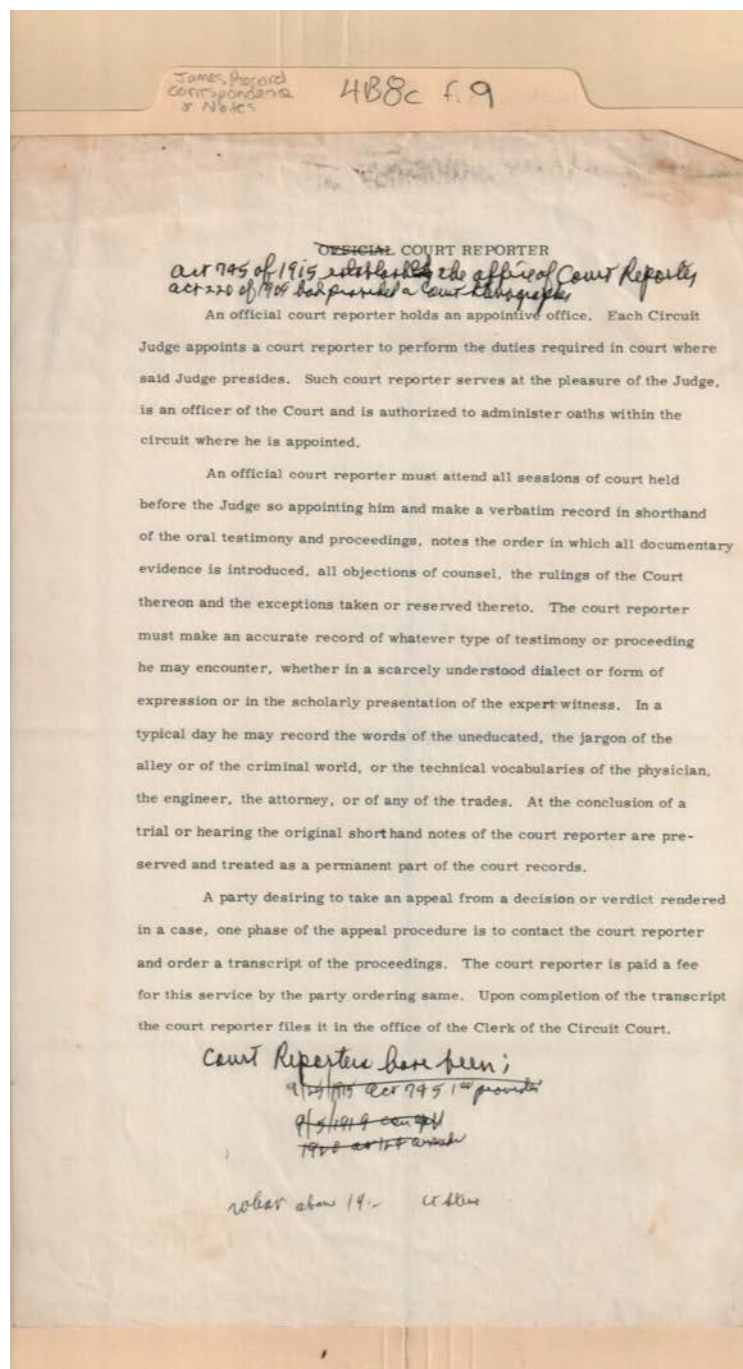
The library was first located at 206 Eustis Avenue and moved into the Courthouse upon its completion in January, 1967. ~~Judge Elbert Parsons was the Presiding Judge at that time and as such first library trustee.~~

~~In August, 1968, with the death of Judge Parsons, Judge David R. Archer became the Presiding Judge and library trustee.~~

