r(President), Charles Miller, S. J. Carter, Albert Weeden, G. W. Allen, Enoch Cooper and R. M. Lowe. The mortgage was given to the board of Church Extension for the sum of \$1,000.00. The mortgage was recorded by Judge Richardson. Another mortgage was given February 5, 1879 for the sum of \$500.00 to the Board of Church Extension. The following gentlemen were trustee: (Messrs. Albert Powers, D. L. Brandon, A.M. Love (Secretary Protem), William Tivis, and Allen Welden.

The members of the church hauled the bricks from Eustis Street with their mules, horses and wagons. One such person was John Porter, the grandfather of the late Reverend Hosea McCaulley who was himself once a loyal member of Lakeside. Lakeside's name was not properly recorded until after Mr. Thornton Stanley of Stanley Construction Company came into possession of the Jefferson Street lot. As you see, the whites originally called the Jefferson Street Church the *African Methodist Church*

In the 1950's Mrs. Lila Penney, the mother of the late Miss Mildred Penny, informed me that her father's funeral was the first funeral that was held in the sanctuary. The sanctuary was not finished and she was in with a new baby. The mother could not get out for the funeral; she sat in the house and watched the funeral procession. Mrs. Penney described her father as a very loyal church member. She said that her father, Lewis Rankins, was loved by the church. The sisters and brothers picked up their buckets, mops, brooms, soap, water and whatever was needed to clean the sanctuary. The sanctuary was in tip top condition for the funeral of Brother Rankins.

The first wedding in the Jefferson Street Lakeside sanctuary was that of a daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Rankins and she was the sister of Mrs. Lila Penny.

The third and last stage of the building program was the building dedication. Rev. A. W. McKinney was Lakeside's pastor at the time and presided over the services. On August 29, 1886 the dedication services were held. The entire program follows:

- Opening Hymn-----"Praise God from Whom All Blessing Flow"
- Paragraph 411 from the *Book of Discipline* read by Dr. J. Braden, D.D.
- President of Central Tennessee College (now Meharry) Speaker of the hour
- Scripture----- Rev. M. M. McKinney, II Chronicles Chapter 6
- Prayer----- Rev. J.F. Humphrey, Pastor of Church Street Presbyterian Church
- Scripture-----Hebrews 10:10-26 Rev. J. F. Humphrey
- Hymns and Anthems by the Sanctuary Choir, interspersed
- Dedicatory Sermon-----Rev J. Braden, Prsident, Central Tennessee College
- Text ----- "Preach the Word" II Timothy 4:2

The ceremony of dedicating the church according to the Discipline was performed. Dr. Braden then in a few words pronounced the church dedicated to God as house of worship. Throughout the solemn service, attention and devotion were exhibited. Dr. Braden thanked the choir for contributing so greatly to the success fo the occasion. With Professor William Riley as the organ and the choir had never rendered sweeter music. Not only did Dr. Braden thank the choir for the success of the occasion but he thanked them for his personal enjoyment. At this service Mr. and Mrs. Neal Robinson presented an elegant Bible to be used on the pulpit. A club, the "Band of Helpers" furnished the pulpit with a carpet and chairs at a cost of thirty-six dollars. The collection of the

Frederick Douglass High School in Baltimore Maryland and the preparatory department of Howard University. Because of poor health, Mr. Binford resigned from Huntsville City School in 1918.

There were five children in this family, three boys: Elmer C., Claxton and Henry Francis. There were two girls: Ruth and Dorothy. Elmer became a minister and teacher. Claxton became a medical doctor. Henry Francis was an electrical engineer and taught the trade at Howard University. Both daughters taught school. Mrs. Ruth Binford Carter spent her teaching years at Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University. Dorothy spent much of her working years in Washington, D.C.

Dorothy remained here in Huntsville for many years in very poor health but she always paid their pledge to the church. They were all dutiful to their church. H.C. Binford, Jr., was the husband of Mrs. Jordan Binford. We can see that Mr. Binford was an education advocate and being an advocate of education and an alderman, I am sure Mr. Binford did all he could for education.

One Daniel Brandon has been mentioned. We shall talk about a second Daniel Brandon, who was a contractor. Most persons who have been in Huntsville for twenty or more years remember a two story red brick house in the state of decay on Pulaski Pike. This had been a beautiful home, was on the opposite side where Bell Avenue runs into Pulaski. The home was that of Alderman Brandon. The house was proof of the excellent work done by him.

In reading the *Huntsville Weekly Gazette*s of the 80's and 90's, we find that Mr. Brandon's father had a brick yard and Daniel was a brick mason. The story says the father had the bricks and the son is building the federal building. Those who remember the post office knows that it was across from First Methodist on Green and Randolph.

The Missionary Baptist Church on Northwest Vine Street in Decatur stands a memorial to honor the work of Daniel Brandon. I remember when this building was being erected and remember hearing what was being said about this contractor. The Church built by Alderman Brandon was renovated in 1992. It looks very nice. How many young men did he teach to lay bricks? Each alderman has made his contribution. Not only were these men fit for the 1880's but they are Methodist men for any age.

