scarcely any thing to do with the miners. They
are all Romanists, and besides I cannot speak
their language, and they will not speak ours.
There are great many Germans here. Last winter
died at St John's S. S. there were three sturdy,
Hapsburgian German boys who could not speak
a word of our language, and not one of the
teachers could speak a word of theirs. I
am now looking out for a churchman or
churchwoman who is able and willing to
teach a German class in the school. More
German children would come, I am sure.
We are improving St Luke's chapel, and
it will soon be a very neat as well as com-
fortable place of worship.
I have a postal from Mr Lansden saying
that they had pitched their tent on Lona River
25 miles South of Uvalde. That they were as well
as usual. That wild ducks and turkeys were
plentiful and that he had already bagged a
fine gopher.
You mentioned the death of Mr Johnson.
Was it the son of the late Mr Daniel Johnson?
When you see Mrs Lox please give her my
best regards.

Dear Fanny:

Yours of the 29th January received. I am very thankful that none of you have taken the fever which has been prevailing in Huntsville. What is supposed to be the cause of the fever?

I was vaccinated last week, and my arm is very sore, so sore that it makes me nervous and irritable. It is the first time within my recollection that vaccination has taken on me. I have a good scar on my right arm. This is my first.

Saturday night I sat up a part of the night with a consumptive who has rooms in a house once occupied by Genl Albert Sidney Johnson, and Genl R. E. Lee. It was Genl Lee's quarters in '61, when he decided to resign his Commission in the Federal Army.

I beg that you all will take good care of yourselves.

Your letter of the 27th and Aunt Bet's of the 26th of Feb'y received last night.

I Mr McQueen wishes the records which Mrs Robertson can me let him have them, if not, keep them in a safe place for me. I see his letter and have ever since been looking out for a day that I could devote to the matter.

None of the little Parishes or Missions except Abilene, furnished a blank book (as was their duty to do) for keeping a record of Baptisms, Confirmations, Communicants, Marriages deaths &c. I kept private memoranda to be transferred to the Register whenever it should be supplied. I have these memoranda among my papers, but it will require some time to make a copy. fell recently.

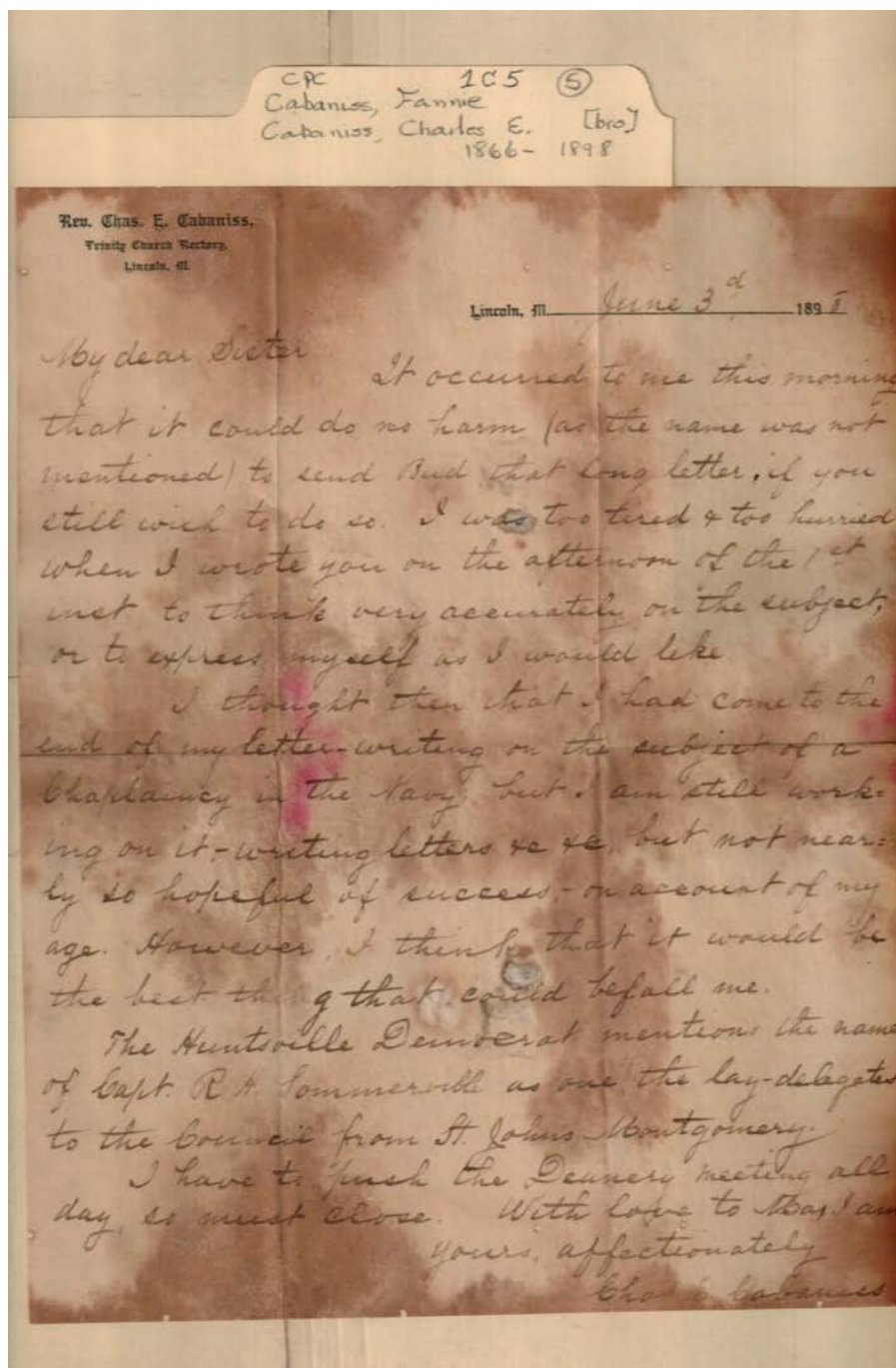
