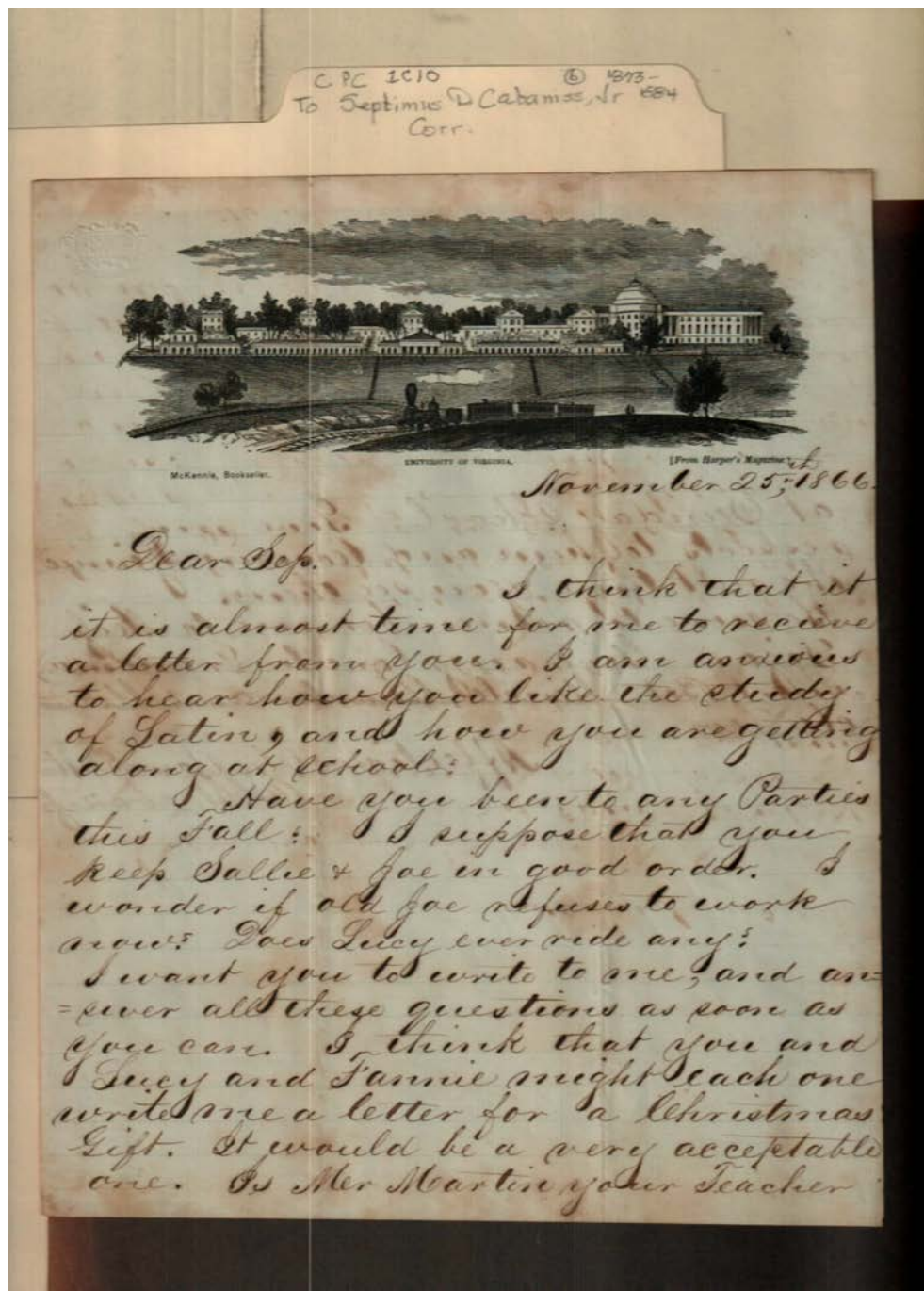

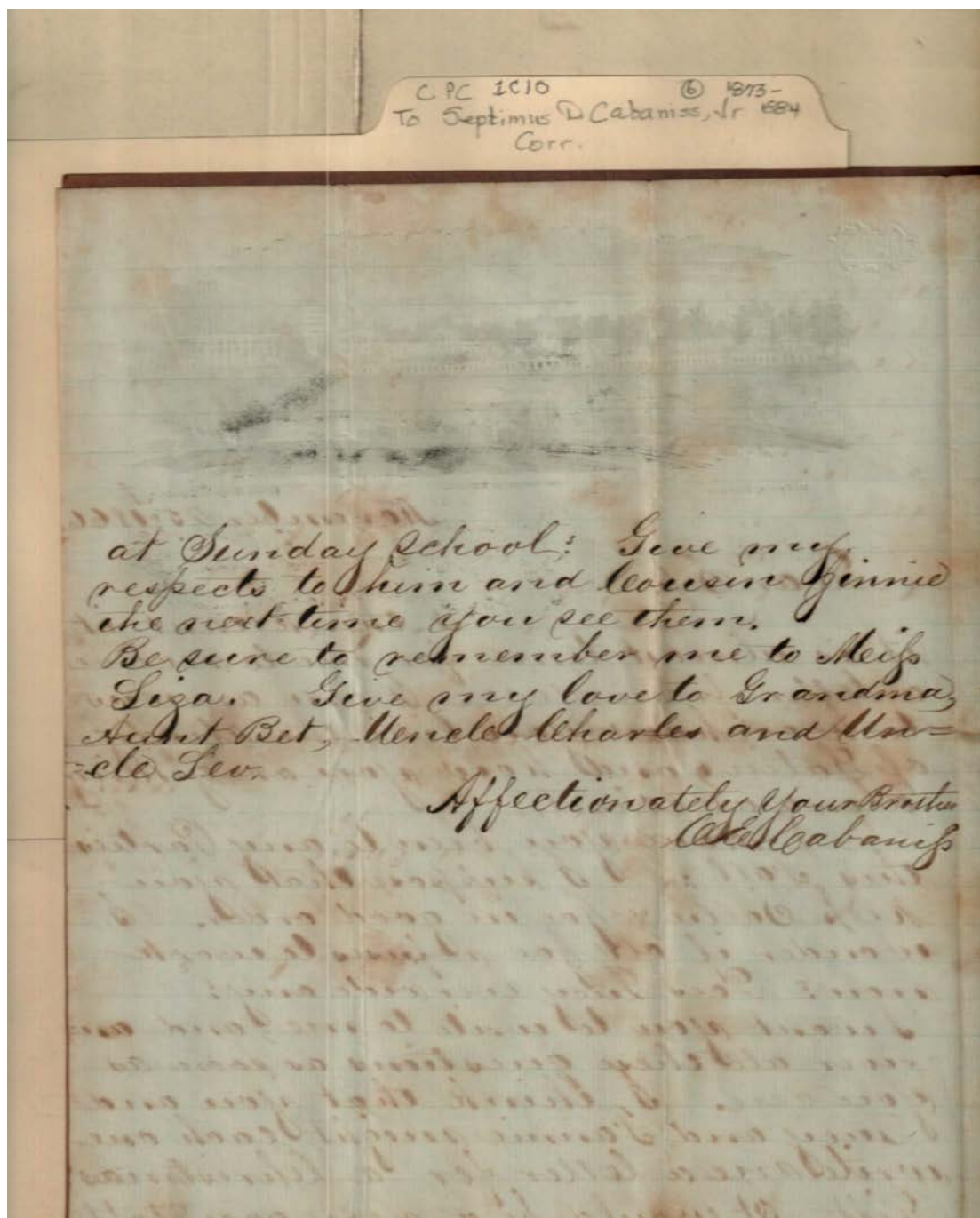

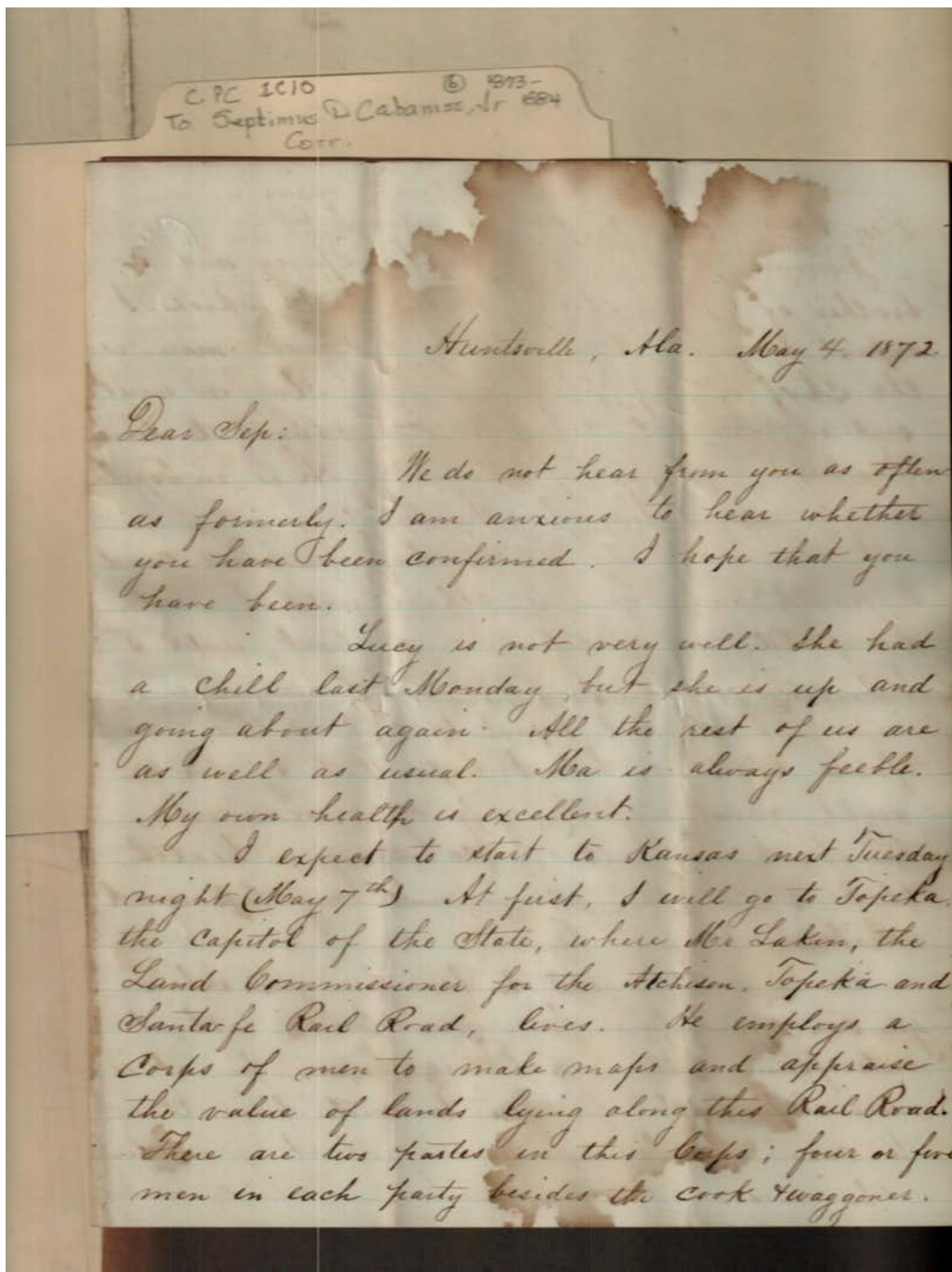

Jimmie Mayhew went out in March, but has been obliged to leave the field on account of chills. He is in Topela now, & may return to Huntsville.
If my health had remained good, I would have gone to school until I had completed my education, or at least, until I had adquired a profession.
I do not expect to continue this business for a life-time, but I hope that by six or eight months of this life of exercise on horseback, I will be so strong in health that I can then commence my life-work, whatever it may be.