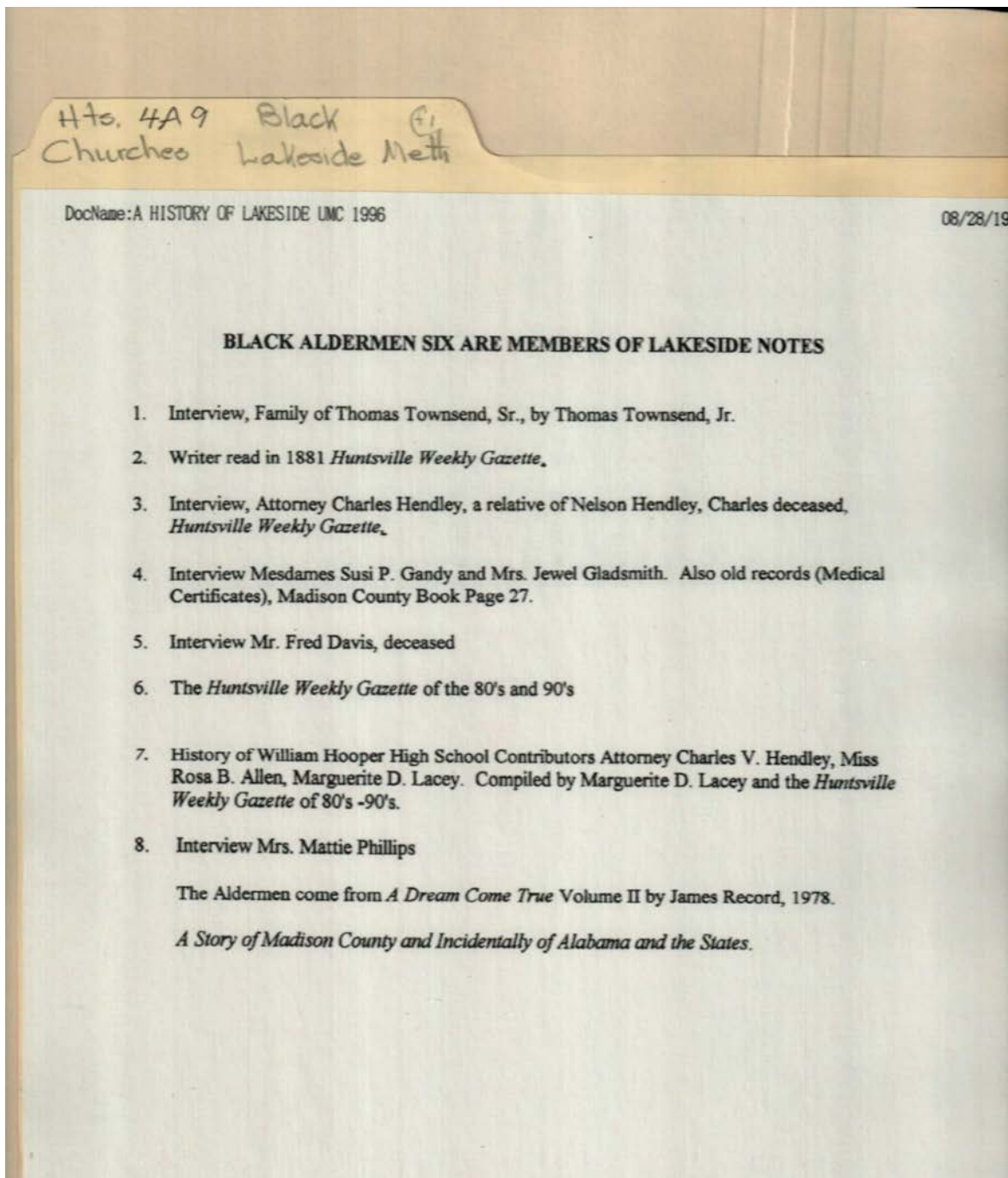

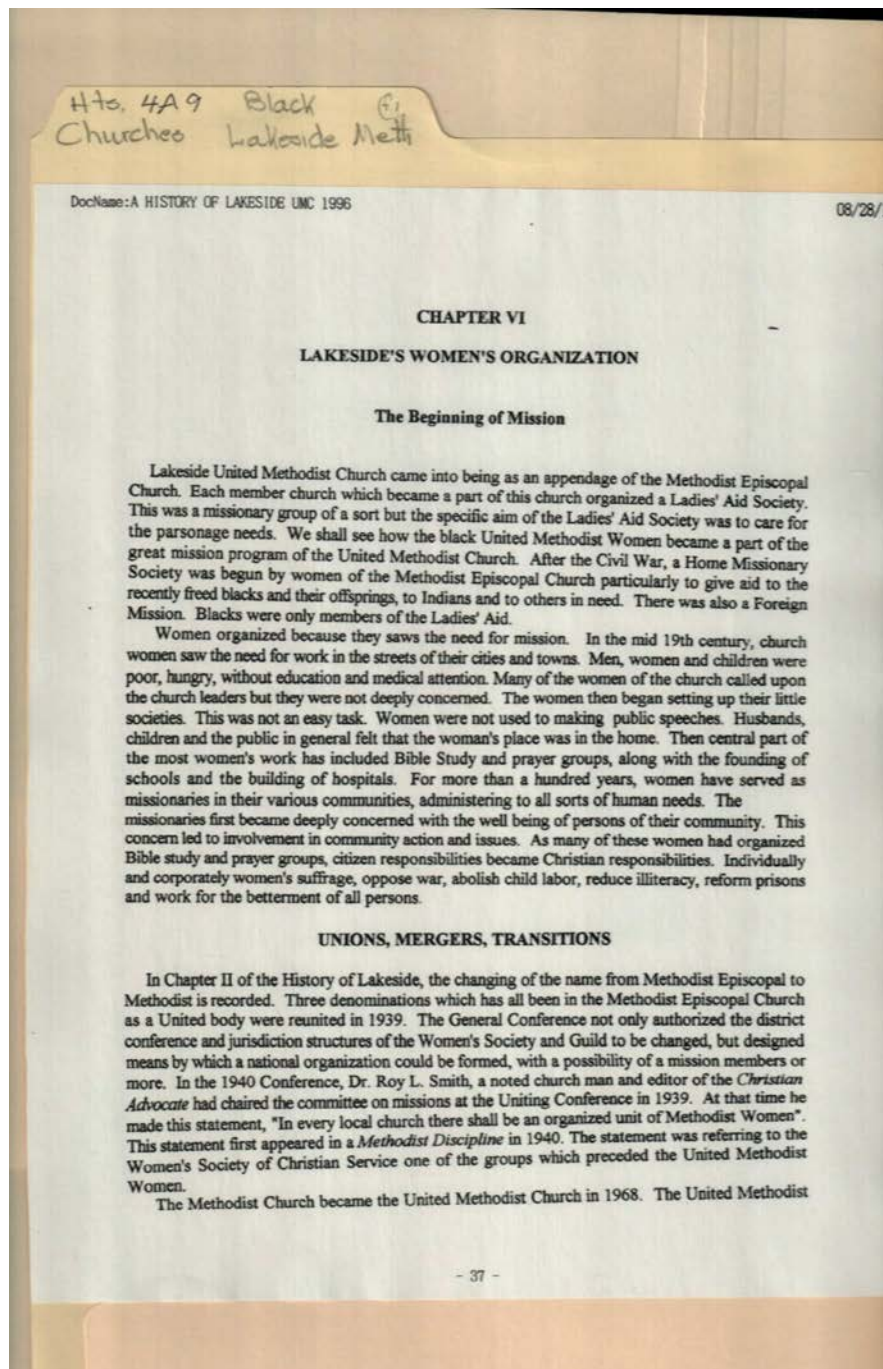

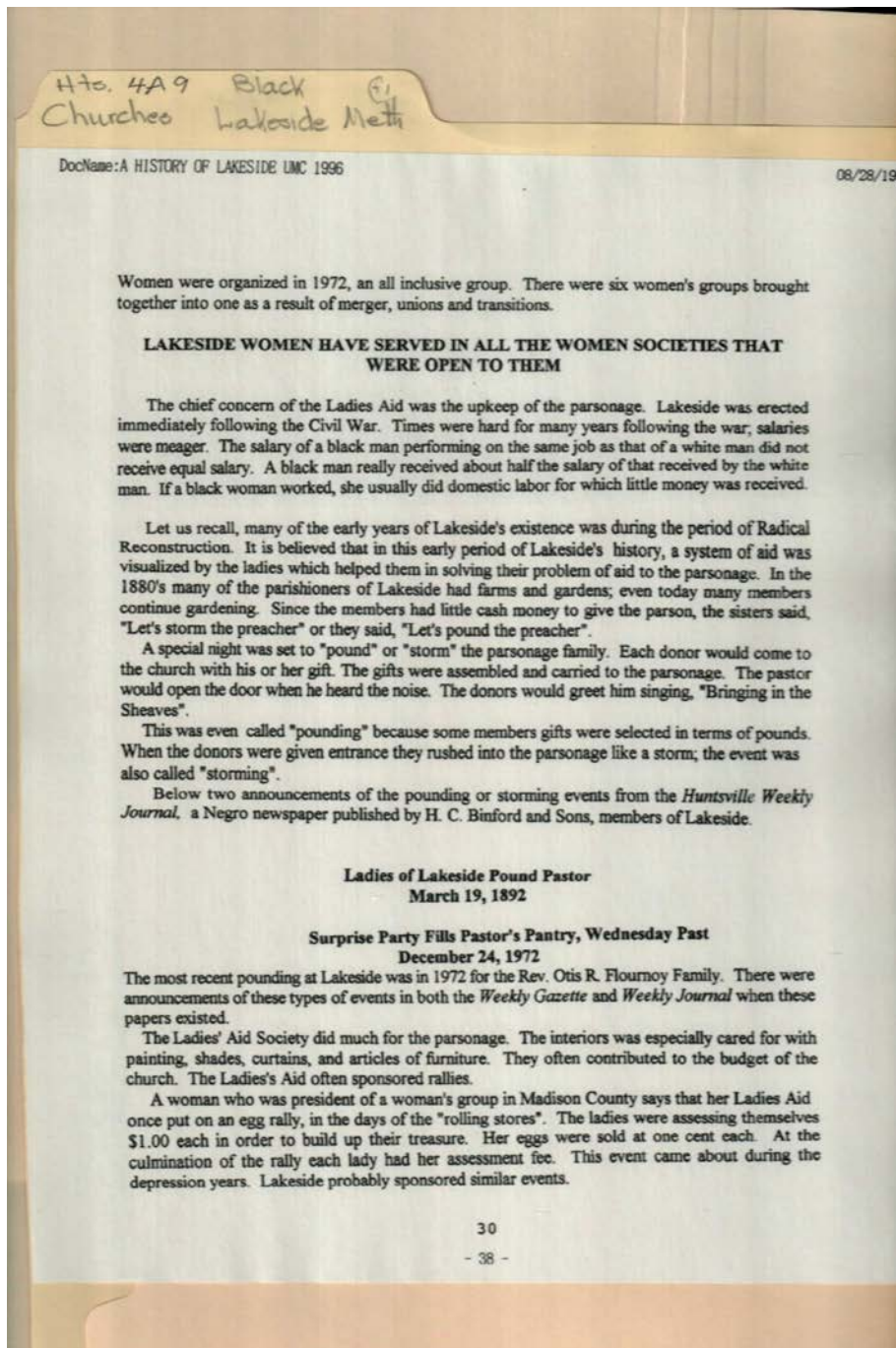

Women were organized in 1972, an all inclusive group. There were six women's groups brought together into one as a result of merger, unions and transitions.

