Young reported that subscriptions had reached \$9,000. Expressing the belief that the required \$10,000 would be forthcoming in two weeks, The Rev. Sawrie, made the motion, which was carried, that ^{since the school would not} as the school itself would not be ready, a committee be appointed to rent suitable rooms so that classes would be able to open on the first Monday in September as planned.

Mrs. Jane Hamilton Childs, who graduated from Athens College in 1845, was conducting a private school for girls in Huntsville which she called Bascomb Female Institution. Mrs. Childs was elected assistant principal of the newly organized school on August 2, 1851. As Mrs. Childs had been using rooms in the Masonic Temple for her school, permission was granted to the Methodist Church to occupy these same rooms so making it possible for the school to open in September.

The Rev. Sawrie reported, at a meeting of November 26, 1851, that the Tennessee Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, had "received the institute under their patronage," and appointed the Rev. R. A. Young as the first president.

The trustees, conceding to the wishes of Mrs. Childs, changed the name of the school and on January 27, 1852, a charter was obtained under the name of The Bascomb Female Institute.

After considerable investigation as to a suitable location, the building committee, on January 27, 1852, recommended the purchase of some property on Randolph Street which was owned by George Steele, and this site was purchased for the sum of \$3,500.

This property is now occupied by the four brick houses just beyond the W. A. Spragin's home. The school faced Randolph Street,

Classes were resumed at college in the fall of 1866, with the Rev. John G. Wilson again ^{him} appointed president by the Tennessee Conference. Since many parents could not afford the tuition during the Reconstruction period, attendance was greatly diminished. Then too, the building and furniture had ~~sustained considerable~~ ^{sustained considerable} damage during the days the college had been used as a hospital. However, even under these conditions the school gradually began to regain its former status among southern schools for girls.

In 1870, when the Huntsville Church was included in the North Alabama Conference, the responsibility of the college was substantially transferred from the Tennessee Conference to this assembly.

Dr. G. W. Price, the first president appointed by the North Alabama Conference, took office in the fall of 1872 and remained in that position until 1880 when Dr. Amos B. Jones succeeded him.

From 1867 until 1887, the college was involved in litigation because of debts claimed to be owing to Dr. George H. Everhart and the four gentlemen, William H. Moore, Thomas S. McCalley, William J. McCalley and David B. Turner who formed the Building Association responsible for the erection and furnishing of the college.

On July 16, 1867, the association filed a bill with the Registrar in Chancery for the 29th District of the Northern Division of the State of Alabama against the Huntsville Female College, George H. Everhart, John G. Wilson, and John W. Scruggs

Corporation itself did not possess sufficient funds to erect college. Nov. 22, 1852, contract with four men, Moore, etc. a little over 1/2 acre. building cost \$35,000, furniture and equipment \$2,500.

conveyed rights Dec. 17, 1857, Everhart promised to pay \$15,000, McCalley, etc. and titles. If Everhart died, property would revert to parties of first part, McCalley, etc. Continued as trustees.

August 1859, Everhart sold to A. R. Erwin for \$27,000

July 1, 1859, John W. Scruggs, administrator for the estate of Erwin, sold, transferred and assigned to John G. Wilson.

Wilson filed petition in bankruptcy March 27, 1877
 Sept. 5, 1868 *an amended filed petition to bankruptcy*

October 17, 1876. Everhart claims that Wilson omitted from his list of debts, the claim of Huntsville Female College and asked that the school be sold to satisfy the debts.

but the campus continued through to Clinton Street.

The laying of the corner stone was set for June 24th, 1853 with the Masonic Lodge conducting the ceremonies. However, it was "unanimously resolved" that the Rev. Edward C. Slater be invited to make the address *at this occasion*

By the fall of 1854, the school was completed and, the building having been inspected and accepted by the trustees, classes were begun in February 1855.

This splendid three story structure was used both as a dormitory and class rooms. The immense dining hall on the second floor, was served by a dumb waiter from the kitchen in the basement.

The school could accommodate a hundred boarding students besides many day pupils. Schlorships were offered to the Tennessee Conference and the city of Huntsville at \$300.00 each with the privilege of selecting the girls who would receive this honor. The city accepted the responsibility of *thirteen* ~~thirteen~~ ^{scholarships} the first year and for several years the Conference named ~~three or four~~ ^{three or four} young ladies, *who would receive this honor.*

In the fall of 1855, both Mrs. Childs and the Rev. Young having resigned, the Conference appointed the Rev. George M. Everhart as president of the college. In December of that year (1855) the name of the school was changed and a charter was issued by the Alabama Legislature to "The Huntsville Female College." This was done partly because there were a number of ~~Bascom~~ ^{Bascom} Methodist Schools by the name of Bascom, but mostly because "The Huntsville Female College," was the name under which the subscriptions for the school were taken.

On Sat. the 15th of Feb. 1851 a group of men met at the Methodist Church in Huntsville, Alabama for the purpose of ~~organizing~~ ^{forming} ~~the~~ ~~establishment~~ of the Huntsville Female College. An "institution of high grade for the education of females" had been discussed for ^{a number of} ~~several~~ years, particularly ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~time~~ ^{the} ~~year~~ ^{the} 1847 to 1850 when the Rev. Saurie Slater was pastor of the local Methodist Church. The Rev. Wm. D. F. Saurie who was station pastor of the Methodist church for the years 1841-1849, stressed this need as did the Rev. Edward C. Slater during the years he was pastor from 1848 to 1850. When the Rev. Wm. Saurie returned to Huntsville in the fall of 1850, as previous pastor of the Huntsville district of the Baptist church, his plans were frustrated which resulted in this February meeting of 1851. At this time Dr. Pleasant B. Robinson was elected president of the board of trustees. Dr. Robinson was pastor of the Huntsville Baptist church from the fall of 1833 to the fall of 1835 after which he retired from the conference & located in Huntsville, where he continued to live and practice his profession of medicine (ref P. 35 notes)
