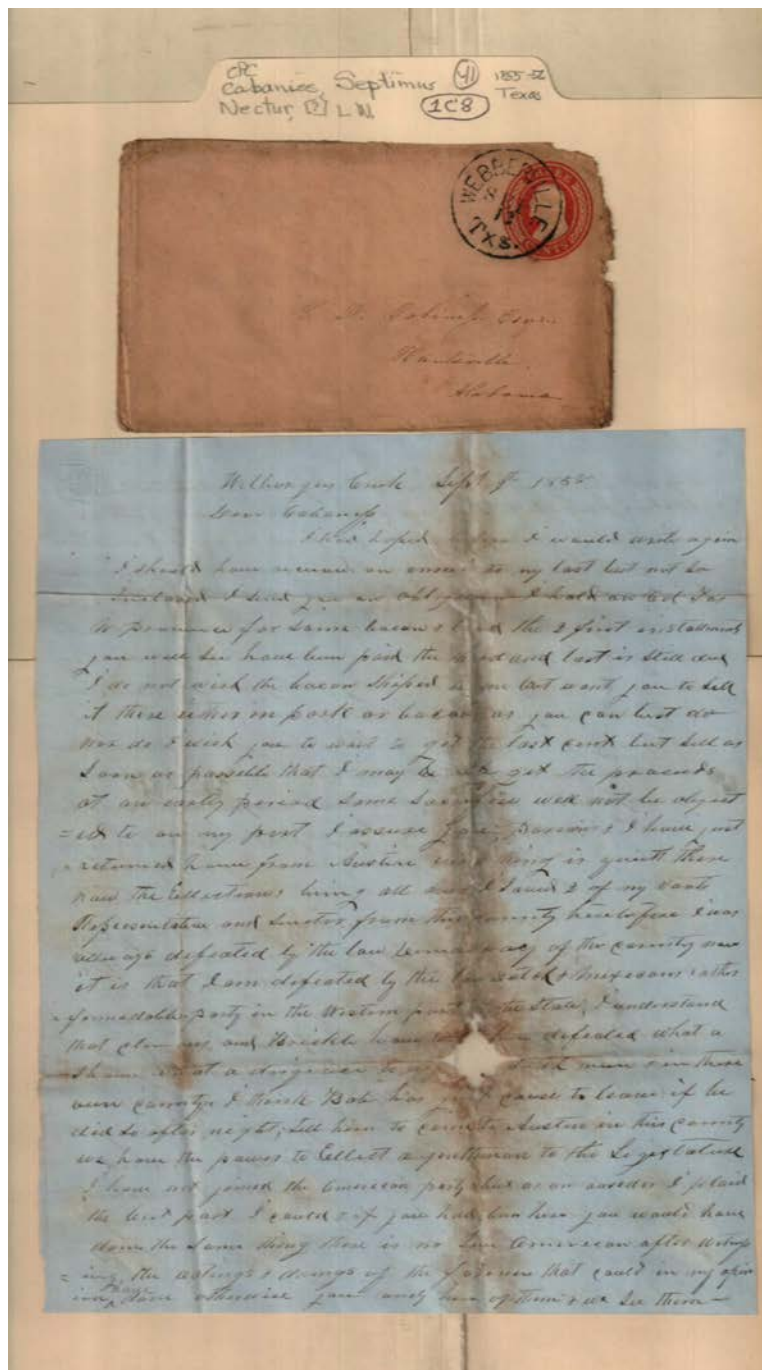

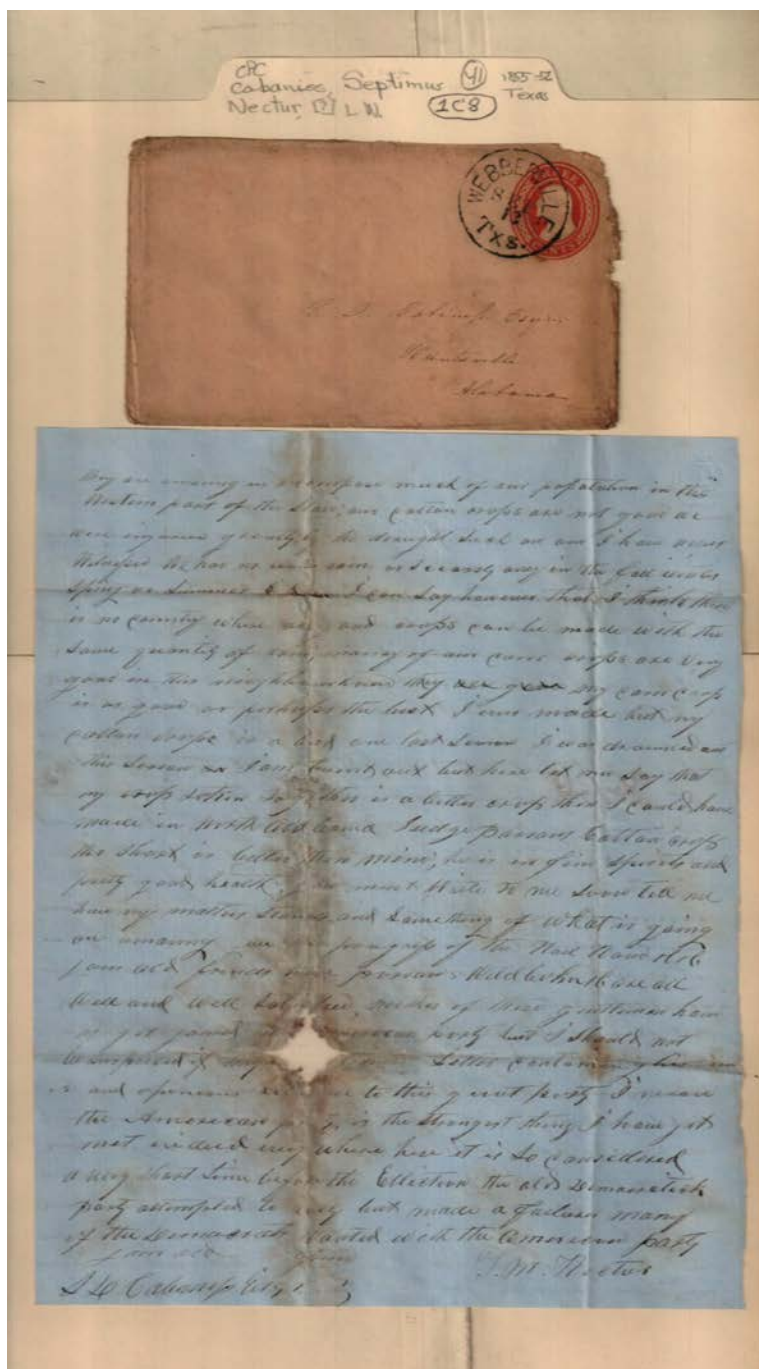

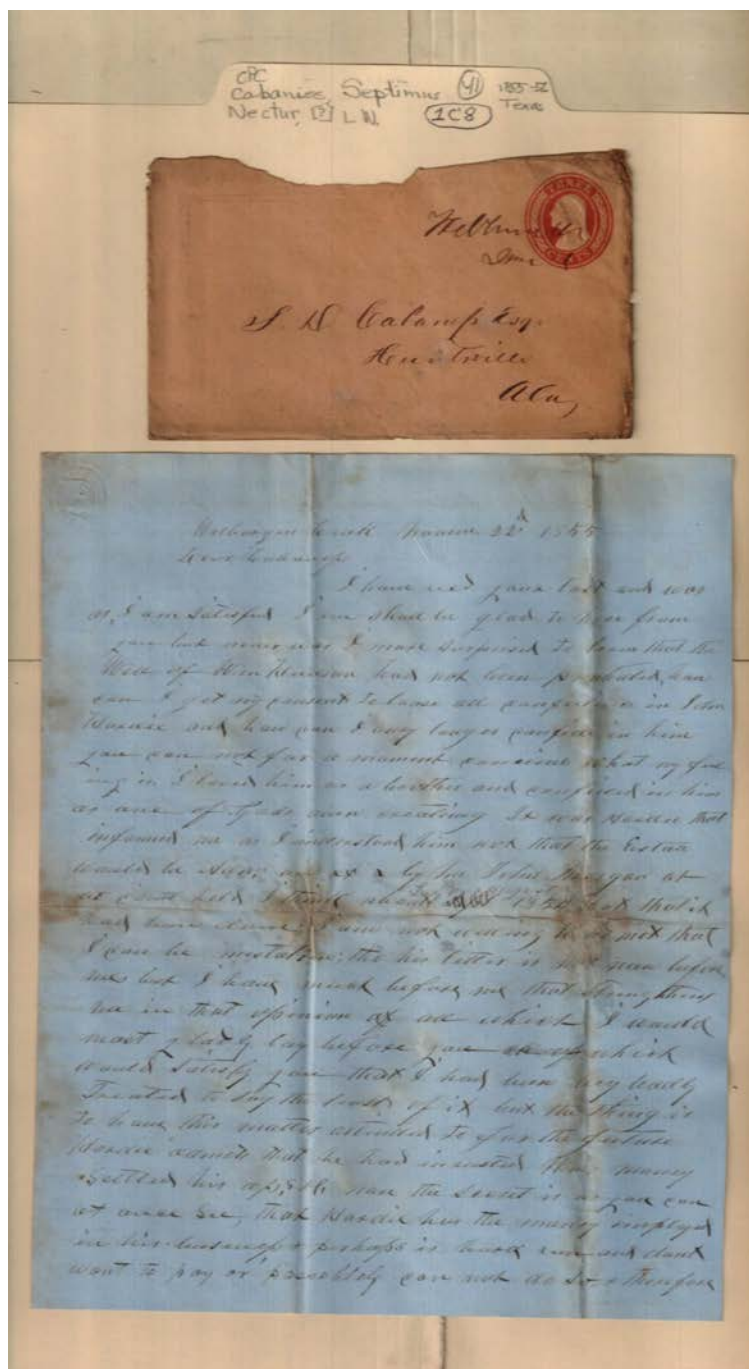

in that I shall now be governed by what you say
have us to my own land I think you had best submit
as soon as you can and if you can not see better by the
time you read this my advice is to take up with
Mr Wyck's offer provided he is a responsible man
this is necessary I think in as much as he pays nothing
now; my debts and liabilities will fall due December
1855 but I could keep them off until the first of March
thereafter by which time Mr Wyck's first payment
could be made available if he is practical (so
I shall be satisfied to accede to his proposition
the same will have to be sold this leaves only
Shampine treatment I have read with regard to
the Estate of William Hudson will not admit of much
staying about the time of my land; if you should find
that you could effect a better sale of some negro
property at once or as soon as I can I wish to buy some
2 or 3 negroes but the first I wanted to be a good house
girl and is one that could be taught to be so
it is the best you can I am however of that well
satisfied; I shall stop I am much and write
now worse than common Cabaniss write me
soon and let me see what you can about all
my business & particularly that of Taladega
that at last is in great danger your friend here
one all with my best respects to Mrs Cabaniss

