Dear cousin Fannie:

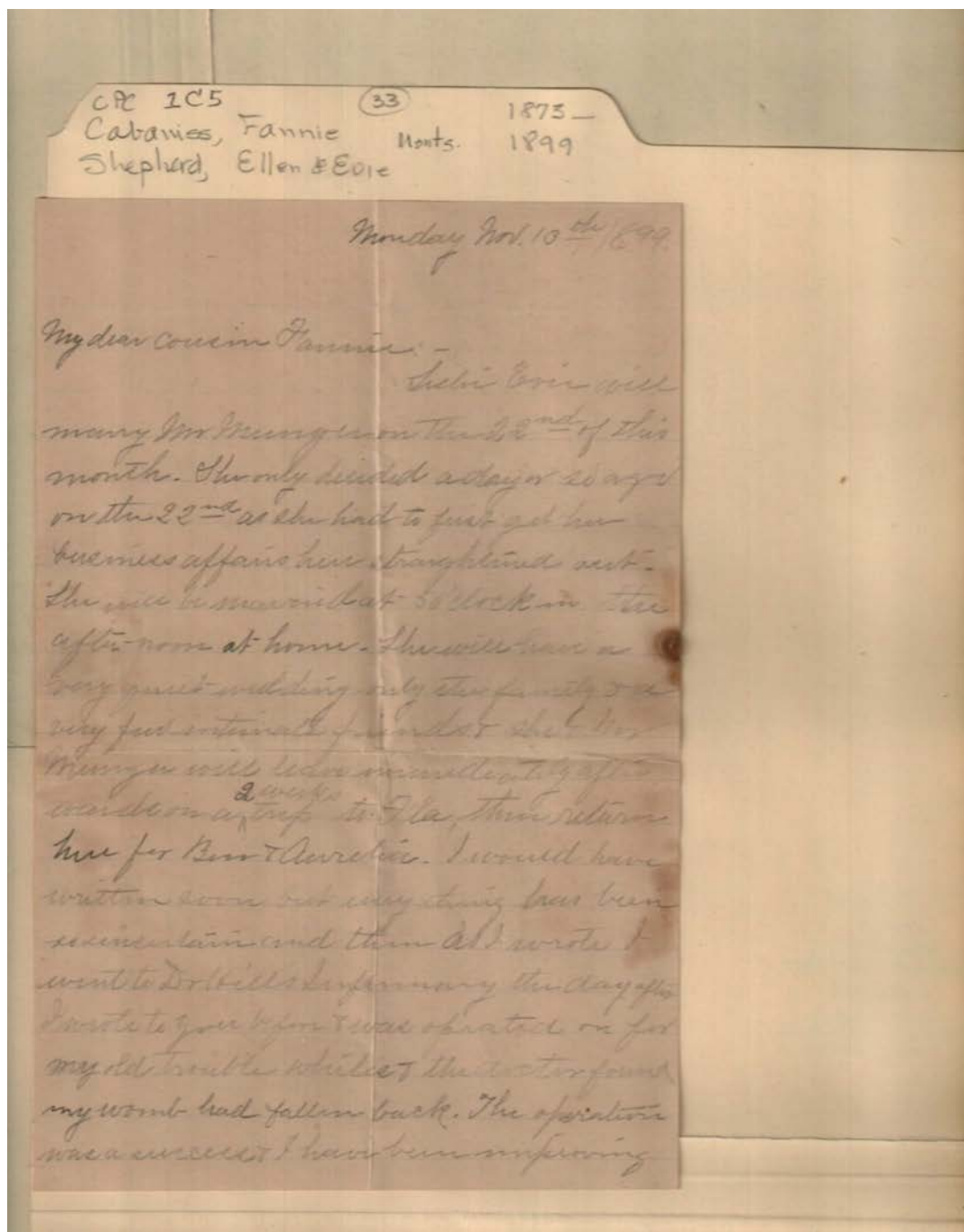
