My Dear Cabaniss,

I am infinitely obliged to you for your friendship to me in regard to Young Miller and his sister. He has been under my observation for some time he has been here. I think him a very good scholar and I doubt not I shall find his sister very superior to him. I shall get them home. I am sure they would not like it - I would have them board at the other place and I wish you would ask Mrs Parker if she can accommodate Catherine and Catharine Miller as boarders. Their brother would like to have them board with me (now despite my own mind). This to Mrs. P. that is if you think there is no doubt about their coming and you know about that better than I do. If Mr. P. cannot board them I will leave it with you to do what you think proper.

I rejoice to hear that your health is in any degree improved and I hope the bright eyes of the fair Miss of Westmore will operate still more than your journey to improve your health and cheer your heart. But be careful not to be out too much then damp evenings; for even beauty has no power to secure you against the demon of vapours.

I hope I shall see you at commencement at Cambridge. I shall wish to occupy your room on that day. I believe I have already mentioned in the subject to you before. I wish you would write me and let me know whether you are willing I should have ~~any~~ if I should want, and whether you will be there or like men whether Mr. Parker and wife will be there.
