Dear Charles -

Mr John H. Russell expects to start to Morgan county to morrow morning and promises to bear this to you - Genl Taylor having summoned all the forces in his department to Genl Canby. It will be proper for you to go in to Huntsville and report yourself to the Military authorities stating the circumstances of your case - that is explaining to them that you were embraced in the Surrender - that the Board of Surgeons of the Hospital at Marion gave you a furlough for 60 days that you might go to the Mountains in Morgan for your health & recommended that you should be discharged but that he surrendered his forces before acting upon the recommendation of the Board of Surgeons. I presume that you can be paroled at Huntsville - but if that is not in Genl Canby's department & they refuse to parole you on that account, they will doubtless suffer you to appear before the Commissioners when they may be sent to parole the Confederate troops in the Tennessee valley -

So soon as I can get may be paroled and can get company I will start homeward - unless I go to Calhoun County on business. It may be several weeks before I can come but it is not probable that I will start soon -

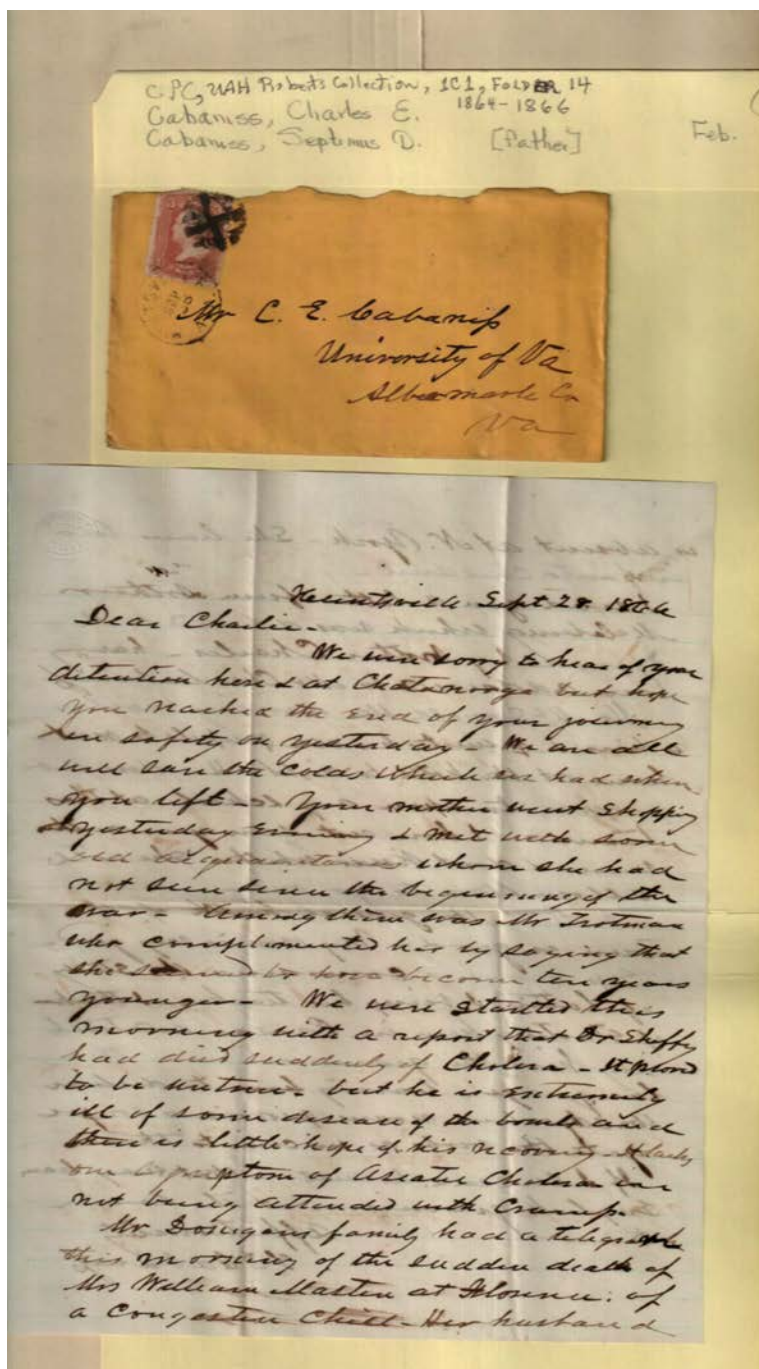

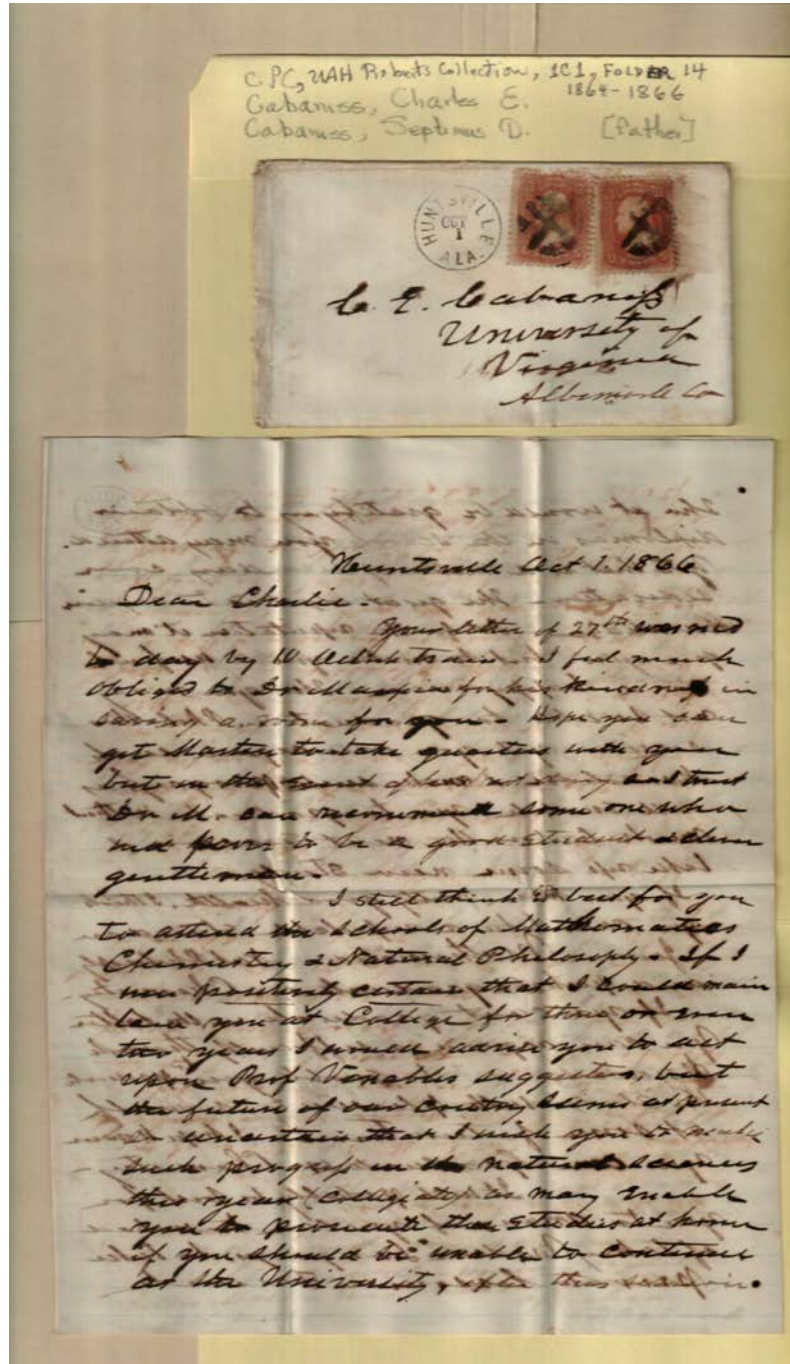

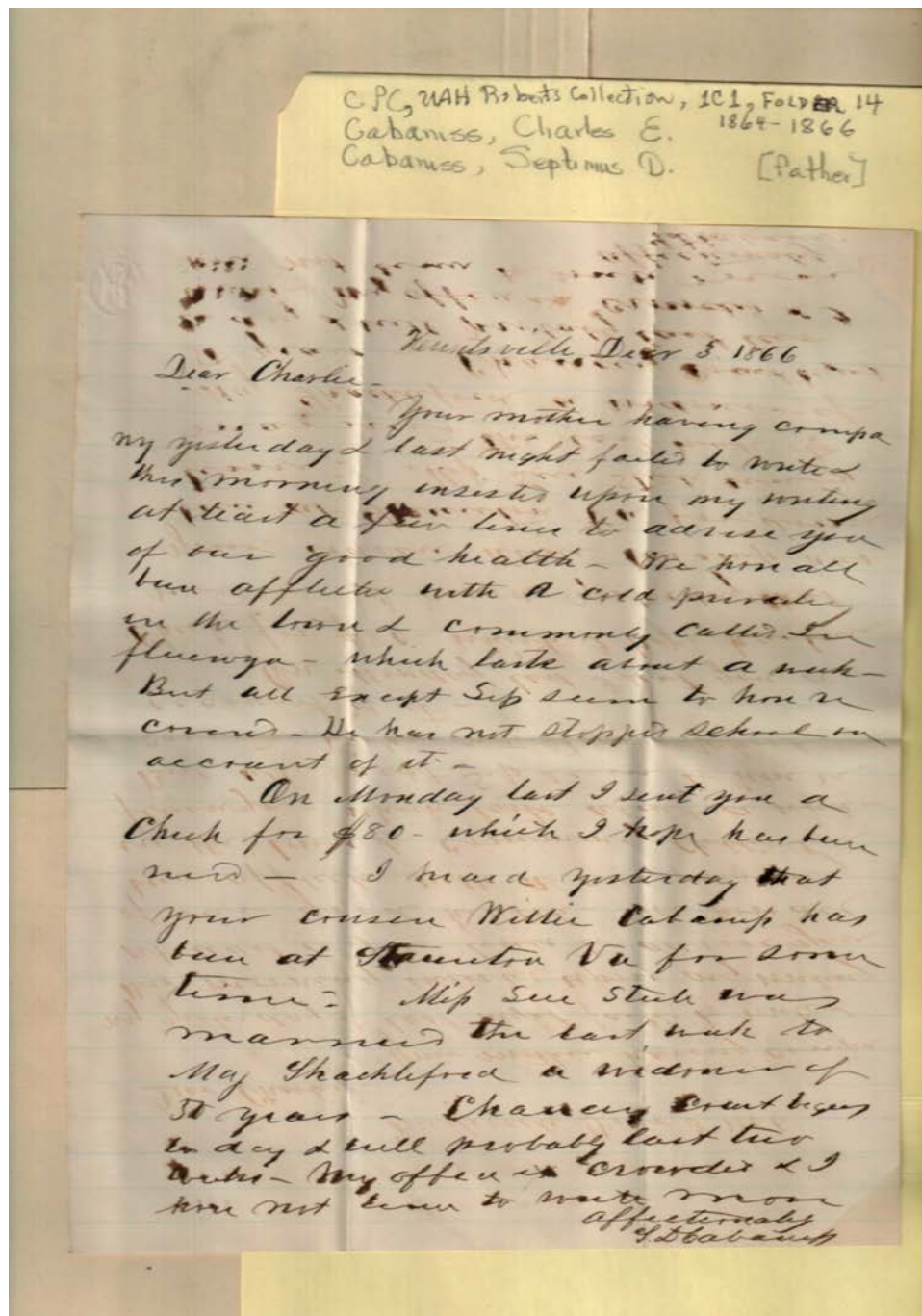