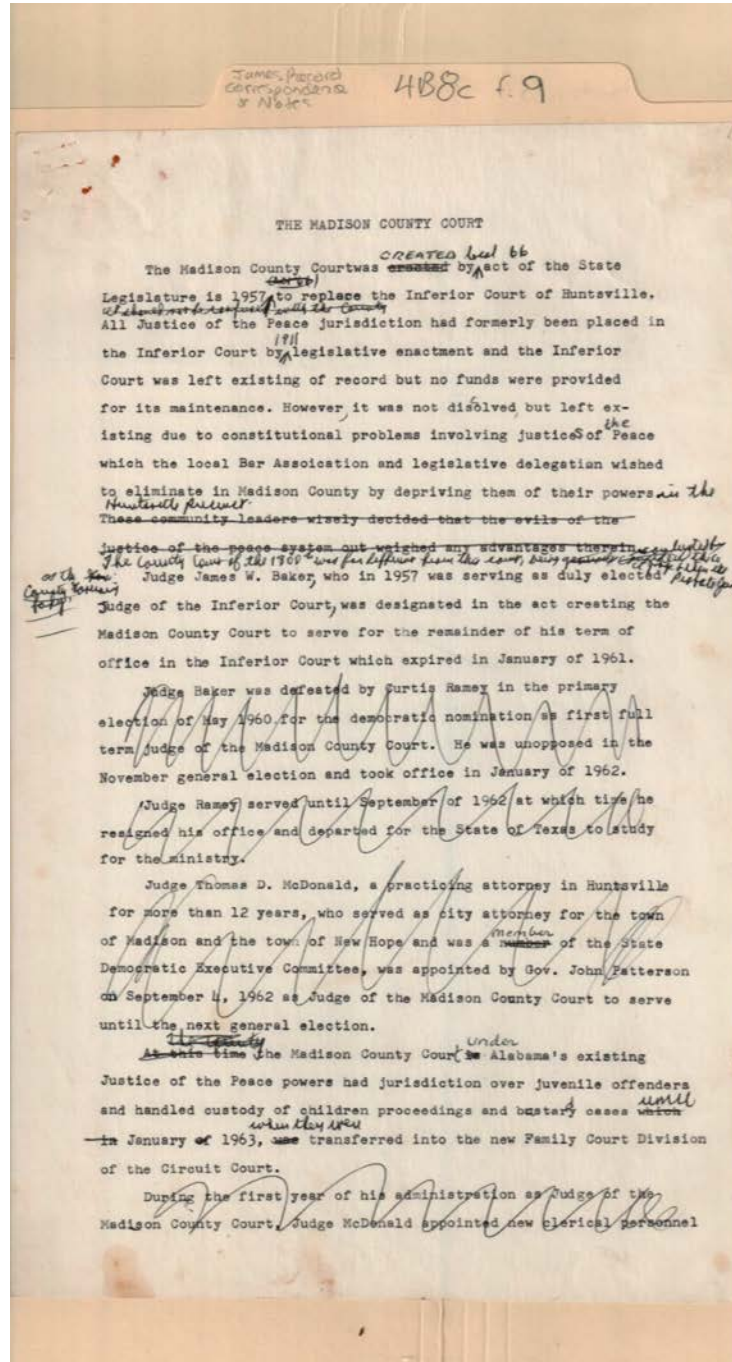
The library, containing some 6,100 volumes, is open to the public during the hours the Courthouse is open. A complete reporter system of appellate cases and other related volumes allow an attorney to completely research his case. No books can be removed from the library, but anyone can utilize the books in the library facility. While primarily for the use of the Courts and attorneys, law students, political science students or business law students will find numerous volumes of help to them. The general public might like to read the Code of Alabama, U. S. Congressional and Administrative News, law school periodicals and reports of cases of particular interest. In addition, the Martindale-Hubbell Law Directory listings of attorneys throughout the United States and law digests of each state could be invaluable to our many residents who formerly resided in another state.

Part of the furnishings in the library were purchased by the Huntsville-Madison County Bar Association and it presently uses the library as its headquarters. In addition to her duties as librarian, Mrs. Batt also serves as assistant to the Bar Association.

for the court ~~and~~ completely reorganized its procedures to conform with existing State Laws. The handling of traffic cases was put on a ~~classified~~ <sup>summary</sup> basis and offenders in hazardous moving violations were required to appear in Court and plead to the charges. ~~The prior~~ <sup>slacking</sup> custom of ~~slacking~~ over the serious violations were curtailed and ~~hard core~~ <sup>and</sup> traffic violations were punished as the law required. Public ~~traffic~~ traffic improved and accident rate in Madison County began to go down.

Other criminal cases were handled in the same manner ~~and~~. Judge McDonald was zealous in seeing to it that ~~felony~~ <sup>felony</sup> cases were given a preliminary examination and a preliminary hearing and ~~that~~ <sup>accused</sup> persons were brought promptly before the court instead of being kept incommunicado in confinement for long periods of time.

Judge McDonald devised ~~many~~ <sup>new</sup> new forms <sup>now required</sup> for the court for use in both civil and criminal cases, which served to expedite court administration. These forms are still in use and some of them have been adapted for use in other counties of the State.

In December of 1963 Judge McDonald was the Junior Chamber of Commerce Good Government award for his work in improving the Madison County Court.

In the Democratic primary election of May 1963 Judge McDonald was vigorously opposed by Robert Schwenn a Huntsville Attorney. Judge McDonald <sup>proved his accusations and</sup> ~~Schwenn~~ defeated him in this election. In the November General election he was unopposed and in January of 1964 was sworn into office as the duly elected Judge for the remainder of Judge Hamey's term of office.

