride home yesterday
morning.

Good night. Be sure not to
work too hard.

I stop writing in order for
William to go home. I fear I have detained too
long already. 11.40 o'clock. Yours &c.

Mr. R. Fearn's, Sept 18, 1868

Dear Mrs.:

I arrived here safely in about an hour and a half after parting with you all. I met the waggon near the top of the mountain, & exchanged mules. I am glad now that I spent the night with you, as no one was inconvenienced by my not returning.

My visit to you all was a delightful one, and I feel no bad effects from it at all.

I asked Mr. Fearn about Tom Gurley's Cows. He says that they are the Durham stock. They are large & acquire very rich pastures.

Please show this to Pa about the whiskey.

Mr. Fearn says that the whiskey which you sent him to test, is a good article of pure whiskey, and that it has the advantage of his whiskey, in this, that it has, he thinks, more age in it, which will improve it very much, with age. In a year, it will be worth \$5.00 per gal.

I hope that Fannie continues to improve, & that she will soon be well again.