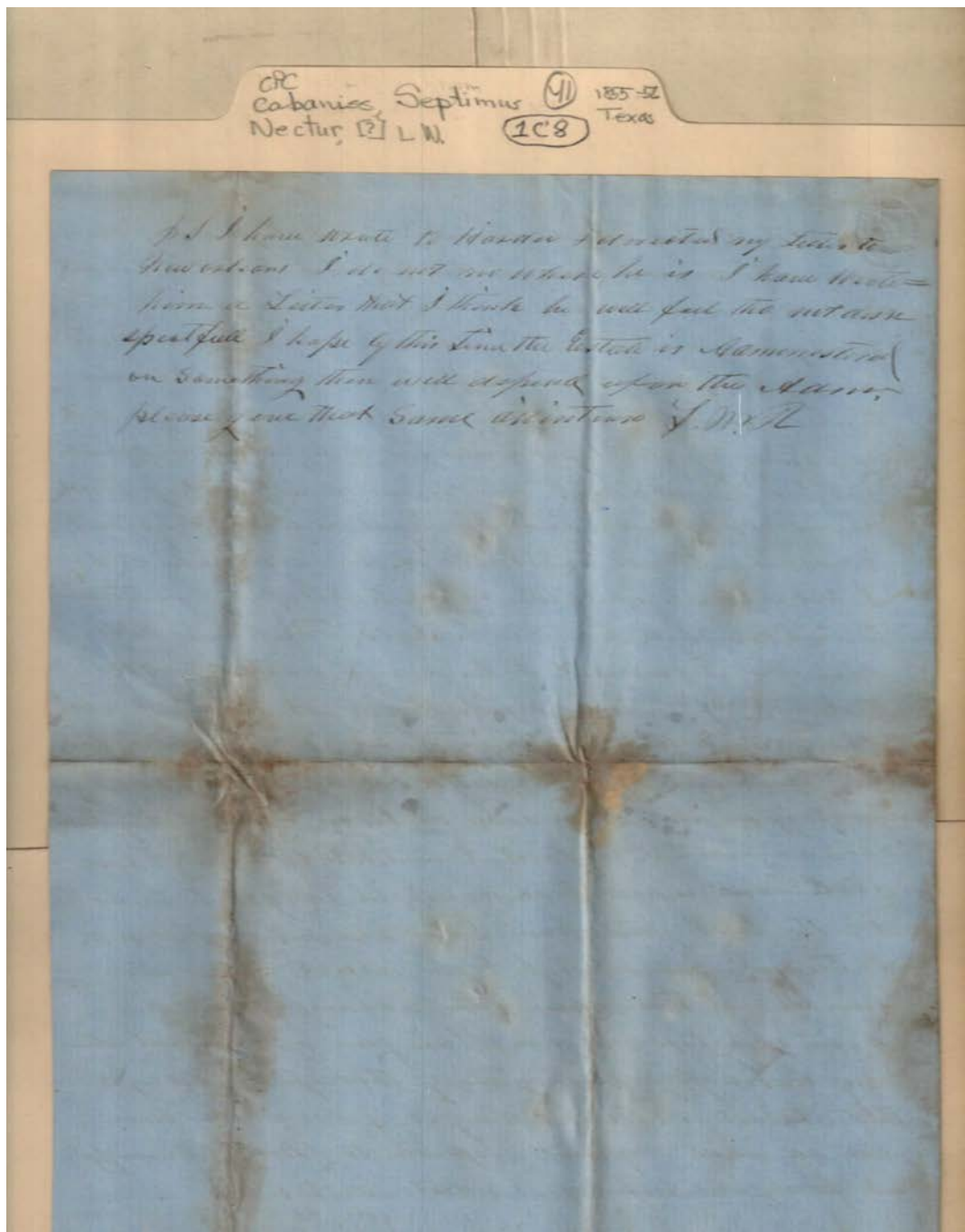

Dear Cabaniss

I am in writing of a complaint
to have it in my power to acknowledge the receipt of the
one to Judge Parsons for \$300 and the other to my self for
\$500; they came to hand on the 11th of this Inst, & was
then in season, at which time I am sure I shall be
able to obtain a title to my land, when I shall be able
my under the name; I have so often mentioned to you
but when the Court came on not having heard from
you & not having any money I got the old man
to go out for the case to try over for 2 weeks
I had all the time promised him to have the money when
he could make a good title, so my head was out
I hope never to be so glad again to see money there
is no money here in circulation, so you can not borrow until
the return of the proceeds of the sale of the cotton crops
I do not know what I may have heretofore said to you about
my crop, my corn crop was the best I ever made my cotton
not so good, I shall average about 300 to the acre
of 1000 of my land was new, & the season dry & bad
it is not safe to presume that we shall ^{soon} again have
so bad a season, Judge Parsons' corn crop was not
so good as mine, but his cotton much better
I think it safe to set his claim from 12 to 1500
per acre; if well gathered I am sure of it I have
just returned from Austin the District Court & Legislature

we both in spring next Monday the Supreme Court sits there
there is quite a deal I am now well satisfied that a good
Lawyer could do well in Austin one who understood the
Law and observed the confidence of the people (with
out any intention to flatter I will say such an one
as your self could not only do well but I think in
ten years get rich notwithstanding I am informed
that there is some 80 Lawyers there. I have not heard
a word from my old friend Hardie or the Wm Hudson
Esq since last spring or rather last Winter I am
sorry to have to say that I do not think that I have been
fully treated by those people I am then wiser that I was
previously in case of many that if they would let me have
