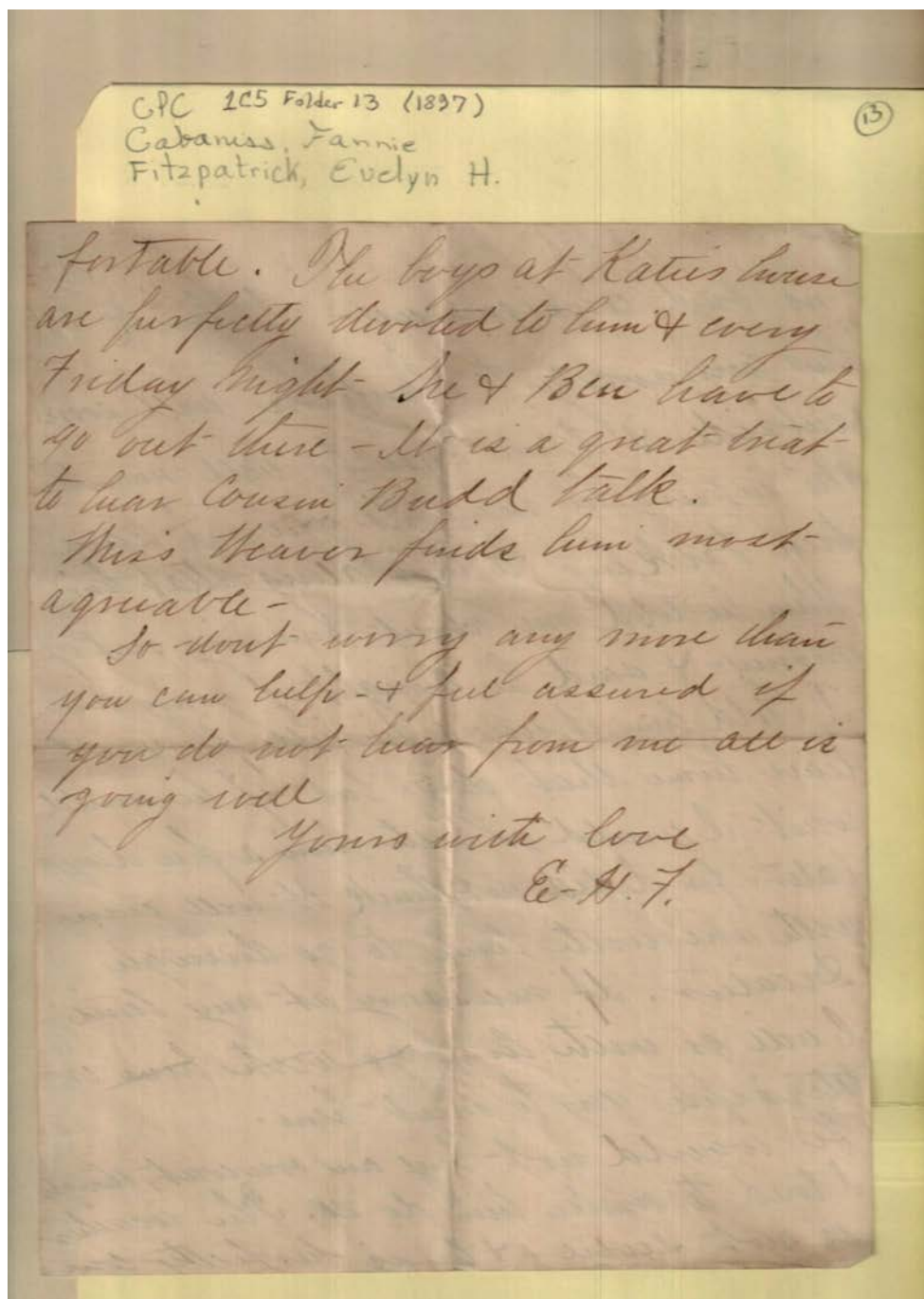
no bad consequences - I think
