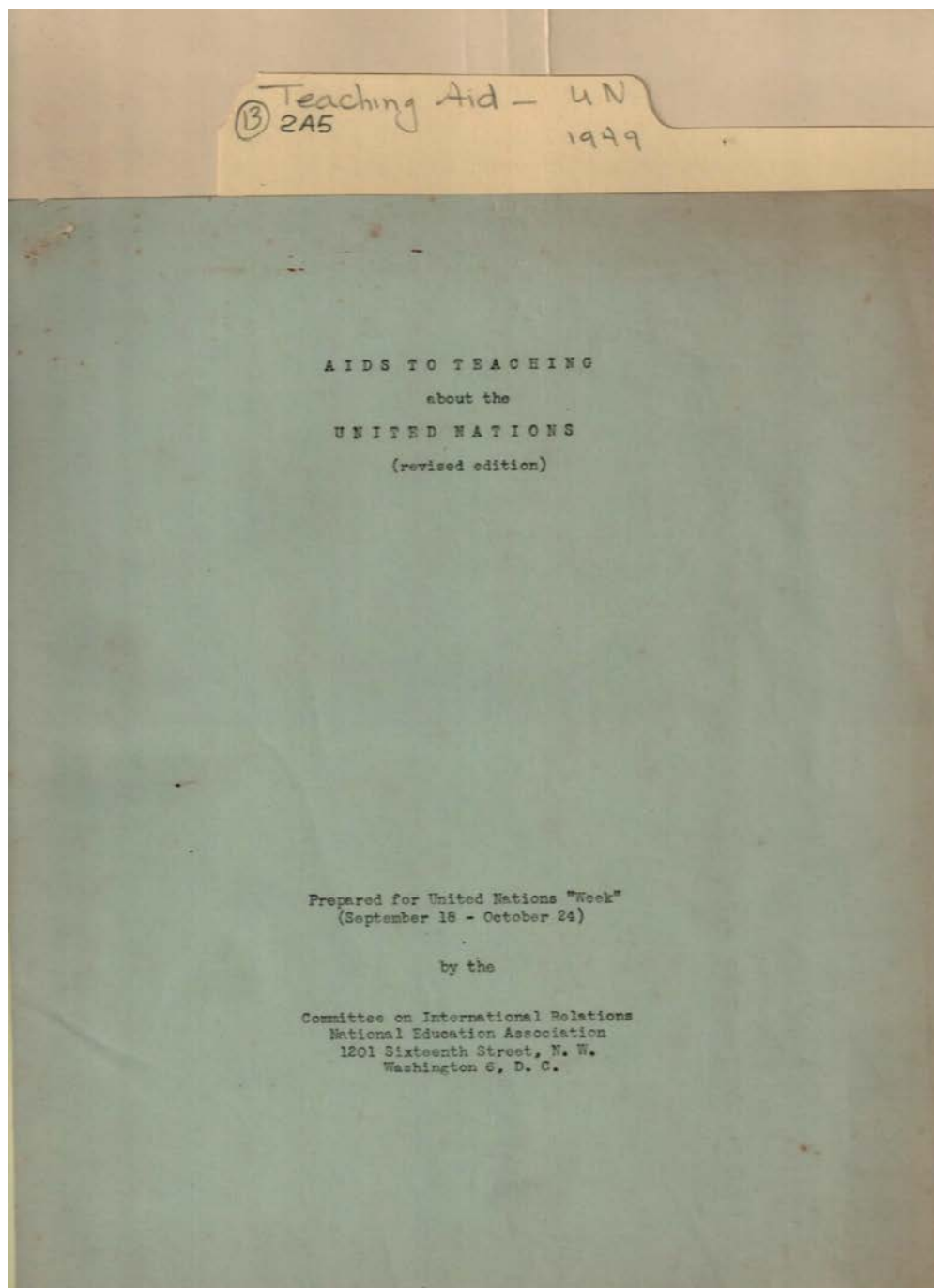

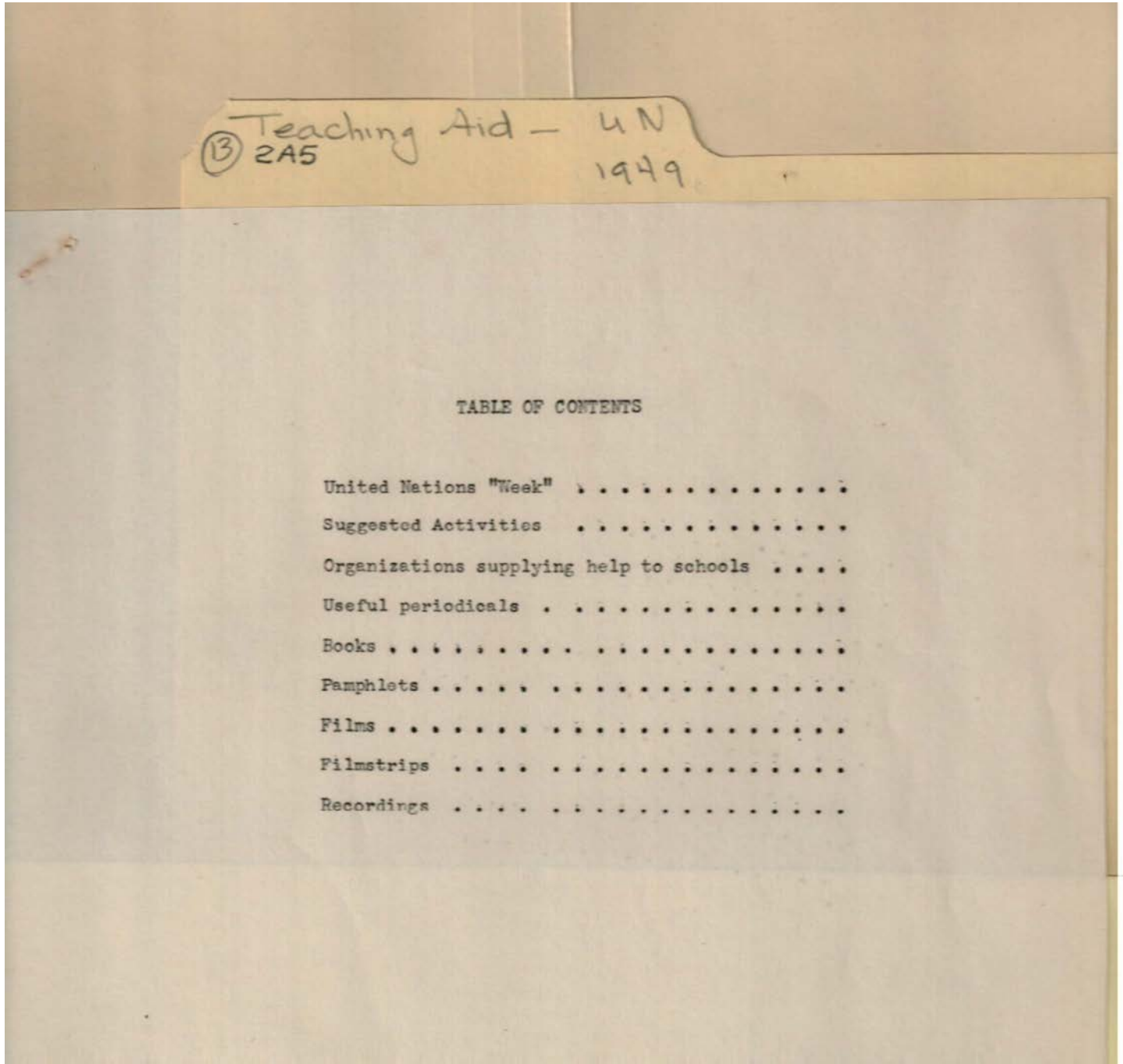

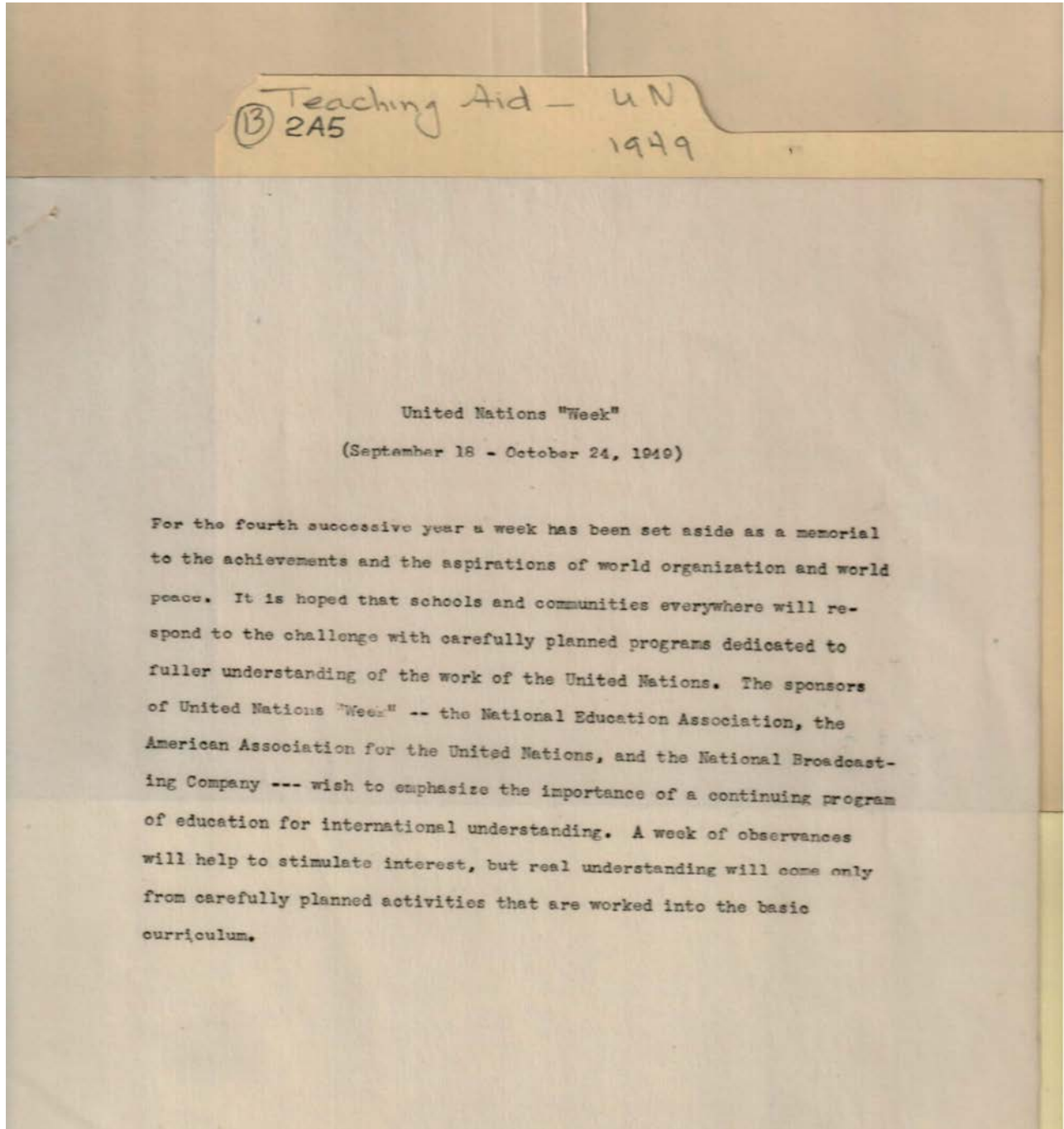

United Nations "Week"
(September 18 - October 24, 1949)

For the fourth successive year a week has been set aside as a memorial to the achievements and the aspirations of world organization and world peace. It is hoped that schools and communities everywhere will respond to the challenge with carefully planned programs dedicated to fuller understanding of the work of the United Nations. The sponsors of United Nations "Week" -- the National Education Association, the American Association for the United Nations, and the National Broadcasting Company --- wish to emphasize the importance of a continuing program of education for international understanding. A week of observances will help to stimulate interest, but real understanding will come only from carefully planned activities that are worked into the basic curriculum.

