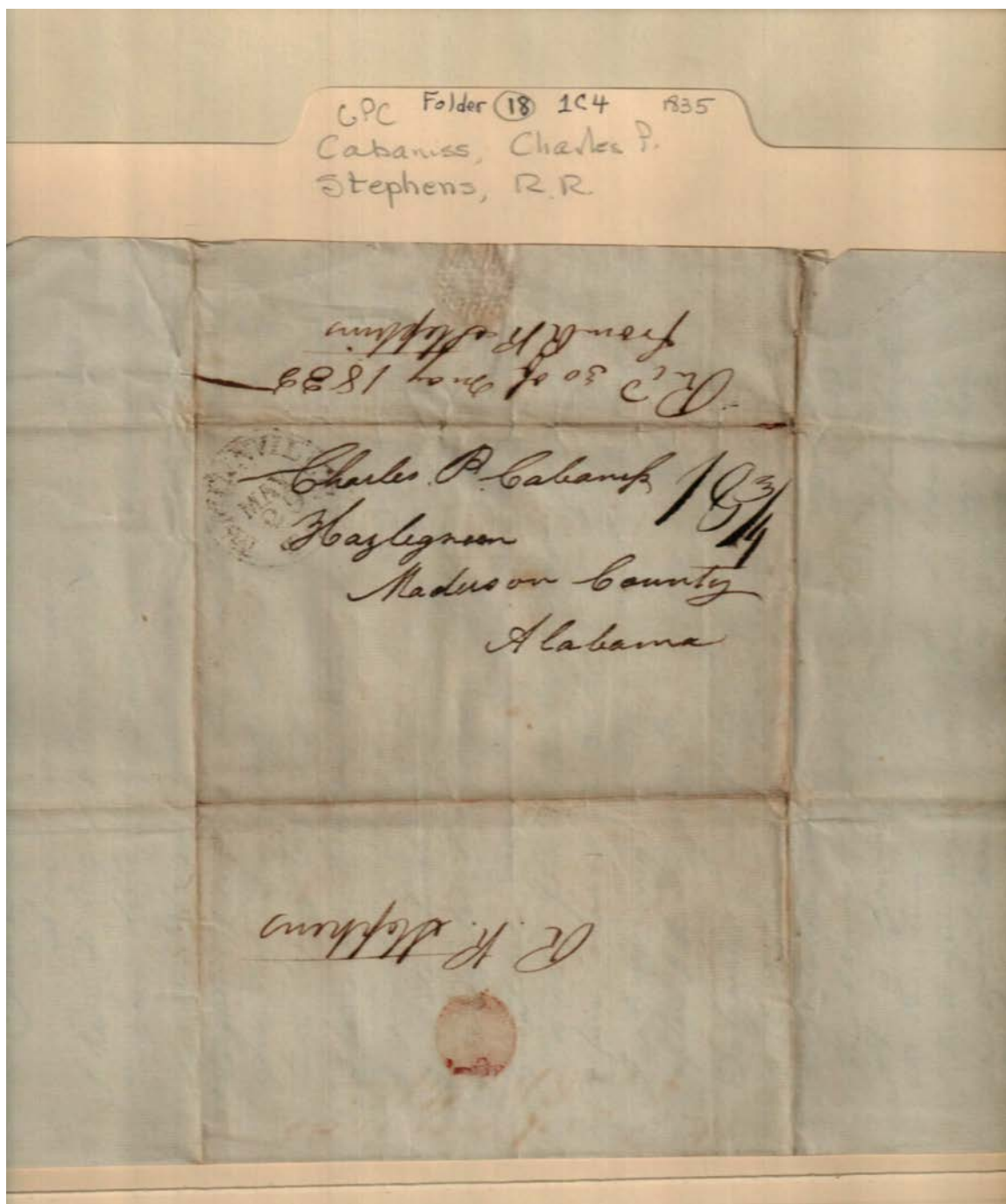

I have so long neglected giving you an answer
to your last that I am left with out any

thoughts I now take the opportunity to say from
you that I am well as I have been for some
time hoping these lines will find you well

I can think of nothing of importance
I was at church last night & saw some very
fine girls they drew my attention a
great deal more than the preaching there
is a very fine female school here now
& fine chance of girls comes to it that is
just begining to think a bout the boys
after I recd your last I saw Miss
Judyann Jewell I gave her your
best respects she thanked me kindly
and told me to be sure and return
the same Compliments to you
she is going to school in Winchester
at this time I told her I would
write to you where she was living when

before the session was out
