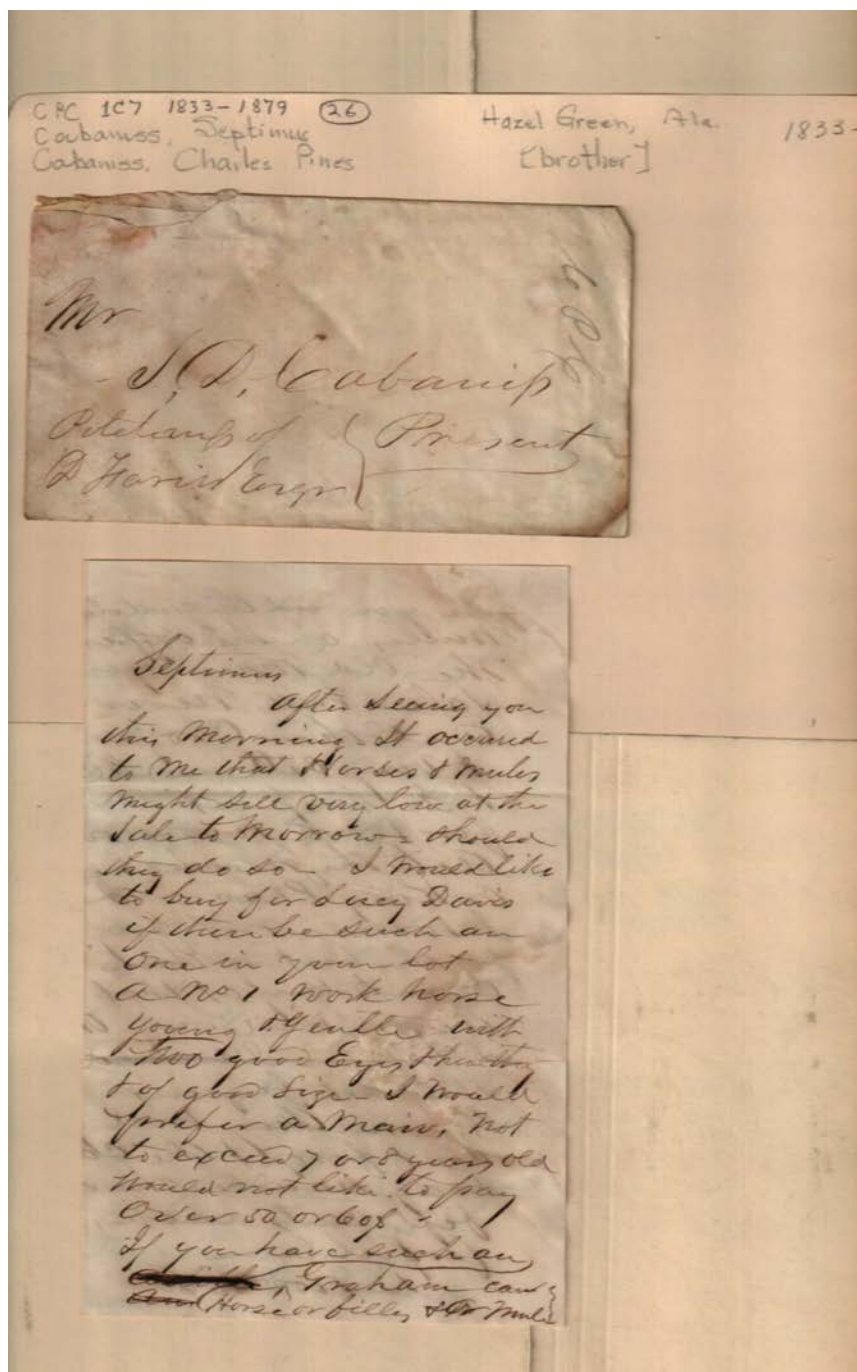

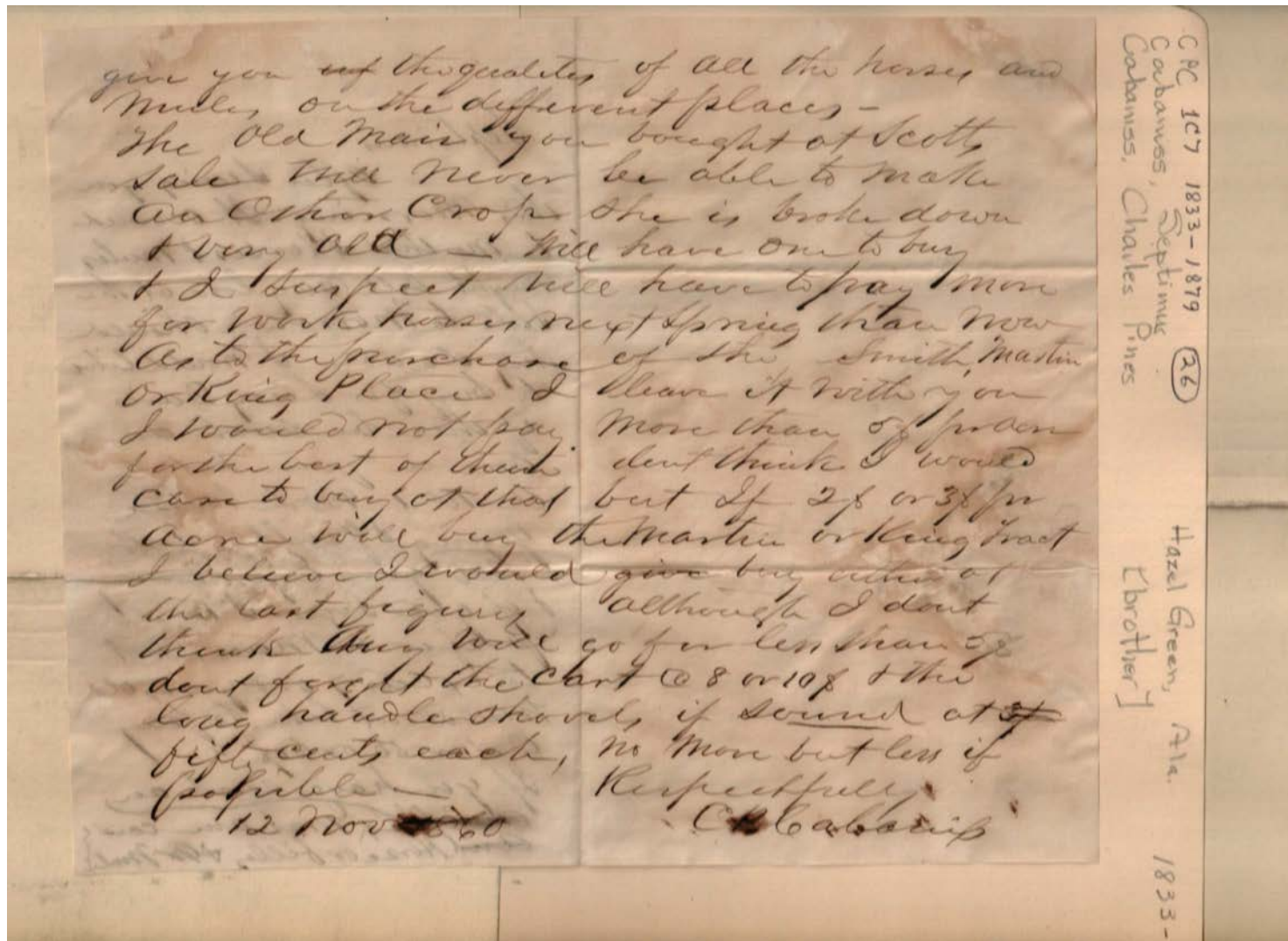

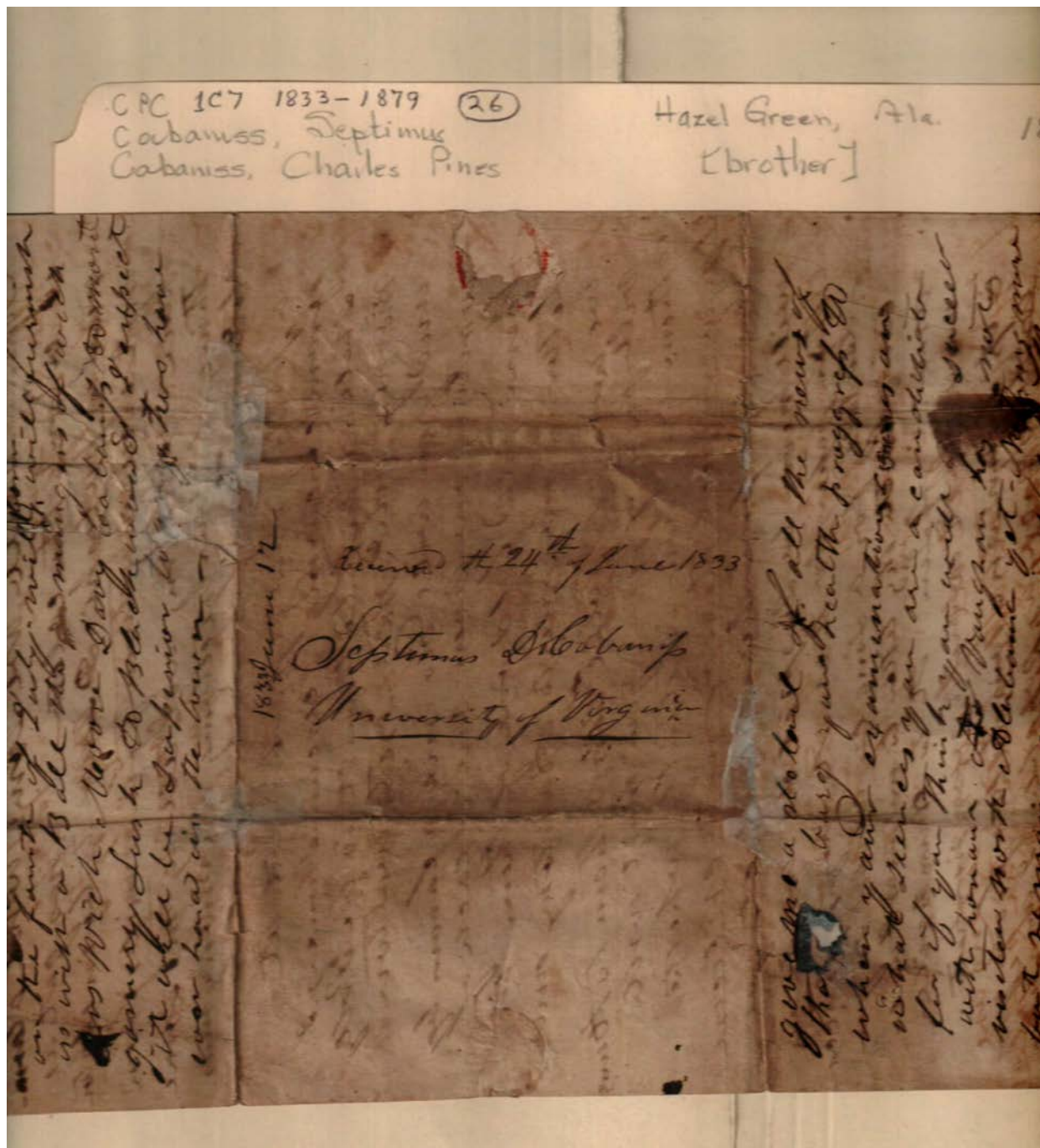

Before this reaches you I expect
you will conclude that I have thought
it only necessary to treat you as a
common friend. But I do assure
you that it is to the reverse of that
yet I must acknowledge I have
given you sufficient reason so
to believe. My situation at this
times will permit me to write
a letter weekly and I would do
it willingly were there a sufficiency
of intelligence to justify it and
my principle reason is that it would
be a tax rather too heavy for you
to well support mine alone would
not be but you have several corres-
pondents or enough to consume
twenty five or thirty dollars annually
and the most of these correspondents
are of the same way and if they
give the neighbors a new news it can
not be but better more than one
might write to the crop of this
place are considered better than
they have been for several years or
rather more forward except wheat
which has been ruined by the im-
mense quantity of rain that has fallen
this spring fruit trees weighted down
with fruit

(Dear Septimus, Jan 1st 1833)
After the compliments of the New Year I shall
immediately write you in response of the
kind letter of the 26th inst. (the only
apology I can make for not writing sooner is the want of
correcting and diligence of composition, as you wear that it
will not permit me to write grammatically or to adorn my
composition with any elegance whatever for the former (correct)
I shall study although the latter (elegance) requires some
step of a personal confrontation could be had I would insist
upon it answering the reception of such a mission as I shall
be able to give you of the general state of things since my last
you left us in a state of gloom & grief so we remain without
a solitary syllable to arouse our sleeping lethargy.