In May of 1965 Robert W. Schwenn again opposed Judge McDonald in the Democratic primary and he was again defeated. In the November general election Judge McDonald defeated the republican nominee James Beck and was sworn in office on January 7, 1966 for a full six year term as Judge of the Madison County Court. Since that time Judge McDonald has twice been honored by being elected President of the Intermediate Judge's Association of Alabama.

The Madison County Court at present has nine clerks, a full time Bailiff and a full time Assistant District Attorney assigned to the Court.

Through <sup>the Court</sup> Judge McDonald's effort and with the approval of the Huntsville Madison County Bar Association the Court became one of the first, if not the first State Court, in Alabama, to have a paid public defender system at the intermediate Court level to handle indigent felony cases. The assigned counsel are assigned in order from a roster of practicing attorneys in Huntsville by <sup>the</sup> Judge McDonald and they are paid for their services as public defenders for indigent felons.

The act creating the Madison County Court <sup>has been</sup> amended several times since 1957 and under current statutes this court has concurrent jurisdiction with the circuit court on civil cases of jurisdictional amount up to \$1,000 and concurrent jurisdiction with the Circuit Court of see Criminal Misdemeanor cases. In addition the County Court has preliminary jurisdiction of all felony case prior to indictment by the Grand Jury and the Judge of the Madison County Court sets all criminal bonds on felony cases. With the exception of search warrants, which are issued by <sup>the</sup> Judge McDonald, all other Criminal affidavits, process, and warrants are issued by the warrants are issued by the warrants and complaints division of the District attorney's office.

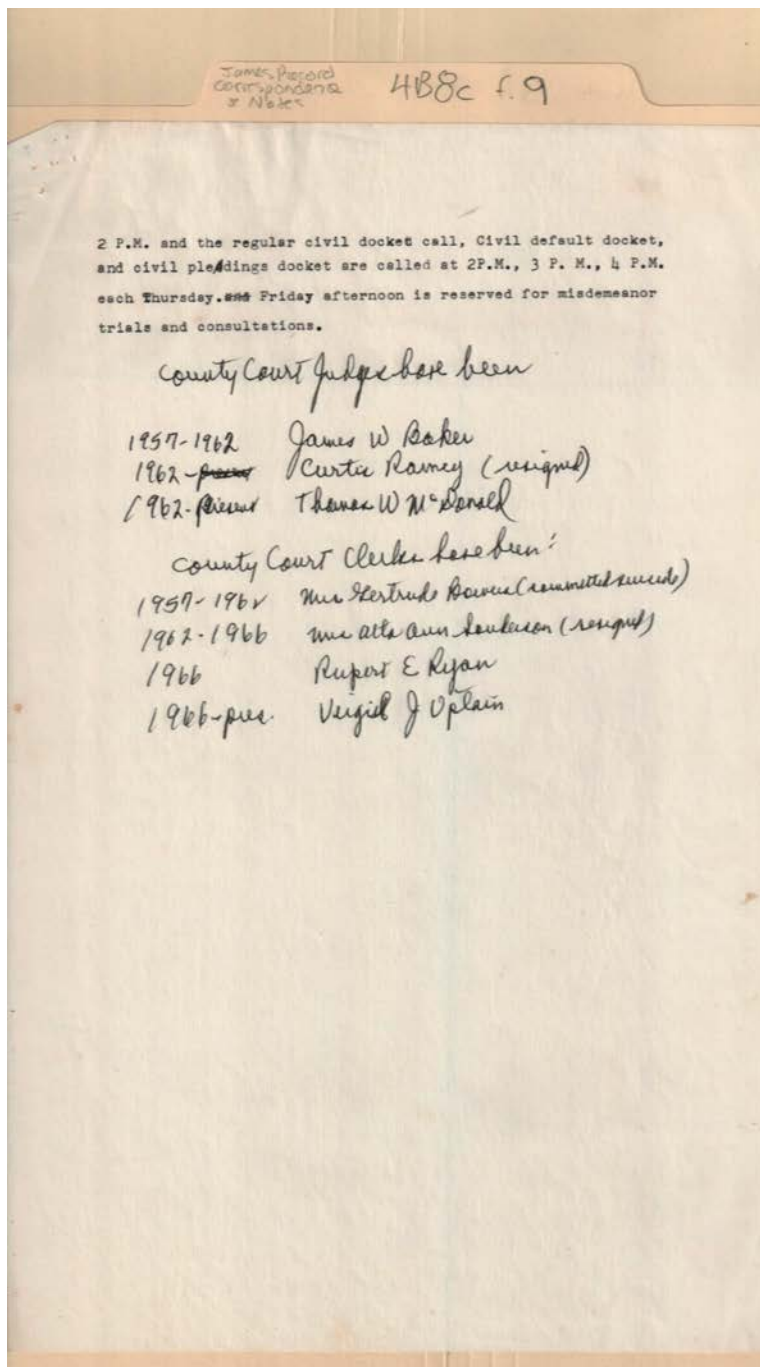
Prior to creation of the <sup>division of Complaint</sup> division misdemeanor affidavits and warrants of arrest were issued by <sup>the</sup> Judge McDonald.

