early architecture used in Europe, and so far as is known, this is the only in the United States with this type of decoration. The other Angel heads placed there when the stucco was added.

On June 13, 1853, the debt on the Annex having been paid, a "Victory-Home-Coming Service" was held. This was a highlight in the history of the church. Dr. B. B. Glasgow was the pastor and Bishop J. L. Decell preached at the 11 o'clock service. Dinner was served in the annex at 2 o'clock, after which Mr. Gayle Geron and Mr. P. S. Dunnivant set fire to the mortgage. Mr. S. O. Holmes then presented the building to the Bishop, who dedicated it. From that day, the church has been free of debt.

In 1941, Dr. Rudolph R. Scott came to this church. The membership was 1388 and the church school, with Dr. A. L. Hipp as superintendent, had an enrollment of 607.

Realizing the need of modernization and expansion, Dr. Scott initiated an "Improvement Fund" drive. Between \$46,000 and \$47,000 was realized from this campaign and in the last report given by him in the second quarter of 1946, Dr. Scott says, "We expect to do the work necessary during this Conference year."

Although Dr. Scott did not live to see the results of his efforts, the completely modernized Sanctuary and Educational Building are a result of his ministry. While Dr. R. L. Archibald and Dr. A. H. Nabors worked wisely and well in the expenditure of this "Improvement Fund," the stairs leading directly to the intermediate department, the beautiful little Chapel for the young people, the utilizing of waste closet space and the old furnace rooms to give more class rooms in all departments are part of the planning of Dr. Scott.

Also about this time, Dr. and Mrs. A. L. Hipp and Raymond had the melodic Carillon Chimes installed in memory of their son and brother, Arville. It is good to hear them ringing from the belfry which had been silent since the old bell was given to the scrap-iron drive during the World War.

Mr. and Mrs. P. S. Dunnivant and their daughter Catharine gave the Kimball organ which thrills us with its rich tones.

The grand piano is a gift of Mr. James H. Terry, Sr., and his sons, James, Jr., and Walter, as a memorial to their wife and mother, Emily Stanfield Terry.

The handsome bronze cross and candle sticks were given by the Woman's Society of Christian Service, and the matching collection plates were gifts of the McCoy Sunday School class.

Dr. A. H. Nabors is in the third year of his pastorate. Under his splendid leadership, the church membership has increased to 2,019 and the church school with Dr. A. L. Hipp still serving as superintendent, has an enrollment of 1135.

Historic old First Church grows with Huntsville. As it grows, each generation will continue to make the changes and adjustments which are necessary to enable Methodism to continue to serve Huntsville to the honor and glory of God and of His Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

HUNTSVILLE FEMALE COLLEGE — Opened in 1851, the Huntsville Female College, also known as the Bascom Female Institution at various times, was located on Randolph Street in the 400-block. The building was 164 feet wide and 52 feet in depth. Operated by the North Alabama Methodist Conference until a few years before it was destroyed by fire in 1885, the school was used by Union troops as a hospital during the federal occupation of Huntsville. The Franklin Street site was used as a parsonage until 1864, when the present parsonage on White Circle was purchased.

On August 4, 1863, the church finally received \$6,000 from the Federal government as indemnity for the destruction of the original church in 1864. Of this amount, \$2,381 was used to buy the property next door, where the women's society that building was started in 1870, and at a construction cost of some \$40,000, was completed in 1870.


Women provided more than half the cost of the building, in addition to furnishing the main floor and equipping the kitchen and dining room.

The first women groups were organized in 1869 and 1870. On April 2, 1869, 12 women of the church met and organized a Women's Missionary Society, with Mrs. Jackson Hand as president. In May of the following year, 22 women organized the Ladies' Aid Society, with the idea of "standing by and aiding the affairs of the church."

The two groups were united in 1869 as the Women's Society for Christian Service.

Except for redecoration and the addition of memorials, the interior of the Sanctuary remains practically as it was when completed in 1870.

However, in 1946, the other portions of the building and the educational building were completely modernized and enlarged.



FIRST METHODIST CHURCH—Built in Reconstruction days and dedicated in 1870, this building, the present First Methodist Church, is the third used by that congregation. The first was built in 1822 and sold in 1832, when the present property was purchased. The church first erected there was burned in 1864 as Union soldiers cooked food on the basement floor. The building above is shown as it appeared prior to 1890, when the spire was added, and before the stucco was plastered. was a High Churchman. His later life brought him into association with Evangelicalism; and in his last period, when Romanizing tendencies seemed to threaten the Church, he was militantly Protestant.

Shortly before his death Chase spoke with pride of his having been among the first professional missionaries of the Church. After his ordination to the diaconate in 1798 he entered at once upon missionary work. Bishop Provoost sent the young man into the sparsely settled regions of upper New York State, in preparation, as it were, for his greater enterprises in Ohio and Illinois. Proceeding from Albany westward as far as Canandaigua, where the world ended in the wilderness, he visited destitute little groups of settlers and Indians. He preached, he baptized; here and there he helped organize a parish, trusting that God would keep it alive once he had left. It was his first acquaintance with the wilderness, and from that time on its call remained insistent in his romantic soul. This first missionary travel ended when he accepted an invitation to become the rector of an organized parish at Poughkeepsie. But after six years, he could no longer resist the temptation to new adventures. An offer came to go to Louisiana as the first minister of the Church in New Orleans. There was enough of excitement: a long journey by sea, the loss of all his goods by shipwreck en route, yellow fever, perilous excursions into the bayous—not to mention personal difficulties in the congregation. Yet Chase later looked back to these years in the South with much satisfaction.

In 1811 he returned to a parish in Hartford, Connecticut, for another six years of settled life, the only really comfortable period he knew. His reasons for leaving at

the end of that time are complex. He certainly felt the call of missionary duty as he saw thousands of Connecticut people migrating westwards, but there were also personal reasons which influenced his decision to go. Consequently in March, 1817, after an arduous journey by coach and sleigh, Chase crossed into Ohio. He was entirely on his own. He was neither sent nor subsidized by any missionary society or authority in the Church. He simply set out alone to tackle the huge problem of bringing the services of the Church to the scattered settlements in Ohio.

RETURN TO WILDERNESS

CHASE was not the first missionary to enter the territory. In the southern part of Ohio Joseph Doddridge, a former Methodist minister who had taken holy orders in the Church, had already done a heroic work in twenty years of itinerant ministry. Living in western Virginia, he used to cross the river into Ohio, providing little groups of Episcopalians at Steubenville and other places with occasional services. His connection with the Diocese of Virginia was merely formal. Receiving no help, salary, or subsidy from the Church in the East, he actually made his living by practicing medicine. He was a humble, unambitious messenger of the Gospel, in some ways an ideal missionary. West of Doddridge's field of work, not far from the site of the present city of Columbus, a congregation of Episcopalians at Worthington enjoyed the unique privilege of having a clergyman in permanent residence. He was, however, in deacon's orders only, and not a man of Doddridge's humility. James Kilbourne—for that was his name—was a jack-of-all-trades, founder of the

