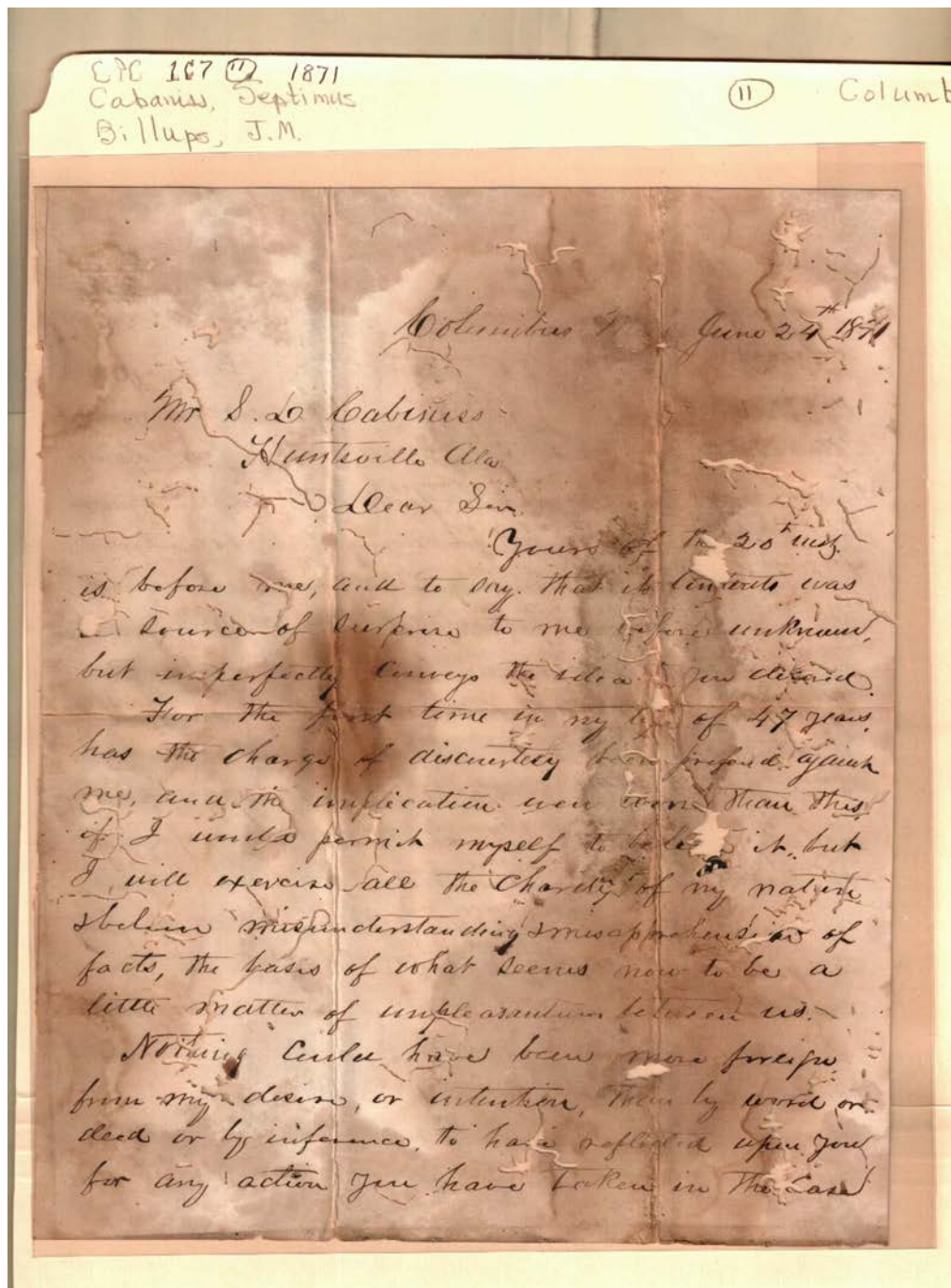

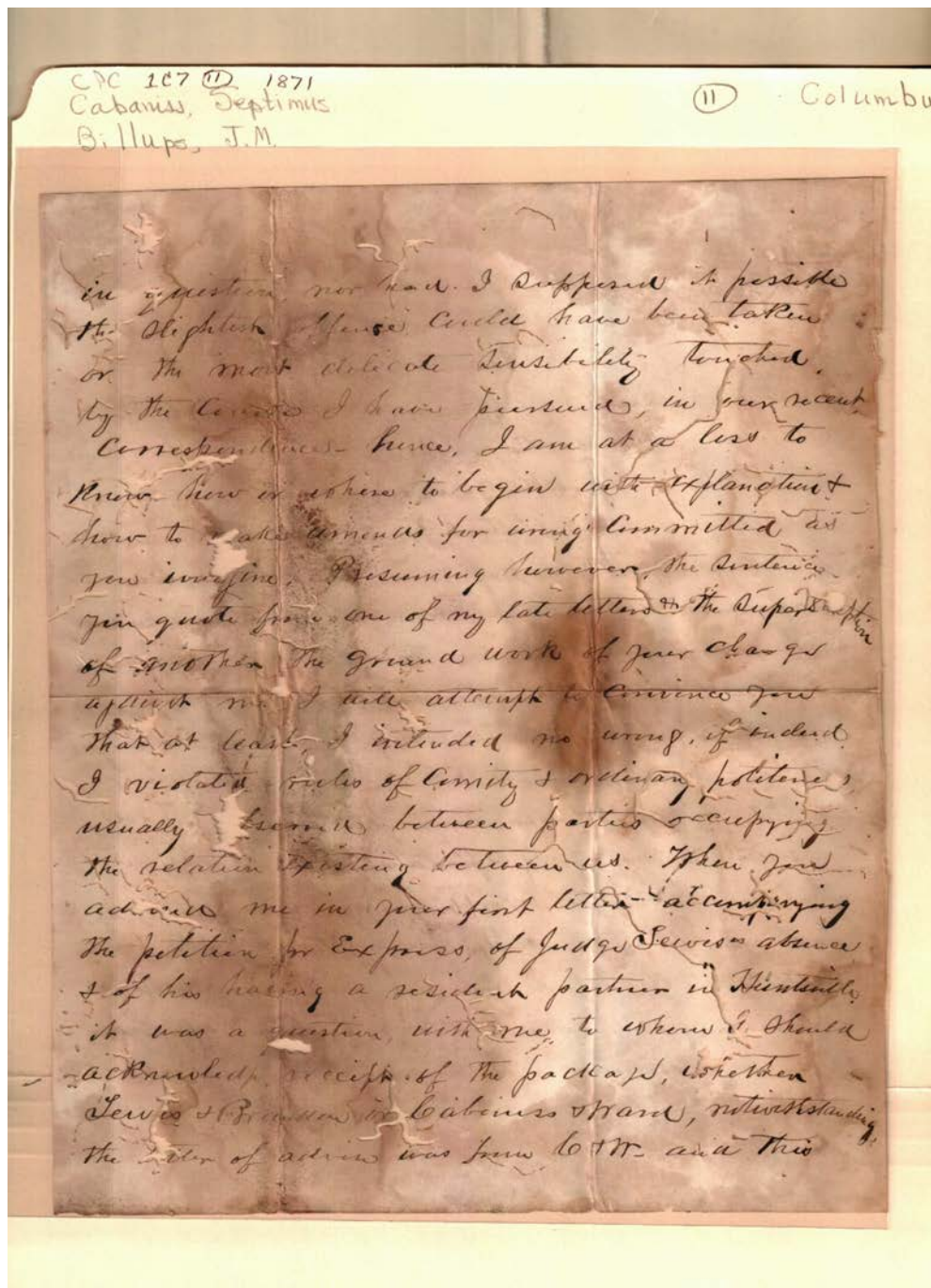

 the utmost confidence in your capacity to manage
 the case, I referred the Bank upon my representation.