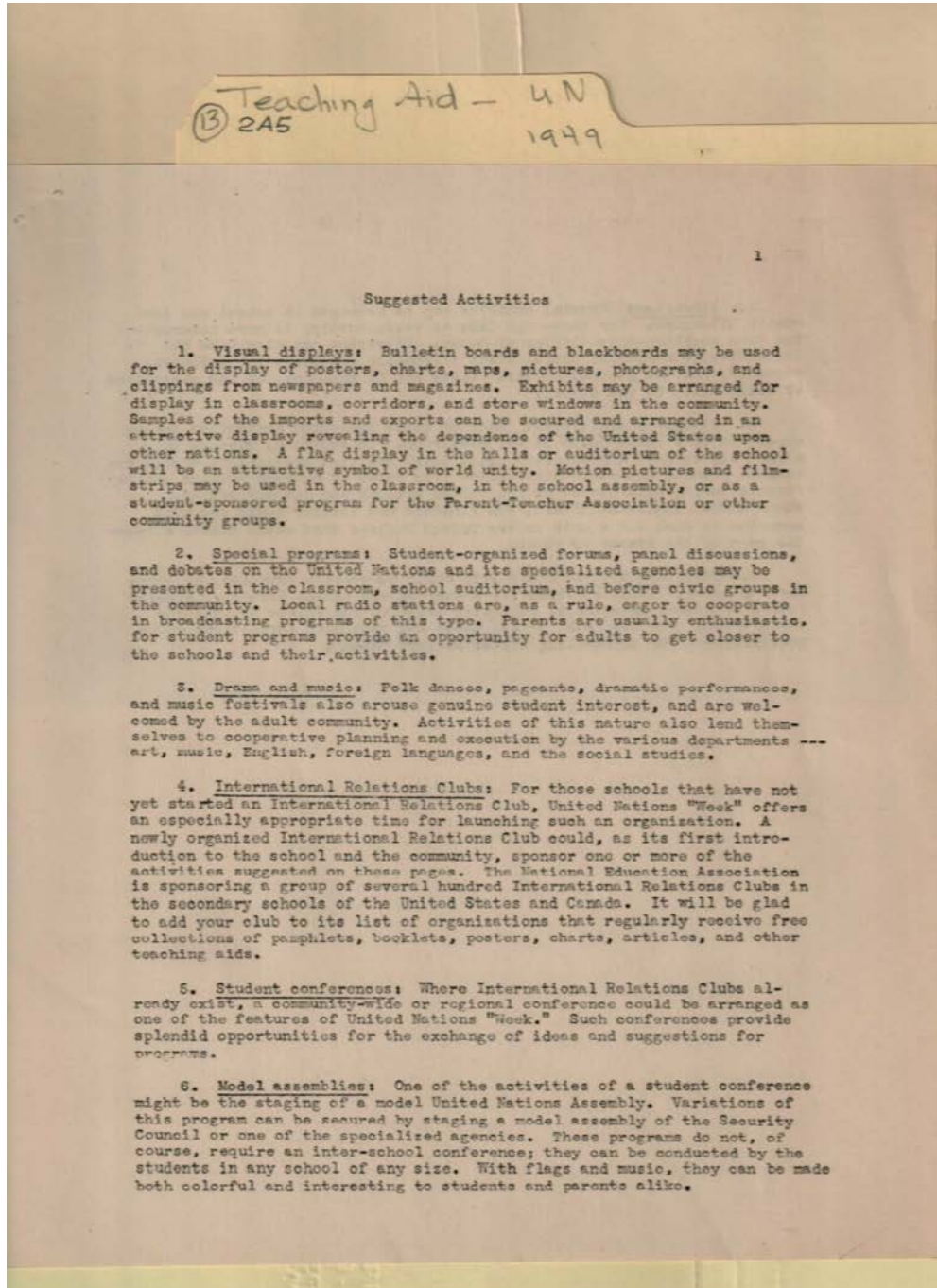

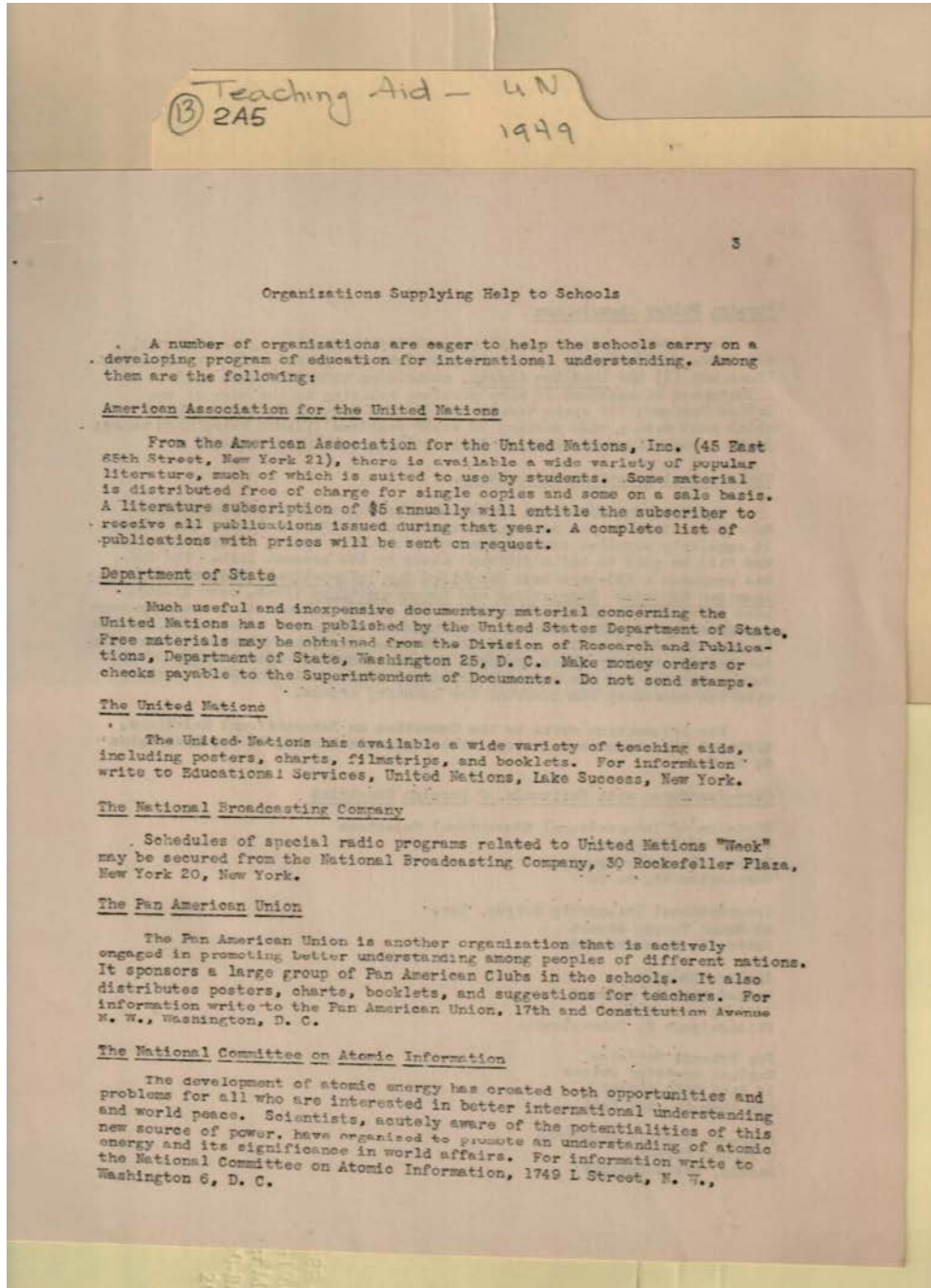

7. Libraries: Special exhibits can be arranged in school and community libraries. For those who like to read, nothing is more interesting than an attractive display of books. Libraries can also take the initiative in compiling useful lists of reading materials for teachers, students, and the general public. These can be mimeographed and circulated at small cost to the school.

8. Classroom activities: Many of these suggested activities can be conducted on a small scale in any classroom. In addition, classes in almost any subject and at every grade level can find appropriate topics for special reports and class discussion. The study of current affairs can be focused during this period on the United Nations and its activities. Perhaps most important of all, the students and teacher could use this occasion to work out a unit on the United Nations that could become a regular part of the course of study.

10. Other activities: This list could be greatly expanded, as every teacher knows. Guest speakers for classroom and school assembly, special issues of school newspapers, contests, trips to the United Nations for those living near New York --- all these and many more suggestions offer possibilities for celebrating United Nations "Week".