**LAKESIDE WOMEN HAVE SERVED IN ALL THE WOMEN SOCIETIES THAT WERE OPEN TO THEM**

The chief concern of the Ladies Aid was the upkeep of the parsonage. Lakeside was erected immediately following the Civil War. Times were hard for many years following the war, salaries were meager. The salary of a black man performing on the same job as that of a white man did not receive equal salary. A black man really received about half the salary of that received by the white man. If a black woman worked, she usually did domestic labor for which little money was received.

Let us recall, many of the early years of Lakeside's existence was during the period of Radical Reconstruction. It is believed that in this early period of Lakeside's history, a system of aid was visualized by the ladies which helped them in solving their problem of aid to the parsonage. In the 1880's many of the parishioners of Lakeside had farms and gardens; even today many members continue gardening. Since the members had little cash money to give the parson, the sisters said, "Let's storm the preacher" or they said, "Let's pound the preacher".

A special night was set to "pound" or "storm" the parsonage family. Each donor would come to the church with his or her gift. The gifts were assembled and carried to the parsonage. The pastor would open the door when he heard the noise. The donors would greet him singing, "Bringing in the Sheaves".

This was even called "pounding" because some members gifts were selected in terms of pounds. When the donors were given entrance they rushed into the parsonage like a storm; the event was also called "storming".

Below two announcements of the pounding or storming events from the *Huntsville Weekly Journal*, a Negro newspaper published by H. C. Binford and Sons, members of Lakeside.

The most recent pounding at Lakeside was in 1972 for the Rev. Otis R. Flournoy Family. There were announcements of these types of events in both the *Weekly Gazette* and *Weekly Journal* when these papers existed.

The Ladies' Aid Society did much for the parsonage. The interiors was especially cared for with painting, shades, curtains, and articles of furniture. They often contributed to the budget of the church. The Ladies' Aid often sponsored rallies.

A woman who was president of a woman's group in Madison County says that her Ladies Aid once put on an egg rally, in the days of the "rolling stores". The ladies were assessing themselves \$1.00 each in order to build up their treasure. Her eggs were sold at one cent each. At the culmination of the rally each lady had her assessment fee. This event came about during the depression years. Lakeside probably sponsored similar events.

The operating room was furnished with all necessary instruments, tables and apparatus for the most difficult of the usual operation. The resident physician and the head nurse were in constant attendance.

The hospital was open to all reputable physicians. Many of the white doctors brought their colored operative cases here, and so did the colored doctors. In this way plenty of practice was provided for the nurses during their three years of training. (The 1919 Normalite: 60)

The hospital facilities were closed when facilities for colored were made available at the Huntsville Hospital. It was remodeled and used variously as a dormitory, the President's home, and a faculty home. In 1947, it was converted into an infirmary and has since served as the University Infirmary, attended by a full-time nurse with a school physician on call.

**BIBB GRAVES HALL**



Bibb Graves Hall was erected in 1929 at a cost of one hundred twenty-two thousand dollars (\$122,000.00). It was the first major building constructed on the campus since 1911. Its construction marked the beginning of President J. F. Drake's building construction boom.

The rock retaining walls and steps in front of Bibb Graves were built from stone that once served as three-foot walls of the Old Green Bottom Inn which burned in 1931.

It was named in honor of the late Honorable Bibb Graves, a former Governor of Alabama, and was the center of campus life for many years.

for faculty and staff, freshmen, graduating seniors, visiting dignitaries and artists; weddings; birthday parties; etc. were held at Hillcrest.

Upon Dr. Drake's retirement in 1961, Dr. Richard David Morrison was named the fifth president of Alabama A&M University. Hillcrest was re-decorated for occupancy for the new presidential family. In 1962, President Morrison and his wife, Ethel, moved into Hillcrest. The Morrison's occupied Hillcrest until his retirement in 1984.

During the early part of this 22 year period, public accommodations became more accessible in the City of Huntsville as a result of the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Thus, the necessity for Hillcrest to serve as the exclusive guest home for special out-of-town guests was eliminated.

By 1984, Hillcrest was 49 years old and had housed two presidential families. Therefore, it needed extensive repairs and renovation. Because of its historical significance, Hillcrest was scheduled for renovation by authority of the Board of Trustees and Alabama State Building Commission with David Jones, Architect and Stevens Contractor, Inc., the contractor. Renovations were begun in January, 1985 under the direction of the Hillcrest Renovation Committee appointed by the Board of Trustees.

In July, 1984, Dr. Douglas Covington was named the sixth president of Alabama A & M University. Dr. Covington; his wife, Beatrice; and their sons, Toney and Jeffrey, became the third presidential family to occupy Hillcrest. Upon their arrival on the campus, they were housed in the Home Management House for a few days, after which they moved into Hillcrest. Hillcrest continues to serve as the official site of presidential functions and the renovation continues.

In June of 1968 we moved into the present building. Bishop W. Kenneth Goodson preached the Consecration sermon in February of 1969. Meantime, the property on Jefferson Street was put up for sale. The church was later destroyed by fire. A number of invaluable items were lost in the fire; namely: stained glass windows, two cornerstones, chandelier and church records. Fortunately, many of the items had been moved to the new church site. Among these items were the organ (a gift from the Episcopal Church of Nativity); the pews, the hall tree; and the lion foot table.