Besides civil and felony cases and traffic offenses this court handles conservation violations, health cases, licensing cases and hunting and fishing violations. At present the court is handling some 15,000 cases per year some of which may be directly channeled through the violations Bureau of the Court, which was created and set up by Judge McDonald in 1963.

A Session of the Madison County Court is called promptly at 9:00 A. M. each week day morning. Highway patrol cases are called ~~promptly~~ at 9:00 A.M. Monday, Misdemeanor cases by citizens <sup>against citizens</sup> are called at 9 A.M. Tuesday, felony preliminary hearings at 9 A.M. Wednesday, felony examinations, conservation cases, and bad check cases at 9 A.M. Thursday and ~~the~~ sheriff's misdemeanor cases at 9 A.M. Friday. A large civil suits docket begins at 2P.M. each Monday, common drunk cases are called at

The urban counties have made substantial gains under the new formula, as well as their cities. In fact, that portion going to our cities is the straw that broke the camel's back for our small counties. The cities were two-fold winners — getting both the county revenue and a lion's share of the \$160 million bond issue. This formula will be followed until after the 1970 Federal decennial census is released. Then all supplements to the various counties will be discontinued. The division will then revert back to the original formula, that is, 25% of the total collections will be divided on an equal basis among the 67 counties and 30% will be divided on a population basis. This gives the counties and cities 55% of the total collected, and the remaining 45% goes to the State Highway Department. With the expiration of the supplements, the small counties will again feel the ax, as will some of the middle counties.

Some of the small counties are in a financial plight in their road programs. In a sense, they have been forced to borrow a great deal of money in order to match the SACP funds and bond revenue. A number of our larger counties are able to supplement their road funds with local road and bridge money, and some make appropriations out of their general funds. The gasoline tax is the sole source of revenue for the small counties, so this division of the gasoline tax is a severe blow to them.

The plight of some of the small counties has been severe enough to cause them to let their engineer go and some have had to cut their engineering force to the bone, with only a skeleton force retained. Will this lead to the passage of a general bill requiring all counties to have engineers? To say the least, this matter has been discussed. One county has passed such a local bill, requiring an engineering department together with a qualified engineer.

We need to be extremely careful and cautious in the management of our road programs. I have said this before and I feel it so strongly that I must say it again, I will not be surprised at any time a move is made for the State to take over all county roads.

The Year 1967 has been shrouded in black from the viewpoint of road activities. The Farm-to-Market Road program, the greatest revolution in the history of any state in the construction of roads, has been KILLED! Yes, "killed" in spite of a successful operation since 1943 — building over 16,000 miles of roads and bridges. This was the handiwork of the administration and the legislature in favor of a \$160 million bond issue.

This has been a terrific blow to all the counties of Alabama and I trust that the people will demand its return.

Regrettable to state that the administration and the legislature were aided and abetted by the Alabama Farm Bureau and the Petroleum Industry in killing our SACP road program. I cannot, for the life of me, understand the motive behind the action of the Farm Bureau when nothing is more helpful to the rural life of our State than a good road program. I can see the interest of the Petroleum Industry wanting to head off another one cent gasoline tax. Then on top of all this, they came back in favor of a uniform gasoline tax price with a 2c increase and wanted it frozen into the Constitution.

1967 was a banner year in making inroads into the county treasury by the legislature. Bill after bill was passed giving additional deputy sheriffs, and expense accounts to just about every office in the courthouse. Some of our members were remembered, but very lightly. A number of bills were passed placing a price on pistol permits. Instead of this revenue going into the county general fund, many were set up in a special fund for the sheriff's use — the most expensive office in the courthouse. Bills are continuing to be passed diverting solicitor funds from the county treasurer to a "special account" for the solicitor. I wonder if these special accounts are under the watchful eye of the Examiner of Public Accounts?

