THE BIG SPRING

THROUGH THE YEARS.—For a century and a half the Big Spring has played a leading role in the development of the city of Huntsville. When John Hunt first saw the spring in 1805, it was just a big old-fashioned spring. But its average flow of approximately 2,000,000 gallons of water per day for the next 150 years was Huntsville's main source of supply and that fact is essential to its past and present. Only now that the city's population is approaching the 50,000 mark is the spring being considered for retirement. The pictures above show the Big Spring at various stages in its civilized history. No. 1 dated approximately 1805, shows that even before its beautification in 1881, it was a source of sparkling water as well as a hot spot on the lips of the community. No. 2 portrays a scene sometime before the abstracts made in the late 1820s. Here the old waterwheel and the fishbait below it. No. 3 shows the picturesque immediately after the 1881 changes, while No. 4 depicts a scene familiar to local citizens some 25 or 30 years ago. A Negro baptizing. No. 5 is a reproduction of a painting by William Price about 1880, and is the earliest picture of the Spring which could be found. No. 6 shows the air and snow when the spring froze over in the winter of 1906, when an all-time low temperature reading of 18 degrees below zero was registered. Thousands of U. S. Army troops were camped around the city in tents at the time. No. 7 reveals the flood which resulted from an overflow of the spring in 1818 for the foreground is what is now Galtair Street, looking southeast down Canal Street. No. 8 shows the spring some after the major beautification project started out in 1905. It is much the same today, except the trees which have grown larger and the flow ceased at a sanitary measure. No. 9 shows horses being watered on Galtair Street before the street below over the spring, road was completed in the middle 1820s.

Its Sparkling Waters Flow With History

Could time run backward and parallel the historic system, and a Courtroom square built on beds of seven are some of today's marks of the Big Spring on the flow of Huntsville's rich history.

The "Big Spring" was known to the Cherokee and Chickasaw Indians of this area to their names.

John Hunt was on his way south with David Swan as one of the Big Spring in the fall of 1804 when he stopped at the cabin of Joseph Cooper near New Market, Isaac Criner, many years later, related how his brother's wife had heard the travelers to take with them, the next day.

Criner said that, Swan helped Hunt build his cabin and both went back to Tennessee. Hunt returning with his family in the spring of 1805.

From the records of this land in the early days, it is believed, are supposed to have come out to great numbers to locate Hunt and his family—which included two adult sons, William and George. They are supposed to have settled the problem by following out Swan, taking them with provisions, bringing them into the tracks and that spring the power. The reported name caused the area to revert to what remains today.

In 1805, these families had come to settle at the spring, including Stephen Neal, who later to become the first sheriff, and Joseph Aikin, both of whom were Hunt's nephews, and some larger families, who were also related to Hunt.

The Big Spring not only furnished water for these early pioneers and their livestock, but its water flowing toward the river provided an area known with little doubt as the "Big Spring" to give them food and water.

It is believed, that, when, with hunters, fish and other food were used at hand and in abundance to support the growing families and they could not bring activities, William and George Hunt were great hunters of the early period.

By 1806, several hundred persons were living in the area of the Big Spring, estimated to what was later Pope's Hill, and immediately afterward along the location of the hotel in Oliver Landing (O'Connell's). In Madison County, there were 250 persons in 1809 listed as heads of families, which included 2,200 white persons with 800 slaves. Another 200 or more families had scattered over the mountains into Indian lands and had had no record compiled except that year that "some families are coming in daily" despite orders to wait until official land sales.

When the government laid out in 1809, John Hunt's main application to purchase, under his rights as a soldier, 200 acres in the immediate area of Huntsville, including the Big Spring. But he failed to pay the necessary cash required to hold the land.

Luther Pope bought four quarter sections of land in the heart of the present city. He paid \$2,500.00 for the 100-acre tract including the spring. His price of \$25.00 per acre being the highest of any land bought in the sale of Madison County lands at Nashville at the time. He laid in a portion to the north of the spring for \$200.00, and offered to the rest for \$200.00 and \$200.00.