#### ANNIE ENGLAND COOPER INCLUDES LAKESIDE IN HER WILL

Mrs. Annie Cooper, a loyal member of Lakeside, included her church in her will. The congregation of Lakeside United Methodist Church is eternally grateful to her for making available to the church, more than \$14,000.00, which was used in defraying expenses in the erection and the equipping of the new church.

Mrs. Cooper was the wife of Thomas Cooper who served as principal of the early school held in the church basement. It is reported that she served her community and church in various capacities over a period of many years. She was a teacher in the public schools, a member and president of the Lakeside Choir, a teacher in the Sunday School. When the Women's Aid Society was organized, the first such organization in the church, Mrs. Cooper was made president, and she served in that capacity until the name was changed to Women's Society of Christian Service.



#### HARVEST CELEBRATIONS

Lakeside has been a viable part of the community for more than one hundred years. A very important date on the annual calendar is the Harvest Celebration, a type of thanksgiving program. The first Harvest Program was held in 1901. The introduction of this feature of Thanksgiving was given by Mrs. Mary Binford Jordan, who departed this life February 10, 1955.

The first wedding to be solemnized in the present structure was that of Dr. Vivian M. Chambers Clark and her husband, Dr. J. Hubert Clark. The first funeral was that of the late Mrs. John Langford, wife of one of our deceased ministers.

Some of the best ministers in the Central Alabama Conference have served as pastors of Lakeside. During the pastorship of Reverend L. G. Fields, Sr., 1941 to 1942, the church was extensively renovated. From 1942 to 1949, the late Reverend J. C. Wilson led the parishioners in another program of renovation which included the installation of beautiful stained glass windows. With his own labor, Reverend T. H. Houston, 1951 to 1960, plastered the walls of the basement and sanctuary (the damp basement kept the walls cracked). Under the leadership of Reverend M. C. Barrett, 1960 to 1969, the church on Meridian Street was planned and constructed. The late Reverend O. R. Flournoy, 1972 to 1981, organized the Altar Guild and the Acolytes of Lakeside. Presently, Lakeside, under the leadership of Dr. Frank J. Lee, has initiated a new program of renovation and expansion.

#### THE NEW CHURCH - MERIDIAN STREET

In 1963, three acres of land were purchased from the estate of the late Max Luther for \$15,000.00 as the site for a new church. In 1967, a committee of church members sold and bought approximately \$100,000.00 worth of bonds. In June 1968 we moved into the present building. Bishop W. Kenneth Goodson preached the Consecration sermon in February of 1969. Meantime, the property on Jefferson Street was put up for sale. The church was later destroyed by fire. A number of invaluable items were lost in the fire, namely the stained glass windows, two cornerstones, chandelier, and church records. Fortunately, many of the items had been moved to the new church site. Among these items were the organ (a gift from the Episcopal Church of Nativity), the pews, the hall tree, and the lion foot table.

#### WOMEN OF LAKESIDE

The late Mrs. Annie Cooper was the wife of Thomas Cooper who served as principal of the early school held in the church basement. She served her community and church in various capacities over a period of many years. She was a teacher in the public schools, a member and president of the Lakeside choir, and a teacher in the Sunday School. When the Women's Aid Society was organized, the first such organization in the church, Mrs. Cooper was made president, and she served in that capacity until the name was changed to Women's Society of Christian Service. Mrs. Cooper was a loyal member of Lakeside and included the church in her will. She made available \$14,000.00 to the church which was used in defraying expenses in the erection and the equipping of the new church on Meridian Street.

The first Harvest Program was introduced by the late Mrs. Mary Binford Jordan. It took place November 3, 1901, at 11:00 a.m. "The Weekly Journal", a Negro newspaper, edited and owned by H. C. Binford and Sons, on Thursday, November 7, 1901, gave an account of this first Harvest Program.

