ALEXANDER SPOTSWOOD

COLONEL William Byrd II, who was given to uneasy nights, wrote in his diary for June 21, 1710: "I dreamed I saw a flaming star in the air at which I was frightened . . . I fear this portends some judgment to this country or at least to myself."

It may have been an omen, for that afternoon Byrd learned that a new governor had landed in Hampton Roads, a man with whom the master of Westover was to contend for power for more than ten years. The governor was Alexander Spotswood, at thirty-four a veteran soldier who was to become one of the most able and versatile leaders in Virginia history—architect, town planner, frontier fighter and friend of the Indians, promoter of western expansion, iron miner, foe of greedy landowners, and, at last, a landed Virginian himself.

Byrd, who saw Spotswood the next day, found him courteous and "a very good man," a judgment he would amend.

The new governor came from a Scottish family prominent in religion and politics. One of his ancestors had been a close associate of John Knox, and Alexander's grandfather, a well-known lawyer, had been executed for his loyalty to Charles I. Alexander was born at Tangier, the son of a British Army surgeon, and had been in the army himself since the age of seventeen. He kept as a souvenir the cannon ball that had struck him at the Battle of Blenheim.

Spotswood had pleasant features, a long face with high forehead and a small mouth, which turned up at the corners, at least when he sat for his portrait. Virginia's officials who watched as he took his oath in Williamsburg thought him affable indeed. He wrote home his private thoughts of

Wiegand Plaque To Be Presented to Church

A white marble plaque honoring the late Professor John Wiegand, an accomplished musician who performed under the batons of such music greats as Richard Wagner and Johann Strauss, will be presented Sunday at the Independent Presbyterian Church, where Wiegand served as organist and choirmaster.

The plaque is being presented by Mrs. Robert Bolling Cabaniss, the former Marie Wiegand, as a tribute to her father, who was composer of more than 1,000 sacred and secular works which have been played and sung throughout the world dating from 1862.

Wiegand, who was organist and choirmaster at Independent Presbyterian from 1902 to 1915, was a violinist in the Berlin (Germany) Opera House Orchestra at the age of 14 when he played alongside his father, Jacob Wiegand.

In 1859, when he was 18, he sailed to the United States and became one of the founders of the original New York Symphony.

Prior to the 11 a.m. weekly Sunday service, the plaque along with photographs of Wiegand and his family and a number of original manuscripts will be exhibited in the entranceway to the sanctuary of the church.

Photographs, together with several original manuscripts and their printed copies, are being given to the church's archives by Mrs. Cabaniss and her son, Charles Wiegand Cabaniss.

Several of Wiegand's compositions will be played and sung during the service, including an excerpt from a major 1897 work which was broadcast in 1946 by the Longines Symphonette under the direction of Michele Pastro.

Mrs. Cabaniss, the youngest of the five daughters and two sons of Wiegand and Mrs. Marie Magdalene Doering Wiegand, is the only one of the children living today. She was born Nov. 12, 1892. *Died Nov. 13, 1981.*

One of her sisters was Lucy Wiegand, Mrs. J.C. Lewis, whose son is Savannah business executive J. Curtis Lewis Jr., who also is a former mayor of Savannah.

Born in 1841 at Homburg, Germany, Wiegand started piano and violin lessons at an early age with his father. In 1855, he launched his musical career as a violinist in the Berlin Opera House Orchestra, which was conducted by Ludwig Spohr.

In 1859 at the age of 18, Wiegand learned of a popular demand for more symphonic music in America.

He packed his three, old, family violins and set sail. Following his efforts to help found the New York Symphony, Wiegand was in the orchestra led by Theodore Thomas and which made the first symphonic tour of the United States. During this tour, he saw the South during Reconstruction.

Later he composed orchestral, choral, organ, piano and harp works that were published by all of the major houses in America.

Wiegand's older brother, George Wiegand, was a conductor of the More on Page 12, Col. 4

Plaque Will Honor Wiegand

Band-on-the-Mail in New York's Central Park and was a composer of band music and taught Edwin Franco Goldman, who later became a famed bandmaster.

In 1872, Wiegand married Marie Magdalene Doering of Cassel, Germany, and they settled in Augusta. They and their seven children moved to Savannah in 1898.

Both Wiegand and his son John Jr. were 32nd Degree Honorary Life Masons and together served a combined 84 years as organists for the Savannah lodges. Much of the step degree music in the Order of Freemasonry was composed by Wiegand.

He continued to compose until his death on March 15, 1923. His last composition was "Sunset and Evening Star," also known as "Crossing the Bar."

Church Supervises Wiegand Memorial For Scholarships

The trustees of Independent Presbyterian Church have agreed to supervise a music memorial scholarship fund opened by the daughter and grandson of John Wiegand, the church's organist from 1902 until his retirement at 74 in 1915.

The first contribution to the fund was given by Professor Wiegand's only surviving child, Marie Cabaniss, and his grandson, Charles Wiegand Cabaniss.

Donations will be tax deductible and will be made payable to the church for the Wiegand Scholarship Fund. Once the fund reaches the necessary size, annual scholarship awards are to be made by a panel of judges.

The contestants will be presented in recitals, adding a dimension to the musical and cultural life of Savannah that the sponsors wish the fund to foster.

Before coming to Savannah from Augusta in 1898, this distinguished musician and composer served 30 years as organist and choirmaster at St. Paul's Episcopal Church there. He became organist-choirmaster at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist on arrival in Savannah, a post he left to take the Presbyterian church position.

Professor Wiegand, as he was called, was born in Homburg, Germany and moved to New York at 18, where he played violin in the orchestra that became the New York Symphony.

He composed more than 1,000 sacred and secular works, many of which were published and continue to be used today.



Biographical Data


Professor John Wiegand (1841-1923) created over a half century of music that spanned over half the globe from Rosburg and Doering to New York, Augusta, and finally 24 West Harris Street, Savannah. A violin prodigy at fourteen, he played under the batons of Wagner and Strauss. Becoming an accomplished pianist and organist by eighteen added to his versatility and led to his teaching profession; and subsequently, to his prolific compositions - over one thousand publications. While in Augusta, Georgia, he led a partnership in the Wiegand Brother's Music Store and became the father of seven children.

Thirteen years (1902-1915) of the very peak of his career were spent as organist and choirmaster of The Independent Presbyterian Church of Savannah, during which time, he composed organ preludes, choral anthems, and light piano concerts with his publications flourishing.
