



Bids by Black firms for project-specifie Chuficking moterials and supplies which fall within 10 % of city projected costs or 10 % of the lowest non-Black firm bid, whichever of the two is greater, shall be awarded to the black firm. All other factors being equal, preference shall be given to local Black firms from within Huntsville. For purposes of this agreement, a Black firm is defined as one in which a minimum of 75 % of the ownership resides with a racially identifiable ethnic group of the Negro Race holding U.S. citizenship.