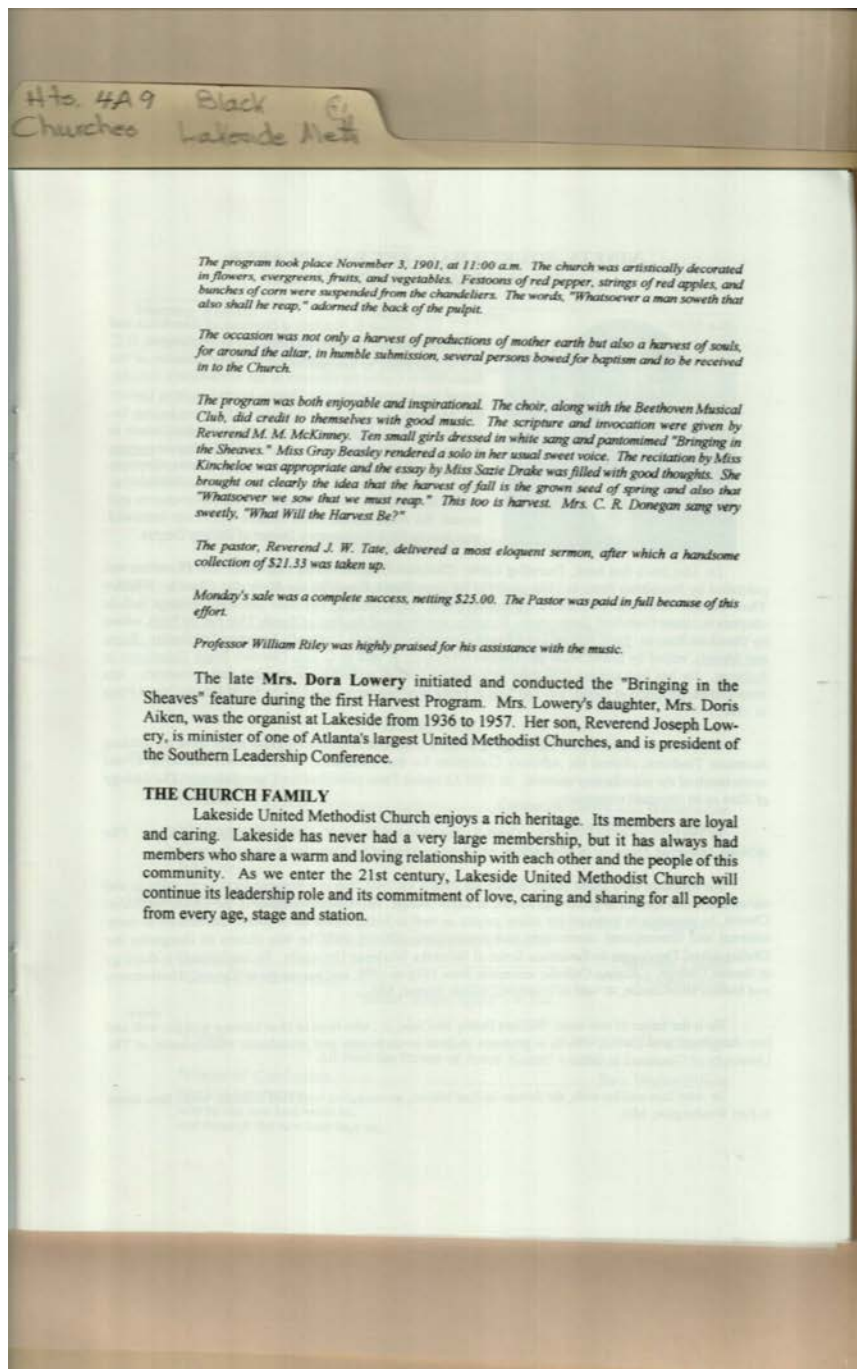

### NINETY-FOURTH HARVEST DAY SPEAKER DR. WILLIAM B. McCLAIN



Dr. William B. McClain is Professor of Homiletics and Worship at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. In 1978 he was named founding Executive Director of the Multi-Ethnic Center for Ministry of the Northeastern Jurisdiction of The United Methodist Church, located at Drew University, Madison, NJ. For ten years prior to that date he was Senior Pastor of the historic Union United Methodist Church in Boston, MA. Dr. McClain received his A. B. degree summa cum laude from Clark Atlanta University in Atlanta, GA; both his master's and doctoral degrees were earned at Boston University, Boston, MA. In recognition of his achievements and service, his Alma Mater, Clark Atlanta University bestowed upon him in 1991 the honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree.

Dr. McClain's first book, *Traveling Light: Christian Perspectives on Pilgrimage and Pluralism* was published by Friendship Press in 1981. In 1984 he wrote *Black People in the Methodist Church: Whither Thou Goest?* which was published by Abingdon Press, Nashville, TN. His other published writings include chapters in James Gadsden's *Experiences, Struggles and Hopes of the Black Church*; *This Far By Faith*, edited by Theodore Runyon; *Race, Religion and Reconciliation* by Gilbert H. Caldwell; *American Spirituality: Roots and Models*, edited by Robin Maas and Gabriel O'Donnell; as well as C. Eric Lincoln's *Black Experience in Religion*. He has had articles published in numerous secular and religious journals and periodicals. His monographs, *Strangers at Home*, and *The Soul of Black Worship*, were issued by the Multi-Ethnic Center Press in 1980.

Dr. McClain conceived of the *Songs of Zion*, a songbook featuring religious songs from the African American Tradition, chaired the Advisory Committee for that publication by Abingdon Press in 1981, and wrote much of the introductory material. In 1990 Abingdon Press published his *Come Sunday: The Liturgy of Zion* as its liturgical companion.

In 1991, he co-edited with Drs. Grant S. Shockley and Karen Y. Collier *Heritage and Hope: The African American Presence in Methodism*, which was published by Abingdon Press.

An Alabama civil rights leader during the 1960's, Dr. McClain is a frequent lecturer at colleges and universities, and speaker at gatherings related to social change. An ordained minister in the United Methodist Church, he preaches in many of the major pulpits as well as being called on to preach and lecture at many national and international conferences and conventions. During 1981 he was chosen to inaugurate the Distinguished Theologian-in-Residence Series at Nebraska Wesleyan University. He has lectured in theology at Boston College, a Roman Catholic university from 1973 to 1978, and has taught at Harvard, Northeastern and Boston Universities, as well as Emerson College, Boston, MA.

He is the father of two sons: William Bobby McClain, Jr., who lives in New Mexico with his wife and two daughters, and David, who is a graduate student in orchestral and symphonic management at The University of Cincinnati in Ohio.

Dr. McClain and his wife, the former Jo Ann Mattos, an executive with Bell Atlantic, make their home in Fort Washington, MD.

