FIELD COURSE IN THE HISTORY OF THE NORTHEAST

1620-1840 (HISTORY 24C)

Objectives

The principal aim of this course is to deepen the student's under-standing of the historical development of the Northeast during the period 1620-1840. Increased historical perspective should result from the three-dimensional approach employed. Ample time is allow-ed for study of the actual sites where great events occurred.

Organization

The group will spend about one-hird of the time at Storrs, and two-thirds in field trips. The class work on campus will serve to ac-quire a better comprehension of the basic forces and personalities which shaped the history of this area. After several introductory lectures the instructor will direct round-table discussions and coop-erative projects. Students will prepare reports upon places to be visit-ed, and will participate in panel discussions. The class will be kept

small so as to enable the instructor to have frequent individual conferences with students, and to facilitate better class discussions.

The course is under the direction of Dr. A. E. VanDusen, Assistant Professor of History at the University of Connecticut. Dr. Van-Dusen is the State Historian of Connecticut, editor of Volume IX of the Public Records of Connecticut, and author of historical articles. He is at present doing research for a history of Connecticut.

Field Trips

In addition to a number of one-day trips from Storrs to such places as Lebanon and Mystic, there will be two long trips of nearly one week apiece. One will run through the heart of historic Eastern Massachusetts, and New Hampshire; the other, through Western Massachusetts, Vermont and New York. In addition, the staff of Old Sturbridge Village plans to offer an intensive two-day institute at the Village during which they will use the rich exhibits there as illustrative material.

ALABAMA HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION

RESOLVED that Paragraph 5 of Article IV of the Constitution of the Association be amended so as to read as follows:

The officers shall be a president, a vice-president, a secretary, and a treasurer. There shall be an Executive Committee of the Association. The Executive Committee shall consist of not less than fifteen members and not more than twenty-five, four of whom are the officers of the Association and the others to be elected by the members of the Association, present and voting at the annual meeting. The officers and members of the Executive Committee shall be elected at the annual meeting and shall serve for one year. No officer of the Association shall serve for a period longer than two years, except the secretary and Treasurer. The duties and powers of the officers shall be such as usually pertain to their position, except as hereinafter provided. Vacancies occuring between annual meetings shall be filled by the Executive Committee.

RESOLVED that Paragraph 6 of Article IV of the Constitution of the Association be amended so as to read as follows:

The president of the Association shall serve as chairman of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall have the following duties and powers: to elect members, to regulate the time and place of meeting, to arrange and provide programs for all meetings, but this function may be delegated by the Executive Committee to the president who shall have the right and power to appoint such committees with power to act or not as the president may prescribe to perform such duty, to regulate the expenditure of the funds of the Association, and shall have all mecessary general control and supervision of its work.