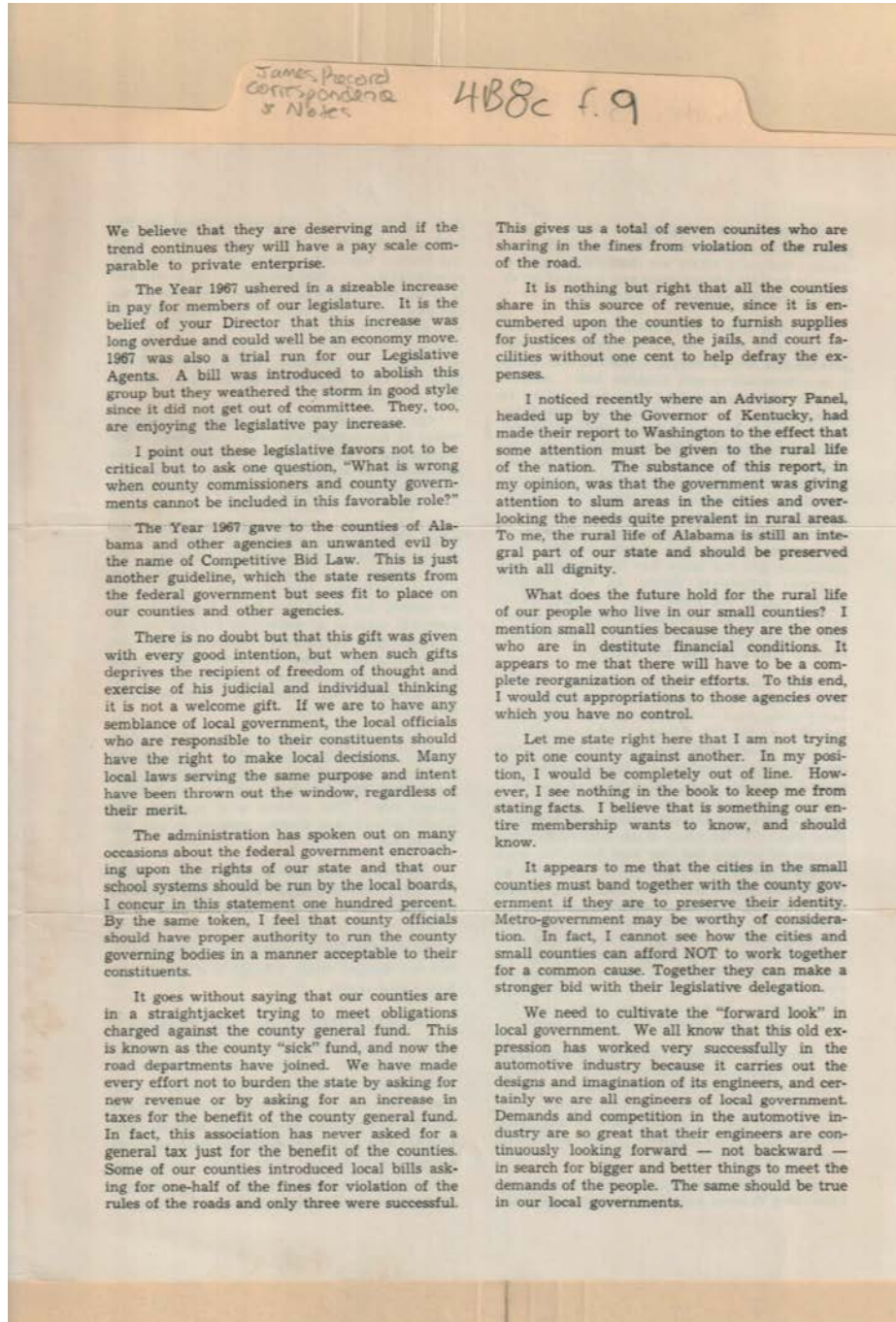
Senate Bill No. 229, by Senator Branyan, giving county commissioners a six-year term finally passed the Senate with an amendment calling for a referendum by the people, which was nothing more than a lethal death. It was finally sent over to the House and died in committee, because of another amendment which did not give time for it to be referred back to the Senate for acceptance or rejection before the legislature adjourned sine die.

It appears that we are confronted with quite a task in passing a general bill giving commissioners a six-year term. I would suggest that you ask your local legislative delegation to pass a "local" bill. If we could get a few local bills passed, then I believe that a general bill could be passed.

We tip our hats to the Tax Assessors and Tax Collectors' Association of Alabama for being able to add a retirement system to their six-year term. I would imagine that it is good to be in a "select" group.

It is good to report that state employees were given raises, retirements, and health insurance.





We believe that they are deserving and if the trend continues they will have a pay scale comparable to private enterprise.

The Year 1967 ushered in a sizeable increase in pay for members of our legislature. It is the belief of your Director that this increase was long overdue and could well be an economy move. 1967 was also a trial run for our Legislative Agents. A bill was introduced to abolish this group but they weathered the storm in good style since it did not get out of committee. They, too, are enjoying the legislative pay increase.