When part of his land was needed as the same site, Pope agreed to deed 100 acres easting through the center of the Spring but retaining the Big Spring, over which he maintained control.

Although there is much debate about what happened to John Hunt after 1810, there is no evidence that he remained here at least until 1811 and on a long which he still could not.

When Pope requested that the tract be passed to the heirs, but the honor of the Spring, past, Alexander Pope, the Territorial Legislature granted his wish, giving the tract to him to be sold on Dec. 21, 1809. This agreement a factor between two families in the town over what the ownership of "Hunt's Big Spring" should be held.

The sale to the debtors were reportedly called the "Globe Old Party" and the "Hunt's Party."

Due to part of the settlement being with England, which later led in the War of 1812, the supporters of John Hunt were not and the Legislature changed the name to Huntsville by an act of Dec. 20, 1811, and a short time later on Dec. 8 incorporated the city.

The old division of the city's streets, which do not run "true north-south, east and west," are due to the spring. The street design, the spring now 100 degrees west of due north, and Jefferson Street was the first laid out to run parallel to the line of the 36th-37th street containing.

This was the only arrangement by which the area could be included in the "Globe" again as it was originally planned by Pope.

Spreading out over a large area, about 100 feet wide, the fishbait from the spring in the early days then of Isaac Henry near Galtair Street, where which were watered, and continued to flow that he never year.

The abundance of water gave rise to the first distillery of a coal in the Tennessee River and the town. Town, was incorporated by the state Legislature Dec. 12, 1811, as a city part. A year later the Indian Chief "Tennessee Co." was chartered.

One of history's most unique scenes at the Big Spring came on Tuesday, April 3, 1811, when two had been actually drenched at a wheel for the heat of the spring and admitted their escape. The other two were slain in history as one of "Hunt's collection."

In 1823 the first of the city's streets was built, using poles (made by hollowing the water bar, shaping a point on one end and draping the point into the opening of the next bar).

The Redstone Division is engaged in high level research and development work in the field of solid-propellant rockets and power units.

This division was started in the Spring of 1949 with the arrival of a technical and administrative group composed of 16 people from the Elton, Maryland Division. They advised and assisted the First Engineers in the initial work on the modification of the original facilities for solid-propellant rocket research and development work. The remainder of the professional personnel and some of the technical operators from the Elton Division moved here in August, 1949, to make a total of 30 people.

Since 1949, the Redstone Division has developed a number of important rockets and boosters to add to the country's arsenal of armaments.

The original group of 30 has grown into one of the largest and best equipped rocket development groups in the country, and now consists of an organization of over 700 people. The professional staff includes experts in many branches of science, such as chemistry, engineering, physics, etc. Redstone Division personnel have authored a number of technical reports, have presented papers to various groups, and have been instrumental in establishing local sections of various technical societies such as American Chemical Society, American Institute of Chemical Engineers, American Rocket Society, and American Society for Quality Control.

Although our staff came from many parts of the country, they have fitted into the religious, civic, social and sports life of the community.

WE STARTED IN 1928


Our company is one of the oldest in the American chemical industry. It was founded in 1928 at Kansas City, Missouri, in manufacture of oil and sulfur catalysts for the recovery of H₂S in Petrochemicals. After moving to New Jersey in 1933, the company's facilities were expanded in 1938.

Since that time, extensive facilities have been added to the company's plant. The development of a new process for the production of ethylene oxide in 1947, the development of a new large scale nitrogen purification plant at Houston, and the completion of a new plant for the production of ethylene oxide, have been some of the major developments in the company's history. The company's facilities are now located at New York, New Jersey.

