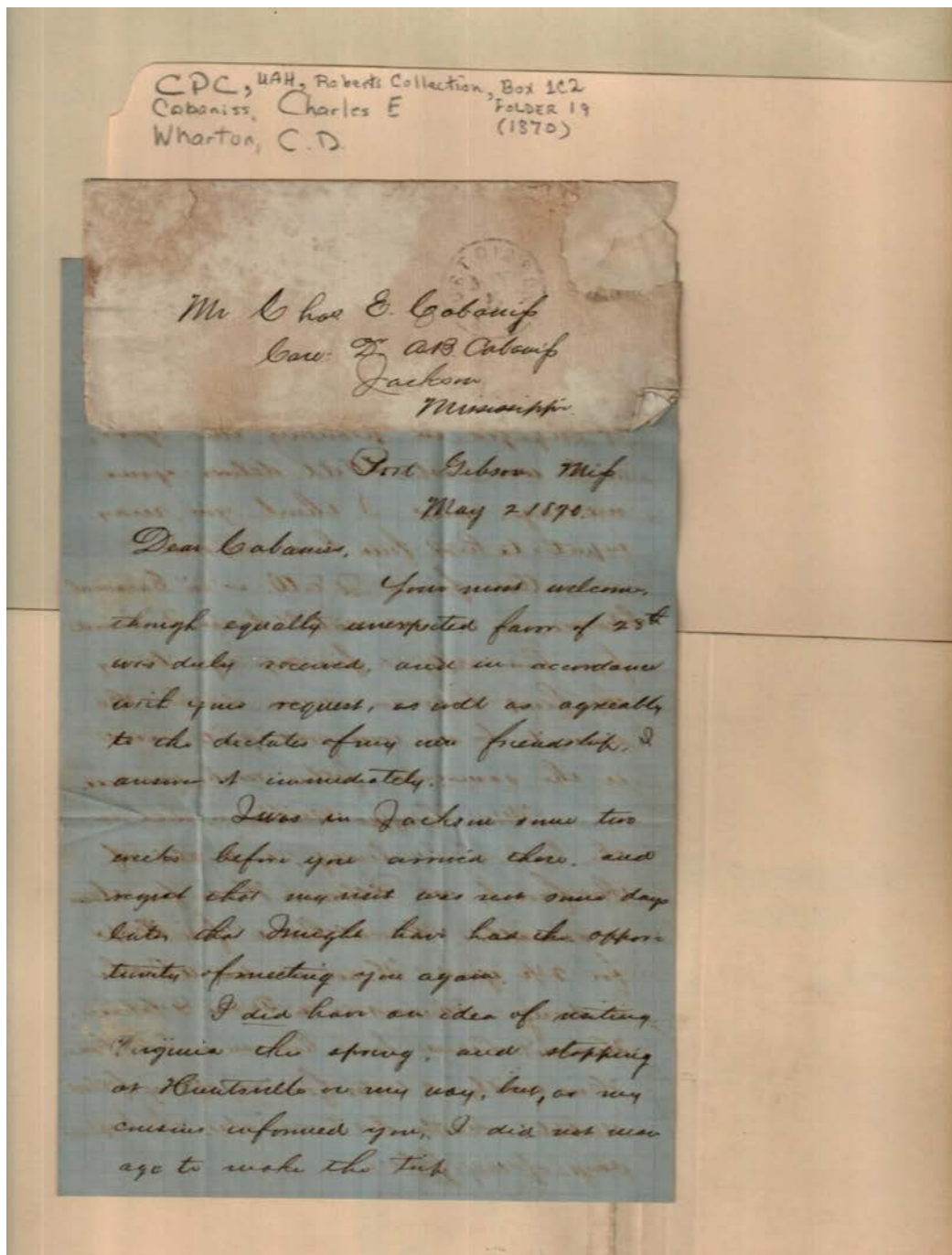

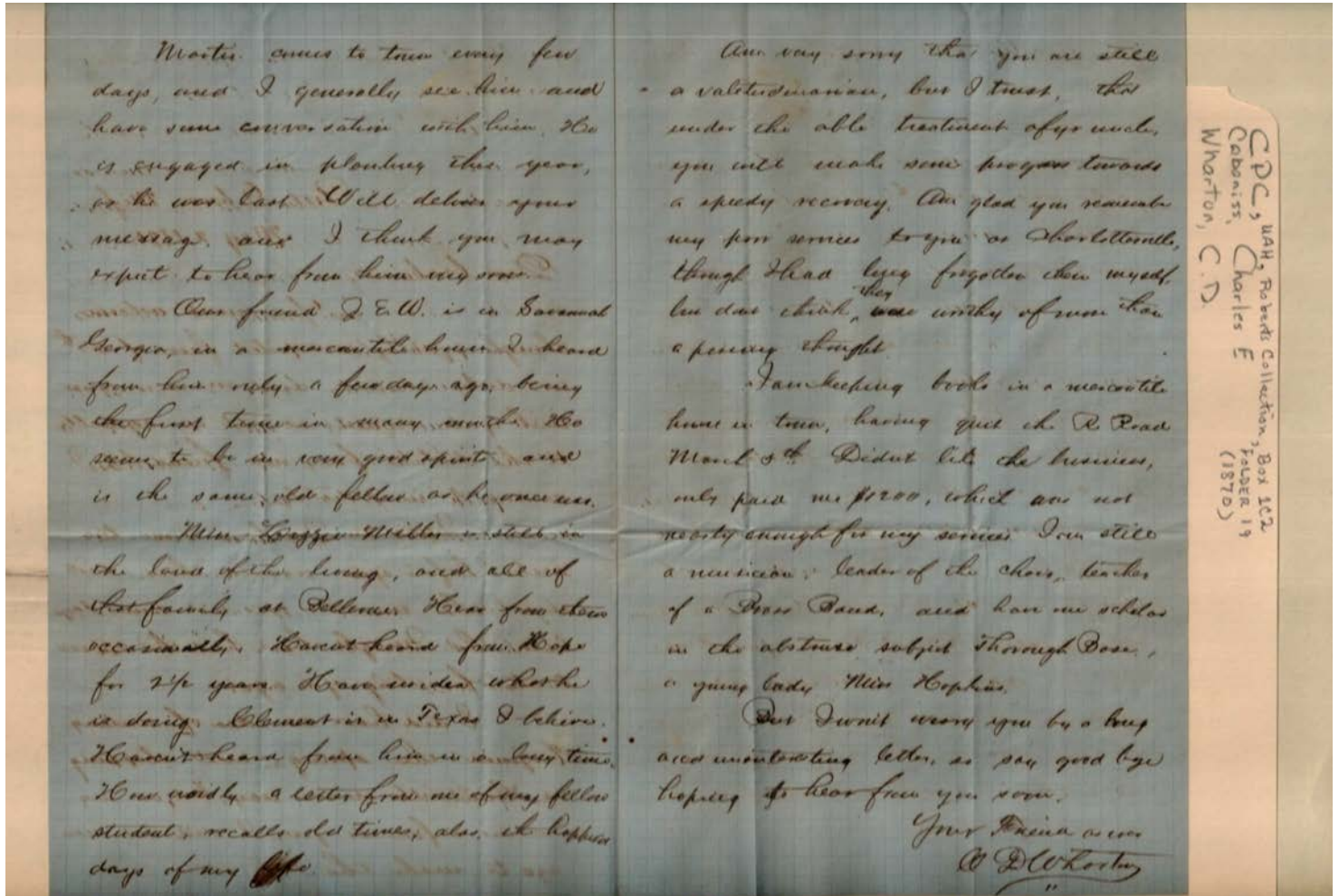

Master comes to town every few days, and I generally see him, and have some conversation with him. He is engaged in planting this year, as he was last. Will deliver your message, and I think you may expect to hear from him very soon.

Our friend J. E. W. is in Savannah Georgia, in a mercantile house. I heard from him only a few days ago, being the first time in many months. He seems to be in very good spirits, and is the same old fellow as he ever was.

Miss Lizzie Miller is still in the land of the living, and all of that family at Delaware. Have from them occasionally. Haven't heard from Hope for 2 1/2 years. Haven't decided whether he is doing. Clement is in Texas I believe. Haven't heard from him in a long time.

Have rec'd by a letter from one of my fellow students, recalls old times, also, the happy days of my life.

Am very sorry that you are still a valetudinarian, but I trust, that under the able treatment of your uncle, you will make some progress towards a speedy recovery. Am glad you remember my poor services to you at Shortlittsville, though I had long forgotten them myself. You don't think, ^{they} were worthy of more than a passing thought.

I am keeping books in a mercantile house in town, having quit the R. Road Mount St. Did not like the business, only paid me \$1200, which was not nearly enough for my services. I am still a musician: leader of the choir, teacher of a Brass Band, and have no scholars in the abstract subject through Bose, a young lady, Miss Hopkins.

But I won't weary you by a long and uninteresting letter, so say good bye, hoping to hear from you soon.
