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Whereas there now exists an indebtedness against Madison County, Alabama, of fifteen thousand dollars, created for the purpose of furnishing the new county court house of said county with suitable furniture; and whereas it is deemed advisable and necessary by the court to issue and sell bonds of the county for the purpose of paying such indebtedness-

Now therefore it is ordered by the court of County Commissioners of Madison County State of Alabama that an election be held in said county, at the several voting places therein, for deciding whether or not bonds of said county to the amount of fifteen thousand dollars shall be issued for the purpose of paying the indebtedness of said county in the sum of fifteen thousand dollars or for the purpose of furnishing the new county court house of said county with suitable furniture.

It is further ordered that the bonds of said county proposed to be authorized by a vote at such election, shall not be more than thirty in number and for five hundred dollars each, the interest to be five per centum per annum payable semi annually and evidenced by coupons attached to the bonds and the interest principal and interest to be payable in gold coin and to be made negotiable and payable at some designated banking house or trust Company in the City of Huntsville, Alabama, or in the city of New York state of New York; said bonds to be made payable at the expiration of twenty years from their date.

Further ordered that said bonds be sold and negotiated to the highest bidder therefor the minimum price therefor to be their face or par value.

Further ordered that said bonds be dated January 1st 1915.

Ordered that court take recess until Sept 9 1914.
