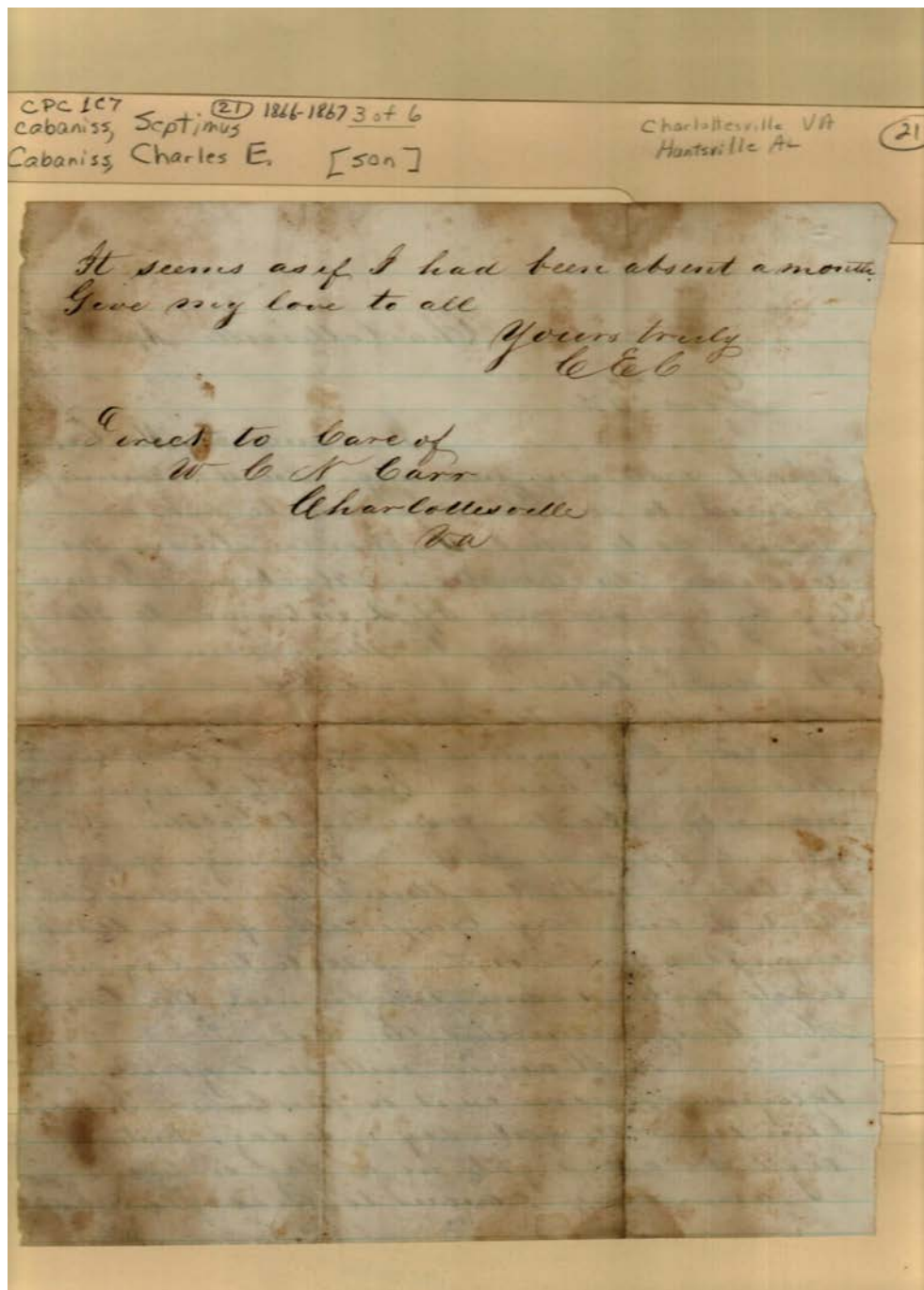

I have settled with Mr Carr up to the first of July, I paid him \$24.50, and I have deposited \$130.00 in the Bank.

I received the Independent, yesterday. I have written to Cousin Leo Hough, but have not heard from him. I have been helping some of the boys to read their Caesar lessons, and I find that I have not forgotten so much Latin as I at first feared, I am very rusty on the Rules, but I can translate nearly as well as ever, therefore I think, that I can lay aside Latin, more easily advantageously than any thing else. Dear Pa.

It has been about ten days since I received your letter of the 14th, in which you asked me to try to explain why the potatoes in the lazy-bed were injured by the frost while those in the other bed were unhurt. I asked Dr Maupin to tell me the Philosophy of it, (this morning). He said that leaves are very good Radiators, but bad conductors. The leaves radiate heat from their surface faster than the ground does. (where there are no leaves). The atmosphere in contact with the surface of the bed of leaves becoming cool faster than that near the surface of the ground, deposits more dew on the leaves than on the ground, and the leaves being the colder, the dew is frozen (becomes frost) sooner than that which falls upon the ground.

Secondly, the plants which have been covered by leaves are more tender than those which have not, & consequently more easily injured.

Your recollection of the Theory of Frost is perfectly correct, and also, the reason why the potatoes under the peach-tree were uninjured.

I thought it best to have Dr. Maupin's opinion in regard to this, while I could get it, and besides I knew that it would not be troubling him, for he is very kind.
