

RULES - DEPARTMENT OF EXAMINERS OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS

The Department of Examiners of Public Accounts is organized under authority of Act No. 351, General Acts of Alabama 1947, page 231 (Title 55, Sections 156(1) - 170(23), Code of Alabama Recompiled 1958), and amendments thereto. The purpose of the department is to audit all state and county departments, boards, bureaus, and agencies, to report any illegal contracts or expenditures and to prescribe the accounting and reporting procedures and systems to be used by these agencies. The department makes charges against officials responsible for illegal expenditures and possesses hearing, subpoena, and investigative power.

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
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1. Organization	
<u>RULES</u>	
a. General supervision of the department is vested in the Legislative Committee on Public Accounts composed of five Senators elected by the Senate and five Representatives elected by the House of Representatives, together with the President of the Senate as Chairman and the Speaker of the House as Vice Chairman.	
b. The Chief Examiner, elected by the Legislative Committee on Public Accounts for a term of seven years and confirmed by the Senate, is the department head. All powers of the department are vested in the Chief Examiner.	
c. The Assistant Chief Examiner, appointed by the Chief Examiner, assumes the duties of the Chief Examiner in his absence and performs such other duties as designated by the Chief Examiner. Among these duties are included general superintendence of all personnel, processing of reports, supervision of rules and regulations, and approval of all expenditures.	
d. The Legal Counsel of the department is appointed by the Chief Examiner and handles all legal work of the department, including legal opinions, investigations, hearing and court

Judicial Summaries (12)
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(3) Settlement may be made only by a check or money order made payable to the agency fund due. Each agency fund should receive separate checks or money orders. No Examiner may accept cash in settlement of charges.

(4) Checks for state agencies should be made payable to the "State of Alabama" and should indicate thereon the fund to which made payable. These checks (or money orders) should accompany the report, together with copies of deposit slips and/or receipts from other agencies. Under no circumstances should an official make payment direct to the state or any of its depositories.

(5) When demand letters are necessary, they should be essentially in the following form:

<p>Mr. Samford, who had been elected governor in August, 1900, became mortally ill and W. D. Jelks, President of the Senate, was called upon to act in Governor Samford's place. He took the oath of office instead of Governor Samford and served as Governor for thirty days. Governor Samford being sufficiently restored, took up the duties of his office and served the state for six months, when he died. Governor Jelks became Governor June 1, 1901. Following the expiration of the term for which Governor Samford had been elected, Governor Jelks became a candidate for Governor for the succeeding term of four years. The contest in the primary was between Ex-Governor Jos. F. Johnston, and Governor Jelks. In the election he defeated J. S. A. Smith, Republican candidate.</p>