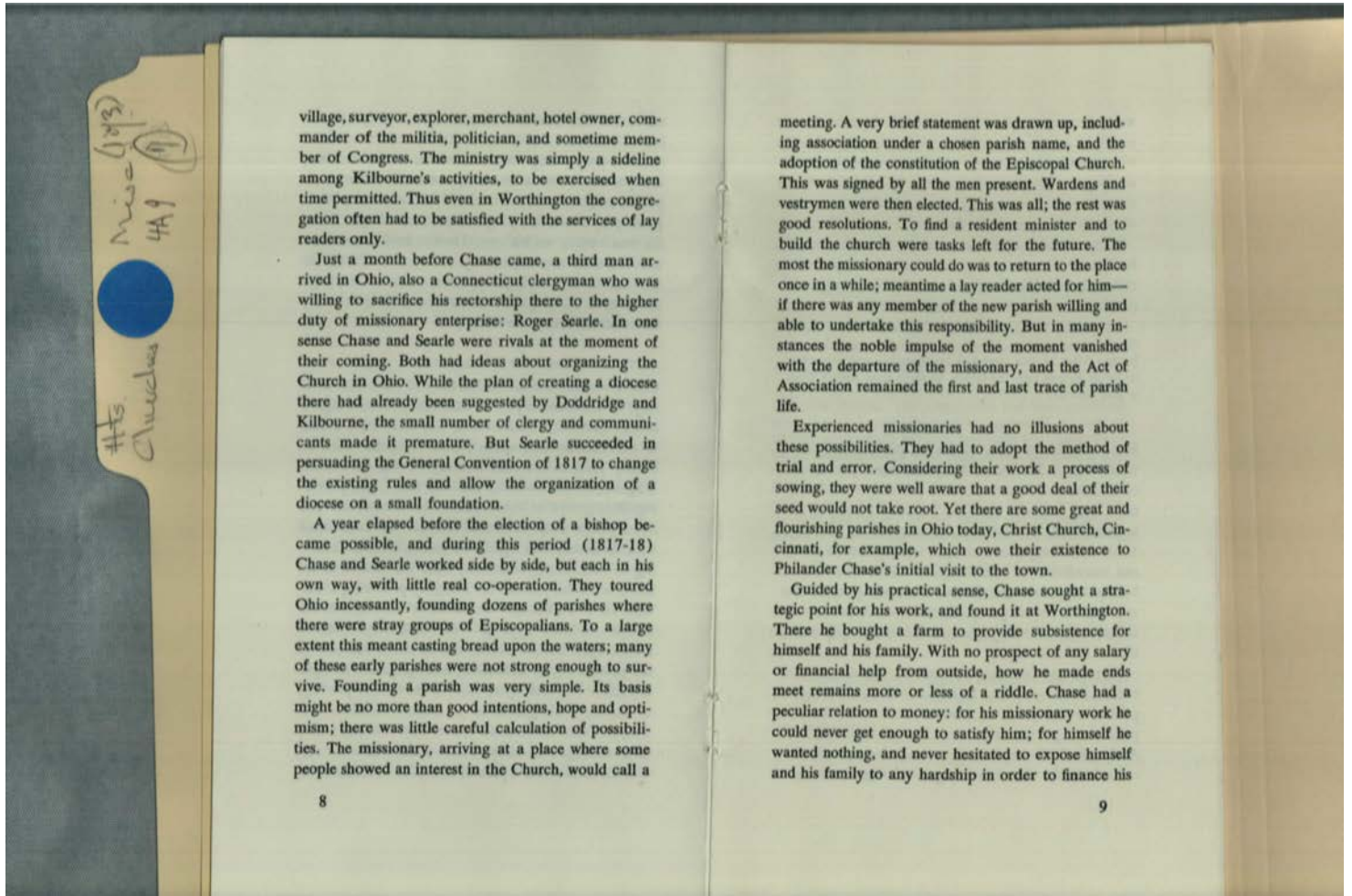

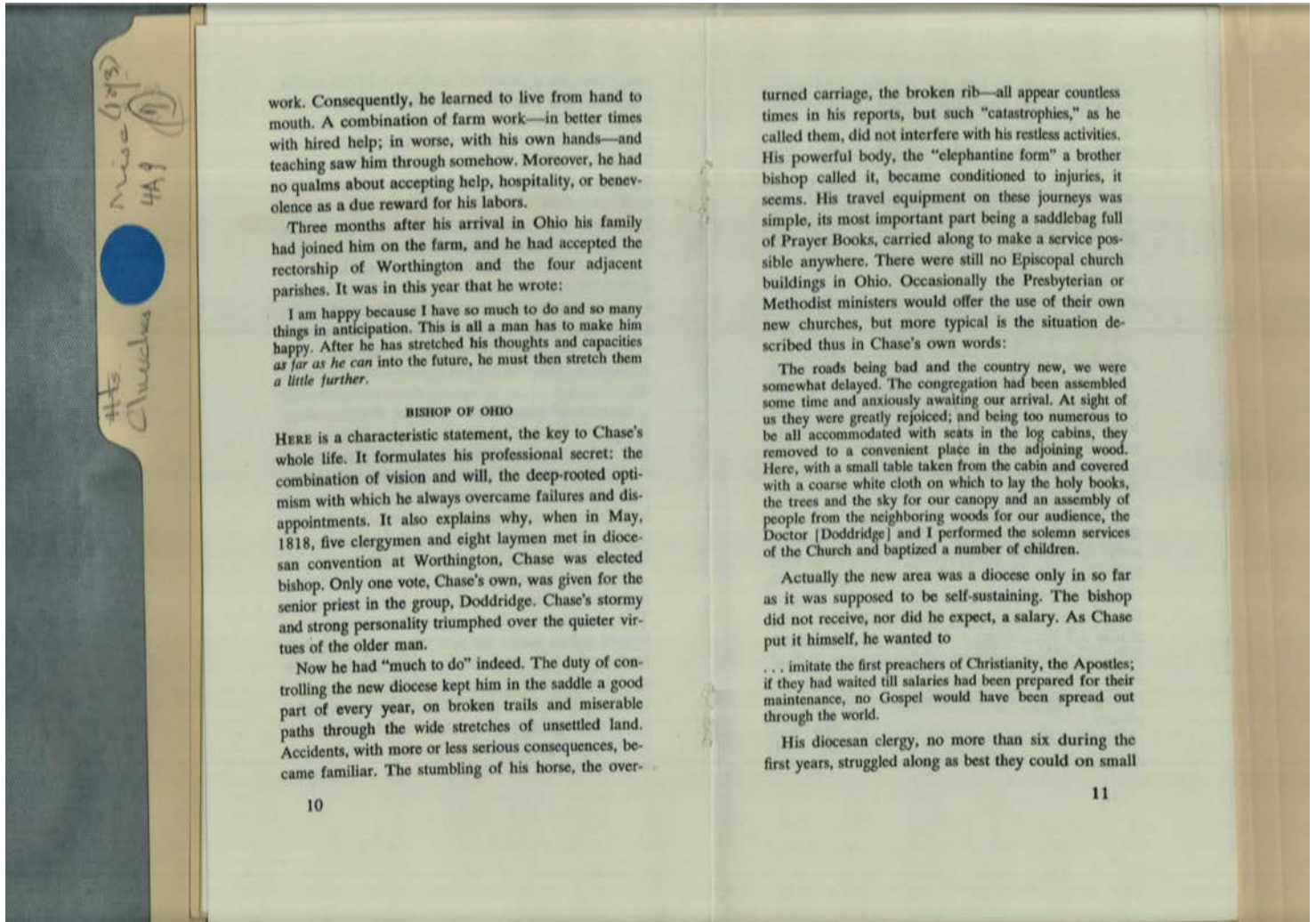

work. Consequently, he learned to live from hand to mouth. A combination of farm work—in better times with hired help; in worse, with his own hands—and teaching saw him through somehow. Moreover, he had no qualms about accepting help, hospitality, or benevolence as a due reward for his labors.

Three months after his arrival in Ohio his family had joined him on the farm, and he had accepted the rectorship of Worthington and the four adjacent parishes. It was in this year that he wrote:

I am happy because I have so much to do and so many things in anticipation. This is all a man has to make him happy. After he has stretched his thoughts and capacities as far as he can into the future, he must then stretch them a little further.

BISHOP OF OHIO

HERE is a characteristic statement, the key to Chase's whole life. It formulates his professional secret: the combination of vision and will, the deep-rooted optimism with which he always overcame failures and disappointments. It also explains why, when in May, 1818, five clergymen and eight laymen met in diocesan convention at Worthington, Chase was elected bishop. Only one vote, Chase's own, was given for the senior priest in the group, Doddridge. Chase's stormy and strong personality triumphed over the quieter virtues of the older man.

