Comments made by John Hendricks, founder, CEO, and Chairman of Discovery Communications, Inc., upon receiving the NEA's Friend of Education Award from NEA President Keith Geiger.

July 3, 1993 San Francisco, California

Thank you, Keith.

I consider this award a great honor because it is bestowed by an organization that represents civilization's most cherished profession -- teaching. And so it is that teachers, who have inspired me since my public school days in Alabama, have now come to grant me a memory of a lifetime here in San Francisco. I thank you all very deeply for this treasured event.

I have been asked to address you here for a few moments on the subject of television in education.

I think it is safe to say that all of us gathered here recognize the tremendous promise of television to teach. Who among us doubts the attention that a television screen can command when it is placed in front of a child or teenager.

Television can engage students emotionally through storytelling and can create lasting impressions through a rich blend of sight, sound, color and motion. But most importantly, television can ignite curiosity and prompt students to hit the books and find out more. When that happens under the guidance of a teacher, patterns can be established for a lifetime of learning.

And, so considering all the great promise of television, why is it that this medium has been so poorly deployed for the purpose of education in this country? Just as keenly as we all sense the promise of the medium, we likewise are acutely aware that this medium is being largely used in this nation for mindless diversion of little redeeming value.

It is as though all of us who value education and the learning experience are being held hostage by some force that produces mediocrity in primetime. It is also a force that just this week caused Congress to hold hearings on excessive and gratuitous violence in programming delivered uninvited into homes every evening.

What is this force that has handicapped the television medium since its beginnings in this country?

This force by which we are held hostage is very simply the viewing habits and tastes of a slim majority of our fellow Americans.

Like it or not, those of us in America who would welcome quality educational programming in primetime are in the minority. On any given night in America, 48 percent of us choose to watch something other than the programming of the big three networks or we watch nothing at all. 52 percent of Americans, the cumulative viewing share of the free over-the air networks, apparently love the sitcoms and the other offerings of "free" television.

Ladies and gentlemen of this convention, may I suggest to you that when you get something for free, you get what you pay for.

Television has developed as a medium with two serious technological weaknesses and disadvantages as compared with publishing.

First, unlike a bookstore, national delivery capacity on broadcasting has produced only five choices -- four commercial networks and PBS. Imagine going into a bookstore and finding only five books available at the moment.

A second weakness, and again unlike a bookstore, is that the technological ability to purchase a single television show delivered by broadcasting is not possible. Now, imagine a bookstore with five books on the shelf and the store owner cannot sell you any of the five books. The technology does not exist for the store owner to carry out a purchase transaction. The only thing he can do is to give you the books free.

Imagine if you could not buy a book. The only way books could be supported would be by advertising or by government support. Now, consider visiting that imaginary bookstore with five books and finding four books full of advertisements and content designed to appeal only to the tastes of the majority of readers. In this fantasy world of publishing, we would have a starved culture indeed.

But what about cable? I must return to our bookstore analogy. Imagine that paltry bookstore with only five free books available. But one day it was possible to roll in a magazine rack holding 40 magazines you could actually purchase. Supported by subscription revenue and advertising, these magazines would prove to be a big hit with consumers, offering more choice and variety. Today, the magazine rack is largely the world of cable. ESPN, CNN, and Discovery are supported by the same economics that support print magazines like Sports Illustrated, Newsweek, and National Geographic Magazine.

But friends, five free books and a magazine rack does not a bookstore make. Where are the books for sale? Where are the 6,000 books that a typical bookstore

offers each customer that walks in the door? Where is the history section with 900 titles or the science section with 500 titles.

Well, I am pleased to report that the development of digital cable television in this country will at last break down the technological barriers and produce a true video bookstore and video library for households and classrooms.

Digital television will accomplish this feat by offering dramatically more video choices ... choices that you can actually purchase on a per-program basis, — just like buying a book at the bookstore. In the beginning, there will not be 6,000 choices — like at the bookstore — but there will be as many as 500. But, by the year 2000, many homes and schools will have immediate, random access to over 6,000 video and multimedia products. Television will at last have begun to fulfill its promise. We will get what we pay for... it will not be free...just as we don't expect books in the bookstore to be free.

The programming efforts of my company, which you have been so kind to recognize today, are not free -- rather they are made possible through the monthly payment of a bill by cable subscribers across the nation. 58 million households fund The Discovery Channel. 22 million households now fund The Learning Channel. Thus, we are not dependent on ratings for survival, we are dependent on viewers who vote for quality with their dollars.

There is a lesson here for schools. As we develop television and video programs for school use, we must not venture far down the path of free ratings supported educational television. We will get what we pay for.

I suggest that we instead work together to create and fund a commercial-free network of curriculum-based educational programs that can be supported as textbooks are today. For about \$25 per student per year, this nation's creative production community can be armed with funding to work with educators to create a wealth of new classroom video and multimedia tools that can bring American education into the 21st century.

We will get what we pay for, I assure you.

In a crowd of educators this large, I know that some of you are experimenting with school television that is supported by audience-delivery numbers ... that is to say advertising. It is free of course. I urge you to at least draw some lines in the sand around this type of programming... perhaps limit it to no more than 15 minutes per day. And, I hope we can all agree to keep our elementary schools on the other side of that line in the sand. My company is committed to helping you
