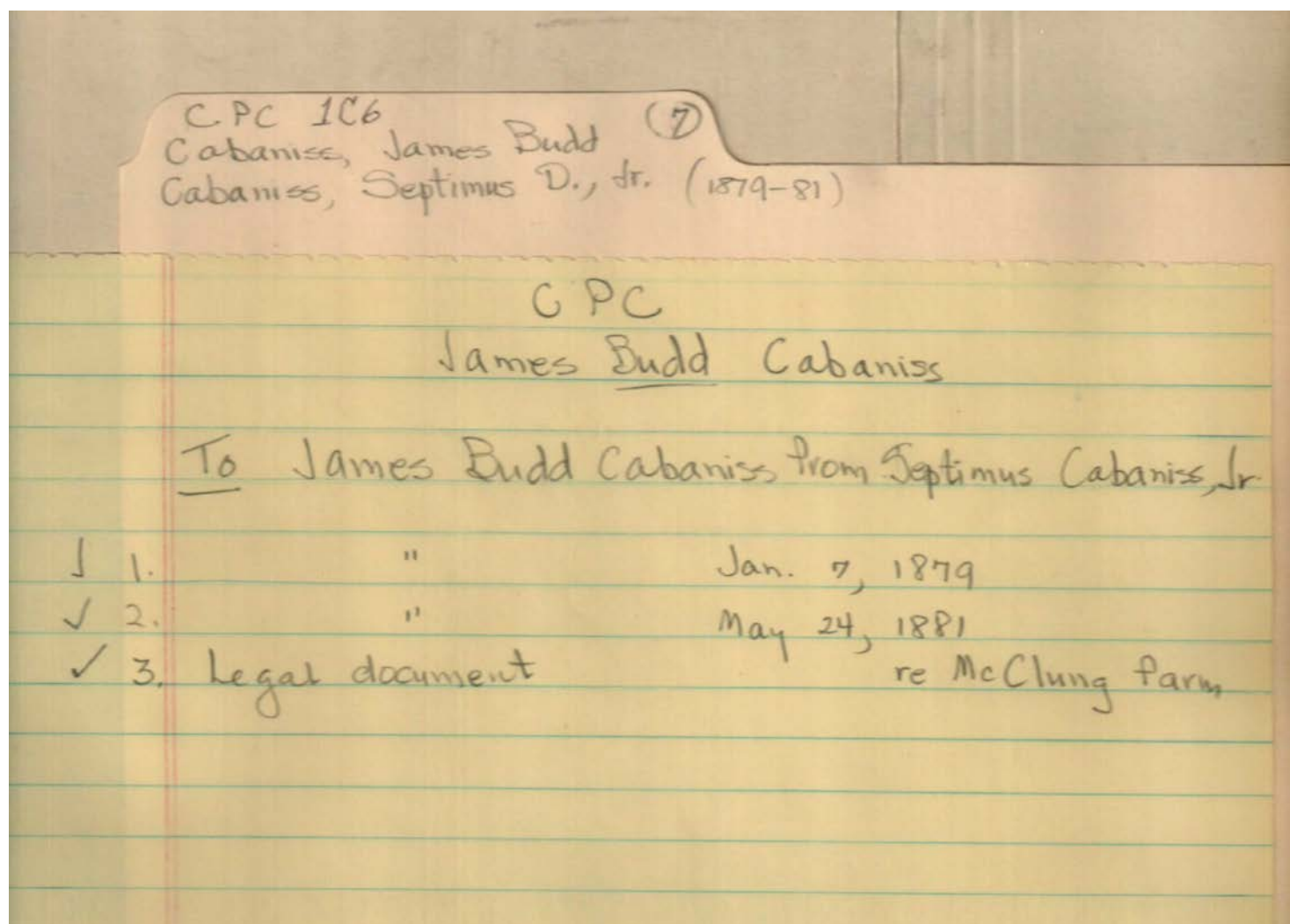

Dear Budd

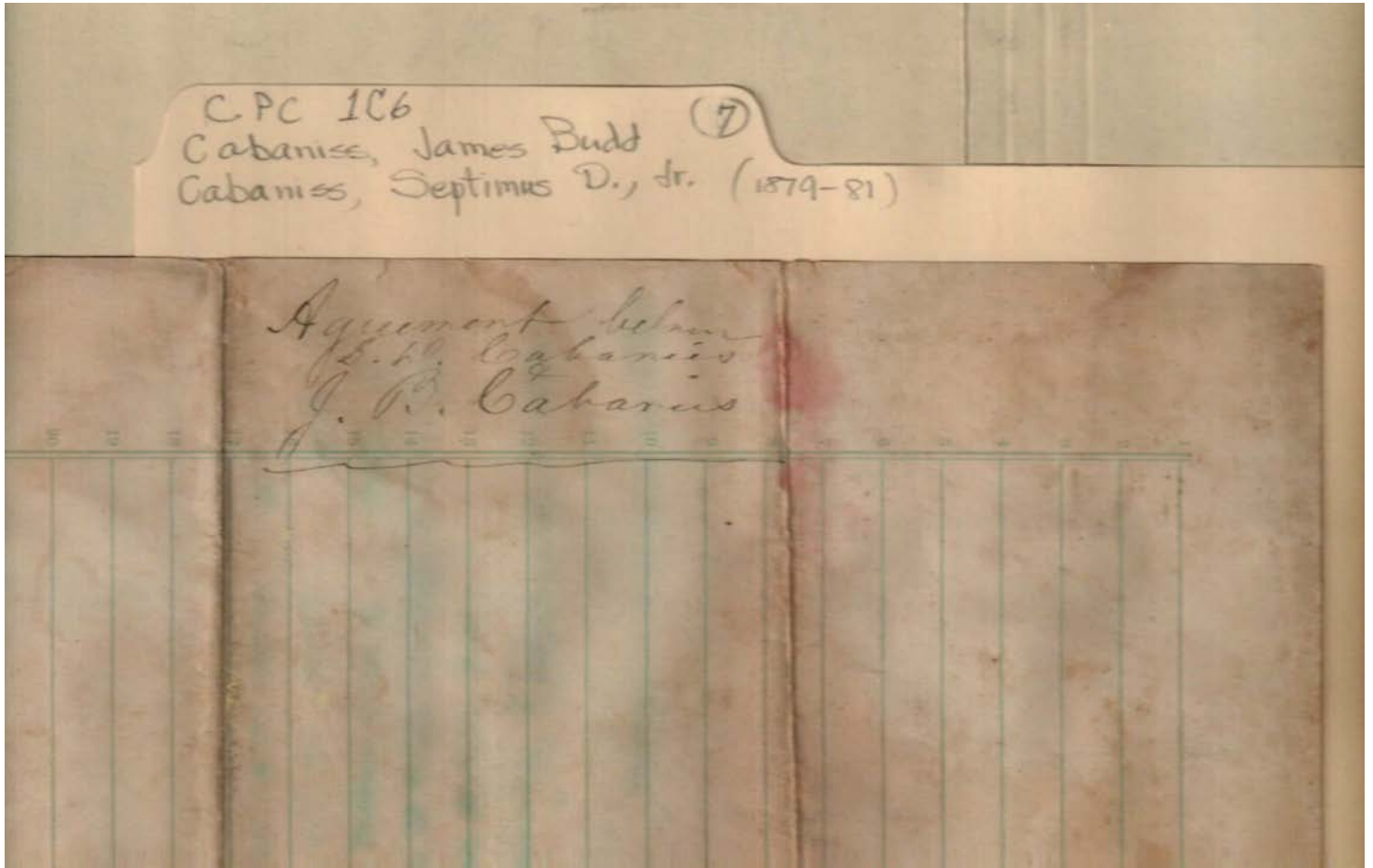

Madison County } This Agreement made
and entered into by and between
S. D. Cabaniss of the first part
and J. B. Cabaniss of the second
part, Witnesseth:
That the said S. D. Cabaniss
for and in consideration of the sum
of One hundred and Ninety six
Dollars (\$196.⁰⁰) paid here by
the said J. B. Cabaniss within
ten days from the delivery of the
rent notes hereinafter mentioned, he
the said S. D. Cabaniss agrees to
put said J. B. Cabaniss in possession
of the tract of land known as the
McClung Farm, situated in said
County & State, and to turn over
to him the rent notes amounting
to five hundred and fifty dollars
(\$550.⁰⁰) being for the year 1896.
Said S. D. Cabaniss also to sur-
render and convey all interest
of whatever kind he may have in and
to the said place. It is further
understood and agreed between the
parties hereto that this contract is
a settlement in full of all in-
debtedness between them, as will
be shown by a statement of
account hereto attached.