Now he had "much to do" indeed. The duty of controlling the new diocese kept him in the saddle a good part of every year, on broken trails and miserable paths through the wide stretches of unsettled land. Accidents, with more or less serious consequences, became familiar. The stumbling of his horse, the over-

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turned carriage, the broken rib—all appear countless times in his reports, but such "catastrophies," as he called them, did not interfere with his restless activities. His powerful body, the "elephantine form" a brother bishop called it, became conditioned to injuries, it seems. His travel equipment on these journeys was simple, its most important part being a saddlebag full of Prayer Books, carried along to make a service possible anywhere. There were still no Episcopal church buildings in Ohio. Occasionally the Presbyterian or Methodist ministers would offer the use of their own new churches, but more typical is the situation described thus in Chase's own words:

The roads being bad and the country new, we were somewhat delayed. The congregation had been assembled some time and anxiously awaiting our arrival. At sight of us they were greatly rejoiced; and being too numerous to be all accommodated with seats in the log cabins, they removed to a convenient place in the adjoining wood. Here, with a small table taken from the cabin and covered with a coarse white cloth on which to lay the holy books, the trees and the sky for our canopy and an assembly of people from the neighboring woods for our audience, the Doctor [Doddridge] and I performed the solemn services of the Church and baptized a number of children.

Actually the new area was a diocese only in so far as it was supposed to be self-sustaining. The bishop did not receive, nor did he expect, a salary. As Chase put it himself, he wanted to

... imitate the first preachers of Christianity, the Apostles; if they had waited till salaries had been prepared for their maintenance, no Gospel would have been spread out through the world.

His diocesan clergy, no more than six during the first years, struggled along as best they could on small

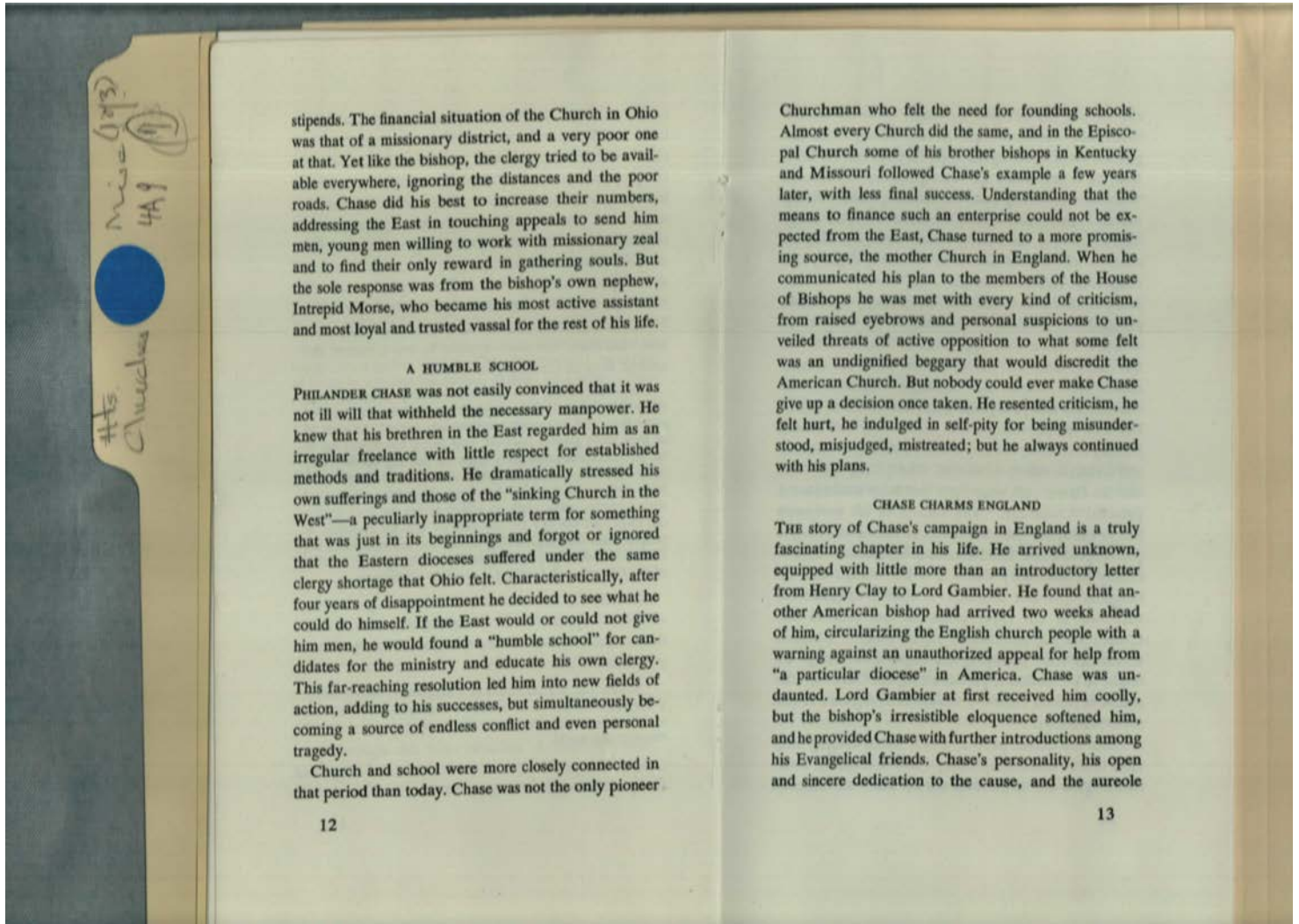

stipends. The financial situation of the Church in Ohio was that of a missionary district, and a very poor one at that. Yet like the bishop, the clergy tried to be available everywhere, ignoring the distances and the poor roads. Chase did his best to increase their numbers, addressing the East in touching appeals to send him men, young men willing to work with missionary zeal and to find their only reward in gathering souls. But the sole response was from the bishop's own nephew, Intrepid Morse, who became his most active assistant and most loyal and trusted vassal for the rest of his life.

A HUMBLE SCHOOL

PHILANDER CHASE was not easily convinced that it was not ill will that withheld the necessary manpower. He knew that his brethren in the East regarded him as an irregular freelance with little respect for established methods and traditions. He dramatically stressed his own sufferings and those of the "sinking Church in the West"—a peculiarly inappropriate term for something that was just in its beginnings and forgot or ignored that the Eastern dioceses suffered under the same clergy shortage that Ohio felt. Characteristically, after four years of disappointment he decided to see what he could do himself. If the East would or could not give him men, he would found a "humble school" for candidates for the ministry and educate his own clergy. This far-reaching resolution led him into new fields of action, adding to his successes, but simultaneously becoming a source of endless conflict and even personal tragedy.

Church and school were more closely connected in that period than today. Chase was not the only pioneer

Churchman who felt the need for founding schools. Almost every Church did the same, and in the Episcopal Church some of his brother bishops in Kentucky and Missouri followed Chase's example a few years later, with less final success. Understanding that the means to finance such an enterprise could not be expected from the East, Chase turned to a more promising source, the mother Church in England. When he communicated his plan to the members of the House of Bishops he was met with every kind of criticism, from raised eyebrows and personal suspicions to unveiled threats of active opposition to what some felt was an undignified beggary that would discredit the American Church. But nobody could ever make Chase give up a decision once taken. He resented criticism, he felt hurt, he indulged in self-pity for being misunderstood, misjudged, mistreated; but he always continued with his plans.

