My Dear Septimus
This rainy day I have set
apart for the purpose of conferring with
you through the medium of pen and
paper. I must confess that
I feel at considerable loss for matter to
write about as there is nothing in our
country at present that will be of
any interest to you in any wise what
ever. At present I will say this much
that we are all well and doing as well
as might be expected under existing
circumstances. We the people of Ala have
made a large crop of cotton this season
in consequence of which in all proba-
bility many of the farmers of our once flour-
ishing ^{country} will be entirely broken up.
This is bad news to reach the ears of one
who consistent with the principles of the
Law of Nature must feel the deepest
interest in the welfare of his friends.

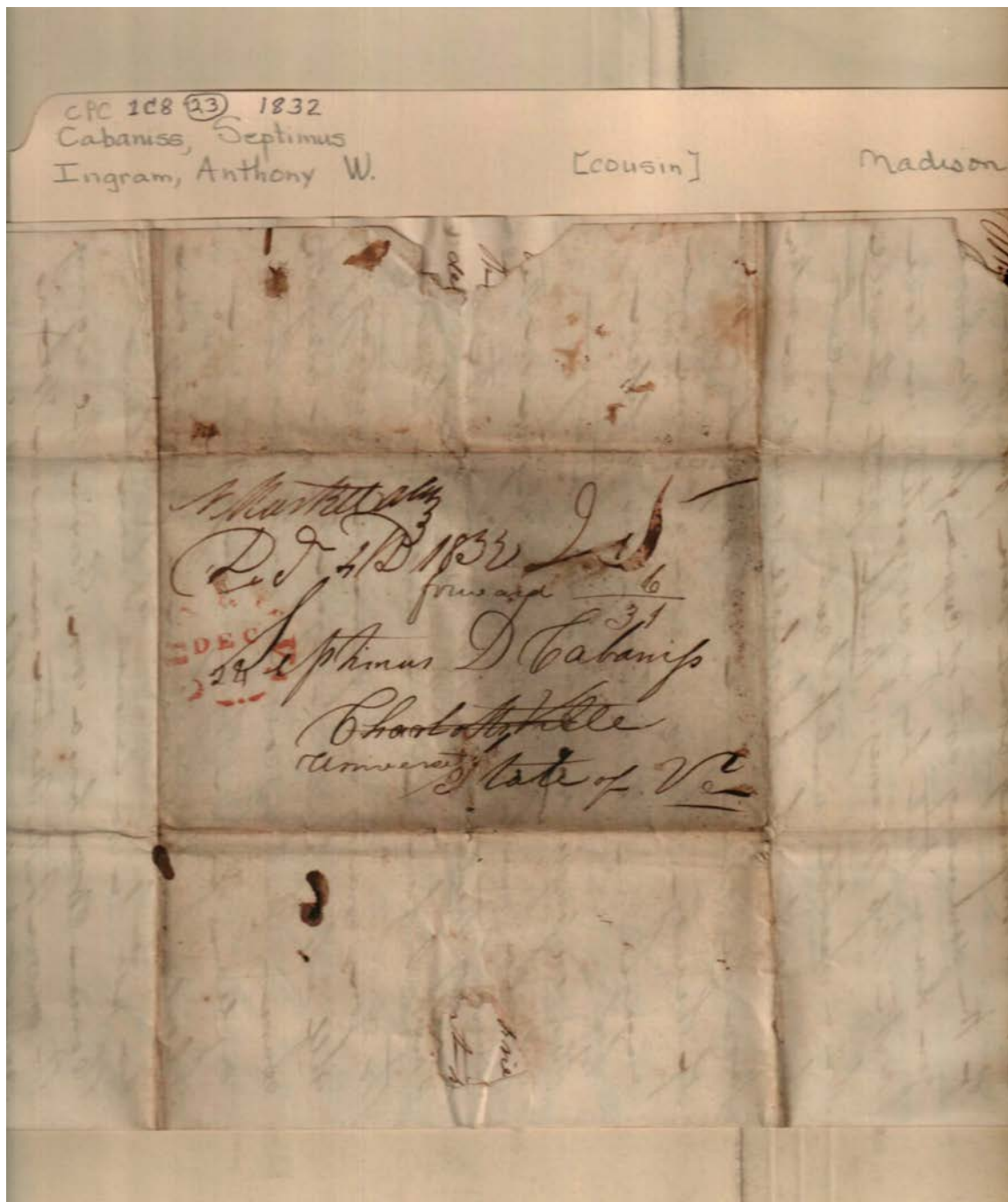