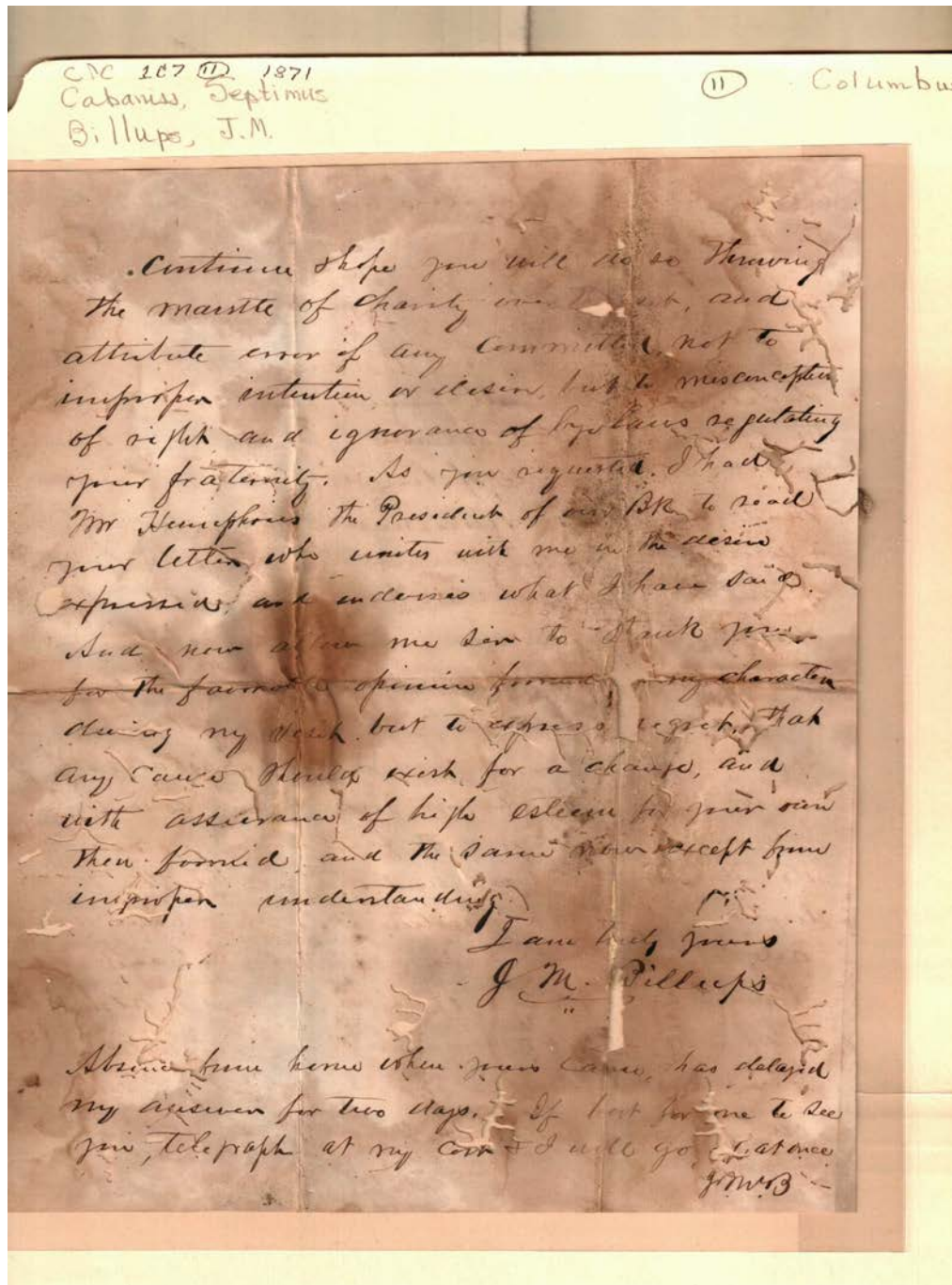