I point out these legislative favors not to be critical but to ask one question, "What is wrong when county commissioners and county governments cannot be included in this favorable role?"

The Year 1967 gave to the counties of Alabama and other agencies an unwanted evil by the name of Competitive Bid Law. This is just another guideline, which the state resents from the federal government but sees fit to place on our counties and other agencies.

There is no doubt but that this gift was given with every good intention, but when such gifts deprives the recipient of freedom of thought and exercise of his judicial and individual thinking it is not a welcome gift. If we are to have any semblance of local government, the local officials who are responsible to their constituents should have the right to make local decisions. Many local laws serving the same purpose and intent have been thrown out the window, regardless of their merit.

The administration has spoken out on many occasions about the federal government encroaching upon the rights of our state and that our school systems should be run by the local boards, I concur in this statement one hundred percent. By the same token, I feel that county officials should have proper authority to run the county governing bodies in a manner acceptable to their constituents.

It goes without saying that our counties are in a straightjacket trying to meet obligations charged against the county general fund. This is known as the county "sick" fund, and now the road departments have joined. We have made every effort not to burden the state by asking for new revenue or by asking for an increase in taxes for the benefit of the county general fund. In fact, this association has never asked for a general tax just for the benefit of the counties. Some of our counties introduced local bills asking for one-half of the fines for violation of the rules of the roads and only three were successful.

This gives us a total of seven counties who are sharing in the fines from violation of the rules of the road.

It is nothing but right that all the counties share in this source of revenue, since it is encumbered upon the counties to furnish supplies for justices of the peace, the jails, and court facilities without one cent to help defray the expenses.

I noticed recently where an Advisory Panel, headed up by the Governor of Kentucky, had made their report to Washington to the effect that some attention must be given to the rural life of the nation. The substance of this report, in my opinion, was that the government was giving attention to slum areas in the cities and overlooking the needs quite prevalent in rural areas. To me, the rural life of Alabama is still an integral part of our state and should be preserved with all dignity.

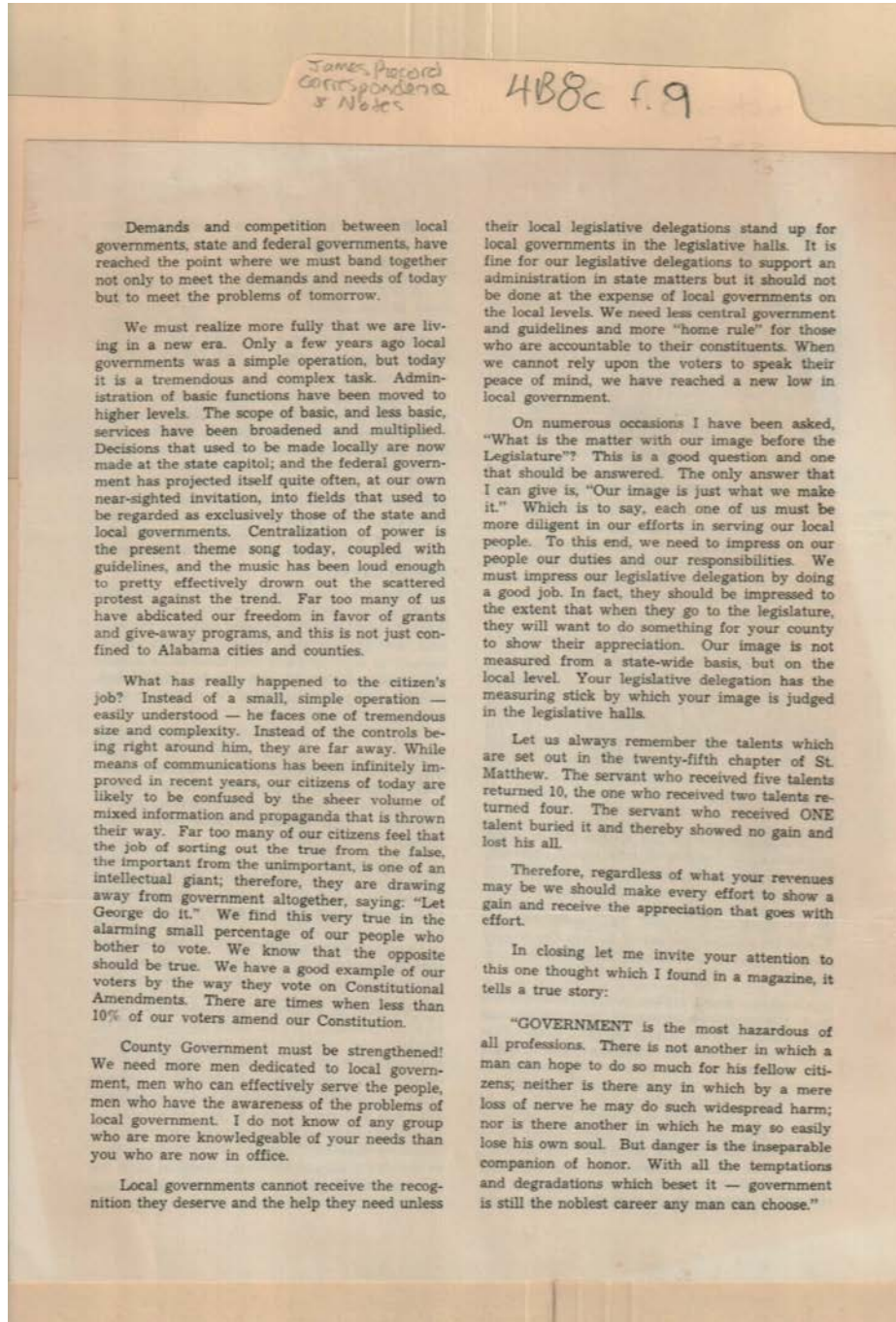
What does the future hold for the rural life of our people who live in our small counties? I mention small counties because they are the ones who are in destitute financial conditions. It appears to me that there will have to be a complete reorganization of their efforts. To this end, I would cut appropriations to those agencies over which you have no control.