CHASE CHARMS ENGLAND

THE story of Chase's campaign in England is a truly fascinating chapter in his life. He arrived unknown, equipped with little more than an introductory letter from Henry Clay to Lord Gambier. He found that another American bishop had arrived two weeks ahead of him, circularizing the English church people with a warning against an unauthorized appeal for help from "a particular diocese" in America. Chase was undaunted. Lord Gambier at first received him coolly, but the bishop's irresistible eloquence softened him, and he provided Chase with further introductions among his Evangelical friends. Chase's personality, his open and sincere dedication to the cause, and the aureole

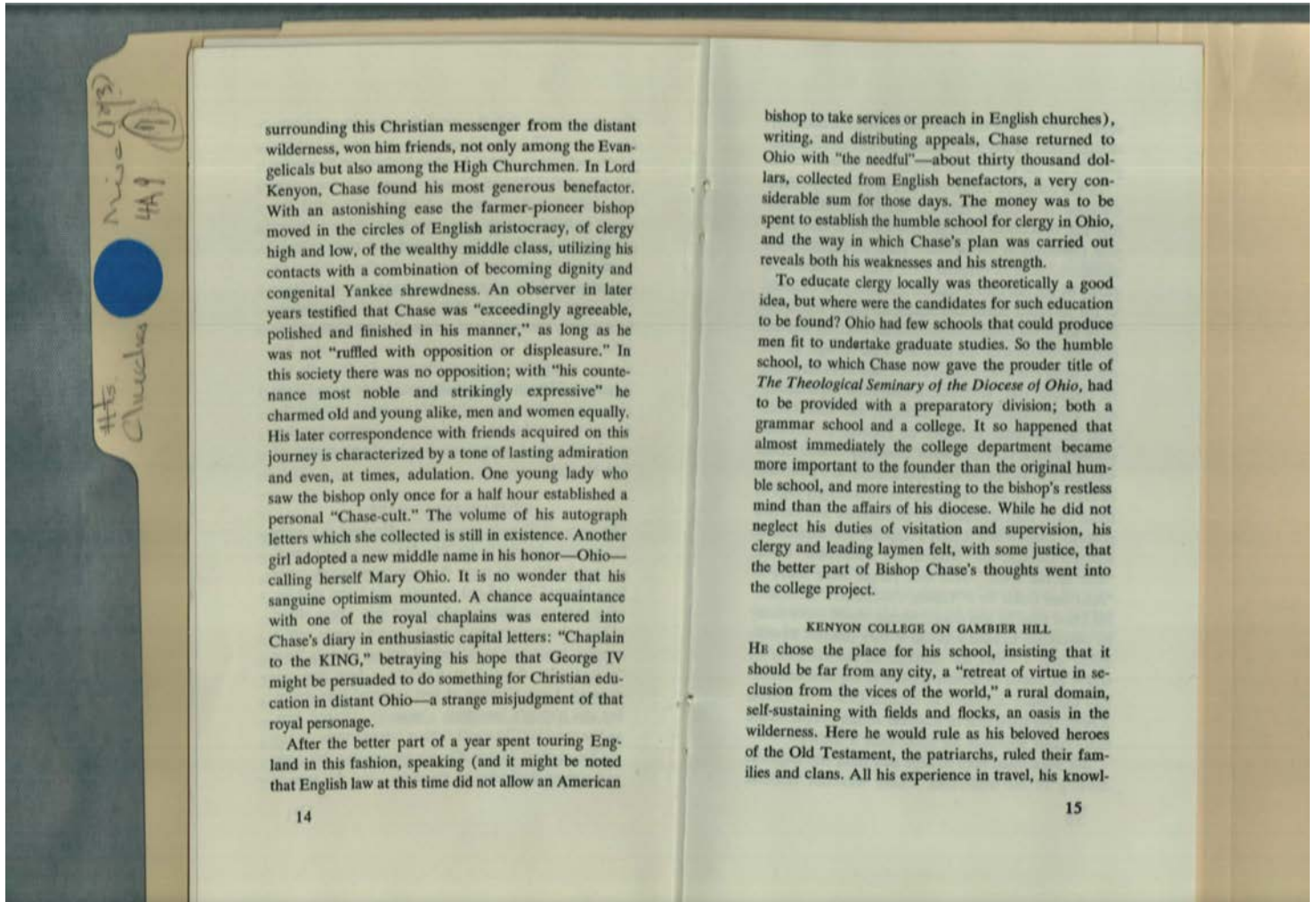

surrounding this Christian messenger from the distant wilderness, won him friends, not only among the Evangelicals but also among the High Churchmen. In Lord Kenyon, Chase found his most generous benefactor. With an astonishing ease the farmer-pioneer bishop moved in the circles of English aristocracy, of clergy high and low, of the wealthy middle class, utilizing his contacts with a combination of becoming dignity and congenial Yankee shrewdness. An observer in later years testified that Chase was "exceedingly agreeable, polished and finished in his manner," as long as he was not "ruffled with opposition or displeasure." In this society there was no opposition; with "his countenance most noble and strikingly expressive" he charmed old and young alike, men and women equally. His later correspondence with friends acquired on this journey is characterized by a tone of lasting admiration and even, at times, adulation. One young lady who saw the bishop only once for a half hour established a personal "Chase-cult." The volume of his autograph letters which she collected is still in existence. Another girl adopted a new middle name in his honor—Ohio—calling herself Mary Ohio. It is no wonder that his sanguine optimism mounted. A chance acquaintance with one of the royal chaplains was entered into Chase's diary in enthusiastic capital letters: "Chaplain to the KING," betraying his hope that George IV might be persuaded to do something for Christian education in distant Ohio—a strange misjudgment of that royal personage.

After the better part of a year spent touring England in this fashion, speaking (and it might be noted that English law at this time did not allow an American

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bishop to take services or preach in English churches), writing, and distributing appeals, Chase returned to Ohio with "the needful"—about thirty thousand dollars, collected from English benefactors, a very considerable sum for those days. The money was to be spent to establish the humble school for clergy in Ohio, and the way in which Chase's plan was carried out reveals both his weaknesses and his strength.

To educate clergy locally was theoretically a good idea, but where were the candidates for such education to be found? Ohio had few schools that could produce men fit to undertake graduate studies. So the humble school, to which Chase now gave the prouder title of *The Theological Seminary of the Diocese of Ohio*, had to be provided with a preparatory division; both a grammar school and a college. It so happened that almost immediately the college department became more important to the founder than the original humble school, and more interesting to the bishop's restless mind than the affairs of his diocese. While he did not neglect his duties of visitation and supervision, his clergy and leading laymen felt, with some justice, that the better part of Bishop Chase's thoughts went into the college project.

KENYON COLLEGE ON GAMBIER HILL

He chose the place for his school, insisting that it should be far from any city, a "retreat of virtue in seclusion from the vices of the world," a rural domain, self-sustaining with fields and flocks, an oasis in the wilderness. Here he would rule as his beloved heroes of the Old Testament, the patriarchs, ruled their families and clans. All his experience in travel, his knowl-

