to have public sch. transferred to the city, without
and to provide for the support of school - should sch.
for the same - The city refused letter 1875.
The council appointed several of its members as a
school committee - from 1875 - 1905 and was under
the supervision of the council.

In 1907 the direct jurisdiction of Sch. System was turned over to a five-Member Board of Education. This Board was appointed by the City Council, J.D. Humphrey, W.T. Hutchens, Lawrence Cooper, David Grayson and Oliver Goldsmith.

By 1920 most of the private sch. were closed they had given away to the rising popularity of public schools.