I will be glad to hear from you when you can spare time from your books, without interfering with your letters home, for it is more important for you to write home than to me. Ma becomes uneasy about you when she misses a letter from you once a week.

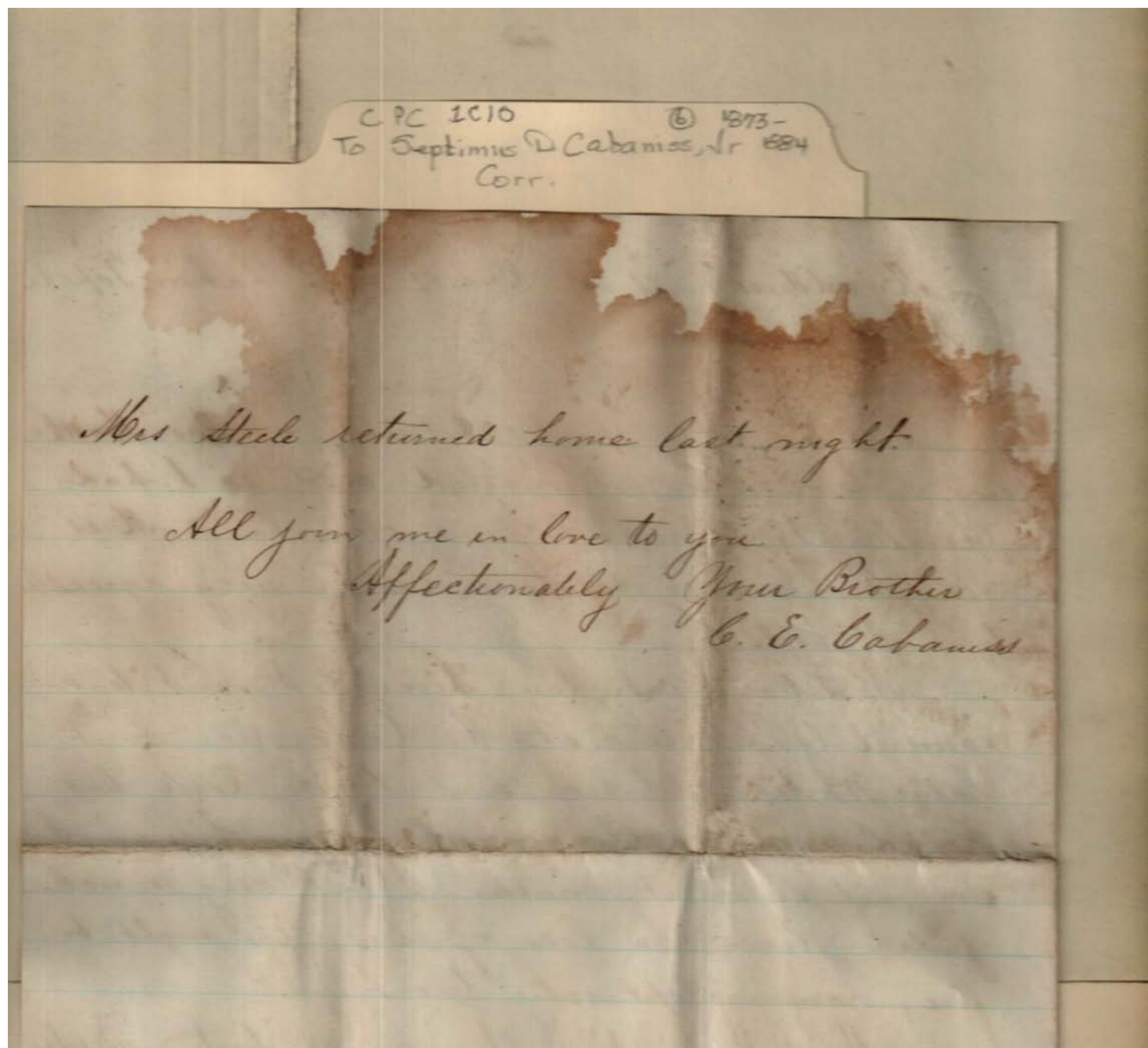

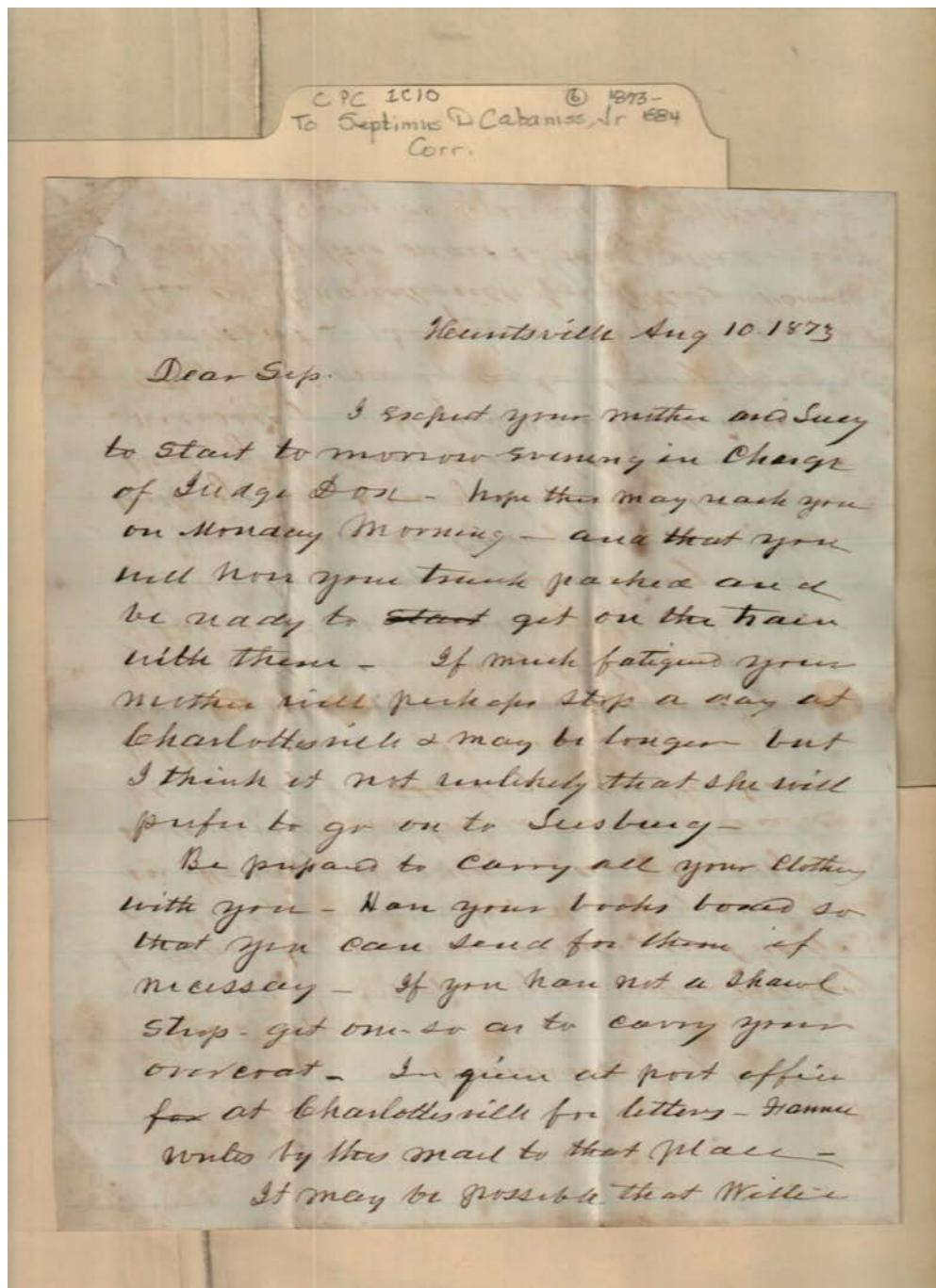

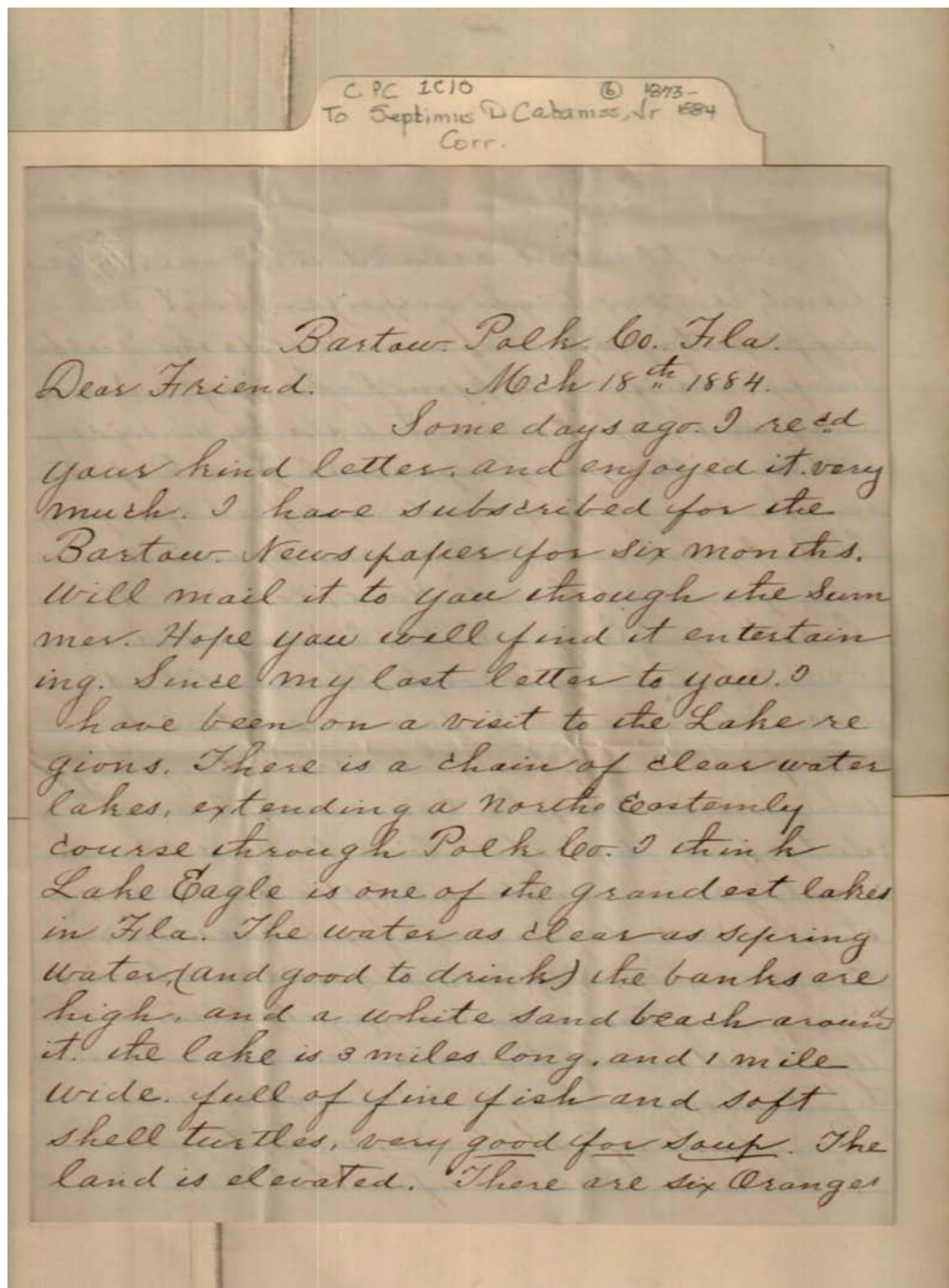