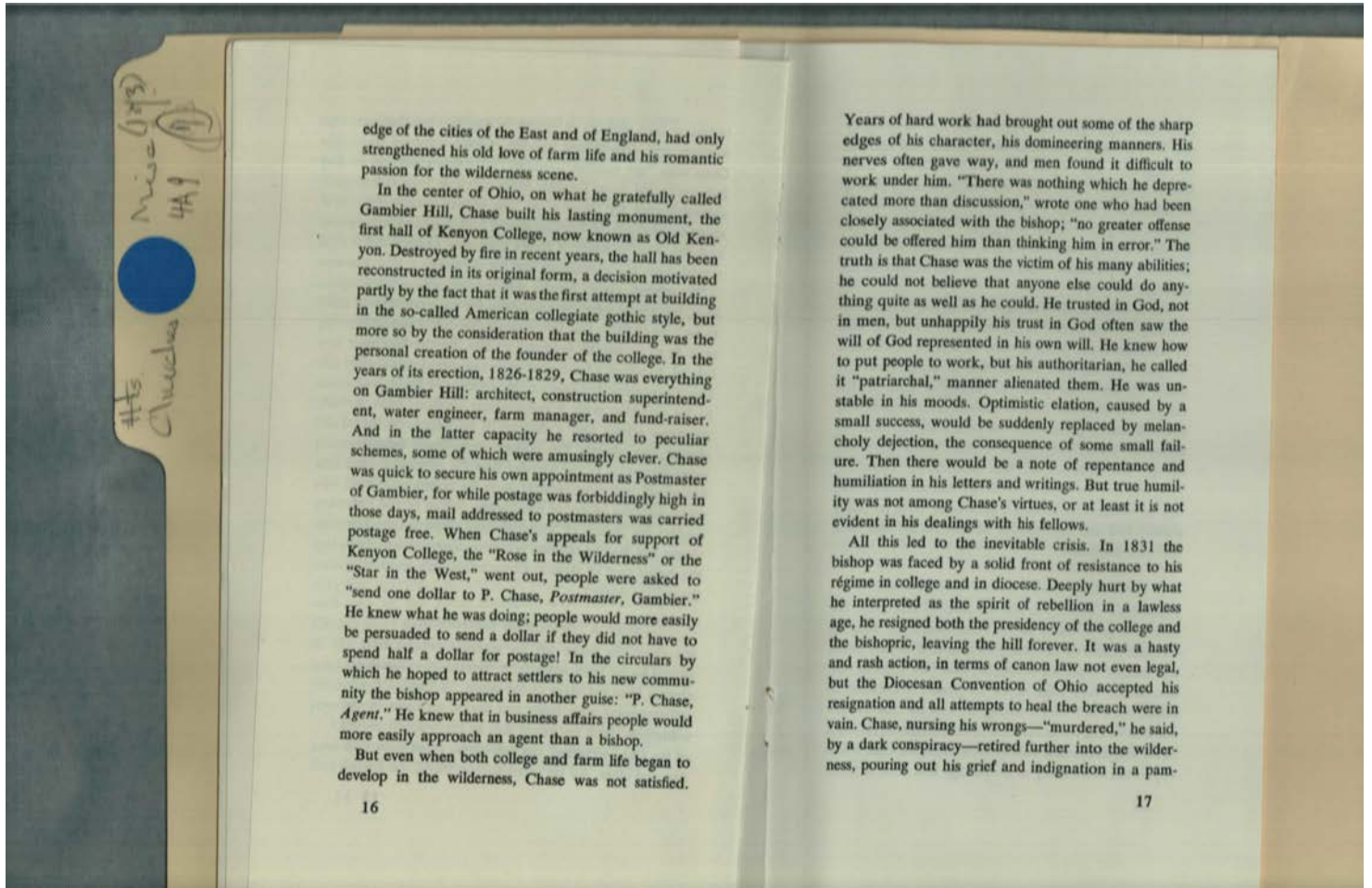

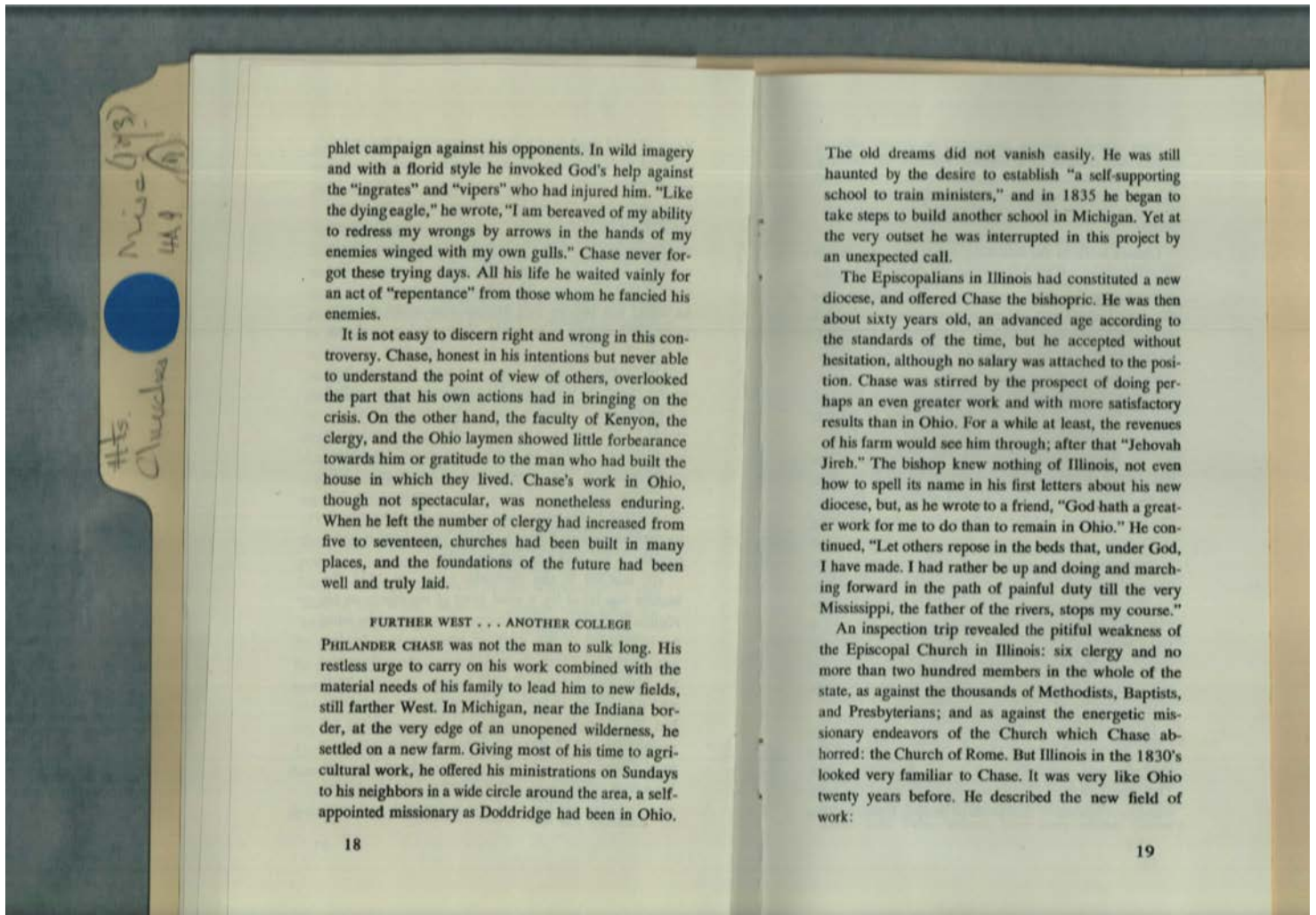

phlet campaign against his opponents. In wild imagery and with a florid style he invoked God's help against the "ingrates" and "vipers" who had injured him. "Like the dying eagle," he wrote, "I am bereaved of my ability to redress my wrongs by arrows in the hands of my enemies winged with my own gulls." Chase never forgot these trying days. All his life he waited vainly for an act of "repentance" from those whom he fancied his enemies.

It is not easy to discern right and wrong in this controversy. Chase, honest in his intentions but never able to understand the point of view of others, overlooked the part that his own actions had in bringing on the crisis. On the other hand, the faculty of Kenyon, the clergy, and the Ohio laymen showed little forbearance towards him or gratitude to the man who had built the house in which they lived. Chase's work in Ohio, though not spectacular, was nonetheless enduring. When he left the number of clergy had increased from five to seventeen, churches had been built in many places, and the foundations of the future had been well and truly laid.

FURTHER WEST . . . ANOTHER COLLEGE

PHILANDER CHASE was not the man to sulk long. His restless urge to carry on his work combined with the material needs of his family to lead him to new fields, still farther West. In Michigan, near the Indiana border, at the very edge of an unopened wilderness, he settled on a new farm. Giving most of his time to agricultural work, he offered his ministrations on Sundays to his neighbors in a wide circle around the area, a self-appointed missionary as Doddridge had been in Ohio.

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The old dreams did not vanish easily. He was still haunted by the desire to establish "a self-supporting school to train ministers," and in 1835 he began to take steps to build another school in Michigan. Yet at the very outset he was interrupted in this project by an unexpected call.

