Seven more machines are needed in room now open for colored people. Singer Sewing Machine Co. yesterday donated seven machines and they are being operated in West Huntsville.

Dec. 1.... Lowe Mills bought by Donald Comerg, textile mill operator of Birmingham for \$286,720. Bankrupt with liabilities of \$2,005,000. Sold at public auction Approximately 700 operatives.

Mercury touches 0° at six AM for lowest temp. in Huntsville in nine years.

Four Huntsville Banks issue joint statement ..1st National, Henderson National, Rison and Tennessee Valley banks..

" At a meeting of representatives of Huntsvilles four banks, it was agreed that the local banks will open tomorrow on a five per cent basis, paying, if requested, up to five percent of each person's balance during the ~~seven~~ remainder of the ten day period."

March 9.. J.J. Walsh was found guilty of using obscene language in the presence of females and was fined \$10. James Timmons, negro, paid a \$10 fine on a charge of assault with a knife.

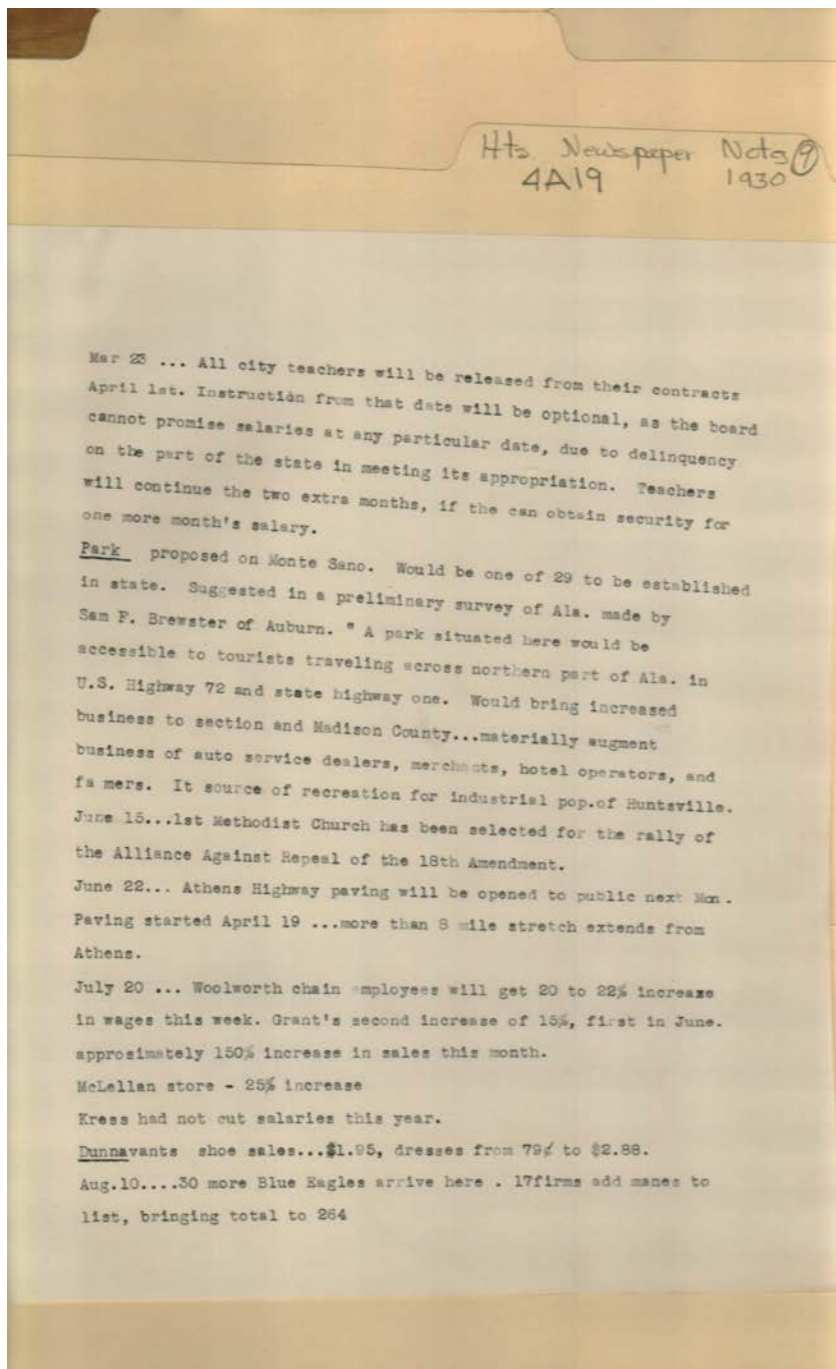

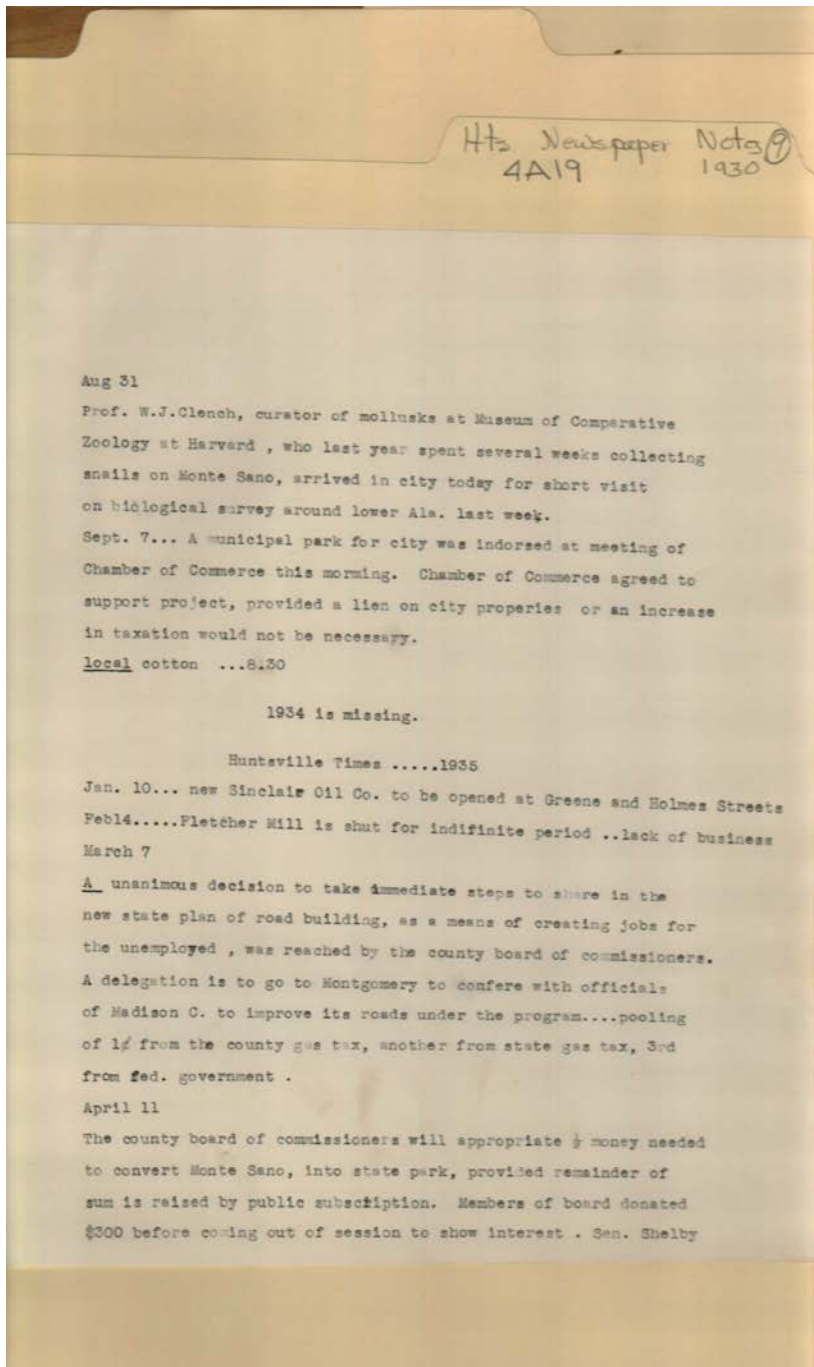

Fletcher gave \$1,000 . There were strong protests against boards refusal to appropriate \$18,000 for acreage.

June 20 ... Meridianville Road between point near Davis Darwin home a mile this side of Meridianville and Steger's gin near Hazel Green will be opened to public tomorrow morning ... completed June 8th 3.7 miles - 10 miles beyond city limits.

The sites for CCC being prepared by men for camps on Monte Sano and on McClung Street ... barracks.

July 4

Seven work relief projects for Madison C. were among the 172 for this state : welfare building, curb market, club house for underprivileged boys gyms for three schools, secondary roads, steel bridge over Copeland Creek, county secondary road construction.

Twelve acre tract will be afforded underprivileged youth by Kiwanians Clubhouse and other building complete near Mooresville. Two weeks for boys ... will be furnished clothing etc.

July 18 ... 2 carloads of materials for construction of CCC camps on McClung arrived 17th. Approximately 30 men stationed there ready for work.

Aug 1

Huntsville Golf and Country Club disbanded after ten years. Unable to exercise its option. Property surrendered to Country Club Heights, Inc. will be operated as public golf course. Membership was \$5.50 per month on yearly basis.

Aug 15

first co. of 200 men assigned to development of a park on Monte Sano will arrive tomorrow at 2 CCC camps on mountain. 175 more next Tues.
