of the Holmes Street entrance. "That was what he called 'Our Bank', because it looked like one with the big doors."

The Huntsville Daily Times began printing operations in the new building, Dec. 17, 1928, with its staff of 17. Ten of those were occupied in the back shop in make-up, composing, and operating the printing press. Berry Pierce, brother of the publisher, was the circulation manager, assisted by Larkin Whitticker and Raymond Massey. Advertising was managed by Pierce (J. E.), and was staffed by Ed. Duffey, Harry Holder, and I. A. Burdett. Emory wrote most of the news, assisted by whoever drifted in looking for a writing job.

After moving into the new building, the staff began to grow, and by Autumn, 1929, the road to prosperity was wide and open. The roadway collapsed Oct. 29, 1929. The paper began to feel the crush of the construction bonds amounting to some \$200,000. The publisher resorted to every method to keep the Times alive. "He would make up a contract for a year's advertising, and once signed by the businessman, would take them to the bank and deposit them as cash. When Mr. Johnston took over in 1931, he made every one of those back contracts good."

Times were hard, as seen by an editorial, dated April 23, 1931, reporting on the Times' practice of accepting produce for payment for subscriptions. The editorial ended with a weak, but optimistic, request for barter during the dark days.

The end came on June 6, 1931, when Emory had played his last trump card, and the U. S. District Court, Judge W. I. Grubb presiding, placed the properties of the Times Publishing Co. in protective receivership of Shelby S. Fletcher, a local cotton dealer and legislator.

The sale of the properties took place on the north steps of the Madison County Courthouse at public outcry, as proscribed by law. Emory and son, William, came and joined in the bidding for the newspaper. When Henry Johnston outbid the Pierces, Emory is reported to have leaped onto the bed of a truck and announced for everyone to "Watch out for the Huntsville Register."

TIMES' SALE SET FOR TOMORROW
Receiver To Auction It To Bidders At 11 A. M. At Courthouse

The Huntsville Daily Times, which has been operated by a receiver since June 6, will be sold at public auction at 11 o'clock tomorrow morning at the north door of the Madison county courthouse.

Terms will be cash, or one-third cash, the balance in two equal installments, due in six and 12 months, bearing 4-per-cent interest, secured by responsible guaranty or indorsers.

Property to be sold includes the newspaper and printing business of the Times Publishing Co., together with the physical properties, the news franchise, advertising and subscription lists.

All bidders have been required to deposit \$10,000 in cash or by certified cashier's check.

HENRY JOHNSTON BUYS THE TIMES ON BID OF \$44,350
Young Birmingham Man Tops Others

HAS FINE RECORD AS NEWSPAPER MAN
Expects To Move Here At Once On Confirmation Of Sale

The Huntsville Daily Times was purchased at public auction yesterday by Henry P. Johnston of Birmingham, on a bid of \$44,350. The sale becomes effective on confirmation by Federal Judge W. I. Grubb.

Other bidders on the property were William H. Pierce, son of J. E. Pierce, former publisher of The Daily Times; Col. Harry Ayers, publisher of The Anniston Star, and Charles Hewgley of Jackson, Tenn., attorney for the Bondholders' Protective Association. Lawrence Goldsmith and associates, of Huntsville, were qualified as bidders, but did not submit an offer.

The sale was conducted by Shelby S. Fletcher, receiver, and was held at the north entrance of the Madison county courthouse. Several hundred curious spectators attended.

First bid is \$15,000

The bidding was opened by Mr. Hewgley, who offered \$25,000 for the property. This was raised slightly by Colonel Ayers. Mr. Johnston was the third bidder and Mr. Pierce was last.

The bids continued lively until the figure had reached approximately \$25,000, when Mr. Pierce and Colonel Ayers dropped, leaving the field to the Bondholders' representative and Mr. Johnston.

Upon reaching a figure of \$44,350, Mr. Hewgley conferred with his associates and then announced that was his limit. Mr. Johnston raised his bid to \$44,350 and the property was knocked down to him at that figure.

Sketch of New Owner
The new owner and publisher is one of the youngest of the newspaper publishers in Alabama. He is 25 years of age, a graduate of Culver Military Academy, and of Washington and Lee University. He is a native of Birmingham.

Novel By Jordan 'The Times' City Editor, Accepted

The McFadden Publishing Co. has among its publications two magazines, True Detective Mysteries and Master Detectives. Both stories will appear in one of these.