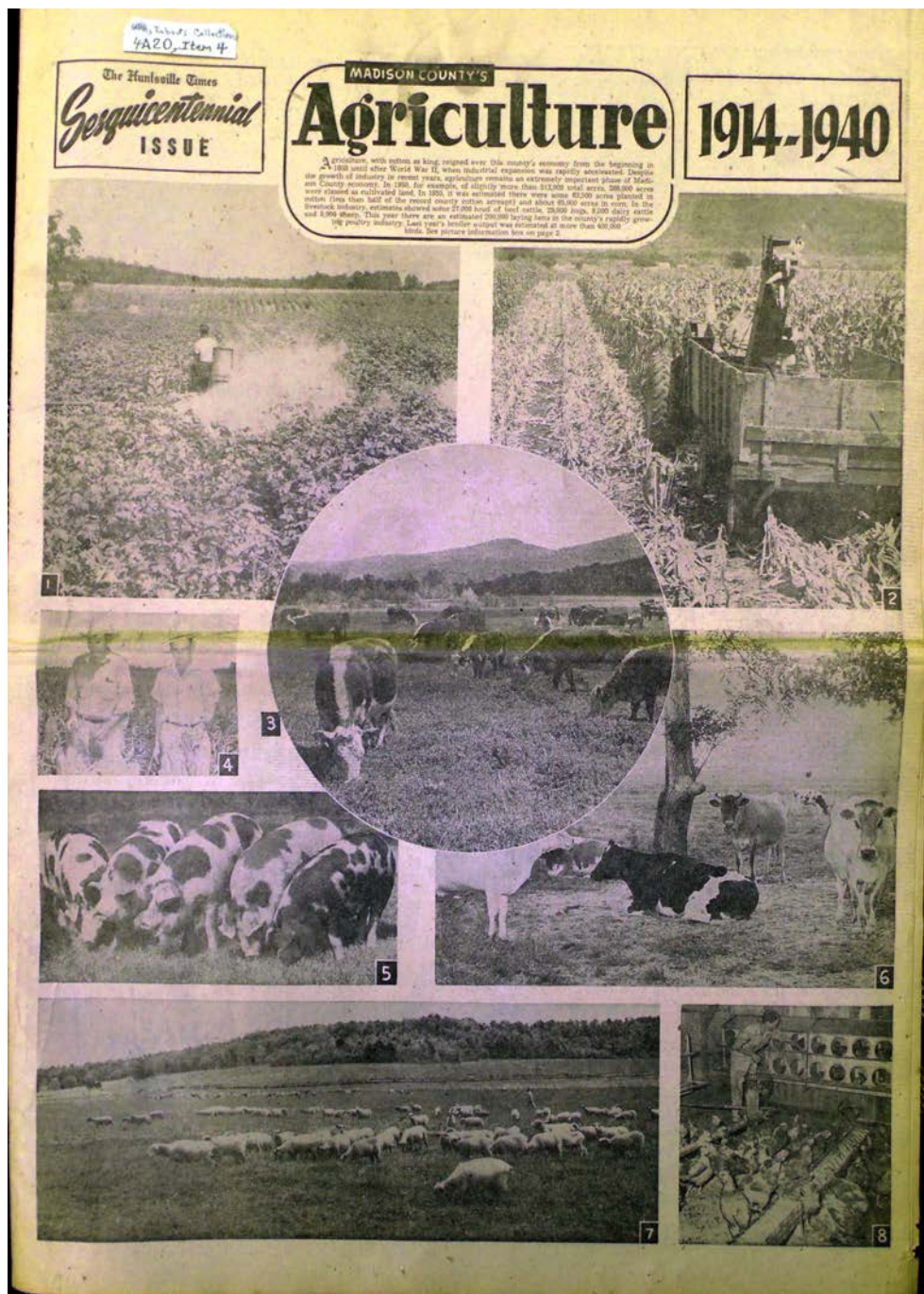

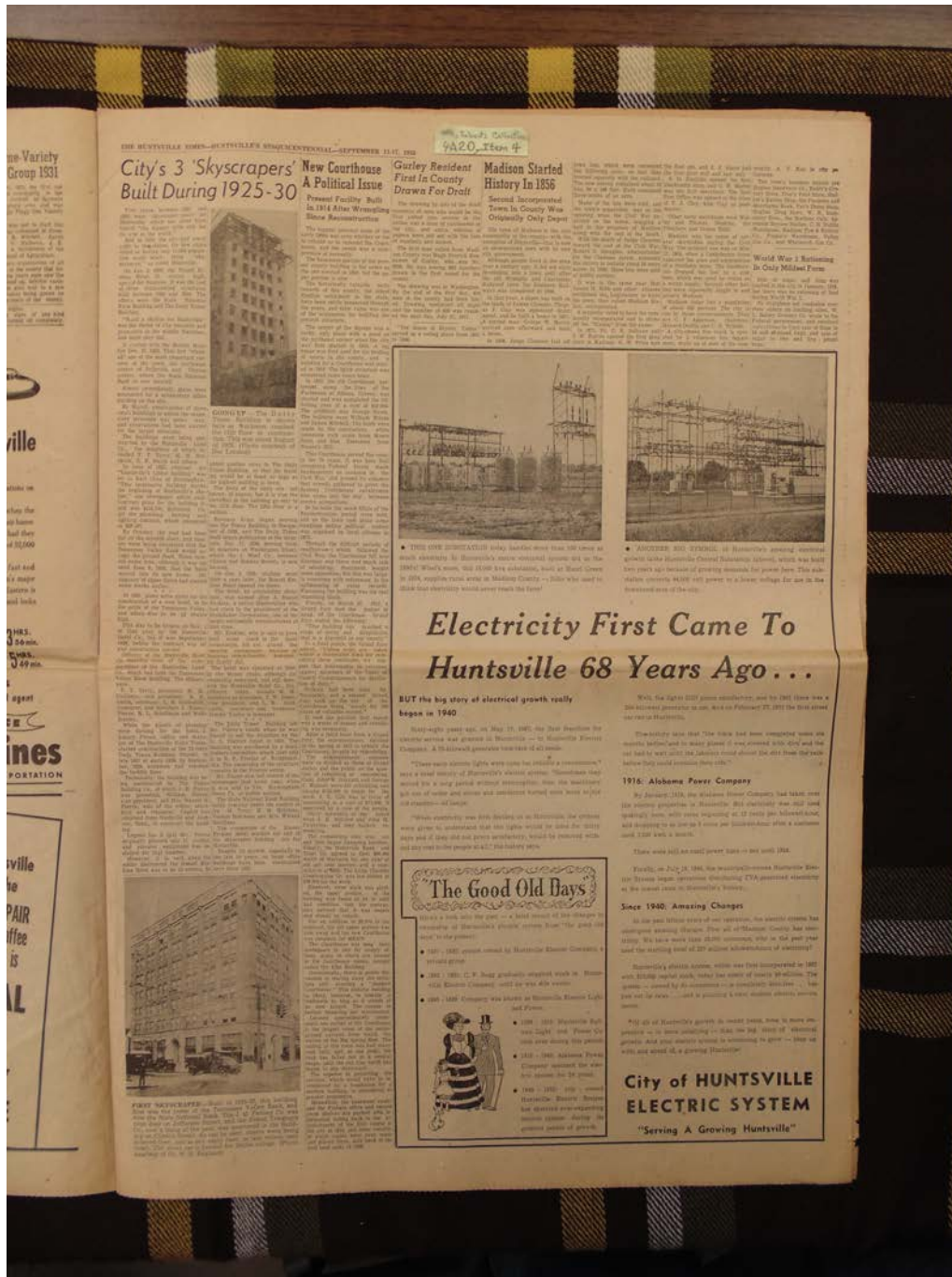

The First Textile Mill Was Built In Madison County Between 1809-1815
IN 1820—HUNTSVILLE BECAME A TERMINUS ON ONE OF ALABAMA'S EARLY STAGE-COACH LINES. THE FIRST INCORPORATED COTTON CLOTH FACTORY IN 1832.





IN 1806, Merrimack Manufacturing Company of Lowell, Massachusetts purchased 1,399 acres of land to build a cotton mill in Huntsville, Alabama, which at this time was only 91 years old.

IN 1809, work was started on the first mill, now known as the number 1 mill and was to be five stories high. The first piece of cloth to be turned out in this mill was in 1800.

TWO YEARS LATER, another mill was started beside the first, now known as the number 2 mill and was to be five stories high as shown in picture on left. This mill was completed in 1804.

LAYING THE FOUNDATION AND SUB-FLOORING OF MILL NO. 2—APRIL 16, 1804
