Dear Mr Mayor,

I am trying to trace the descendants of an Alexander Greet who settled in your City of Haverhill many years ago, and I wondered if you could help me. Perhaps, in your Church Records, Burial Records, or Baptismal Records there may be some record of him and his family.

Over the last few months I have had many enquiries about this family, and from information given to me, Alexander Greet settled in your area. Alexander Greet, is or was the brother of or a son of, a Thomas Young Greet who was Mayor of our Ancient Borough (Charter Date 1369).

Alexander Greet is thought to have settled in Haverhill about the end or during the Civil War. He had a large estate and slaves. I have also been informed that he married into a large family bearing the name of Rich? I have traced many branches of the family, but Alexander seems very elusive.

Perhaps your Church Records, perhaps the Alder members of your population may remember to hearing the name, as it is not a very common one. Thomas Young Greet was Mayor of Queensborough for eleven years from 1815-1829 when he died whilst in Office.

The name Greet may be incorporated as a Christian as appears in several branches that have been traced. I append a few examples for you to see.

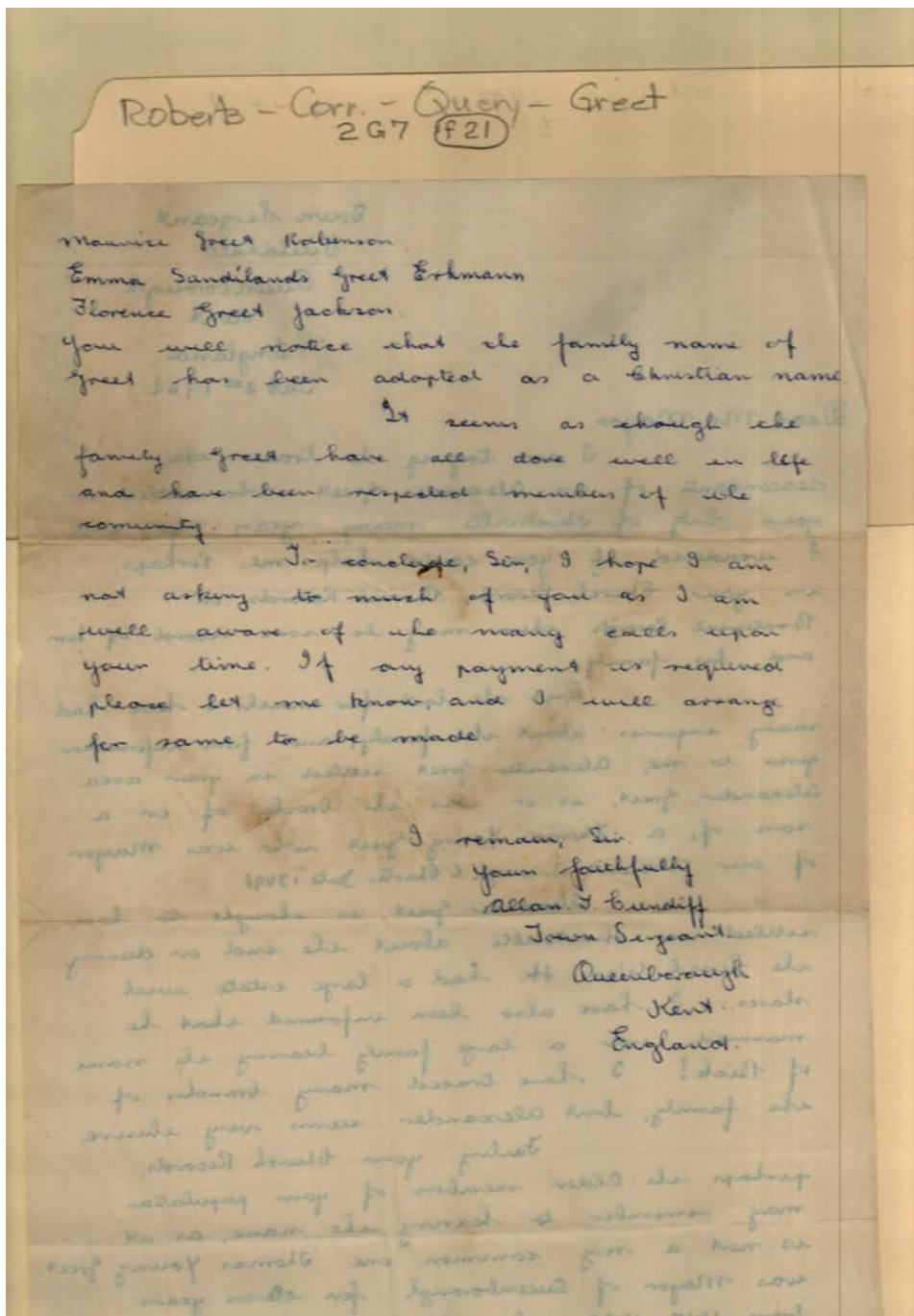