The Episcopalians in Illinois had constituted a new diocese, and offered Chase the bishopric. He was then about sixty years old, an advanced age according to the standards of the time, but he accepted without hesitation, although no salary was attached to the position. Chase was stirred by the prospect of doing perhaps an even greater work and with more satisfactory results than in Ohio. For a while at least, the revenues of his farm would see him through; after that "Jehovah Jireh." The bishop knew nothing of Illinois, not even how to spell its name in his first letters about his new diocese, but, as he wrote to a friend, "God hath a greater work for me to do than to remain in Ohio." He continued, "Let others repose in the beds that, under God, I have made. I had rather be up and doing and marching forward in the path of painful duty till the very Mississippi, the father of the rivers, stops my course."

An inspection trip revealed the pitiful weakness of the Episcopal Church in Illinois: six clergy and no more than two hundred members in the whole of the state, as against the thousands of Methodists, Baptists, and Presbyterians; and as against the energetic missionary endeavors of the Church which Chase abhorred: the Church of Rome. But Illinois in the 1830's looked very familiar to Chase. It was very like Ohio twenty years before. He described the new field of work:

1. Assisting missions and churches according to their needs for continued growth and development which should include the following:

- Personal counsel and assistance.
- Church leadership training and development.
- Communication of church program information.

2. Establishment of new missions and churches as needed according to stated policies which should include the following:

- Purchase of property ahead of housing development.
- Aid in the erection of buildings.
- Aid on pastor's salary.

Category Two - Reaching and ministering to people through institutions. When there are spiritual needs which can best be met through a specialized institutional ministry and when funds can be secured without hampering the programs of reaching and ministering to people through churches and missions, we recommend that institutional ministries be established.

Category Three - Reaching and ministering to people through human welfare programs. When there are spiritual needs which can best be met through specialized programs of human welfare and when funds can be secured without hampering the program of reaching and ministering to people through churches, we recommend the establishment of such programs.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

A. The Association shall be composed of messengers from the churches of our territory who have been certified by their church as the appointed representative of the church.

B. Every church of the Association shall be entitled to representation in the following manner, viz: Each church shall be entitled to three messengers, and one additional messenger for each fifty members or major fraction thereof above fifty for the first thousand members; they shall be entitled to one messenger for every hundred members or major fraction thereof above one thousand members.

C. New churches seeking admission shall present a petitionary letter to the Credentials Committee at least thirty days before admission.

1. The petition shall be examined by the committee and if the new church is found to be in cooperation with the spirit and work of the Association, then the committee may recommend to the Executive Committee that the church be admitted to all the privileges of the Association during the interim between regular or called meetings of the Association and shall be approved for full membership in the Association at its next meeting.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

A. The Association shall meet annually on Wednesday and Thursday after the second Sunday in October.

B. Called Meetings - Called meetings of the Association may be convened after the Executive Committee makes written request of the Moderator to call the Association into Session. It shall be the duty of the Moderator then to call the Association into Session.

In case of such meetings the Association's membership shall consist of the messengers of the last annual session, unless new messengers are elected by the churches to replace those who are no longer members of that church. The churches shall notify the Clerk of the Association of such changes.

A quorum of such called meetings shall consist of one-half of the messengers and one-fourth of the churches represented at the last annual meeting of the Association.

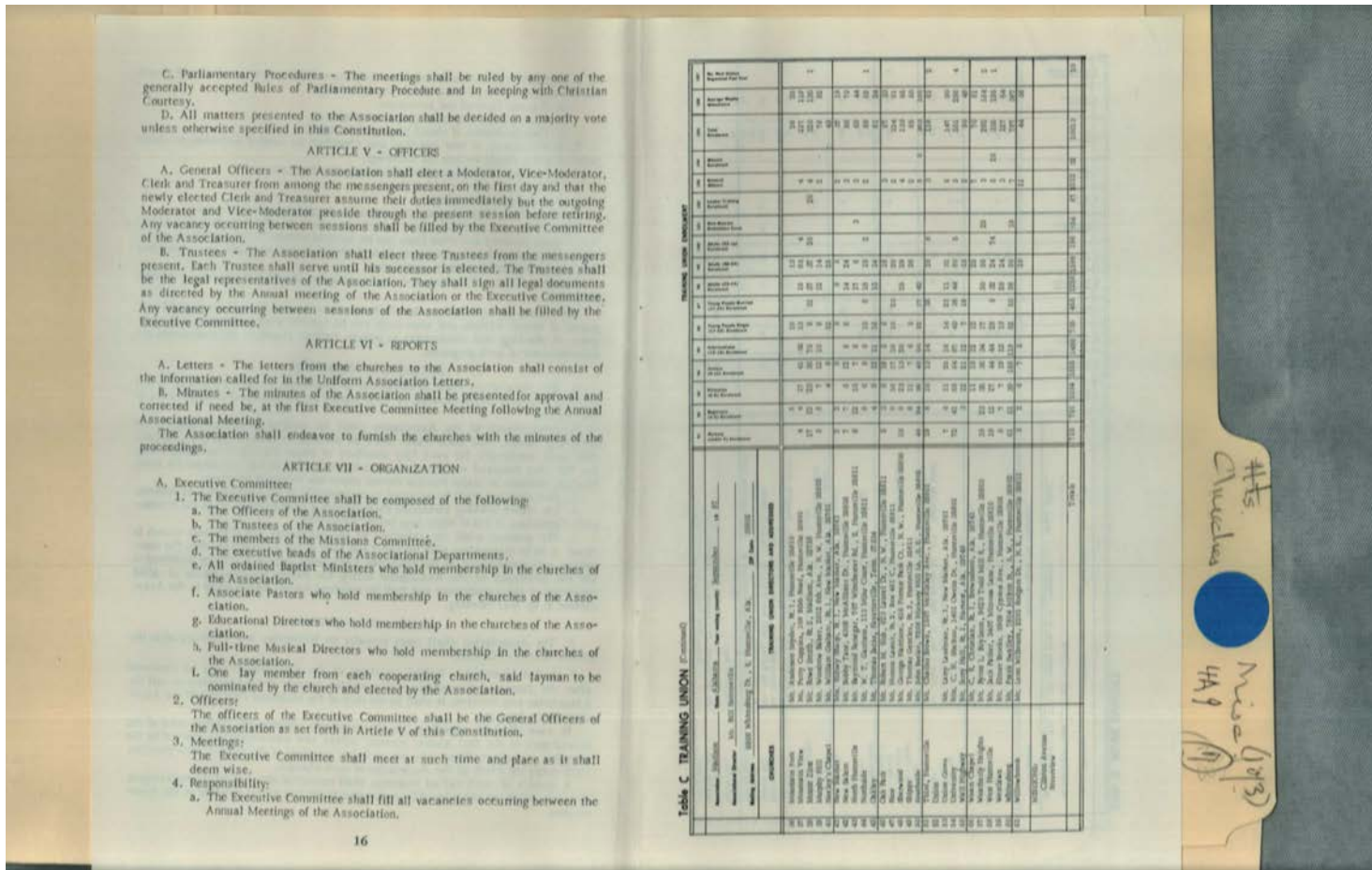

b. The Committee shall be responsible for the promotion of all the work of the Association between meetings of the Association.

c. The Committee shall have power under the instruction of the Association to hold, buy, sell, and convey property, both real and personal; and to direct the Trustees to sign any and all documents necessary for such purchase or conveyance.

d. In any and all cases of emergency between the Annual Meetings of the Association, the Committee shall have the power to act legally for the Association; provided, however, that in such instances as involves the purchase, mortgage or sale of real property two weeks notice shall be given in writing to every member stating the purpose of the meeting and the nature of the transaction to be passed upon.

e. At each Annual Meeting of the Association, the Committee shall recommend a budget for the ensuing year's work, covering all the activities of the Association and its Departments.

B. The Administration Committee:

1. Membership - The Administration Committee shall be composed of five pastors and two laymen who shall be members of the Executive Committee and shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Association upon the recommendation of the Nominating Committee.

2. Responsibility:

a. Perform the functions of an Administration Committee.

b. Recommend for election and supervise the work of all personnel employed by the Association.

c. The establishment of the following program for the Association:
 Paid personnel as follows:
 (1) Priority One - Superintendent of Missions and Office Secretary or Secretaries.
 (2) Priority Two - Assistant to the Superintendent of Missions.
 (3) Priority Three - Additional staff to meet program needs as they develop.

