"The Henderson And Stone Families"

By PHILIP H. HURST

My thanks to the late Peter Graham Fulkerson for his contributions to the following articles.

John Henderson, gentleman, was born in Scotland. His son, **William Henderson, gentleman,** was born April 30, 1676 and died August 1, 1737. He married Margaret Bruce on February 7, 1705. Margaret was born in Ulster, Ireland March 1, 1680 and died December 15, 1739. Their son, **Samuel Henderson,** was born November 28, 1713 and died January 19, 1782 in Augusta County, Virginia. In his will he mentioned his wife, **Jean,** and children: **James, Andrew, Alexander and Florence.** The children of Andrew and Mary Russell Henderson were:

Andrew, Samuel, John, Joseph, Thomas, Florence and Jean. Grandfather **Thomas Henderson** was among the very first settlers of Claiborne County (about 1780). He was a large landowner and prominent citizen. He first married a Miss Riggs and secondly married Elizabeth Hardy. His children by his first marriage were: 1. Rhoda H. who married John Hunt, Jr., 2. Jane, who married Thomas Hanse, 3. Polly, who married Archibald Bayles, 4. Preston, 5. Betsy, who married Pryor Adams, 6. Calvin, 7. Minerva, who married a Huddleston, 8. Jeremiah, who married Betsy Mills, 9. Emily who married a Simpson, 10. Susan, and 11. James H. Henderson.

John Hunt, Jr. moved to Alabama where they founded Huntsville. **John Hunt, Jr.** was the son of **John Hunt, first sheriff of Claiborne County.** **John Hunt, Sr.** owned part of the land upon which Tazewell was built. It was at his home that Bishop Asbury preached in 1802, converting many early settlers to Methodism. **Jeremiah Henderson** lived on a boundary of land known as the "Cedar Fork Farm".

Caroline Henderson, who married **Stokely R. Lanham** and **Adalise Henderson** who married **Reuben Kesterson** were daughters of **Jeremiah Henderson** and granddaughters of **Thomas Henderson.**

Caroline was born June 21, 1819 and died June 21, 1889. **Stokely R. Lanham** was born July 12, 1820 and died June 26, 1864. He was probably a grandson of **Abel Lanham,** an Englishman who fought for the British Crown, and who came to Claiborne County in about the year 1785.

Adaline Henderson was born December 3, 1820 and died September 22, 1861.


Reuben Kesterson was born January 11, 1820 and died May 15, 1882. He was the son of **David Kesterson** who came to Claiborne County in 1810.

Grandfather **Thomas Henderson's** children by his second marriage were: 1. **Clementina,** who married **Stephen Thompson.** 2. **John,** 3. **Thomas,** who married the widow of **Milton Hurst.** 4. **Martha,** who first married **Robert Southern,** secondly **James Thompson.** 5. **Eliza,** who married **Nelson Robinson.** 6. **Hugh,** who married **Vesta McVey,** and 7. **George,** who died unmarried in the Confederate Army.


Susan Henderson, daughter of **Thomas,** first married **Thomas Stone,** secondly, **Asa Barton.** The children of **Grandfather Thomas Stone** and **Susan Henderson Stone** were: 1. **Thomas Henderson Stone,** who married **Mary Harper.** 2. **Reuben F. Stone,** who married **Fetney Hurst.** 3. **John,** who married **Sallie Hurst.** 4. **Polly,** who married **William Evans.** 5. **Elizabeth,** who married **John Bruce** and 6. **Susan Stone,** married **Hugh Farmer.**

Grandfather **Thomas Stone** who married **Susan Henderson** was a soldier of the War of 1812. He came from North Carolina and settled on **Sycamore Creek.**