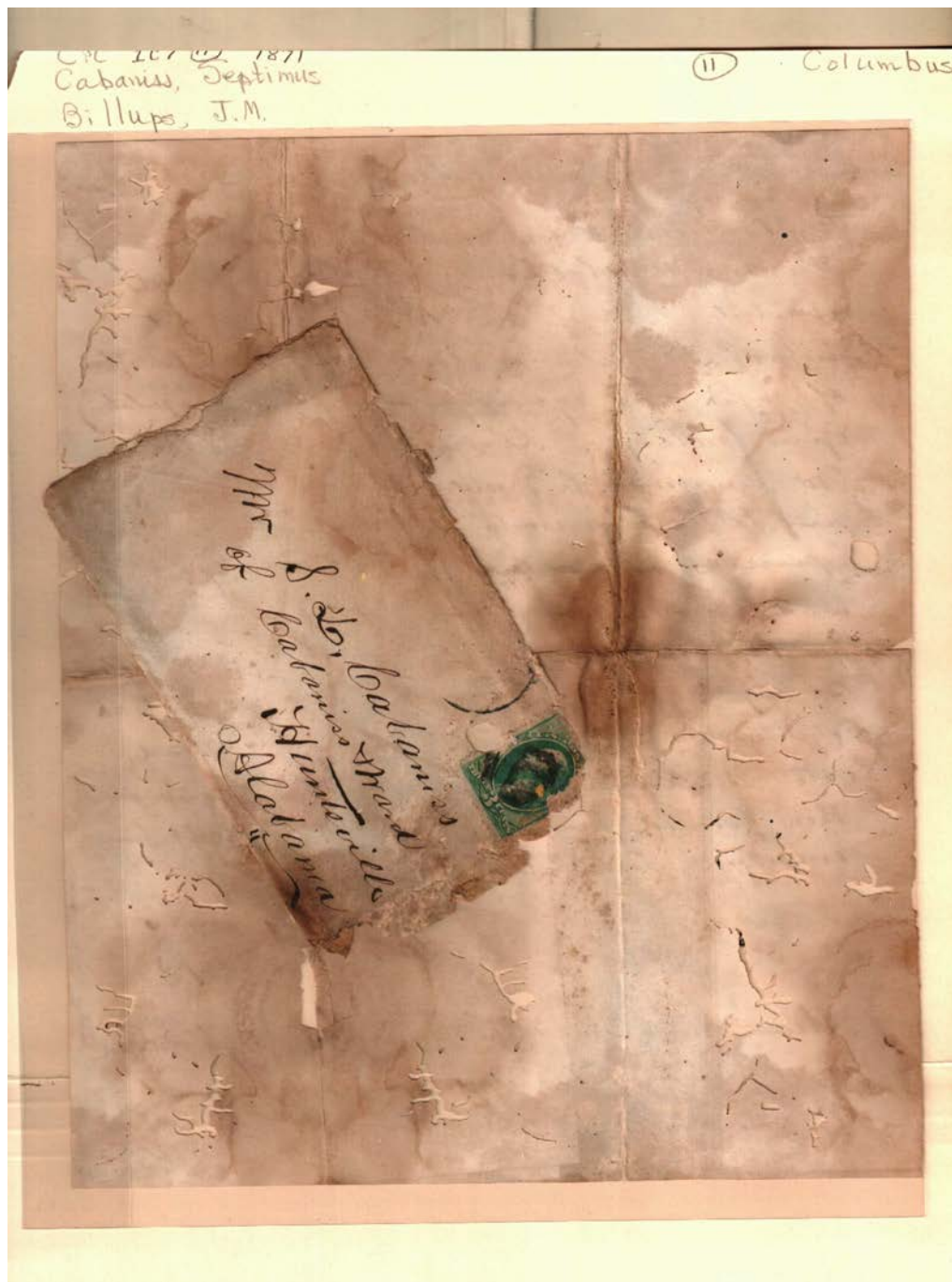