The qualifications and duties of paid personnel as follows:

(1) Superintendent of Missions

(a) Qualifications:

(a) Faith - The Superintendent of Missions should be an ordained Baptist Preacher who is found to be sound in faith and Baptist doctrine and feels Divinely called for this particular ministry.

(b) Education - The Superintendent of Missions should be fitted academically and theologically to command the respect of all in his field, therefore, he should be a man who possesses a theological education in keeping with the ideals of the Southern Baptist Convention.

(c) Administration - Because of the nature of the work of the Association, the Superintendent of Missions should possess unusual administrative abilities thereby enabling him to organize and coordinate the work and be able to delegate responsibility.

(d) Public Relations - The Superintendent of Missions should be endowed with the fundamental principles of public relations enabling him to make a good public appearance in speaking ability, in dress and in manner.

(b) Duties:

The general and specific duties of the Superintendent of Missions, along with the job description of the work, will be determined by the Administration Committee and presented to the Executive Committee for final approval.

(2) Assistant to the Superintendent of Missions

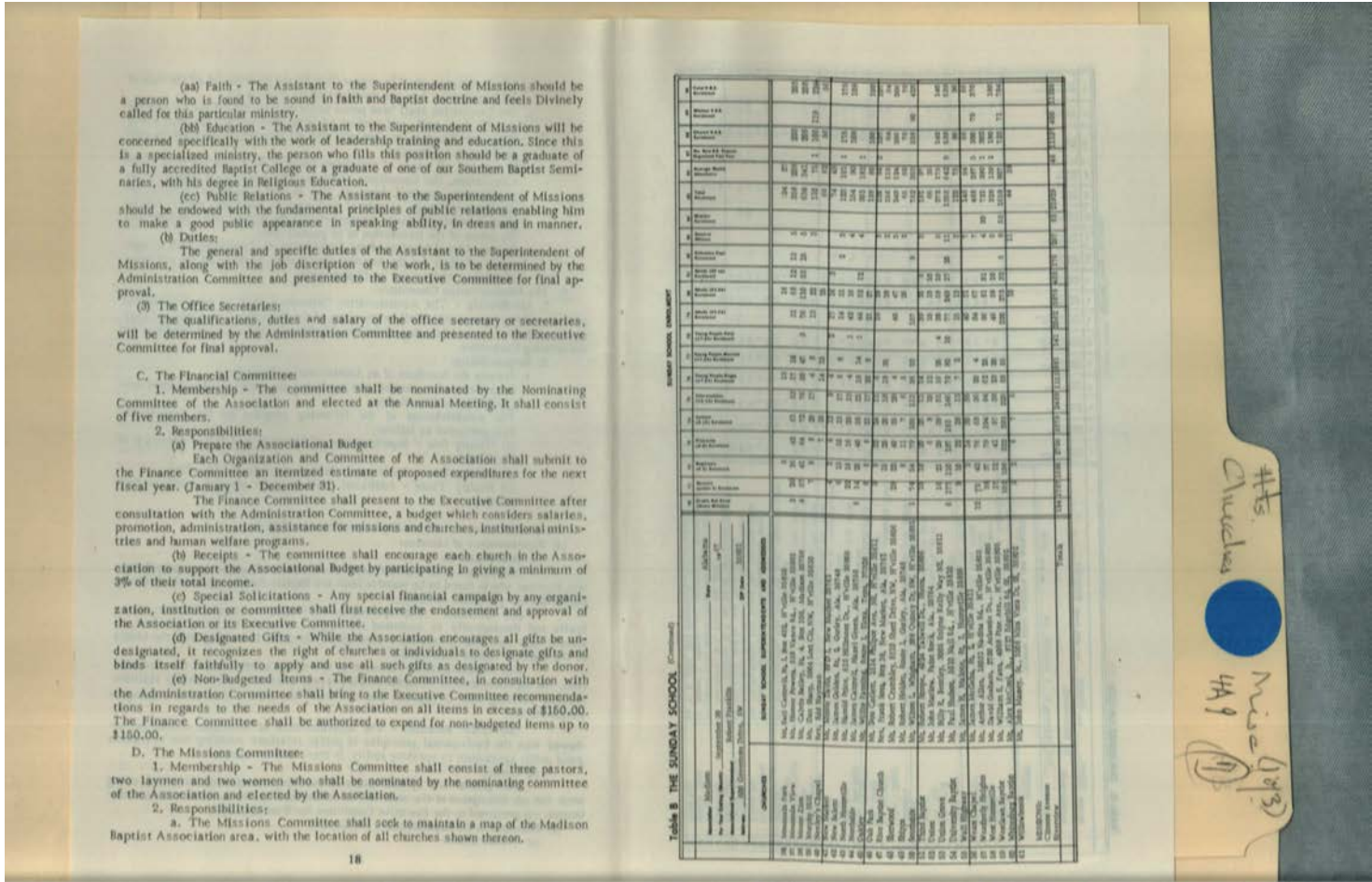

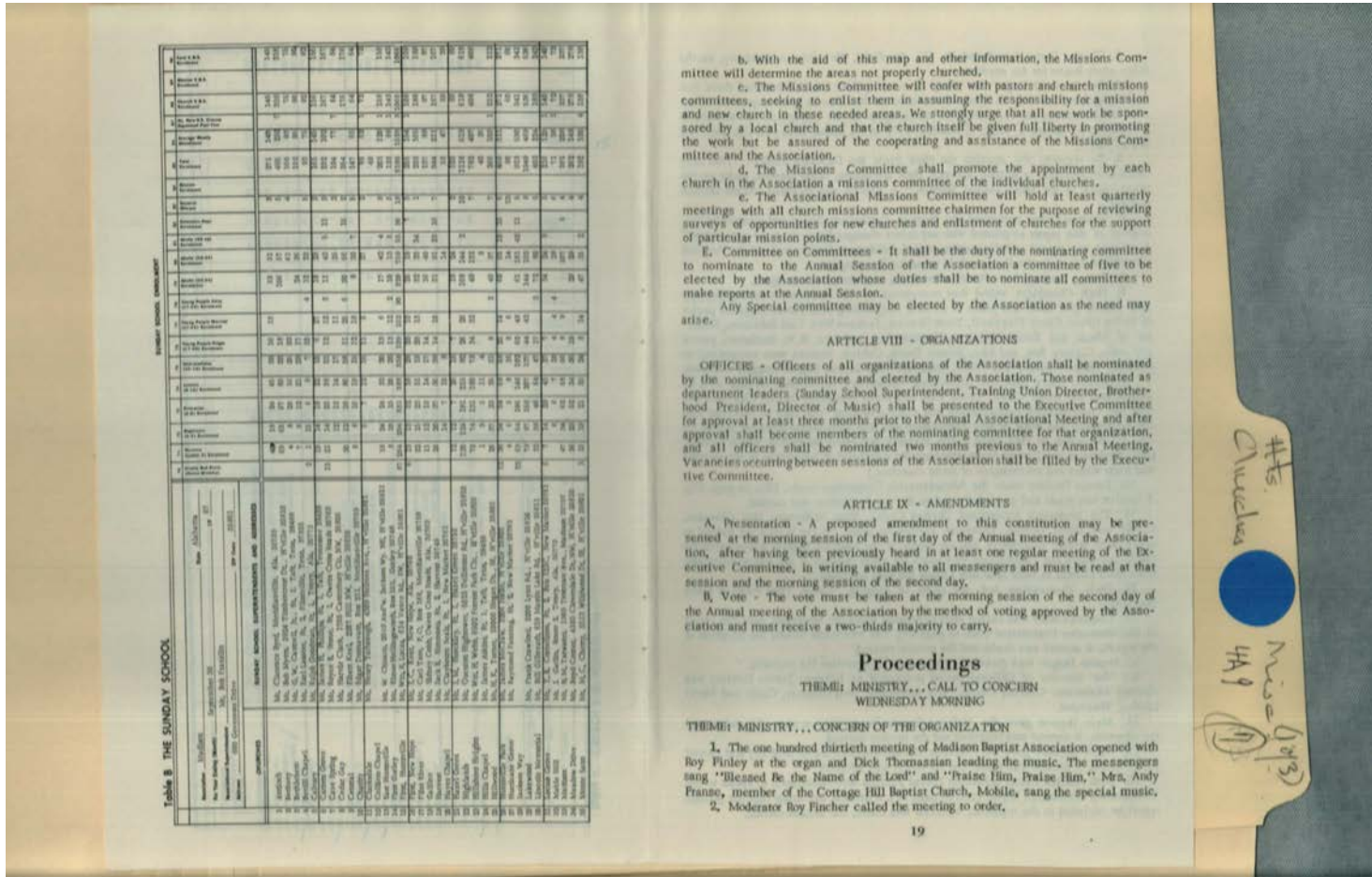

3. Charles Carter introduced Dr. V.L. Stanfield, New Orleans Seminary, as the Bible study leader for the sessions.

4. Dr. Stanfield began the study by reading John 14:12. Interesting Facts About First Baptist Church

Building Notes

The beautiful new Sanctuary of First Baptist Church is one of the most imposing structures in the city of Huntsville. The seven large arches, 67' in height, which span the entire length of the building, create a new dimension of design in church architecture among Baptists. Upon entering the huge smoothed aluminum doors, you are greeted by an expansive floor covering for the Narthex is terrazzo. From the Narthex, seven lovely American Cherry and glass doors open into the Sanctuary which seats approximately 2000. The basic color scheme for the room is gold, in various shades. Terrazzo also is used at the pulpit area. You have already seen pictures of a number of views of this marvelous room and its functional aspects. A sound room and television room look down from the balcony upon the pulpit and choir area. The choir loft contains 122 movable chairs and will seat up to 175 behind the choir rail.

Adjacent to the Sanctuary, though located in the educational facility, are adequate baptismal dressing rooms.

Located behind the Sanctuary is a complete Music Suite containing offices for the Minister of Music, Associate Minister of Music and Organist-Music Secretary; a library, ladies' and men's robing rooms and rest rooms, piano practice rooms, a sound room and one of the finest choir rehearsal rooms to be found.

The new building contains 2,170 yards of concrete, 4,800 cubic feet of limestone, 100,000 bricks, 200 tons of reinforcing steel, 55 tons of structural steel. The total cost of the Sanctuary building was \$1,200,000 plus furnishings.

There is a rigid frame at each end of the Sanctuary going down into the ground 45 feet. This rigid frame and the limestone columns to each side of the Sanctuary support the longest span of concrete roof east of the Mississippi River. The 400 tons of air conditioning equipment located in the educational facilities adequately care for heating and cooling of both units.

The educational facilities, the finest to be found anywhere, were planned under the able leadership of the former Minister of Education, Mr. Ira Hildose. Significant contributions were made in the early planning by Richard H. Sparks. Over 100,000 square feet of floor space provides room for 12 Nursery departments, 6 Beginner departments, 9 Primary departments, 4 Junior departments, 4 Intermediate departments, 2 Young People's departments, and 9 Adult departments; a Fellowship Hall with seating capacity of 600 for dining, a large kitchen, Recreation Room, Chapel to seat 500, Library, Parlor, Prayer Room, Conference Room. Offices for pastoral, educational, and administrative staff, and a large inner court partially floored with concrete and partially landscaped with a beautiful lawn and trees.

Several interesting facts regarding the building are: over 10,000 linear feet (approximately two miles) of duct work for heating and cooling; over 25,000 cubic yards of concrete; 400 tons of steel; 253,000 bricks; a total cost of \$1,600,000 plus equipment.