Mr Abbott started this morning for clearing up Thursday
William starts to Jacksonville tomorrow in tendering
Creek nation about the 15th inst. Sam Pool has bought
another entire piece of land that did belong to the
estate and is going to settle there (call the old Apple
Richard & Kate is now living at Boardman and makes
many visits to us he and Kate have intended having

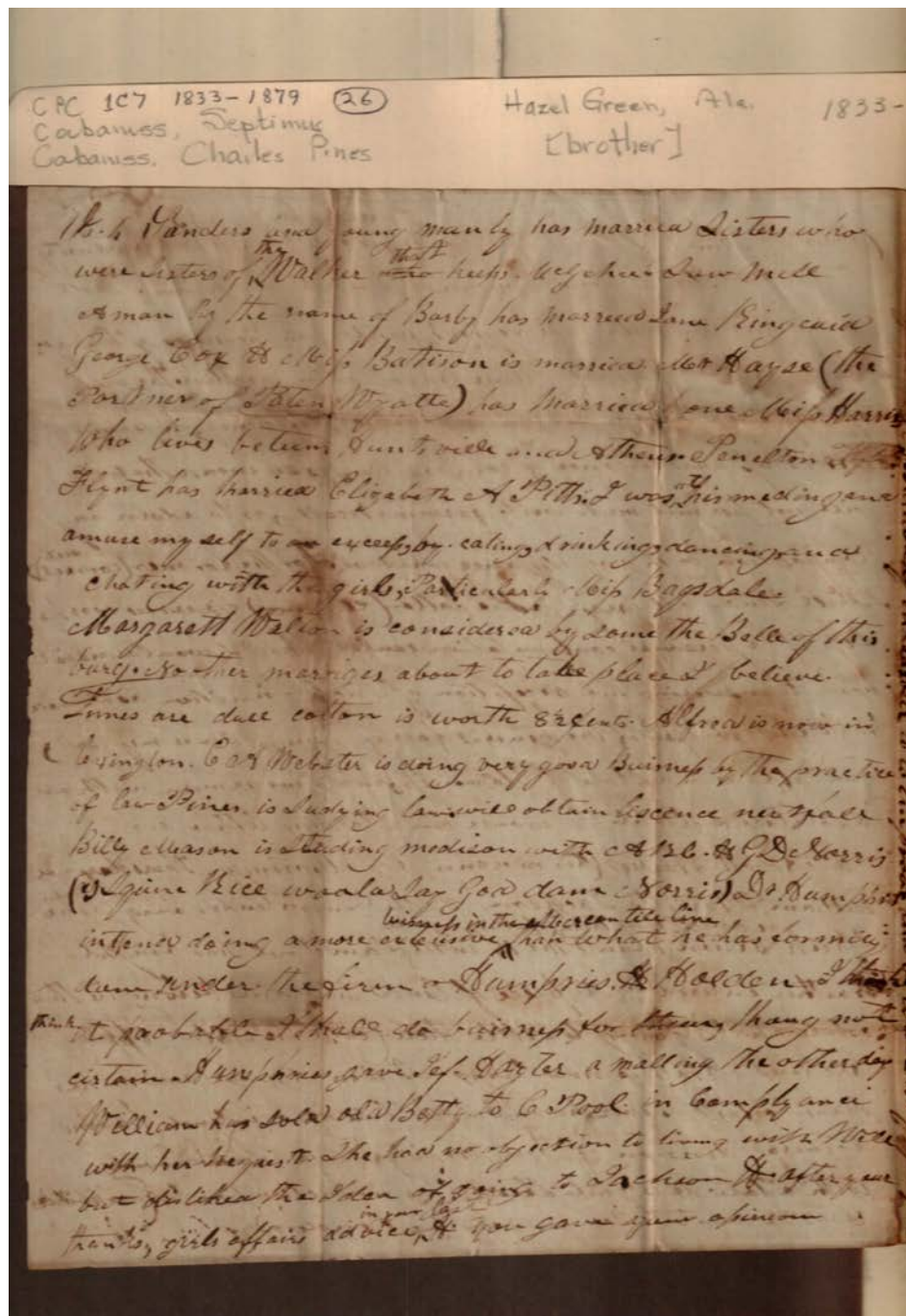

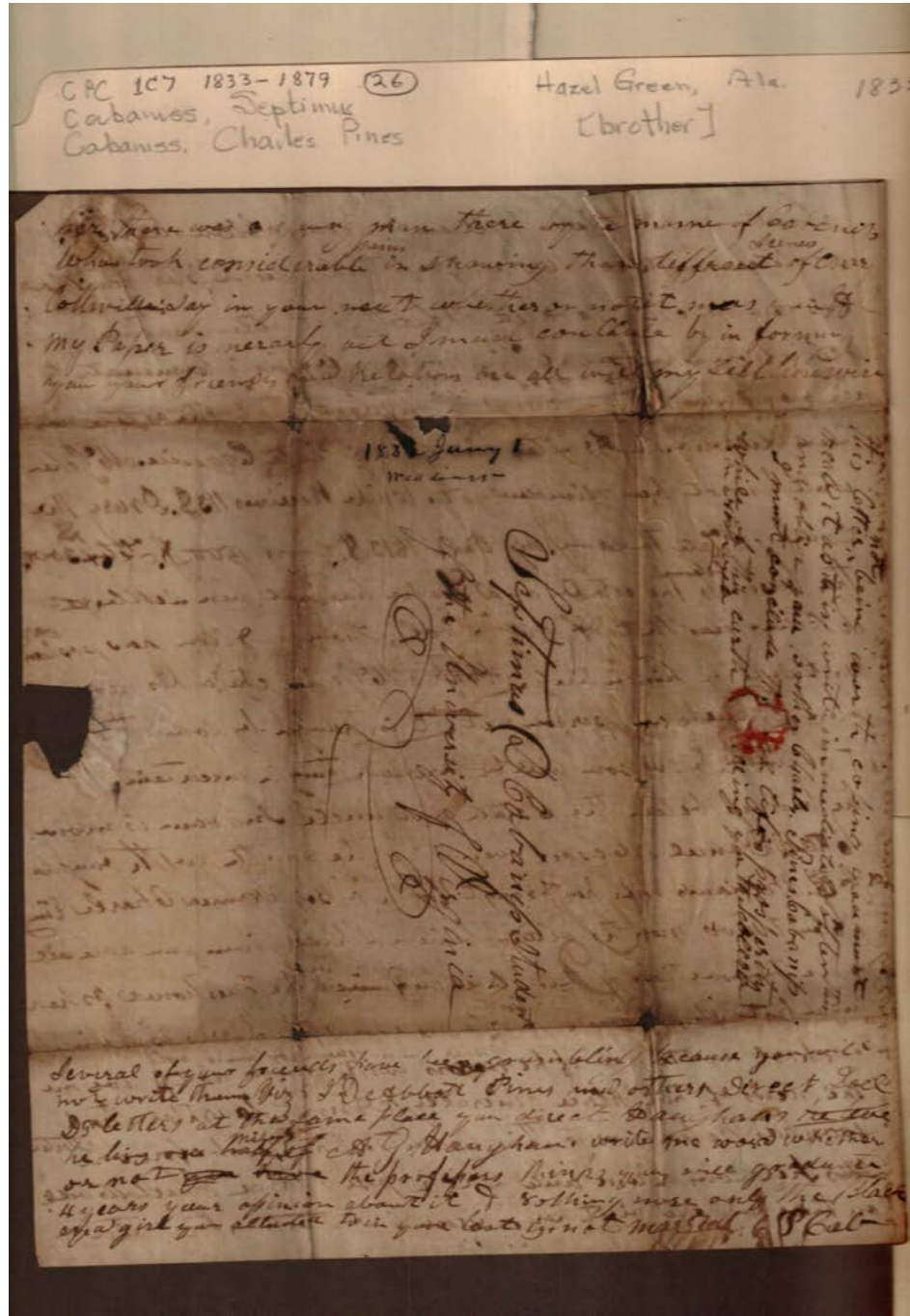

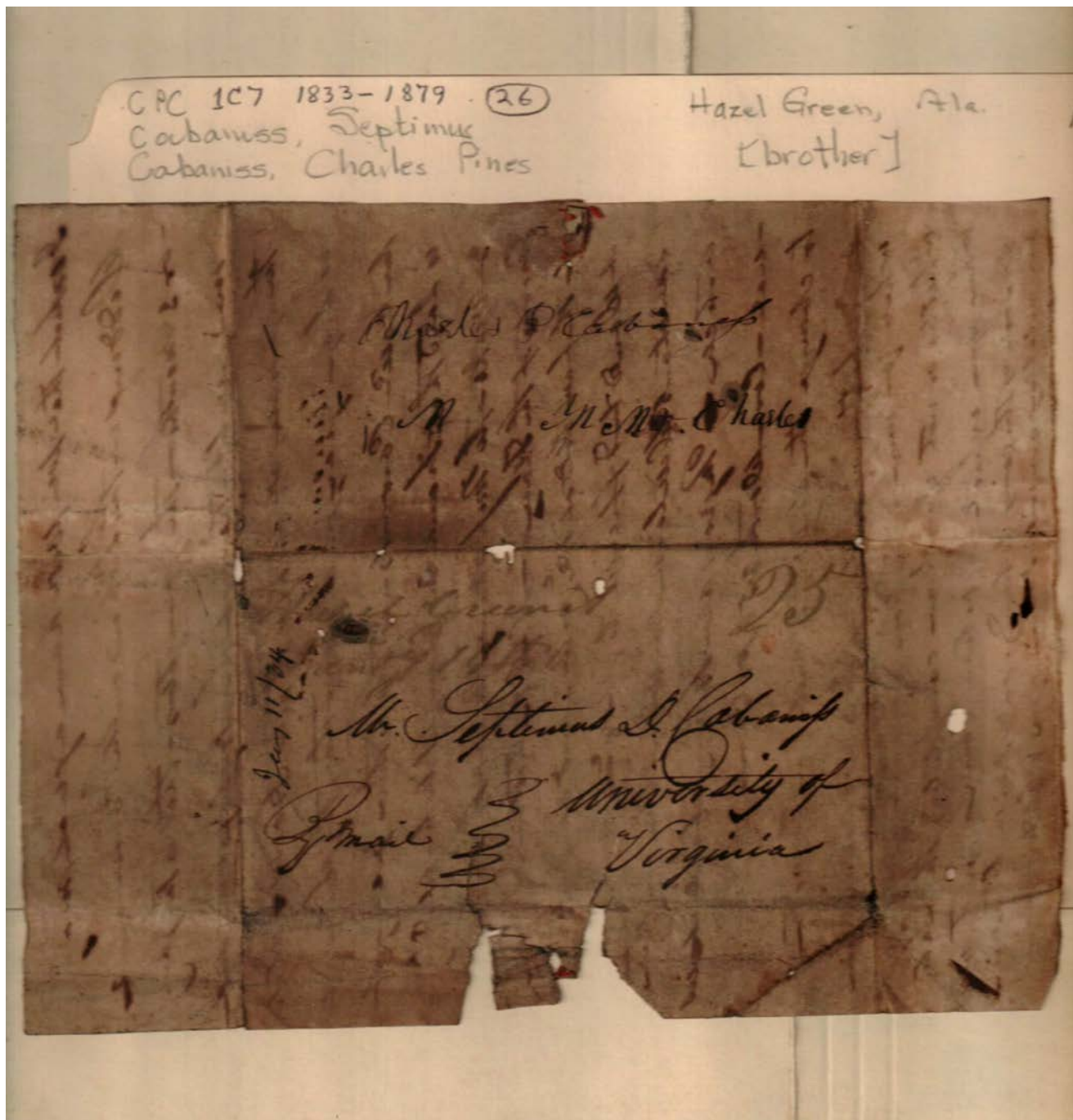