Let me state right here that I am not trying to pit one county against another. In my position, I would be completely out of line. However, I see nothing in the book to keep me from stating facts. I believe that is something our entire membership wants to know, and should know.

It appears to me that the cities in the small counties must band together with the county government if they are to preserve their identity. Metro-government may be worthy of consideration. In fact, I cannot see how the cities and small counties can afford NOT to work together for a common cause. Together they can make a stronger bid with their legislative delegation.

We need to cultivate the "forward look" in local government. We all know that this old expression has worked very successfully in the automotive industry because it carries out the designs and imagination of its engineers, and certainly we are all engineers of local government. Demands and competition in the automotive industry are so great that their engineers are continuously looking forward — not backward — in search for bigger and better things to meet the demands of the people. The same should be true in our local governments.





Demands and competition between local governments, state and federal governments, have reached the point where we must band together not only to meet the demands and needs of today but to meet the problems of tomorrow.

We must realize more fully that we are living in a new era. Only a few years ago local governments was a simple operation, but today it is a tremendous and complex task. Administration of basic functions have been moved to higher levels. The scope of basic, and less basic, services have been broadened and multiplied. Decisions that used to be made locally are now made at the state capitol; and the federal government has projected itself quite often, at our own near-sighted invitation, into fields that used to be regarded as exclusively those of the state and local governments. Centralization of power is the present theme song today, coupled with guidelines, and the music has been loud enough to pretty effectively drown out the scattered protest against the trend. Far too many of us have abdicated our freedom in favor of grants and give-away programs, and this is not just confined to Alabama cities and counties.

What has really happened to the citizen's job? Instead of a small, simple operation — easily understood — he faces one of tremendous size and complexity. Instead of the controls being right around him, they are far away. While means of communications has been infinitely improved in recent years, our citizens of today are likely to be confused by the sheer volume of mixed information and propaganda that is thrown their way. Far too many of our citizens feel that the job of sorting out the true from the false, the important from the unimportant, is one of an intellectual giant; therefore, they are drawing away from government altogether, saying: "Let George do it." We find this very true in the alarming small percentage of our people who bother to vote. We know that the opposite should be true. We have a good example of our voters by the way they vote on Constitutional Amendments. There are times when less than 10% of our voters amend our Constitution.

County Government must be strengthened! We need more men dedicated to local government, men who can effectively serve the people, men who have the awareness of the problems of local government. I do not know of any group who are more knowledgeable of your needs than you who are now in office.

Local governments cannot receive the recognition they deserve and the help they need unless

their local legislative delegations stand up for local governments in the legislative halls. It is fine for our legislative delegations to support an administration in state matters but it should not be done at the expense of local governments on the local levels. We need less central government and guidelines and more "home rule" for those who are accountable to their constituents. When we cannot rely upon the voters to speak their peace of mind, we have reached a new low in local government.