The grounds have been beautifully landscaped with shrubs, trees, and islands of ivy in the parking areas. The spacious front lawn add to the beautiful expanse of the front of the Sanctuary and Chapel. A 240-foot tower will be constructed in the future and will stand at a point almost centrally located between the Chapel and the Sanctuary. The church facilities are situated on approximately 12 acres of land, with the areas to the East, North, and West utilized as paved parking space.

Historical Notes

- 1809 First Baptist Church organized on West Fork of Flint River a few miles Northeast of Huntsville on June 3. First name of church, Enon; first pastor, John Canterbury, 1809-1815.
- 1814 Church affiliated with the Flint River Association which was formed in September; reported 69 members.
- 1825 A new brick church was built.
- 1827 Baptist State Convention met with Enon Baptist Church. William H. Holcombe, pastor.
- 1828 Church voted unanimously protesting non-fellowshipping resolution of Flint River Association. Proceeded to organize missionary churches into a new association.
- 1838 Church voted to request the Home Mission Board for financial assistance with work in Huntsville, an arm of Enon.
- 1861 Enon voted to move into Huntsville, corner of West Clinton and Gallatin Streets. Eugene Strode was pastor.
- 1870 Huntsville Baptist Female Society organized. Name changed to Miss Society in 1876, to Ladies Aid Society in 1883; and to Woman's Missionary Society in 1895.
- 1885 Dedicated new First Baptist Church on corner of Clinton and Gallatin Streets. Oscar Haywood was pastor; church membership, 200.
- 1890 New pipe organ installed in church. Two years later Beulah Neece, now Mrs. Frank Ware, became church organist and served continuously for 60 years.
- 1905 B.Y.P.U. of First Baptist Church sponsored the appearance of Naval hero and statesman, Richmond Pearson Hobson, in Huntsville.
- 1925 Pastor R. M. Jennings led the church into a building program to build a new First Baptist Church on the Chapman lot on East Holmes Street. An architect was employed. Because of failure of members to agree and collapse of the fund-raising effort, the project was abandoned.
- 1925 Dr. John J. Milford became pastor. Longest pastorate in history of the church, 1925-1949.
- 1949 Dr. J. T. Ford became pastor. New educational building constructed during his pastorate, 1949-1962.
- 1953 Dr. Alvin H. Hopson, of Lebanon, Tennessee, called as pastor on July 22; assumed pastorate, September 1.
- 1954 Long Range Planning Committee formed October 6th.
- 1956 Hauer property on Governors Drive purchased May 9th.
- 1957 Church voted in January to develop entire program on new site. Elected Building Committee in April.
- 1958 In July Church accepted preliminary plans and design for a new church.
- 1959 Church observed the Sesquicentennial from May 11 to June 7, using the theme "A Historic Church Accounting the Future." 66 pastors have served the church during 150 years of service.
- 1963 Church moved into new educational building on Governors Drive, January 13.
- 1966 Church occupied the new sanctuary on February 20.

Our New Pipe Organ





MR. CLARENCE LEDBETTER

Our new Casavant pipe organ has been named in loving honor of Mrs. Frank Ware, organist of First Baptist Church for sixty years. The Beulah Ware Pipe Organ is made up of 4,149 pipes (76 ranks) housed in the five divisions listed below. The organ, built by Casavant Freres, Limitee, of St. Hyacinthe, Quebec, Canada, was installed in the new Sanctuary prior to opening day services, February 20, 1966. The tonal work was completed just prior to Easter Sunday. The four-manual console contains 60 stop knobs, nine tilting tablets, 53 thumb pistons and toe studs, two balanced expression pedals and a crescendo pedal, as well as a standard A.G.O. pedal board. The Great and Positive divisions are exposed above the Baptistry, with a portion of the Pedal division exposed to either side. Two divisions, the Swell to the left of the Baptistry, and the Choral to the right of the Baptistry, are under expression. The remainder of the Pedal is free-standing, above the Swell division. The Rauschpfeife III and the 32' Kontraposaune are prepared on the console and will be added later.

Mr. Clarence Ledbetter, Assistant Professor of Music at Ball State College, Muncie, Indiana, will play the Dedicatory Recital at 4:00 in the afternoon, May 15, 1966.