*It could be said that Lorenzo "Piper" Davis was ahead of his time. An outstanding baseball player in the Negro Leagues, he almost broke the color barrier with the Boston Red Sox in the early 1940s, but was cut from their Scranton farm team. Because of race? More likely age. Davis was 33.*

*But Davis and other Negro Leaguers made their mark on the game. First base, short stop, any position, Davis could play them all. An all-around athlete and showman, he toured with the Harlem Globe Trotters during the off-season.*

*Davis was one of a great line-up of Birmingham Black Barons who drew large numbers of black and white fans to Rickwood Field. Later, as coach of the team, he was "like a father" to young Willie Mays. He continued in the game as a scout for the majors.*

In 1867, Major Lewis Starke deeded two acres to church trustees Nimrod Lovett, Stamford Starlin (now Sterling), Narcis Elwa and Benjamin Franklin, four ex-slaves. Buried in the cemetery is Russell Dick, whose mother, Lucy, came to Mobile on the last voyage of the slave ship Clotilde. Dick is remembered as an outstanding and industrious citizen who acquired much land in the area and once owned all of downtown Daphne.

**DECATUR**  
(Morgan County)

**70 First Missionary Baptist Church**, Corner of Vine & Grove St. NW. The congregation was established in 1866 and the present structure was built in 1921 based on a design by noted black architect W.A. Rayfield. The church is patterned after the 16th St. Baptist Church in Birmingham. The original stained glass is exceptionally beautiful.

**71 Old Decatur Courthouse**, (HS), (AR) Corner of Ferry and Cain Streets. The courthouse was the scene, in 1933, of the retrial of the "Scottsboro Boys." This case led to the landmark Supreme Court decision interpreting a jury of one's peers to mean that blacks could no longer be excluded from jury service.

**72 Old State Bank**, (NR) 925 Bank Street. (205) 350-5060. Open Mon.-Fri. 9:30 a.m.-noon and 1-4:30 p.m. No Admission charge. In 1832 Alabama's first state bank was built in Decatur. The slaves who hoisted into

position the 100-ton pillars were then freed.

**73 Leon Sheffield Elementary School**, Hwy. 72. Named for a noted black educator who provided leadership for early public education in the area. The school formerly served as a county training school for black students.

**DEMOPOLIS**  
(Marengo County)

**74 Morning Star Baptist Church**, (AR) 614 East Jackson Street. The Colored



Lawson State Community College, 36

Baptist Church of Demopolis was organized in 1812 and first met in the servants' living quarters in a barn behind Gaineswood mansion. In 1920 it was renamed the Morning Star Baptist Church. Dr. King spoke at the church and civil rights workers used it as a base of operations.

**The Scottsboro Boys**  
Early in 1931, nine young black men were arrested in Scottsboro and charged with criminal assault in the alleged rape of two white women on a freight train. Within three weeks they were found guilty and all but the youngest, a boy of 13, were sentenced to death.

Through efforts of the NAACP, the International Labor Defense Committee (ILD) and the Communist party, the case became an international cause. A new trial was ordered by the Supreme Court when it was proved that the defendants had not had adequate counsel. Again, the verdict was "guilty." This time sentences were up to 99 years.

After 20 years and much legal action, the last defendant was released. In the mean time one of the women admitted lying and medical testimony maintained that rape had not occurred. The case of the Scottsboro Nine shined a spotlight on racism illuminating wrongs it would take decades to redress.

Alfred Anderson inspired the founding of the School of Aviation at Tuskegee University and became its chief instructor. **High Aspirations**  
*"Who says blacks can't fly," challenged first lady Eleanor Roosevelt after taking a ride in Charles Alfred "Chief" Anderson's tax-seater. Anderson was not only a record-setting aviator, he was a man with a mission to teach others to fly. In a special test program at Tuskegee's Moton Field, he taught the Tuskegee Airmen who flew in World War II, including the four squadrons of the 332nd Fighter Group, the 99th, 100th, 301st and 302nd.*

*The 332nd flew escort for bombers of the 15th Air Force. Commanded by Col. Benjamin O. Davis, Jr., the group received Distinguished Unit Citations for action over Sicily and Cassino and for escorting B-17's on Berlin in March of 1945.*

*Davis became the first black general in the Air Force, following in the footsteps of his father, B.O. Davis, Sr., the first black Army general. Daniel "Chappie" James, another Tuskegee pilot, flew more than 100 missions in Korea and Vietnam and became the nation's first black four-star Air Force general.*

**299 Tuskegee University**, (NR) *Old Montgomery Highway*. (334) 727-9011. This well-known black educational institution was created in 1881 by a legislative act sponsored by Louis Adams, a former slave, and George W. Campbell, a former slave

owner. Booker T. Washington was the school's first president. More than 27 buildings which are listed on the National Register are associated with the work of Booker T. Washington and Dr. George Washington Carver. Tuskegee University is the lasting legacy of these two great Americans.

**300 Administration Building**, (Kresge), (NR) *Tuskegee University*. This was originally the office of Booker T. Washington. A Centennial Vision Mural, 12 by 26 feet, is permanently displayed.

**301 The Chapel**, (NR) *Tuskegee University*. The Chapel was built in 1969 and designed by Paul Rudolph. The Old Tuskegee Chapel (1896) was destroyed by fire on January 23, 1957. It was designed by R. R. Taylor and built by students.

**302 Grey Columns**, (NR) *399 Old Montgomery Road*. Not open to the public. Two-story, masonry, Greek Revival structure built in 1857. It has an octagonal cupola, six protruding interior chimneys and a columned portico around three sides. The building is now the home of the Tuskegee University president.