\$1000. I would give them any sort of advice they would
not to refuse if they had the money according to me and
ought to have let me have some of it, I shall not
make another application as I have before said I
leave the case in your hands with a request that you
demand the money of the Attorney of the court period
the Law will give it you, I then I was told by
them did not issue for nearly 12 months after the due
= one I did this delay they say was produced by the
improper interference of Gen Austin the Scherger
die wrote me last Winter that he had got the
opinion of several Lawyers of high standing
& that they all thought the Law could be held
under the Will, that is as much as Austin had done
& I am so much the better there were all dissenting

To try it I understood that I did not think the land could
 be held but in as much as business law was decided and that
 the action as they said had done and I did much
 against those interested I would not stand back
 or throw any thing in the way if they wished to pro-
 = ceed. Since then I have not heard a word I have
 no particular object to have a lawsuit with action
 and to pay costs in this case; I shall expect
 you to ask for me and do what you may
 think right & I shall be fully satisfied. I had a
 letter some 10 days since from Cal. pronounced by Judge
 he stated that my plantation was going much
 to back and was not in a state that he was help-
 ing all he could to effect a sale. I hope
 this fall you will be able to sell. I will no have
 it is with a plantation that has to be rented out
 it will go down down. I hope the completion
 of the rail road will change things about
 and give them a new face I hope when I
 get that promised Doctor of Law I shall
 have everything and more too for I think
 it was about 9 months since you wrote me we
 are all well we have no sickness here
 this year the locust has paid me rent to my
 family my last bill for fare to about \$3.50
 give my respects to your wife & for your
 best accept the best wishes of your old friend
