LILY FLAGG, A HUNTSVILLE COW, TAKES THE CAKE AS A BUTTER PRODUCER. BISSON'S BELLE LEFT IN THE SHADE.

Last Wednesday Huntsville's now world famous Jersey cow, Lily Flag, of the Monte Sano Dairy owned by Messrs. Moore, Humts, and Matthews, rounded her year of butter making with 1047 pounds 6 3/4 ounces thus beating the world's record.

Bisson's Belle, that led the record in one year made 1028 pounds and 15 5/6 ounces of butter. Lily Flag beats this by 18 pounds 7 3/8 ounces. The official test was made by representatives of the American Jersey cattle club which also selected four of the Monte Sano Dairy Jerseys as part of the fifty Jersey cows from the U.S. to be exhibited at the World's Fair.