**303 Daniel "Chappie" James Center for Aerospace Science and Health Education**, *Tuskegee University*. Mon.-Fri. 9 a.m.-12 noon and 1-4 p.m. Sat. and Sun. by appointment. No admission charge. The building houses the offices of the University's Army and Aerospace Sciences, Department of Aerospace Engineering, Natatorium, Health Education and the memorial hall for Gen. Daniel "Chappie" James, the first black four-star general and one of the University's best known students. The Aerospace Center bearing his name was designed by Alabamian and Tuskegee graduate Tarlee W. Brown.

**304 The Kellogg Executive Conference Center**, *Tuskegee University*. (334) 727-3000. Opened in 1994, the Center provides a total environment for successful meetings and conferences. It features

17,000 square feet of meeting space and 108 guest rooms and suites. An elegant, state-of-the-art facility, it is ideal for corporate and educational gatherings. The front entrance is Dorothy Hall which was part of the original campus.

**305 Veteran's Administration Medical Center**, *North Tuskegee*. (334) 727-0550. Built in 1921, it was the only Veterans Hospital for black veterans of World War I. It originally comprised 27 buildings. Many blacks received medical training here when it was not available to them elsewhere.

**306 Washington Collection and Archives**, *Tuskegee University Library*. Mon.-Thur. 8 a.m.-10 p.m., Fri. 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Sat. 12 noon - 4 p.m., Sun. 2 p.m.-10 p.m. The Washington Collection and Archives are located on the first floor of the Library. The library also houses many other books and artifacts by and about blacks.

**307 Booker T. Washington Gravesite**, *Tuskegee University*. Washington, his family, Dr. Carver, Levi Dawson and other noted persons associated with the university are buried in the University Cemetery.

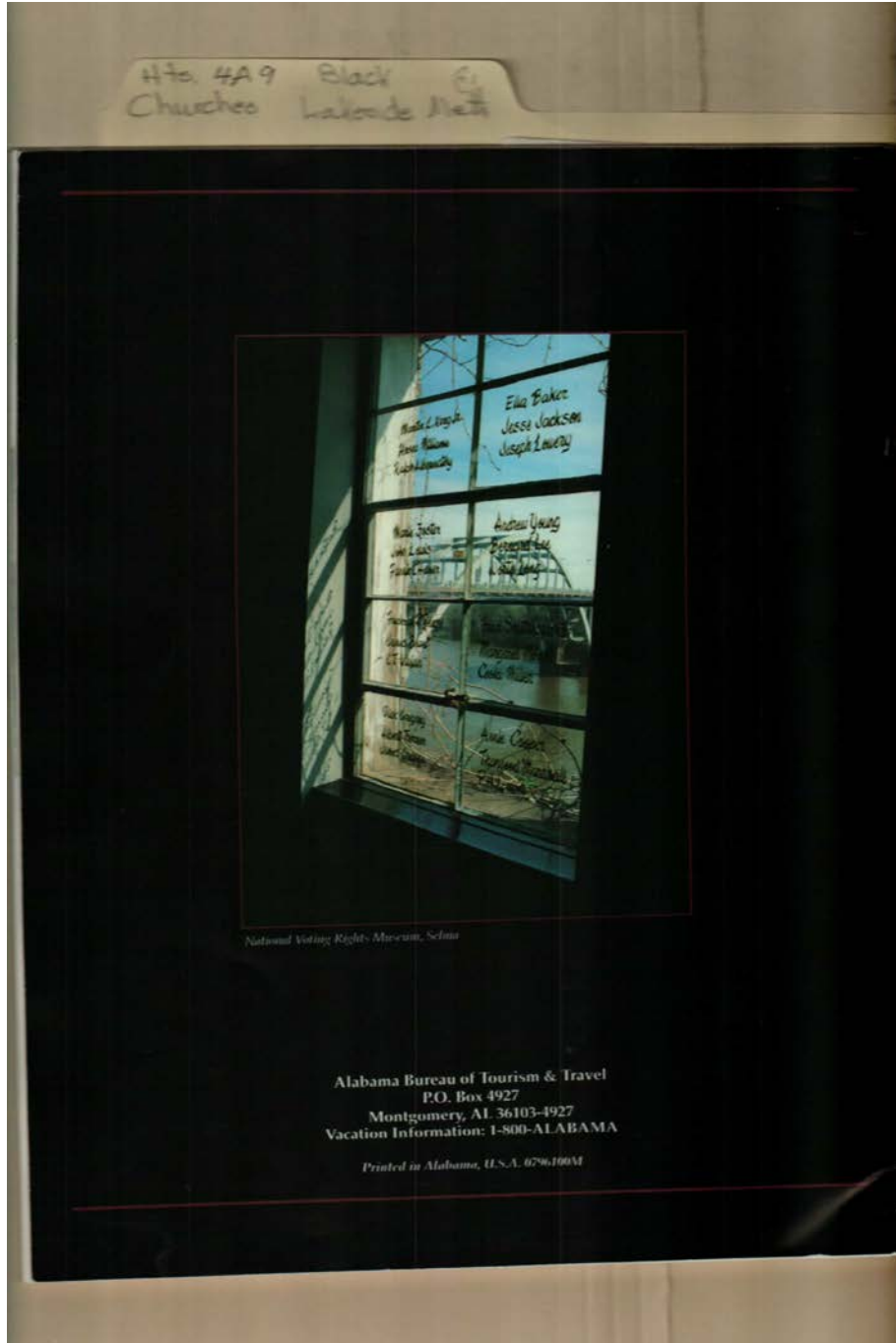