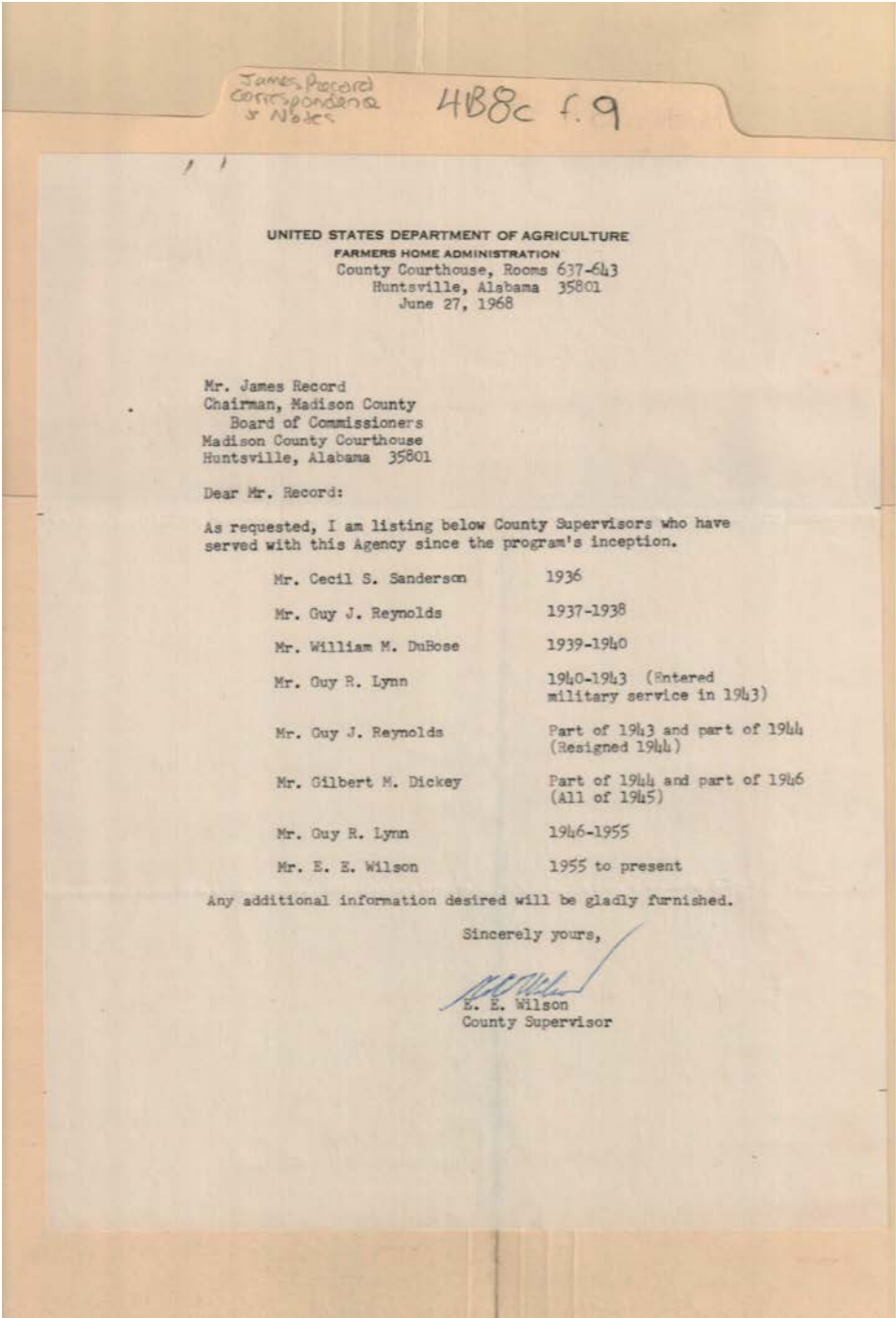
On numerous occasions I have been asked, "What is the matter with our image before the Legislature?" This is a good question and one that should be answered. The only answer that I can give is, "Our image is just what we make it." Which is to say, each one of us must be more diligent in our efforts in serving our local people. To this end, we need to impress on our people our duties and our responsibilities. We must impress our legislative delegation by doing a good job. In fact, they should be impressed to the extent that when they go to the legislature, they will want to do something for your county to show their appreciation. Our image is not measured from a state-wide basis, but on the local level. Your legislative delegation has the measuring stick by which your image is judged in the legislative halls.

Let us always remember the talents which are set out in the twenty-fifth chapter of St. Matthew. The servant who received five talents returned 10, the one who received two talents returned four. The servant who received ONE talent buried it and thereby showed no gain and lost his all.

Therefore, regardless of what your revenues may be we should make every effort to show a gain and receive the appreciation that goes with effort.

In closing let me invite your attention to this one thought which I found in a magazine, it tells a true story:

"GOVERNMENT is the most hazardous of all professions. There is not another in which a man can hope to do so much for his fellow citizens; neither is there any in which by a mere loss of nerve he may do such widespread harm; nor is there another in which he may so easily lose his own soul. But danger is the inseparable companion of honor. With all the temptations and degradations which beset it — government is still the noblest career any man can choose."
